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

Notes on the Data

The first chart, Delinquency Cases Received (1975-76 through 1992-93), is based upon two data sources. Figures prior to 1982-83 come from the Intake Log Book Count of Referrals. This system was discontinued after 1982-83, when the HRS Client Information System (CIS) began reporting referrals. The number of cases received is counted by unduplicating the number of referrals reported received on CIS by client identifier and the date the referral was received. If the same juvenile is referred for several offenses on the same date, these would be counted together as one case. If that juvenile is referred for one or more offenses on another date during the year it would be counted as another case. Using this definition for delinquency cases yielded 98.8 percent agreement between Intake Log Book counts and the number of cases reported as received on CIS during 1982-83, the one year that both systems were utilized.

All other data in this section come from CIS.

Delinquency Cases Received


Comparisons between 1982-83 and 1992-93 figures

(Based upon most serious offense charged in each case)

- The Florida population aged 10 to 17 increased by 8.9% over the eleven year period and the total number of delinquency cases received by HRS intake during 1992-93 was 93% greater than the number received in 1982-83.
- There was a 95% increase in felony cases and a 76% increase in misdemeanor cases. There was a 233% increase in other delinquency cases received.
- The largest percentage increase was for attempted murder, which grew from 13 cases to 268 in 1992-93, for an increase of 1,962%. Murder and manslaughter cases grew by 132%.
- The number of drug felony cases (excluding marijuana) grew by 478%, although the figure for 1992-93 was down by over 39% from the peak year 1988-89. Felony marijuana cases have grown by 47% since 1982-83.
- The number of auto theft cases increased by 341% since 1982-83.
- Concealed firearm cases were 298% higher than 1982-83. However, figures were down 7% from 1991-92.
- The number of armed robbery cases increased by 158% since 1982-83. However, the figures were down 15% since 1991-92. Other robbery cases increased by 201%.
- Sexual battery cases increased by 90%, while other felony sex offenses increased by 274%.
- Aggravated assault cases increased by 174%. Misdemeanor assault cases increased by 222%.
- The total number of delinquency cases received increased by 56% for white males, 171% for black males, 58% for white females and 160% for black females.

BY FISCAL YEAR




DELINQUENCY CASES RECEIVED

BY RACE AND SEX




VIOLENT FELONY CASES RECEIVED

BY MOST SERIOUS OFFENSE CHARGED



BY MOST SERIOUS OFFENSE CHARGED





BY AGE



BY RACE



Notes on the Data

Data for the first two charts, Detention Admission and Average Daily Population in Detention 1975-76 through 1992-93), come from manual Detention Population Reports submitted each month by the detention centers and compiled in the Juvenile Justice Research and Data Unit.

Figures for all other charts and graphs come from CIS reports of cases with an interim placement in detention. The counts of cases (referrals unduplicated by client identifier and date the referral was received) are consistently lower than admissions reported on Detention Population Reports. Cases reported detained on CIS consistently represent just over 75 percent of secure admissions reported on the manual data collection system. There seems to be little reason, however, to believe that cases not reported on CIS are significantly different than those which are reported. If this assumption is correct, then the data represent a very substantial sample for purposes of identifying trends and examining relationships.


Delinquency Cases Reported Detained

Comparison between 1982-83 and 1992-93 figures


(Based upon most serious offense charged in each case)

- In comparing the number of delinquency cases detained to the total number of cases disposed, the proportion has dropped from 22% to 17% over the eleven year period.
- The proportion of cases reported detained on felony charges remained relatively constant at 66 - 69% each year until 1988-89 when implementation of an improved risk screening process may have been the reason the percent rose to 72%. In 1992-93 felony cases comprised 75% of those cases reported detained.
- The offense of burglary continues to be the charge for which the largest number of youth are reported detained, although the proportion has declined from 29% to 21% in the eleven year period.
- The proportion of cases reported detained on murder, manslaughter or attempted murder charges has risen from 0.46% in 1982-83 to 1.4% in 1992-93.
- The proportion of cases reported as detained on auto theft charges has risen from 6% to 11%, for armed robbery from 3% to 5% and for aggravated assault/battery from 6% to 10% over the eleven year period.
- The total number of cases reported detained increased by 44% in the eleven year period. The number of white male cases reported detained increased by 9% while the black male cases increased by 119%. During this same period, the number of white female cases reported detained decreased by 19% and the black female cases increased by 56%.

DETENTION ADMISSIONS




AVERAGE POPULATIONS IN DETENTION




DELINQUENCY CASES DETAINED

BY RACE AND SEX




VIOLENT FELONY CASES DETAINED

BY MOST SERIOUS OFFENSE CHARGED**







BY AGE






Comparison between 1982-83 and 1992-93 figures

(Based upon most serious offense charged in each case)

- The proportion of delinquency cases reported handled non-judicially has declined from 49% to 51% of all case dispositions.
- The number of cases handled non-judicially was 90% higher than in 1982-83. The figures were, however, down 8% from 1991-92.
- In 1992-93 felony cases constituted about 34% of those cases handled non-judicially, with the remaining consisting of lesser offenses.
- Burglary continues to be the most common felony charge for non-judicial cases. The actual number of cases in 1992-93 is, however, down for the first time in five years.
- Shoplifting is the most common misdemeanor charge for non-judicial cases. The actual number of cases in 1992-93 is, however, down for the first time in seven years.
- Since 1982-83 the number of delinquency cases reported handled non-judicially for white males increased by 56%, for black males by 178%, for white females by 55% and for black females by 157%.




DELINQUENCY CASES HANDLED NON-JUDICIALLY

BY RACE AND SEX




VIOLENT FELONY CASES HANDLED NON-JUDICIALLY



- The proportion of delinquency cases reported handled judicially has increased from 49% to 51% of all case dispositions.
- The number of cases handled judicially has increased by 105% since 1982-83.
- For 1982-83 felony cases constituted 54% of those cases handled judicially, with the remaining consisting of lesser offenses. In 1992-93 felony cases were 50% of the cases handled judicially.
- Burglary continues to be the most common felony charge for judicially handled cases, at 18% of all felony cases handled judicially during 1992-93.
- The number of felony cases handled judicially which have shown the largest proportional increases have been attempted murder (up 2,080% to 218 cases), non-marijuana drug felonies (up 577% to 2,181 cases), auto theft (up 338% to 5,041 cases) and concealed firearms (up 341% to 837 cases).
- Shoplifting continues to be the most common misdemeanor charge for cases handled judicially (6,199), followed by assault (5,699), trespassing (3,271) and petty larceny (2,814).
- The number of white male cases handled judicially increased by 66% while black male cases increased by 180%. During this same period, the number of white female cases handled judicially increased by 56% and the number of black female cases has risen by 169%.





BY RACE AND SEX




VIOLENT FELONY CASES HANDLED JUDICIALLY







BY AGE



BY SEX



Delinquency Cases Referred to JASP


Comparisons between 1982-83 and 1992-93 figures

(Based upon most serious offense charged in each case)

- In comparing the number of delinquency cases referred to JASP to the total number of cases disposed, the proportion has risen from 17% to 20% over the eleven year period.
- There has been a 121% increase in the number of cases reported referred to the Juvenile Alternative Services Program over the eleven year period. The number of cases were, however, down 4% from 1991-92.
- This growth consists of a 113% increase in misdemeanor cases and a 120% increase in felony cases.
- Shoplifting continues to be the most common specific offense for which cases are referred to JASP, growing from 22% to 26% of all JASP cases. The actual number of reported JASP cases for this offense has more than doubled over the eleven year period.
- Burglary continues to be the second most common offense for which cases are referred to JASP, comprising 15% of the total. The actual number of reported JASP referrals for burglary has increased by 100% since 1982-83.
- The misdemeanor offenses showing the largest percent increase since 1982-83 in JASP cases are assault/battery, shoplifting, resisting arrest, concealed weapon, disorderly conduct and trespassing. Assault/battery, petty larceny, shoplifting, vandalism and trespassing constituted over 50% of the total JASP cases for 1992-93 and almost 80% of the misdemeanor cases referred to JASP in that year.
- The felony cases showing the largest percent increase since 1982-83 were auto theft, other robbery, sexual battery and other felony sex offenses. All together, however, these offenses constituted only 5% of total JASP referrals for 1992-93.
- Burglary, auto theft, aggravated assault/battery and grand larceny constituted 25% of the total JASP cases for 1992-93 and over 75% of the felony cases referred to JASP in that year.
- The number of white male cases referred to JASP has increased by 83% while the number of black male cases has increased by 179%. During the same period, the number of white female cases referred to JASP increased by 118% and black female cases increased by 246%.




DELINQUENCY CASES REFERRED TO JASP

BY RACE AND SEX




VIOLENT FELONY CASES REFERRED TO JASP

BY MOST SERIOUS OFFENSE CHARGED



BY SEX




Comparison between 1982-83 and 1992-93 figures

(Based upon most serious offense charged in each case)

- In comparing the number of delinquency cases placed on community control to the total number of cases disposed, the proportion has remained relatively stable ranging from 19% to 23% over the eleven year period.
- There has been a 91% increase in the number of delinquency cases placed on community control since 1982-83.
- This growth was comprised of a 102% increase in misdemeanor cases, a 57% increase in felony cases, and a 253% increase in the "other delinquency" category.
- These "other delinquency" cases disposed to community control, which constitute 17% of reported community control cases, consist mainly of technical (non-law) violations of community control requirements, reopened previously deferred prosecutions, transfers from other counties and cases reopened upon apprehension of the youth.
- Among felony cases placed on community control, the largest percent increases have been for concealed firearm (up 388% to 317 cases), felony non-marijuana drug (up 327% to 607 cases) and auto theft (up 289% to 1,592 cases).
- Among misdemeanor cases placed on community control, the largest percent increases were for resisting arrest without violence (up 423% to 408 cases), assault/battery (up 251% to 2,364 cases) and trespassing (up 219% to 1,548 cases).
- The number of delinquency cases reported placed on community control increased by 61% for white males, by 158% for black males, by 52% for white females and by 156% for black females.




DELINQUENCY CASES PLACED ON HRS COMMUNITY CONTROL

BY RACE AND SEX




VIOLENT FELONY CASES PLACED ON HRS COMMUNITY CONTROL





Notes on the Data

All data in this section come from a subsystem of the HRS Client Information System (CIS), the Florida Assessment Classification and Tracking System (FACTS), which consists of information on all reported commitments to juvenile justice programs in Florida. Since this subsystem was fully implemented in FY 1988-89 only 5 full years of data are available.

Commitments to HRS Delinquency Programs


Comparison between 1988-89 and 1992-93 figures

(Based upon most serious offense charged for each commitment)

- The number of commitments to HRS programs has remained relatively stable over the last five years, increasing by only 3% since 1988-89.
- During 1992-93, 68% of commitments were for felony offenses.
- Misdemeanors consistently comprise about one fifth of commitments, with less than 11% coming from the "other delinquency" category (primarily technical violations of community control) in 1992-93.
- Burglary continues to be the most common offense for commitments, constituting about 25% of the total for 1992-93.
- Technical violation of community control has become the second most common offense for commitments during 1992-93 (11%), followed by auto theft (9%) and misdemeanor assault/battery (7%).
- The number of white male commitments rose by 10% and the number of black male commitments decreased by 9% since 1988-89. During the same period, the number of white female commitments to delinquency programs increased by 21% while the black female commitments increased by 44%.





BY RACE AND SEX




VIOLENT FELONY COMMITMENTS TO JUVENILE JUSTICE PROGRAMS

Notes on the Data

Juvenile offenders may be transferred for processing in adult court in three ways: direct filing of a bill of information by a state attorney, waiver of jurisdiction by a juvenile court judge, or indictment by a grand jury. All data in this section came from HRS Client Information System (CIS) reports of cases disposed through transfer for processing in adult court during each fiscal year from 1982-83 through 1992-93, with the exception of data prior to 1982-83 on the first chart, which came from Intake statistical card reports.

Total numbers of such transfers are also reported by each county to the Office of the State Court Administrator. Comparisons of these figures to those cases reported on CIS for the last two fiscal years indicate 98 and 99 percent agreement.


Delinquency Cases Transferred to Adult Court

Comparison between 1982-83 and 1992-93 figures

(Based upon most serious offense charged in each case)

- In comparing the number of delinquency cases ~~referred to JASP~~ transferred to Adult Court to the total number of cases disposed, the proportion has risen from 4% to 5% over the eleven year period.
- There has been a 127% increase in the number of cases reported as transferred for processing in adult court since 1982-83. The numbers have grown steadily for the last eight years.
- The proportion of cases transferred to adult court for felony charges remained relatively constant at slightly over 80%.
- The proportion of cases transferred to adult court for misdemeanor charges decreased from 18% to 15%, although the actual number almost doubled since 1986-87.
- Burglary continued to be by far the most common charge of cases transferred to adult court, constituting 23% of all such cases in 1992-93.
- Armed robbery, non-marijuana felony drugs and auto theft were the next most common charges for which cases were transferred to adult court in 1992-93. These offenses constituted 29% of the total cases transferred.
- Those charges which showed the largest percent of increases in actual number of cases transferred to adult court were attempted murder (up 2,300% to 168 cases), non-marijuana felony drug (up 1,160% to 630 cases) and resisting arrest without violence (up 710% to 81 cases).
- The number of delinquency cases reported transferred to adult court for processing increased by 89% for white males, by 175% for black males, by 42% for white females and by 130% for black females.


DELINQUENCY CASES REPORTED TRANSFERRED TO ADULT COURT






VIOLENT FELONY CASES TRANSFERRED TO ADULT COURT
