# Message from the Attorney General

---



Gang-related crime and violence are among the most critical challenges facing California today. Yet many schools and communities are unprepared to deal with gangs and their culture of crime and violence. Unlike drug and alcohol prevention programs, anti-gang programs have not been widely promoted and disseminated. Many schools and communities are trying to develop anti-gang initiatives but need help in getting started.

My Crime and Violence Prevention Center has compiled this statewide resource directory of agencies providing anti-gang programs. We designed this directory to help schools and communities develop, establish, or maintain anti-gang programs in their communities. We wanted it to be an indispensable reference guide to enable agencies to find one another, to share information, to collaborate on local or regional strategies, to make referrals, and to simply network.

The need for this directory is well documented by findings from our 1993-94 California Student Substance Use Survey. In this survey, we asked all students about their involvement in gangs. Sixteen percent of 7th graders, 18 percent of 9th graders and 16 percent of 11th graders reported having belonged to a gang at some time in their life.

Students were also asked about school safety. Of the 9th graders, 39.8 percent reported being in a physical fight, 16.8 percent reported taking a weapon to school, and 57.3 percent reported seeing someone at school with a weapon.

These findings are sobering. We cannot tolerate gang-related crime and violence in our schools and communities. It is my hope that this directory will help you meet the challenge facing all of us.

## INTRODUCTION

### Background

In early 1993, the Crime and Violence Prevention Center of the California Office of the Attorney General initiated the development of this statewide directory of agencies providing anti-gang programs. As part of the Attorney General's Youth Anti-Gang Initiative, the directory is intended to provide schools, communities, and criminal justice agencies with information and contacts that will help them respond to youth gang-related problems in their schools and communities. The directory was prepared by the Southwest Regional Laboratory (SWRL) under contract with the Crime and Violence Prevention Center of the California Office of the Attorney General.

### What are Anti-Gang Programs?

Youth anti-gang programs are relatively new and untested. However, a majority of California programs have been in existence for at least a few years. These agencies employ a wide variety of approaches for dealing with gang membership and criminal activity. Typically, these efforts are categorized as prevention, intervention, and suppression. For the purposes of this directory, we developed the following definitions:

**A *youth gang prevention program*** is aimed at preventing youth involvement in gang activities and related violence. Prevention programs may target youth, families, or communities.

**A *youth gang intervention program*** targets youth who are gang members or who associate with gang members. The goals of such programs are to prevent further involvement with gangs, assist youth in leaving gangs, reduce delinquent behaviors, and improve school attendance. Intervention programs may target youth, families, gangs, or communities.

**A *youth gang suppression program*** uses the criminal justice system to combat gang-related crimes. Suppression includes arrest, gang suppression or prosecution units, gang probation supervision, and parole.

### What's in the Directory?

This directory is made up of brief profiles of over 500 California agencies providing youth anti-gang programs. The profiles are based on agency responses to the Attorney General's Youth Anti-Gang Program Survey. They are intended to serve as an introduction to a program, not a comprehensive program review. The inclusion of a program profile in this directory does not suggest that it has been proven to be effective, or that it has been endorsed by either the Office of the Attorney General or

Southwest Regional Laboratory. Likewise, the omission of a program does not suggest that it is ineffective and that it was intentionally omitted from this directory.

Prior to publication, agency contact persons were given an opportunity to review the profiles to ensure accuracy and minimize errors. Nonetheless, programs and staffing change over time. Thus, it is not possible to guarantee the current accuracy of any of the profiles.

Following the local agency profiles are a list of state/federal agencies and organizations. We have also included a description on Developing the Survey and Findings (Appendix A), the Statewide Survey of Youth Anti-Gang Programs questionnaire (Appendix B), and preliminary findings from the 1993-94 California Student Substance Use Survey (Appendix C).

### **How is the Directory Organized?**

The directory is organized alphabetically by county. Within each county, program profiles are listed in alphabetical order under one of three categories: Education, Community Agencies, and Criminal Justice.

Schools and school districts are listed under Education; community-based agencies and local governmental agencies other than criminal justice, are under Community Agencies; and police departments, sheriffs, district attorneys, and probation departments, are listed under Criminal Justice.

At the end of this publication, we have included a city-county index and an alphabetical agency index. If the agency name is known, the alphabetical index will help you find it. If only the city is known, the city-county index and table of contents will help you to locate the appropriate page. *Remember, this directory includes only those agencies that responded to our Youth Anti-Gang Program Survey.*

### **Will this Directory Be Updated?**

We anticipate the need to update this directory, and we invite your participation. ## DEVELOPING THE SURVEY AND FINDINGS

In 1993, the Attorney General's Crime and Violence Prevention Center contracted with the Southwest Regional Laboratory (SWRL) to develop a statewide directory of agencies providing youth anti-gang prevention, intervention and suppression programs. Two statewide surveys were conducted by the SWRL to identify agencies that provide youth anti-gang programs and to obtain program information for this directory.

**Definitions.** For both surveys, definitions and instructions were provided to standardize how respondents would report gang-related activities and anti-gang services. Survey recipients at criminal justice agencies were instructed to use the Penal Code definition for *criminal street gangs* as then defined by Penal Code § 186.22 (f). In contrast, respondents for school districts and community agencies were instructed to report all data with regard to *youth gangs*. *Youth* were defined as persons who are under 18 years of age.

Definitions were also developed for reporting the type(s) of program(s) that respondents' agencies provided. The following guidelines were provided to define prevention, intervention, and suppression programs.

- *A youth gang prevention program* is aimed at preventing youth involvement in gang activities and related violence. Prevention programs may target youth, families, or communities.
- *A youth gang intervention program* targets youth who are gang members or who associate with gang members. The goals of such programs are to prevent further involvement with gangs, assist youth in leaving gangs, reduce delinquent behaviors, and improve school attendance. Intervention programs may target youth, families, gangs, or communities.
- *A youth gang suppression program* uses the criminal justice system to combat gang-related crimes. Suppression includes arrest, gang suppression or prosecution units, gang probation supervision, and parole.

### PROGRAM IDENTIFICATION SURVEY

In the first survey mailing, over 2200 Program Identification Surveys were sent to school district administrators, sheriffs, chiefs of police, chief probation officers, state funded grant recipients, and community agencies. State and local resource directories were used to develop the mailing lists. Recipients were asked to identify other agencies in their community that might also be involved in anti-gang efforts.

A total of 832 agencies responded to the survey for a response rate of 37 percent. This response rate was not unusual for a mail survey. Of these 832 agencies, 629 reported having an anti-gang program. The respondents also identified another 798 agencies as possible providers of youth anti-gang programs. (Table 1)

### PROGRAM IDENTIFICATION SURVEY RESULTS

The Program Identification Survey results reported are for the 629 agencies with some type of youth anti-gang program. These results include 154 community agencies, 240 educational agencies, 227 criminal justice agencies, and 8 city or other local governmental agencies.

**Types of Youth Anti-Gang Programs Implemented.** The most common type of program provided by respondents included all three components: prevention, intervention, and suppression (28%). An almost equal number had only a prevention component (27%). Programs with two components -- prevention and intervention services (23%) -- were also common.

**Types of Youth Anti-Gang Programs Provided by Type of Agency.** Different types of agencies were involved in providing youth anti-gang programs. Nearly all community agencies provided prevention programs (95%), and nearly two-thirds provided intervention programs (62%). Educational agencies most often provided prevention (91%) programs. However, schools also provided intervention (56%) and suppression (35%) services. Criminal justice agencies provided suppression programs (78%), intervention (57%) and prevention programs (71%). City or

other local government agencies also provided prevention (100%), intervention (80%), and suppression (40%) programs.

**Ethnic/Racial Composition of Gang Members.** Respondents were asked to describe the ethnic or racial composition of the participants in youth/criminal street gangs in their communities. A number of ethnic or racial groups were identified. However, the most commonly cited groups were Mexican American/Latino, African American, and White (e.g., Stoners, Skinheads, etc.). (Table 2)

## INDICATORS OF GANG-RELATED PROBLEMS

**School Districts and Community Agencies.** Respondents for school districts and community agencies were asked to identify signs of youth gang-related problems in their respective school districts or communities. More than half the agencies reported the following signs of youth gang activity: gang graffiti; attitudes of youth; displays of gang identifying colors, clothing and symbols; tagging; and gang involvement in drug use and sales. Nearly half of the agencies reported gang-motivated violent crimes and drive-by shootings.

**Criminal Justice Agencies.** Respondents for criminal justice agencies were also asked to identify signs of criminal street gang activity in their communities. The most frequent responses matched those of the school districts and community agencies, with the addition of signs of gangs in schools. (Table 3)

**Problems with Female-Only Youth Gangs.** We asked respondents whether there had been problems with female-only gangs in their communities. More than half reported that female-only gangs were not a problem (55 percent), 29 percent said that they were, and 16 percent did not know.

**Communication About Youth Gang-Related Problems in School Districts and Communities.** School district and community agency respondents were asked to identify who had communicated with them about youth gang-related problems in their district or community. Nearly 90 percent said that they had received information from law enforcement officers. Other common sources of information were school administrators, parents, teachers/ counselors, students, community leaders, and probation officers. Half of the responding school districts and community agencies reported communications about youth gang-related problems from local gang prevention programs and current/former gang members.

## PROGRAM SURVEY RESULTS

A second survey requested information from agencies on their specific anti-gang programs and services provided for inclusion in this directory. It was mailed to 1427 agencies identified from the first survey as providing anti-gang programs and services. See Appendix B for a copy of the survey. Completed program surveys were received from 276 of the original 629 Program Identification Survey Respondents, and 233 of the 798 other agencies identified by the original respondents. A total of 509 responding agencies provided some type of youth gang prevention, intervention, or suppression program. The reasons for the low response rate from agencies responding to the first survey were unclear.

**Types of Agencies Providing Programs.** Of those agencies providing youth anti-gang programs, 33% were provided by criminal justice agencies, 31% by community agencies, 29% by educational agencies, and 8% by other local governmental agencies.

**Types of Programs Implemented.** The most common approach used to combat youth gang problems was through a combination of prevention and intervention services (32%). Thirty percent of the agencies reported that they had implemented a comprehensive program with three components, prevention, intervention, and suppression services. Twenty two percent of the agencies employed a single anti-gang strategy -- most of which were prevention-only programs.

**Target Populations.** Respondents were asked to indicate the populations that were specifically targeted by their agency's program. Suppression, understandably, targeted gang members and other youth most at-risk for gang involvement. Intervention programs targeted these same youth, as well as young people who were using or were at-risk of using alcohol and other drugs. (Table 4)

### PROGRAM EFFECTIVENESS

Respondents were asked to provide their opinions of the effectiveness of their agencies' programs. Although many rated their agency's program as very effective (28%), most indicated that the program was somewhat effective (62%). Only one percent said that the program was not effective and ten percent were unable to rate program effectiveness. We also asked respondents to assess the effectiveness of their agencies' programs along a number of dimensions based on the best information that was available to them. Program outcomes were based on respondents' observations as to whether or not there had been reductions in negative behaviors or increases in positive behaviors. (Tables 13 and 14)

The fifth biennial California Student Substance Use Survey (CSS) sponsored by the Office of the Attorney General, Department of Justice and the California Health and Welfare Agency, Department of Alcohol and Drug Programs, was conducted from November, 1993 to February, 1994. The survey was administered in 100 public schools. Half of the school sample participated in the 1991-92 survey. New schools were selected using the same stratified, proportional, random sampling plan applied in previous surveys. Thirteen independent (private) schools also participated in the survey, but their results will be reported separately at a later date.

The survey was completed by 5,655 students in grades 7, 9, and 11 (1700-2000 students per grade). Students were randomly selected within grade levels. The sampling procedure as well as information on gender and ethnic representation confirm that the current sample of students is representative of California public school students with respect to geographic region, gender, and ethnicity.

Selection of students and administration of the questionnaire was conducted for the first time by the Southwest Regional Laboratory rather than by local school personnel. Respondents completed the survey voluntarily under conditions of confidentiality and anonymity.

The questionnaire assessed frequency of use of 21 substances or classes of substances as well as use of two or more drugs on the same occasion. The survey also assessed heavy or abusive alcohol consumption, experiences and attitudes relevant to substance use, including involvement in prevention programs in school, and perceptions of harmfulness of occasional vs. frequent use of alcohol vs. marijuana. This year's survey was expanded to include items on current (past 30 days) and lifetime use of substances, comparable to the National Monitoring the Future Survey, and new items on personal problems associated with abuse of alcohol and other drugs (AOD).

## OVERVIEW TO 1993-94 FINDINGS

### Trends from 1985-86 to 1991-92

Between 1985 and 1989, illicit drug use among California youth declined, and in 1989 alcohol consumption declined for the first time. In the last survey, however, there were indications of an upswing in the use of marijuana, LSD, and several other illicit drugs. Yet cocaine, polydrug use, and other indicators of illicit drug use continued to show declines in all three grade levels. Alcohol use increased, but still remained below levels reported prior to 1989.

The results of the current survey indicate that illicit drug use has further increased substantially over the past two years, but alcohol consumption has remained stable. . Nationally, increases in illicit drug use have been observed over the past year, although they are less pronounced, and alcohol use also remained stable.

### Illicit Drug Use

A sharp rise occurred in the use of any illicit drug, marijuana, inhalants, amphetamines, LSD, and polydrug use in grades 9 and 11, and, to a lesser extent, grade 7. Other drug categories also showed increases, particularly among 9th graders. Overall, drug use appears to have rebounded to levels only slightly below those observed in 1985-86.

**Six-Month Prevalence Rates.** Among both 9th and 11th graders, marijuana use increased eleven percentage points, to 30% and 40%, respectively, the largest change ever recorded by the survey. Increases almost as large (about 8 points) were reported for use of any illicit drug (to 42% and 47%), as well as polydrug use, which had steadily declined between 1985 and 1991. Inhalant use rose to 22% (up 10 points) and 13%; LSD, to 8% and 12%, double the rates in 1985. The primary exception to this rising trend was cocaine, which rose only slightly among 9th graders and declined slightly among 11th.

Even among 7th graders, 3-4 percentage point increases were reported for any illicit drug (to 25%), marijuana (to 11%), and inhalants (to 17%). These use categories have steadily increased since 1989-90.

**Weekly Marijuana Use.** Marijuana use once a week or more often rose to 10% of 9th graders and 15% of 11th, for the first time approaching or meeting the rates for weekly beer drinking.

**High-Risk Drug Use.** Consistent with these increases, the proportion of High-Risk Users rose to a fifth of 9th and over a quarter of 11th graders, after declining in 1991.

**Intoxication.** The proportion of students at each grade who reported ever getting high on an illicit drug increased markedly, to 11% of 7th, 30% of 9th, and 40% of 11th graders. This equaled 1985-86 rates among 9th graders and exceeded them among 7th.

**High at School.** A fifth of 9th graders and almost a third (30%) of 11th reported being high on drugs or alcohol in school, a 5 point increase for both since the last survey.

## Alcohol Consumption

Although drinking has fluctuated over the eight years of the survey, it appears relatively stable. Nevertheless, alcohol remains the most popular drug and, in contrast to the situation nationally, there is no indication that drinking among California youth is declining. Furthermore, substantial proportions of students are drinking frequently and/or heavily, and driving under the influence.

**Frequent or Heavy Drinking.** Weekly drinking was reported by 14% of 9th and 21% of 11th graders, and recent heavy drinking by about a fifth of both grades, as well as by a tenth of 7th graders. In addition, 21% of 9th graders and 29% of 11th were classified as excessive alcohol users based on a summary index, only slight increases over 1991-92.

**Intoxication.** The percentage of students who had been "high" on alcohol increased substantially at each grade level, rising from nearly a quarter of 7th graders to two-thirds of 11th. In addition, among 11th graders, 41% had been very drunk or sick after drinking, 13% had passed out, and 16% had forgotten what happened.

**Drinking and Driving.** Among 9th and 11th graders, 28% and 41%, respectively, reported that they had ever driven a car after drinking or been in a car when a friend was drinking and driving. These rates have been rising since 1989.

## Correlates of Use

Survey results suggest the upswing in illicit drug use may be related to the changing perceptions of the harmfulness of marijuana, reductions in prevention efforts in the state, and increases in availability.

**Easy Availability.** By grade 11, somewhat more than half of the respondents considered both alcohol and marijuana to be "very easy" to obtain. The rate for marijuana was even slightly higher than for alcohol (56% vs. 53%).

**Perceived Harmfulness.** Perceptions that frequent marijuana use is extremely harmful has declined since 1989-90 and, for the first time, is currently lower than for alcohol in grade 11 (59% vs. 63%). In contrast, the rate for frequent use of alcohol has increased.

**Prevention Exposure.** Measures of exposure to prevention programs and activities at school indicate declining exposure in all grade levels since 1989-90.

## National Comparison

For 11th graders, these survey results confirm, and considerably exceed, the rises in the use of marijuana, inhalants, stimulants, and LSD between 1992 and 1993 among 12th graders nationally, as indicated by the National Institute on Drug Abuse's Monitoring the Future Survey. This reverses a long-term declining trend. As in California, drinking among seniors nationally appears to have remained stable over the past two years, although it declined in the late 1980s. California 11th graders currently report slightly lower rates of alcohol consumption and substantially higher rates of illicit drug use. For example, the prevalence of current drinking is one percentage point lower (50% vs. 51% for seniors nationally); heavy drinking is six points lower (22% vs. 28%). In contrast, marijuana use is ten points higher in California (26% vs. 16%) and inhalants five points higher (7.4 % vs. 2.5%).
