Finding Federal Funds To Prevent Crime

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The Bureau of Justice Assistance is a component of the Office of Justice Programs, which also includes the Bureau of Justice Statistics, the National Institute of Justice, the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention, and the Office for Victims of Crime.

Introduction

Reducing and preventing violence, drug abuse, and other crimes are major concerns for communities throughout the Nation. Law enforcement officers, civic leaders. health officials, social services staff, youth workers, and others who deal with the aftermath of crime are increasingly interested in working together to address both its symptoms and its causes. Community residents are more eager than ever to solve problems and tackle projects that improve the quality of their lives and help ensure the security and safety of their neighborhoods.

A major Federal program reaches out to help fund State and local efforts to curb crime. The Edward Byrne Memorial State and Local Law Enforcement Assistance Formula Grant Program provides funds to each State, the District of Columbia, and five U.S. territories to help communities stop illegal drug use and violent crime. This program is administered by the Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA), Office of Justice Programs, U.S. Department of Justice. Byrne funds can be used to start or enhance State- or local-level programs that address a wide range of anti-crime needs, from dealing with causes to demanding restitution from offenders.

This document helps readers benefit from Byrne funds in several ways. First it helps people in local communities understand how Byrne funds can help their communities and States by:

- Describing what States are required to do to receive these funds—that is, identifying needs within the State and strategically planning how to address those needs.
- Outlining how a community resident or organization can offer insights on local needs and program ideas for consideration by State officials developing strategic priorities and explaining how a group might apply for funding under the State's established priorities.

The document is divided into four sections:

- Section One describes purposes, criteria, and processes under the Byrne Formula Grant Program.
- Section Two suggests ways in which interested organizations can contribute their views and experiences to their State's strategic plan for criminal justice funding. It also explains how these groups can apply for crime prevention project funds
- Section Three notes some key Federal resources that might provide funding or support for local crime prevention efforts.
- Section Four lists agency contacts for State-level

inquiries on Federal funding resources.

This document does not guarantee funding, of course. It does offer ideas for seeking and obtaining additional resources and support in community efforts to reduce crime.

Reducing crime requires many and varied resources disciplines, topics, and skills. BJA-funded comprehensive approaches such as Operation Weed and Seed, the Comprehensive Communities Program, and the Texas Cities Action Plan To Prevent Crime have shown that widespread engagement of all sectors of the community, a clear and firm commitment, and active, energized partnerships are key ingredients in strategic community anti-crime and antidrug efforts. Because the process of securing Byrne funding requires that States plan strategically, it has the potential to encourage and support such local strategic efforts.

Funding through the Byrne Formula Grant Program can be an important resource for community action. In Florida, for example, 18 community-based programs were initiated through 21 subgrants in just 1 year. The programs included community policing, neighborhood drug-free and crime-free events, "at-risk" youth programs, media presentations, home security projects, block

or neighborhood watches, "safe homes" for children, citizen patrols, hot lines to local law enforcement, neighborhood cleanups, drug coordinating councils, community support groups, prevention education, organizing volunteers, and recreational programs. This range of initiatives reflects the range of local activity aimed at reducing crime and building safer and more vital communities.

The public safety task facing the Nation's communities goes far beyond individual projects. It requires changing how individuals think about their communities and about themselves as community members. It needs cooperative approaches and attitudes that build partnerships among those who can and want to deal with crime's causes as well as its consequences. It requires tenacity and innovation. But the job can be done, and Byrne funds can help get it done.

Section One Resources for Local Crime Reduction and Prevention Under the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1986 (As Amended)

In the mid-1980's, in response to growing public demand to combat the drug problem, Congress enacted the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1986 (amended in 1988). It sought to provide major financial

resources to States and localities to contain and reduce drug-related and violent crime. The grant programs created by the Act span the criminal justice, health, and education areas. These programs were intended to increase the coordination and effectiveness of responses to the drug problem at all levels of government.

In establishing and updating this program, Congress expressed concern about the inability of beleaguered and often isolated police and sheriff's departments to cope with the surge of drug-related and violent crimes. Congress annually appropriates funds to each grant area under the Act. The Byrne Program is the criminal justice grant mechanism created as a result of the Act and its amendments.

One part of the program makes formula-based grants annually to each of the 50 States, the District of Columbia, and 5 U.S. territories. State and territorial governments and the District of Columbia then distribute these funds as subgrants to State and local projects that fit within approved categories under the State's crime and drug control strategy. The State's program is usually administered by a criminal justice services agency, a criminal justice planning authority, or a drug control/prevention agency.

In a separate part of the Byrne Program, BJA makes a limited number of discretionary grants directly to local and other entities. For convenience, this monograph refers to the Formula Grant Program as "Byrne funds" and specifically identifies any other Byrne program discussed.

How States Receive Their Formula Grants

To understand how Byrne funds can meet community needs, it is useful to know how and under what restrictions the States receive these funds. This section describes in some detail how that process typically works. The next section helps community organizations and their members understand how they can be part of the process that establishes State priorities for spending Byrne funds.

BJA determines each State's annual grant entitlement by applying a modified population-based formula to the total annual congressional appropriation for the program. That amount can change from year to year. A base amount—0.25 percent of the total with a minimum of \$500,000—is guaranteed to each State. Allocation of the bulk of the funding is determined by the State's share of the U.S. population.

To receive Byrne funds, each State must develop a strategic, multiyear violence prevention and drug control strategy to demonstrate that funds will be used efficiently and in accordance with the purposes of the law. This requirement is

designed to promote planning, coordination, and strategic decisionmaking within each State. BJA must review these State plans.

The State's plan is to be supported by data, appropriately analyzed, that help identify problems and needs of the State and its communities, including attention to issues that transcend local boundaries.

The State plan must be made available for public comment and for review by the State legislature. BJA does not prescribe methods for doing these things, but does require that both be done.

To promote coordination, the State agency that applies for Byrne funds must consult with criminal justice practitioners, treatment and education officials, and elected local officials. Again, the format for this action is left to the State's discretion.

BJA encourages States to link their plans to national strategy, to incorporate multijurisdictional efforts, and to stress user accountability. In a few States, county or regional planning is performed to specify the allocation of grant funds to particular projects, but these allocations must fit within the State's approved strategy.

Governors can form Drug and Violent Crime Policy Boards or other groups to help in their decisionmaking on the State's strategic plans. Many kinds of mechanisms have been used to make these decisions

Byrne funds can be used for any purpose described in the Federal legislation. BJA may interpret these 26 purpose areas (see page 13) but may not change them. The areas are generally acknowledged to have some overlap. Taken together, they provide a broad base for addressing States' and communities' criminal justice and crime prevention needs.

The Federal Government places other important requirements on States' use of Byrne funds:

- States must "pass through"

 a share of the funds to
 local jurisdictions in proportion to local agencies' share of total State criminal justice expenditures. The remaining funds can be used at the State's discretion, consistent with the other general requirements. A number of States use more than the required minimum to fund local projects.
- Subgrants may not be funded for more than 48 months, except those waived by the legislation itself (multijurisdictional task forces, gang task forces, and victim-witness programs).
- Twenty-five percent of grant expenses must be paid with State or local moneys. This requirement must be met with cash

- rather than with in-kind support.
- Formula grant funds may not be used to take the place of moneys currently being spent by State or local governments.
- States must limit administrative expenses to 10
 percent of the total Byrne
 funds received and are
 encouraged to use some of
 the administrative set-aside
 for evaluation of subgrants.
- States must submit strategies and award local subgrants within time limits specified in the legislation.
- States must monitor subgrant activities and provide periodic reports to BJA on these activities and their impact on drug and other crime problems.

(See separate table of approved purpose areas for Byrne expenditures.)

Benchmarks in State Action

State procedures for administering Byrne funds vary widely, even within Federal guidelines, but certain key features appear in the process in virtually every State. Potential applicants should contact the State agency that administers these funds to secure specific information on the State's processes and procedures as well as time lines for both the application to the Federal Government and

the local applications for funding from the State passthrough of grant funds.

Though States follow the basic BJA requirements, each State may add its own requirements and guidelines. Those familiar with their State's specific policies and processes have considerable advantage in helping to shape strategies and in identifying compatible projects for possible funding.

The State Appoints Policymakers To Guide the Byrne Process

There must be some State-level mechanism to establish Byrne funding priorities. More than 40 States have established some form of policy board, often called a Drug and Violent Crime Policy Board. In more than half the cases, these boards have substantial influence on what funding priorities are selected. Some are directly involved in subgrant awards. Boards often conduct hearings around the State to gather views on what the State's anticrime strategy should be. Normally, the Governor appoints the members of the board.

The State Consults To Develop the Strategic Plan

Until fiscal year 1997, States were required to submit annual strategic plans. As of fiscal year 1997, multiyear plans are required covering 3-year periods. Most States first draft a plan and then consult with

representatives of relevant sectors through hearings or other processes; some consult about what the plan should be and then develop a draft.

Federal requirements for consultation in development of the plan and opportunity for public comment are often met in part by holding hearings at various locations around the State. Some States hold conferences or summits to which they invite representatives of all the sectors they see as relevant; others conduct surveys. These outreach efforts help State policymakers decide the priorities they will establish for use of the State's Byrne funding, what the State's needs assessment will say, and what State programs will be included in the Byrne funds plan. BJA must review this plan.

The States Issue Rules on Eligibility for Grants

Once the plan is developed and approved, the State issues rules and procedures for accepting and processing grant applications to disburse the Byrne funds. State rules must, of course, include any conditions and restrictions required in Federal legislation. These rules usually provide for local general-purpose units of government (e.g., cities and counties) and State agencies to apply. Some States allow wider latitude in the types of groups that may receive funds, although applications must be made through a unit of State or local government.

The rules describe how proposals are to be submitted and what they must contain. Sometimes the judging criteria are spelled out. Calls to the State agency to clarify concerns, ask questions, or explore issues are usually permitted or even encouraged.

Applicants Submit Their Proposals to the State

The application typically asks for a problem statement or needs assessment, a description of the proposed project and the difference it will make, how the project furthers the State strategy, an explanation of those with whom the applicant will collaborate, a description of how the project will be evaluated, a clear budget, and the specific source of the required 25-percent cash matching funds.

The State Awards Grants

Grants are normally provided for a single year. Most projects cannot be funded for more than 48 months. Multijurisdictional task forces, gang task forces, and victim-witness programs, by law, may be funded for longer time periods.

Approved Applicants Implement Their Projects

Approved applicants are notified by the State and proceed with their projects. The State has important reporting requirements that the project must meet in order to continue receiving funds. The project

should be completed within the prescribed timeframe.

State Conducts Monitoring and Other Evaluation

The State must collect, analyze, and report to BJA data on each project's intent and results. These data reflect the project's goals and its progress toward them as well as lessons learned and results obtained. States must monitor projects and are encouraged to work with BJA and its sister agency, the National Institute of Justice, in developing formal evaluations of selected projects.

Section Two Seeking Byrne State Formula Grant Funds

There are two major ways in which local organizations can play a part in determining what is funded under the State's Byrne formula grant. One way is through thoughtful, wellsupported testimony about needs and priorities that the State's Byrne allocation should focus on. This testimony should take place in a strategic context-a look at anti-crime needs in general with priorities suggested based on evidence of the State's development of its strategic plan. Another way is through a carefully developed and well-presented application for funding that complies with the State's criteria.

The outline that follows, based on the experience of many State-level Byrne administrators and others familiar with the program, offers a framework for these processes that should be applicable in any State.

At the Beginning

The very first step, whether testifying on crime reduction needs to help shape State strategy or applying for a specific grant, is to get in touch with the State's point of contact for Byrne funding (see Section 4) and to learn about current State priorities and procedures. This contact will be able to provide specific details on the State's strategy development process and local application process. Keep in mind that though they are related, these two processes are separate.

Contributing to the State's Strategic Plan

Framing issues of concern to the community is sometimes a challenge. But by contributing thoughtfully to development of State strategy, concerned residents can change attitudes, priorities, and funding emphasis. To do this, however, requires laying some groundwork.

First, get the facts. How does the State intend to develop its strategy? Who sits on the Drug and Violence Policy Board or its equivalent? The State is required to consult on the development of a strategic plan. Who reviews the plan

and its recommendations? How does the State board or agency gather information about needs and priorities? When and where are public hearings held? Can people submit written statements? Can they talk directly with board members?

Second, get grounding. Review last year's State strategy if possible. Look at needs identified, strategic priorities and directions chosen, and who is eligible to get grants, among other points. Examine the list of applications funded last year and compare these with needs that you know about within the State. Find out whether organizations in your community got grants and, if they did, talk with them. The Byrne point of contact can help you obtain this information.

Third, gather information that helps document the need for and benefits of community action in areas your group believes are important. Show how the concepts can meet both violence prevention and drug prevention needs. Be able to explain how those needs support or expand on the State's concerns.

Fourth, demonstrate support. Letters or statements of endorsement can help lend credibility to the positions presented. Local criminal justice executives, county and city officials, community organization heads, religious leaders, youth service groups, and education agencies are just some of the people to approach for such support.

Fifth, get on the hearing agenda for State priority setting and testify, if appropriate. Whether you speak in person or through a clear, concise, written statement, be sure that the message focuses on the needs of the State and its communities and on ways Byrne funds can help meet them—not on your specific project idea.

Applying for Funding

The following steps assume that applicants engage in a thoughtful process to define and plan the project itself. In general, the better planned a project is, the better the application will present itself.

Step One: Determine eligibility for Byrne funding and requirements for a successful application. Identify the current local recipients of Byrne funds. Learn the process. Some States provide information and orientation sessions to educate potential applicants about the process. Get up-to-date information so that you can determine whether your agency is eligible for funding under current State requirements.

Though States differ in their procedures, several application requirements are common:

 Data that demonstrate the need to address drug and violent crime problems in the applicant community.

- Description of current efforts to address these problems and an explanation of how Federal funds will enhance current efforts.
- Explanation of population and geographic area to be served.
- Commitment of full-time staff to address the problem.
- Statement specifying extent and kinds of cooperation among agencies involved in the program (along with letters of commitment, if required).
- Description of anticipated impact of the project on drug and violent crime problems.
- Demonstration of a plan and the ability to measure effectiveness of the project.

Step Two: Line up resources. Before applying for funds, it is wise to gather (or at least line up) the diverse resources the project will need. These include evidence of community support for your project, such as statements from people in key positions who would be likely to lend support. These contacts may include local law enforcement officials, local and/or national organizations whose programs support or complement your own, leaders from your community (for example, municipal, education, business, religious, civic), State associations and agencies, and members of the group that develops State strategy. Remember to secure

commitment for the required 25-percent cash "match," or contributions toward project costs.

Step Three: Apply for Byrne funds. Once the State issues its rules, decide whether the organization is eligible and the project meets basic criteria. If so, proceed. The application should convey a clear, concise picture of what the program may have already achieved and what it expects to accomplish. There are at least seven basic kinds of information to include in almost any proposal:

- Background and needs.
- Policy issues addressed.
- Project goals and objectives.
- Extent to which State strategy is furthered by the project.
- Key tasks (and time line if appropriate).
- Deliverable products/ services (or expected accomplishments).
- Anticipated outcomes and benefits.
- Budget for the project.
- Evaluation plans.

The State may have specific organizing or formatting requirements; it may use terms different from those used here. Be sure to follow the State's specific application instructions and to check with the State agency if there are questions.

Weigh the application thoughtfully and objectively against the State's requirements. Be sure that the project's relationship to State priorities and the strategic plan is clear. It is helpful to allow time before the submission deadline for a review by a knowledgeable person not immediately involved in the project, someone who can provide a candid, constructive critique.

Document clearly and explicitly how the proposed project will address the State's priorities as described in its 3-year plan. Demonstrating novel but promising approaches as well as clearly responding to documented local needs can strengthen the application.

If possible, talk to one or two groups who won Byrne support in past years. They may be able to offer helpful tips. Also seek to show how the proposal fits with a more strategic approach by the community to its drug and violence problems.

Section Three Some Other Federal Sources of Funding for Community-Based Crime Reduction and Prevention

This section describes a number of Federal resources other than Byrne funds that may be used to support community efforts to reduce crime—projects that directly attack crime and the fear of crime. These include drug prevention, school-based, public housing, child protec-

tion, and community development funding sources.

A number of Federal programs not described here can also help prevent crime, though less directly. For example, Head Start eventually results in fewer dropouts and less crime. Job Corps and similar programs provide skills training and enhance employment prospects for atrisk youth, which reduces unemployment, one factor linked with increases in crime. Aid to victims of crime can reduce their risks of repeat victimization.

Local Law Enforcement Block Grants

Created pursuant to the Omnibus Fiscal Year 1996 Appropriations Act, the Local Law Enforcement Block Grants Program is also operated by BJA. This program provides funds to local units of government to support projects that reduce crime and enhance public safety.

There are seven purpose areas in which these funds can be spent:

- Hiring and training new law enforcement officers and support personnel; paying overtime; and securing needed technology and equipment for law enforcement.
- Improving security in and around schools and around

- other facilities that local authorities consider a special risk for incidents of crime.
- Establishing or supporting drug courts.
- Enhancing adjudication of cases involving violent offenders.
- Establishing multijurisdictional task forces that work with Federal law enforcement agencies.
- Establishing crime preventtion programs that involve police-community partnerships.
- Defraying the cost of indemnification insurance for law enforcement officers. The program requires a 10-percent cash match by the local jurisdiction, contains some prohibitions on the use of funds, and requires public input, in the form of at least one public hearing, on the use of the funds.

An advisory board that includes representatives of key criminal justice agencies as well as crime and/or drug prevention representation from the community makes non-binding recommendations on how the funds should be spent.

The BJA Clearinghouse (1-800-688-4252) can provide further information on this program as well as other possible funding opportunities from BJA.

Drug-Free Schools and Communities

The Drug-Free Schools and Communities initiative includes a significant formula grant program that aids local drug and crime prevention efforts. Its basis is the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988, which was further amended by the Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act Amendment of 1989 and the Crime Control Act of 1990.

This program allocates funds to States through a formula that takes into account schoolage population and funding under Chapter I of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act. Each State's allocation is divided between the State educational agency (SEA) and the Office of the Governor. The SEA must allot at least 90 percent of the funds it receives to local educational agencies to improve anti-drug abuse education, prevention, early intervention, and rehabilitation referral programs. The Governor's Office provides financial support for anti-drug abuse efforts to parent groups, community-based organizations, and other public or private nonprofit entities. At least 42.5 percent of the Governor's Office funds must be used for programs for at-risk vouth.

For more information on the Drug-Free Schools and Communities initiative and to find out whether and how you

qualify for funding, contact the Governor's Office or the SEA. Both are listed in Section 4.

Public Housing Anti-Drug and Anti-Violence Funding

Many public housing developments need crime and drug reduction. Recognizing this, Congress has established grants to public housing authorities (PHAs) to help make these communities safe from drugs and to develop the structures, skills, connections, and coordination that can help create and sustain a better community, more resistant to crime. These programs are administered by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

These grants require demonstrable cooperation between local public housing agencies and community groups. The PHAs can contract for crime prevention and substance abuse prevention, among other services, with local agencies and organizations.

A related HUD program makes direct grants to pay for youth sports programs; it requires a 50-percent cash match from the applicant PHA. HUD can sometimes provide

technical assistance to help the applicant become better prepared to submit an application and to develop substantive crime prevention programming and skills.

HUD's Office of Drug-Free Neighborhoods administers these programs. For more information, call your local PHA or the HUD Regional Office that serves your State. These are listed in Section 4.

Community Development Block Grants

Community Development Block Grants (CDBGs) can be used for some local crime prevention efforts. Though the great majority of these moneys aid in more general economic development activities, funds can be spent for activities intended to result in decent housing in suitable living environments and/or improved community facilities and services.

Some States and localities have used CDBG moneys to improve neighborhood security or foster social and civic changes that help the community resist crime. The City of Oakland, California, working with the Oakland Community

Organization, combined CDBG and other funds to target crime hot spots, enforce city health and safety codes, and work in partnership with public utilities to stop drug dealing.

HUD administers the Community Development Block Grants. Among the activities eligible for funding are housing code enforcement, city planning and related studies, certain social service program funding, and improvement or installation of public works.

Direct grants are generally available only to larger cities and urban counties; smaller communities may qualify under the State's allowed setaside of its CDBG allocation. To determine whether your organization is eligible, call your city or county government or the State prevention contact for the programs of HUD (see the list in Section 4). If your group is not eligible, find out what groups in your community are getting these funds and look into forming a partnership. The **HUD Drug Information &** Strategy Clearinghouse (1-800-578-3472) has information on other forms of assistance available through this Federal department.

Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention

Many youth-oriented crime prevention efforts can be funded under State formula grants from the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act of 1974, as amended by laws in 1977, 1980, 1984, 1988, and 1992.

One section of the Act authorizes grants to States and units of general local governments to assist them in planning, establishing, operating, coordinating, and evaluating juvenile justice projects, either directly or through grants and contracts with public and private agencies. Their purpose is to develop more effective education, training, research, prevention, diversion, treatment, and rehabilitation programs to reduce delinquency and improve the juvenile justice system.

Most of these funds go to local juvenile justice agencies to deal with issues such as juvenile correctional facilities, serious and violent offenders, and separation of juvenile and adult correctional facilities, but a number of crime prevention activities that engage youth or protect them from victimization have also been funded. In Rhode Island, for example, juvenile justice formula grant funds helped the State lawrelated education organization to implement the "Teens, Crime, and the Community"

crime prevention education and action curriculum in junior high and middle schools around the State.

An important connection to juvenile justice funding in your State is the State Advisory Group (SAG), a council of citizens and experts appointed by the Governor to advise on State juvenile justice policy and projects. For more information, or to identify the State's SAG representative, contact your State agency for juvenile justice.

Youth Gang Drug Prevention Program

Gang activity has been an issue of growing concern in many communities. The Federal Government offers a number of resources for local gang prevention efforts. The 1988 Anti-Drug Abuse Act authorized the Administration on Children, Youth and Families of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) to award grants for drug education and prevention programs relating to youth gangs. The Family and Youth Services Bureau (FYSB) of that department developed the Youth Gang Drug Prevention Program to support State and local efforts to respond to the youth gang problem. The program seeks to build understanding of why youth become involved in gangs; assess effective

measures for preventing further recruitment and involvement of at-risk youth in gang activities; and contribute to the development of successful, replicable models to prevent youth involvement in gangs and illegal drug activities.

The program has focused on a holistic approach, including support for families of at-risk youth, the development of intervention strategies for intergenerational gang families, and promotion of cooperative ventures among youth service providers. Any public agency (State, county, city, or housing authority, for instance) or nonprofit private agency or organization is eligible to apply. FYSB also provides technical assistance and evaluates programs.

Other Federal programs, funded primarily through discretionary grants, have been used for local gang prevention initiatives. Agencies with available funds have, at various times, included the Office of Juvenile Justice and **Delinquency Prevention** (OJJDP), BJA, HUD, and the Center for Substance Abuse Prevention (CSAP). For more information, contact the State government representative for HHS funding sources, listed in the Appendix.

Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention

Research has documented links between abuse of children and their later problems, including delinquency, crime, and substance abuse. Thus, child abuse prevention offers double rewards: The immediate abuse is prevented and the risk of the victim later engaging in criminal behavior is reduced significantly.

Federal law and funding designed specifically to encourage child welfare services and reduce abuse date from 1935. The Social Security Act is still the basis for many programs that provide important services relevant to families in which child abuse and neglect have occurred.

In 1974, Congress enacted the Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act (Public Law 93-247), which created the National Center on Child Abuse and Neglect (NCCAN) in HHS.

NCCAN provides States with four major kinds of funding that are of interest to local applicants. States that meet Federal guidelines receive grants to support startup activities. NCCAN also offers funds to States that have programs or procedures in their child protection systems that enable them to respond to reports of medical neglect.

Under the Children's Justice and Assistance Act of 1986, NCCAN provides grants to assist States in developing, establishing, and operating programs designed to improve handling of child abuse cases, especially those involving sexual abuse. NCCAN also provides challenge grants to States to encourage the establishment of trust funds or other funding mechanisms to provide ongoing support for child abuse prevention activities.

Legislatively Authorized Program Purposes

Both the discretionary and the formula grant funds may be used to implement programs that carry out any of the 26 following legislatively authorized purposes:

- 1. Demand reduction education programs in which law enforcement officers participate.
- 2. Multijurisdictional task force programs that integrate Federal, State, and local drug law enforcement agencies and prosecutors for the purpose of enhancing interagency coordination and intelligence and facilitating multijurisdictional investigations.
- 3. Programs that target the domestic sources of controlled and illegal substances, such as precursor chemicals, diverted pharmaceuticals, clandestine laboratories, and cannabis cultivations.
- 4. Community and neighborhood programs that assist citizens in preventing and controlling crime, including special programs that address the problems of crimes committed against the elderly and special programs for rural jurisdictions.
- 5. Programs that disrupt illicit commerce in stolen goods and property.
- 6. Programs that improve the investigation and prosecution of white-collar crime, organized crime, public corruption crime, and fraud against the Government, with priority attention to cases involving drug-related official corruption.
- 7. a. Programs that improve the operational effectiveness of law enforcement through the use of crime analysis techniques, street sales enforcement, schoolyard violator programs, and gang-related and low-income housing drug control programs.
- **b.** Programs to develop and implement anti-terrorism plans for deep draft ports, international airports, and other important facilities.
- 8. Career criminal prosecution programs, including the development of proposed model drug control legislation.
- 9. Financial investigative programs that target the identification of money laundering operations and assets obtained through illegal drug trafficking, including the development of proposed model legislation, financial investigative training, and financial information-sharing systems.
- 10. Programs that improve the operational effectiveness of the court process by expanding prosecutorial, defender, and judicial resources and implementing court delay reduction programs.
- 11. Programs designed to provide additional public correctional resources and to improve the corrections system, including treatment in prisons and jails, intensive supervision programs, and long-range corrections and sentencing strategies.
- 12. Prison industry projects designed to place inmates in a realistic working and training environment that will enable them to acquire marketable skills and to make financial payments for restitution to their victims, for support of their own families, and for support of themselves in the institution.

- 13. Programs that identify and meet the treatment needs of adult and juvenile drug-dependent and alcohol-dependent offenders.
- 14. Programs that provide assistance to jurors and witnesses and assistance (other than compensation) to victims of crime.
- 15. a. Programs that improve drug control technology, such as pretrial drug testing programs; programs that provide for the identification, assessment, referral to treatment, case management, and monitoring of drug-dependent offenders; and programs that provide enhancement of State and local forensic laboratories.
- b. Criminal justice information systems that assist law enforcement, prosecution, courts, and corrections organizations (including automated fingerprint identification systems).
- 16. Innovative programs that demonstrate new and different approaches to enforcement, prosecution, and adjudication of drug offenses and other serious crimes.
- 17. Programs that address the problems of drug trafficking and the illegal manufacture of controlled substances in public housing.
- 18. Programs that improve the criminal and juvenile justice system's response to domestic and family violence, including spouse abuse, child abuse, and abuse of the elderly.
- 19. Drug control evaluation programs that State and local units of government may utilize to evaluate programs and projects directed at State drug control activities.
- 20. Programs that provide alternatives to detention, jail, and prison for persons who pose no danger to the community.
- 21. Programs in which the primary goal is to strengthen urban enforcement and prosecution efforts targeted at street drug sales.
- 22. Programs for the prosecution of driving-while-intoxicated charges and the enforcement of other laws relating to alcohol use and the operation of motor vehicles.
- 23. Programs that address the need for effective bindover systems for the prosecution of violent 16- and 17-year-old juveniles in courts with jurisdiction over adults for certain violent crimes.
- 24. Law enforcement and prevention programs that relate to gangs or to youth who are involved in or are at risk of involvement in gangs.
- 25. Programs that develop or improve forensic laboratory capabilities to analyze DNA for identification purposes.
- 26. Programs that assist States in the litigation processing of death penalty, Federal habeas corpus petitions.


