

INTRODUCTION

The violence within the American domicile has been recognized for decades by elements of government and society with little done to correct the problem. Only recently has this phenomenon begun to receive the attention it deserves. In an effort to understand, identify and treat the incidents of abuse occurring within the home, the State of New Jersey, through its legislature, has provided the means to gain a meaningful insight into this issue.

In 1982, the Domestic Violence Act was instituted to protect battered victims and study the complex problems that spark such aggressive behavior. This legislation also provided the opportunity to identify the causes of violence in the home and put forth a more comprehensive effort to combat the crime of Domestic Violence.

Improvements since the implementation of the Domestic Violence Act are continuing; serious concern has been displayed within many municipal and county agencies whereby various committees and working groups have been formed to help battle this important problem. Revised investigation and reporting procedures by the police; improved processing of domestic complaints by the courts; mandatory in-service training for police and court personnel have all enabled the victim to come forward and implement the constitutional rights granted to all Americans.

The following pages of narrative and graphics in this chapter are the result of gathered data displaying the complexities of domestic violence found within the State of New Jersey. As stated in the following pages, reported domestic violence acts increased seven percent over 1993. It is through analysis of this data that, hopefully the keys to preventing future violence can be found.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE STATISTICAL SUMMARY

Highlights of the 1994 domestic violence statistics are listed below:

- There were 70,991 domestic violence offenses reported by the police in 1994, a 7% increase compared to the 66,248 reported in 1993.
- Murders decreased 22% in 1994 (42) when compared to 1993 (54).
- Assaults accounted for 55% (39,047) of the reported offenses in 1994.
- The total arrests for 1994 (25,364) increased 5% over 1993 (24,115).
- Arrests were made in 36% (25,364) of the offenses reported for 1994.
- The most frequent day of domestic violence occurrences was Sunday (12,976).
- For the twelfth consecutive year, the most frequent hours of domestic violence incidents were between 8:00 p.m. and midnight, when 30% (21,506) of the offenses were reported.
- Children were involved or present during 49% of all domestic violence offenses occurring in 1994. Specifically, 8% (5,771) were involved and 41% (29,140) were present.
- Wives were the victims in 29% (20,745) and ex-wives were the victims in 3% (2,199) of the reported domestic violence offenses in 1994. Overall, females were victims in 82% (58,072) of all domestic violence offenses.
- The number of domestic violence complaints that had prior court orders issued against the offender increased from 15,631 in 1993 to 17,007 in 1994. This is an increase of 9%.
- Alcohol and/or drugs were involved in 39% (27,672) of the reported offenses occurring in 1994. Alcohol involvement alone accounted for 34% (23,794) of the total domestic violence offenses reported.
- Persons age 60 or over were victims in 3% (2,251) of all reported domestic violence offenses that occurred in 1994.
- Domestic Violence does not occur at a regular frequency, but when viewed as a ratio of its occurrence to a fixed time interval, one act of domestic violence would occur every seven (7) minutes and twenty-four (24) seconds.

- Arrests for domestic violence offenses increased (5%), and reflected the highest number of arrests since the inception of the Domestic Violence Program.
- The violent crimes of homicide (42), aggravated assault (5,828) and sexual assault (118) accounted for eight (8) percent of reported domestic violence offenses (70,991).
- * Domestic Violence offenses of Terroristic Threats and Criminal Trespass were first reported during 1992.

- Forty-eight percent (34,077) of all domestic violence complaints resulted in injury. This is less than one-half of one percent decrease when compared to the 34,226 that occurred in 1993.
- Of all the domestic violence offenses involving weapons (38,658), hands, fists, feet, etc. were used in 88%(33,834) of these offenses.
- Domestic violence offenses involving a gun decreased 11%, from 462 in 1993 to 410 in 1994.
- There were 3,177 serious injuries reported in 1994, a 2% decrease when compared to the 3,258 reported in 1993.




- Assaults accounted for 39% (888) of all domestic violence offenses for victims 60 years of age or over.
- Females, 60 years of age or over, were the victims in 67% (1,493) of the 2,251 elderly abuse offenses.
- Persons age 60 or over were the victims in 3% (2,251) of all the reported domestic violence offenses during this period.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE OFFENSES BY TIME OF DAY 1993/1994




• During 1994 thirty percent (21,506) of the reported Domestic Violence offenses occurred between 8:00 p.m. and 12 Midnight.

- The most frequent day of occurrence for Domestic Violence during 1994 was Sunday.
- During 1994, thirty-six percent (25,725) of the reported Domestic Violence offenses occurred during the weekend (SATURDAY and SUNDAY).

- In 1994, the highest number of Domestic Violence offenses occured during the months of July and August.
- During 1994, the month with the lowest number of reported Domestic Violence offenses was February.
