

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Uniform Crime Reporting

The National Uniform Crime Reports Program (UCR), under the direction of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), is the outgrowth of a need for a national and uniform compilation of law enforcement statistics. The need for such statistics was recognized more than forty years ago when, in 1930, the Committee on Uniform Crime Records of the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) solicited such records from law enforcement agencies throughout the country, based on uniform classification and procedures. In that same year, the IACP requested that the FBI be the national clearinghouse, a role the FBI then assumed and maintains today.

The Committee of Uniform Crime Reports of the International Association of Chiefs of Police continues to serve in an advisory capacity to the FBI in the operation of the program. Also, in 1966, the National Sheriff's Association (NSA) established a Committee on Uniform Crime Records to serve in an advisory capacity to the NSA membership and the National Uniform Crime Reporting Program while actively encouraging sheriffs throughout the country to participate in the program.

The President's Commission on Law Enforcement and the Administration of Justice pointed out in the 1967 report, The Challenge of Crime in a Free Society, that "The receipt and analysis of crime statistics is a proper responsibility of the state. A state program should include the receipt and analysis of crime reports, mandatorily submitted by local departments, and submission of statistics to the FBI...modern technology can make many specific contributions to criminal justice administration. The most significant (contribution) will come from the use of computers to collect and analyze the masses of data the system needs to understand the crime control process."

In the last several years, the FBI has been actively assisting individual states in the development of local statewide law enforcement statistics programs compatable with the national program. These statistical programs have been given impetus by the development of statewide computerized law enforcement information systems, of which Uniform Crime Reports are an essential part. Nebraska was one of the early states to become involved in developing its own computerized program for the benefit of local law enforcement agencies and the national system.

Nebraska Uniform Crime Reporting

The Nebraska Uniform Crime Reporting Program involves the compilation, classification, and analysis of crime statistics reported by police agencies in the state pursuant to guides and regulations prescribed by law.

The Nebraska Legislature, in establishing the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice, authorized it to collect and record criminal statistics on a statewide basis. Since the FBI was encouraging states to have a UCR program, the Commission began developing their UCR program in the early months of 1970. In the fall of 1970 the Commission received the necessary funds for the UCR program through a 60/40 match discretionary grant from the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration (LEAA).

Law enforcement agencies began dual reporting to both the Crime Commission and the FBI in September of 1970. On January 1, 1971, the FBI eliminated the direct collection of reports from the police agencies in Nebraska and began receiving the reports directly from the Commission on magnetic tapes.

The Commission requires reports from the State Patrol, all sheriffs' departments and all police departments of municipalities of 1,000 population and over. Any municipality under 1,000 population may report at their option. In 1973, 212 agencies were required to report and of these ten reported less than six months or not at all. Five sheriffs' departments reported less than half a year.

Uniform Crime Classification

Since criminal statutes differ throughout the nation, the FBI adopted a Uniform Crime Classification for the reporting of offenses and arrests. The following is the Uniform Crime Classification.

Part I (Index) Offenses

- (1) Homicide (a) Murder any unlawful killing of a human being in which the element of malice aforethought was present in the murder. Manslaughter any unlawful killing of a human being without the element of malice aforethought. (b) Death by Negligence any death that occurs because of the negligence of some person other than the victim and that is not in the commission of an unlawful act.
- (2) Rape (a) Rape by Force the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will, but excluding statutory rape and other sex offenses. (b) Assault to Rape all assaults and attempts to rape.
- (3) Robbery the felonious and forcible taking of the property of another against his will by violence or by putting him in fear. Robbery differs from larceny in that it is aggravated by the element of force.
 - (a) Armed Robbery-Any Weapon when any object is so employed as to constitute force or the threat of force, it will be considered a weapon. This would include firearms, knives, clubs, brass knuckles, blackjacks, broken bottles, acid, explosives, etc. Cases involving possible pretended weapons or cases involving weapons not seen by the victim but which the robber claims to have with him should be counted in this category.

- (b) Strong Arm-No Weapon includes muggings and similar offenses when no weapon is used but strong-arm tactics are employed to deprive the victim of his property. This is limited to hands, arms, fists, feet etc. As in armed robbery, all attempts are included.
- (4) Assault an attempt or offer, with unlawful force or violence, to do physical injury to another. General Rule all assaults will be classified in the following categories, excluding assaults with intent to rob or rape.
 - (a) Gun all assaults and attempted assaults involving the use of any type of firearm. This includes revolvers, automatic pistols, shotguns, zip guns, rifles, pellet guns, etc.
 - (b) Knife or Cutting Instrument all assaults and attempted assaults involving the use of cutting or stabbing objects such as knives, razors, hatechets, axes, cleavers, scissors, glass, broken bottles, daggers, ice picks, etc.
 - (c) Other Dangerous Weapon assaults or attempted assaults when any object other than a gun, knife or cutting instrument is used. This includes clubs, bricks, jack handles, bottles, explosives, acid, lye, poison, scalding water and cases of attempted drownings, burnings etc.
 - (d) Hands, Fists, Feet Etc. (Felony) any assaults with hands, fists, feet etc. which could result in a felony conviction. In order to be classified as a felony, the victim must suffer great bodily harm.
- (5) Burglary any unlawful entry or attempted forcible entry of any structure to commit a felony or larceny. For Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, burglary with larceny is classified and scored only as burglary, the larceny is excluded. Breaking and entering of a motor vehicle is classified as larceny.
 - (a) Forcible Entry all offenses where force of any kind is used to unlawfully enter a locked structure to commit a felony or with intent to steal something. This includes entry by use of a master key, celluloid or other device that leaves no outward mark but is used to open a lock. Concealment inside a building followed by breaking out of the structure should also be scored here.
 - (b) Unlawful Entry-No Force any unlawful entry when you fail to discover any evidence of forcible entry.
 - (c) Attempted Forcible Entry when determined that forcible entry has been attempted.
- (6) Larceny-Theft (Except Auto Theft) the unlawful taking of the property of another with intent to deprive him of ownership. This involves all larcenies and thefts resulting from pocket picking, purse snatching, shoplifting, larceny from auto, larceny of auto parts and accessories, bicycle theft, larceny from buildings and larceny from any coin-operated machines. Any theft that is not a robbery or any theft that does not

- result from a breaking and entering will be scored here. Embezzlements, unlawful conversions, larceny by bailee, frauds or bad check cases are excluded.
- (7) Auto Theft larceny or attempted larceny of automobiles. All thefts and attempted thefts of motor vehicles are included. This includes all vehicles which can be registered as a motor vehicle in this state. Exclude those incidents in which the alleged offender had lawful access to the vehicle as in a family situation or the unauthorized use by others having lawful access to the vehicle such as chauffeur, employee, etc.

Part II Offenses

- Other Assaults (Misdemeanor) consists of all assaults and attempted assaults which are simple or minor in nature.
- (9) Arson include all arrests for violations of state law and municipal ordinances relating to arson and attempted arson.
- (10) Forgery and Counterfeiting all offenses dealing with the making, altering, uttering or possessing with intent to defraud anything false in the semblance of that which is true.
- (11) Fraud fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretense. Includes bad checks, confidence games, etc.
- Embezzlement the misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody or control.
- (13) Stolen Property all offenses of buying, receiving, possessing or concealing stolen property as well as all attempts to commit any of these offenses.
- Vandalism-Destruction of Property all willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement or defacement of any public or private property, real or personal, without the consent of the owner or person having custody or control by cutting, tearing, breaking, marking, painting, drawing, covering with filth or any other such means as may be specified by law or ordinance.
- Weapons includes violations of weapons laws such as manufacture, sale or possession of deadly weapons; carrying deadly weapons; furnishing deadly weapons to minors; aliens possessing deadly weapons, and all attempts to commit any of the above offenses.
- Prostitution and Commercialized Vice include in this class the sex offenses of a commercialized nature such as prostitution; keeping bawdy house, disorderly house or house of ill repute; pandering, procuring, transporting or detaining women for immoral purposes, etc. and all attempts to commit any of the above.

- (17) Sex Offenses includes all sex offenses other than forcible rape. prostitution and commercialized vice. This encompasses offenses against chastity, common decency, morals and the like such as adultery and fornication, buggery, incest, indecent exposure, sodomy, carnal abuse (no force) and all attempts to commit any of the above.
- Narcotic Drug Laws statistics for these arrests are requested on the basis of the narcotics used. This includes all arrests for the violation of state and local ordinances, specifically those relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing and making of narcotic drugs. Four divisions of narcotic drugs are recognized. These are (a) opium and cocaine and their derivatives (morphine, heroin, codeine), (b) marijuana, (c) synthetic narcotics which can cause true addiction (demerol, methadones) and (d) other dangerous nonnarcotic drugs (barbituates, benzedrine).
- Gambling includes all charges relating to promoting, permitting or engaging in gambling. This classification is broken into three divisions: (a) bookmaking (horse and sport book), (b) numbers and lottery and (c) all other gambling.
- Offenses Against Family and Children include here all charges of nonsupport, neglect or abuse of family and children such as desertion, abandonment or nonsupport, neglect or abuse of child, or nonpayment of alimony.
- (21) Driving Under the Influence limited to driving or operating any vehicle while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotic drugs.
- Liquor Laws with the exception of drunkenness and driving under the influence, all state or local liquor law violations are placed in this class. Federal violations are not included. Include manufacturing, selling, transporting, furnishing as in maintaing unlawful drinking places, bootlegging, operating a still, furnishing liquor to a minor and using vehicle for illegal transportation of liquor.
- Drunkenness-Intoxication include in this class all offenses of drunkenness or intoxication with the exception of driving under the influence. This generally encompasses drunk and disorderly behavior and public intoxication.
- Disorderly Conduct-Disturbing the Peace include all disorderly persons who can not be classified under offenses 1 through 23 or under offense 25.
- (25) Vagrancy include arrests for failure of an individual to give a good account of himself, begging, loitering, etc.
- All Other Offenses include all violations of state and local laws not otherwise classified.
- Suspicion limited to suspicion arrests when the persons arrested are released by the police.

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- (28) Curfew and Loitering Law Violations (Juveniles) all arrests made for violations of local curfew or loitering ordinances.
- (29) Runaways (Juveniles) limited to juveniles taken into custody who have run away from the reporting jurisdiction.

Crime in Nebraska

Much has been said in regard to crime statistics - the most general being crime statistics do not give a true picture of crime. Many crimes are never detected and, therefore, not reported. A store owner may not realize an item has been shoplifted and, therefore, cannot report it. Also, many crimes are never reported to the police - gambling, liquor and drug violations, prostitution - especially when the victim is one of the participants. Other types of crime also go unreported. According to a survey of 10,000 households undertaken by the National Opinion Research Center of the University of Chicago, the police were not notified in 90 percent of consumer fraud cases, in 63 percent of larcenies under \$50, and in 35 percent of robberies. People did not notify the police because they felt the matter was private, they did not want to harm the offender, or because they thought the police could not be effective or would not want to be bothered.

An increase in crime does not necessarily mean an <u>actual</u> increase. The reporting procedures of an agency may have improved or been changed. Also, as police become more professionalized and more efficient, more crimes may be reported to them. Also, campaigns in a city or neighborhood, such as anti-burglary programs, could account for more burglaries being detected and reported.

While an area may show no index crimes, they may very well have another type of specific crime problem - for instance vandalism. Vandalism is not counted as an index offense and, therefore, the only thing which can be reported are the arrests made for vandalism. A person may have suffered a loss of \$50 in a robbery and also a loss of several thousands of dollars due to vandalism done to his place of business.

We are only cautioning whoever reads this report not to take the crime statistics as the absolute fact but rather as an estimate of crime in Nebraska, which is more than we had before the UCR program was initiated.

Crime Factors

Statistics gathered under the Nebraska UCR program are police statistics. The agencies report the offense and arrest data according to the Uniform Crime Classification and not according to state statute or city ordinance. The disposition data is police agency disposition data rather then court disposition or county attorney disposition. Reported Part I Offenses and Arrests are related to municipality and county in which they occur, rather than to the agency which may investigate, arrest or otherwise dispose of the case. The clearance, in every case, is attributed to the muncipality in which the offense occurred, even though the arresting agency may not be the department originally reporting the offense.

The factors which influence crime rates are dependent upon many characteristics of the community and, therefore, when attempting to interpret the crime statistics presented herein, one should be aware of the social structure and the factors that lead to or cause criminal behavior.

Awareness of the presence of certain crime factors, which may influence the resulting volume and type of statistics presented, is necessary if fair and equitable conclusions are to be drawn. These crime influencing factors are present, to some degree, in every community and their presence affects, in varying degrees, the crime experience of that community. Attempts at comparison of crime figures between communities should not be made without first considering the individual factors present in each community.

The police are limited in their role to the suppression and detection of crime. As stated by the President's Commission on Law Enforcement and Administration of Criminal Justice in their report The Challenge of Crime in a Free Society (1967-Page 92): "But the fact that the police deal daily with crime does not mean that they have unlimited power to prevent it, or reduce it, or deter it. The police did not create and cannot resolve the social conditions that stimulate crime. They did not start and cannot stop the convulsive social changes that are taking place in America. They do not enact the laws that they are required to enforce, nor do they dispose of the criminals they arrest. The police are only one part of the government; and the government is only one part of society. Insofar as crime is a social phenomenon, crime prevention is the responsibility of every part of society. The criminal process is limited to case-by-case operations, one criminal or one crime at a time." Set forth below are some of the conditions which will, by type and volume, affect the crime that occurs from place to place:

Density and size of the community population and the metropolitan area of which it is a part.

Composition of the population with reference particularly to age, sex and race.

Economic status of the population.

Relative stability of population, including commuters, seasonal, and other transient types.

Climate, including seasonal weather conditions.

Educational, recreational, and religious characteristics.

Standards governing appointments to the police force.

Policies of the prosecuting officials and the courts.

Attitude of the public towards law enforcement problems.

The administrative and investigative efficiency of the local law enforcement agency, including the degree of adherence to crime reporting standards.

Statistics used in this section are indicative of those agencies that reported all 12 months of both 1973 and 1972.

Offense data

During calendar year 1973, 41,655 Crime Index Offenses were reported to law enforcement agencies in Nebraska. This constituted a 7.8 percent increase over 1972 reports.

A total of 1,802 crimes against persons (murder, manslaughter, forcible rape and felony assault) were reported in 1973 which represents a 0.5 percent total Crime Index Offenses. 84 percent of the crimes against persons were

A total of 39,853 crimes against property were reported during 1973, an 8.2 percent increase over 1972. Crimes against property accounted for 95.7 percent of the total Index Offenses. Larceny accounted for 63 percent of the crimes against property with Burglary the next highest.

Rate

During 1973 there were 2,807.3 Index Offenses reported per 100,000 population. This represented a 7.8 percent increase over 2,603.7 per 100,000 in

The rate for crimes against persons was 121.4 per 100,000 population during 1973. Within this group felony assault had the hightest rate at 101.6 per ,

Crimes against property had a rate of 2,685.9 per 100,000 population. Larceny had the hightest rate at 1,687.2 per 100,000.

Value of Property Stolen







Index offenses

The following section contains data on the seven Index Offenses: Murder, Manslaughter, Forcible Rape, Robbery, Felony Assault, Burglary, Larceny and Auto Theft. The data contains estimates for those agencies that reported only 1-6 months out of the year along with those agencies that reported all 12 months. Those agencies that reported less than half a year are not included.

As of January 1, 1973, larcenies under \$50 in value were included in the Crime Index. In the individual analysis of Larceny, larcenies under \$50 are not included in the 1972 analysis.

Any "By Month" analysis is indicative of only those agencies that reported all 12 months of 1973.

Murder-Manslaughter

Murder is defined as the unlawful killing of a human being in which the element of malice aforethought was present. Manslaughter is defined as any unlawful killing of a human being without the element of malice aforethought. Suicides, accidental deaths and justifiable or excusable homicides are excluded.

1972 Summary Analysis

A total of 44 murders were reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska in 1972.

Murder, manslaughters accounted for 2.3 percent of all crimes against persons and two-tenths of one percent of all Index Offenses.

The murder rate per 100,000 population was 3.0.

Almost 55 percent of the murders occurred in the City of Omaha.

59.1 percent of the victims were White, 31.8 percent were Negro, 6.8 percent were Indian and the other races accounted for 2.3 percent. 81.8 percent of the victims were male. 29.5 Percent of the victims were between the ages of 18 and 29.

52.2 percent of the perpetrators were males. In one case the perpetrator was not known.

Handguns were used in 61.3 percent of the murder and manslaughter cases. Shotguns were used in 6.8 percent, knives in 13.6 percent, personal weapons in 11.4 percent and other weapons in 4.6 percent. In one instance the weapon was unknown

65.9 percent of the murders were committed by a relative or acquaintance of the victim.

75 percent of the murder, manslaughter cases were cleared. 12 percent of the clearances involved juveniles only.

62.8 percent of the persons arrested for murder were White, 32.6 were Negro, 2.3 were Indian and 2.3 were of other races.

The age group accounting for the highest percent of persons arrested for murder, 14.0, occurred in the 25-29 age group. Males accounted for 72.1 percent of all persons arrested for murder.

1973 Summary Analysis

A total of 64 murders were reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska in 1973.

Murder, manslaughter accounted for 3.4 percent of all crimes against persons and two-tenths of one percent of all Index Offenses.

The murder rate per 100,000 population was 4.3.

57.8 percent of all the murders occurred in the City of Omaha.

51.6 percent of the victims were White, 37.5 percent were Negro, 6.3 percent were Indian and other races accounted for 1.6 percent. 68.8 percent of the victims were male. 26.6 percent of the victims were between the ages of 18 and 29.

68.8 percent of the perpetrators were males. In seven cases the perpetrator was not known.

Handguns were used in 32.8 percent of the murder, manslaughter cases. Shotguns were used in 28.1 percent, knives in 17.2 percent, personal weapons in 9.4 percent and other weapons in 7.8 percent. In 4.7 cases the weapon was unknown.


39.1 percent of the murders involved husbands, wives, children and girl friends and boy friends. 12.5 percent of the murders occurred during the course of robberies and burglaries.


68.8 percent of the murder, manslaughter cases were cleared. 6.3 percent of the clearances involved juveniles only.


45.5 percent of the persons arrested for murder were White, 45.5 percent were Negro, 7.5 percent were Indian and 1.9 were of other races.

The age group accounting for the highest percent of persons arrested for murder, 20.8 percent, occurred in the 25-29 age group. Males accounted for 73.6 percent of all persons arrested for murder.

Analysis of Murder by month - 1973








Analysis of Murder by age, sex and race of victim – 1973

Forcible rape is the carnal knowledge of a female forcible and against her will. For the purpose of Uniform Crime Reporting rape is divided into two categories: (1) rape by force and (2) attempt or assault to rape. Statutory rape and other sex offenses are excluded here.

1972 Summary Analysis

A total of 215 forcible rapes (attempts included) were reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska in 1972. 174 were rapes by force and 41 were attempts to rape.

Forcible rapes accounted for 11.7 percent of all crimes against persons and 0.8 percent of the total Index Offenses.

The forcible rape rate for 1972 amounted to 14.5 rapes per 100,000 population.

58.2 percent of all rapes reported occurred in the City

Law enforcement agencies were able to clear 96 percent of the rapes by force and 73 percent of the attempts to rape.

65.9 percent of the reported arrests for forcible rape during 1972 were of persons under the age of 25.

63.7 percent of all persons arrested for forcible rape were White, 27.9 percent were Negro, 7.3 percent were Indian and 1.1 were of other races.

1973 Summary Analysis

A total of 251 forcible rapes (attempts included) were reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska in 1973. 190 were rapes by force and 61 were attempts to rape.

Forcible rapes accounted for 13.3 percent of all crimes against persons and 0.6 percent of the total Index Offenses.





59.7 percent of all persons arrested for forcible rape were White, 35.7 percent were Negro, 3.1 percent were Indian and 1.6 were of other races.





Analysis of Rape by type

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Robbery

Robbery is the felonious and forcible taking of the property of another against his will by violence or by putting him in fear. Robbery is divided into two categories: (1) Armed - any weapon and (2) Strong-arm - no weapon.

1972 Summary Analysis

A total of 804 robberies were reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska in 1972.

Robberies accounted for 3.0 percent of all crimes against property and 3.1 percent of all Index Offenses.

The robbery rate amounted to 54.2 robberies per 100,000 population.

86.1 percent of all the robberies occurred in the City

A total of 325 robberies were cleared by law enforcement agencies in 1972.

The age group accounting for the highest percent of persons arrested for robbery, 10.8 percent, occurred in the 22 age group. Males accounted for 88.2 percent of all persons arrested for robbery.

41.2 percent of all persons arrested for robbery were White, 52.0 percent were Negro, 6.1 percent were Indian and 0.7 were of other races.

The largest number of actual effenses of robbery occurred under the Highway category, which represents 38.8 percent of all offenses of robbery. The armed robber was responsible for over 64 percent of the reported offenses.

The value of property stolen in robberies outside the City of Omaha amounted to \$53,602. The highest average loss, amounting to \$9,255.50, occurred in bank robberies. The lowest average occurred in robberies on highways.

1973 Summary Analysis

A total of 963 robberies were reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska in 1973.

Robberies accounted for 2.3 percent of all crimes against property and 2.2 percent of all Index Offenses.

The robbery rate amounted to 65.1 robberies per 100,000 population.

84.8 percent of all robberies occurred in the City of Omaha.

A total of 326 robberies were cleared by law enforcement agencies in 1973.


The age groups accounting for the highest percent of persons arrested for robbery, 19.6 percent, occurred in the age groups 15 and 16. Males accounted for 89.3 percent of all persons arrested for robbery.

37.2 percent of all persons arrested for robbery were White, 53.9 percent were Negro, 8.3 percent were Indian and 0.6 percent were of other races.

The largest number of actual offenses of robbery occurred under the Highway category, which represents 46.0 percent of all offenses of robbery. The armed robber was responsible for over 65 percent of the reported offenses.

The value of property stolen outside the City of Omaha amounted to \$53,687. The highest average loss, amounting to \$7,325.50, occurred in bank robberies. The lowest average occurred in miscellaneous robberies.

Felony Assault

Assault is an attempt or offer, with unlawful force or violence, to do physical injury to another. Felony Assault is divided into four categories: (1) gun, (2) knife or cutting instrument, (3) other dangerous weapon and (4) hands, fists, feet etc. Misdemeanor assaults are not included in the Crime Index.

1972 Summary Analysis

A total of 1,578 felony assaults were reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska in 1972.

Felony assaults accounted for 85.9 percent of all crimes against persons and 6.1 percent of the total Index Offenses.

The rate of felony assaults amounted to 106.4 assaults per 100,000 population.

69.0 percent of all felony assaults occurred in the City of Omaha.

Law enforcement agencies were successful in clearing 66.4 percent of all felony assaults in 1972.

The age group accounting for the highest percent of persons arrested for felony assault, 16.1 percent, occurred in the 25-29 age group. Arrests of males for felony assault accounted for 84.7 percent of the total arrested.

56.3 percent of all arrests for felony assault were White, 34.5 percent were Negro, 7.2 percent were Indian and 2.1 percent were of other races.

Of all weapons used in felony assaults, the use of guns was the most prevalent, representing 27.8 percent of all reported felony assaults.

1973 Summary Analysis

A total of 1,568 felony assaults were reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska in 1973.

Felony assaults accounted for 83.3 percent of all crimes against persons and 3.6 percent of all Index Offenses.

The rate of felony assaults amounted to 105.9 assaults per 100,000 population.




Law enforcement agencies were successful in clearing 74.4 percent of all felony assaults in 1973.

The age group accounting for the highest percent of persons arrested for felony assault, 15.7 percent, occurred in the 25-29 age group. Arrests of males for felony assault accounted for 86.4 percent of total arrested.

59.5 percent of all arrests for felony assault were White, 33.2 percent were Negro, 7.1 percent were Indian and 0.3 percent were of other races.

Of all weapons used in felony assaults, the use of a gun was the most prevalent, representing 29.3 percent of all reported felony assaults.





Burglary

Burglary is any unlawful entry or attempted forcible entry of any structure to commit a felony or larceny. Burglary is divided into three categories: (1) forcible entry, (2) unlawful entry and (3) attempted forcible entry.

1972 Summary Analysis

A total of 8,439 burglaries were reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska in 1972.

Burglaries accounted for 35.1 percent of all crimes against property and 32.2 percent of the total Index Offenses.

The burglary rate was 568.8 per 100,000 population.

Almost 49 percent of all burglaries occurred in the City of Omaha.

Law enforcement agencies in Nebraska were successful in clearing 17.1 percent of all burglary cases.

The age group accounting for the highest percentage of persons arrested for burglary, 13.3 percent, occurred in the 13-14 age group. Males accounted for 95.6 percent of persons arrested for burglary. Juveniles accounted for 54.2 percent of all arrests for burglary.

78.3 percent of all persons arrested for burglary were White, 15.8 percent were Negro, 5.1 percent were Indian and 0.7 percent were of other races.

70.7 percent of all burglaries were the result of forcible entries and 25.7 percent were unlawful entries with no force. Attempted burglaries accounted for 3.6 percent of the total reported burglaries.

The value of property stolen in the burglaries outside the City of Omaha was \$1,315,974.

Residential burglaries accounted for 29 percent of the total burglaries and 71 percent were burglaries of non-residences.

1973 Summary Analysis

A total of 9,742 burglaries were reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska in 1973.

Burglaries accounted for 23.7 percent of all crimes against property and 22.6 percent of the total Index Offenses.

The burglary rate was 658.2 per 100,000 population.

51.3 percent of all burglaries occurred in the City of Omaha.

Law enforcement agencies in Nebraska were successful in clearing 18.6 of all burglary cases.

The age group accounting for the highest percentage of persons arrested for burglary, 17.4 percent, occurred in the 13-14 age group. Males accounted for 94.7 percent of persons arrested, for burglary. Juveniles accounted for 60.3 percent of all arrests for burglary.

73.9 percent of all persons arrested for burglary were White, 21.0 percent were Negro, 4.6 percent were Indian and 0.6 percent were of other races.


74.0 percent of all burglaries were the result of forcible entries and 22.5 percent were unlawful entries with no force. Attempted burglaries accounted for 3.5 percent of the total reported burglaries.

The value of property stolen in the burglaries outside the City of Omaha was \$1,165,018.

Residential burglaries accounted for 61.2 percent of the total burglaries and 38.8 percent were burglaries of non-residences.

Larceny - Theft

Larceny-Theft is the unlawful taking of the property of another with intent to deprive him of ownership. Larceny-Theft is divided into three categories: (1) \$100 and Over in Value, (2) \$50 - \$100 in Value and (3) Under \$50 in Value. Beginning in 1973, under \$50 in value is included in the Crime Index.

1972 Summary Analysis

A total of 10,392 larcenies \$50 and over were reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska in 1972.

Larcenies \$50 and over accounted for 45.4 percent of all crimes against property and 42.2 percent of all Index Offenses.

The larceny rate for 1972 amounted to 736.8 per 100,000 population.

Almost 39 percent of the larcenies \$50 and over were reported in the City of Omaha.

Law enforcement agencies were successful in clearing 10.7 percent of reported larcenies in 1972.

The age group accounting for the highest percentage of persons arrested for larceny, 12.3 percent, occurred in the 13-14 age group. Males accounted for 69.5 percent of persons arrested for larcenies (under \$50 included). Juveniles accounted for 43.9 percent of the total arrests for larceny.

82.5 percent of all arrests for larceny were White, 14.4 percent were Negro, 2.7 percent were Indian, and 0.3 percent were of other races.

The value of property stolen in offenses of larceny totaled \$2,065,489.

Thefts from automobiles accounted for the highest dollar volume at \$374,633, followed by theft from buildings at \$369,176.

1973 Summary Analysis

A total of 25,784 larcenies (under \$50 included) were reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska in 1973.

Larcenies accounted for 62.7 percent of all crimes against property and 60.0 percent of all Index Offenses.

The larceny rate for 1973 amounted to 1,742.2 per 100,000 population.

 $41.6\ \mathrm{percent}$ of all larcenies reported were in the City of Omaha.

Law enforcement agencies were successful in clearing 21.2 percent of reported larcenies in 1973.

The age group accounting for the highest percentage of persons arrested for larceny, 14.5 percent, occurred in the 13-14 age group. Males accounted for 66.7 percent of all persons arrested for larceny. Juveniles accounted for 52.8 percent of the total arrested for larceny.

78.9 percent of all arrests for larceny were White, 17.3 percent were Negro, 3.5 percent were Indian and 0.3 percent were of other races.

The value of Property stolen in offenses of larceny totaled \$2,503,135.

Thefts from farmyards or open fields accounted for the highest dollar volume at \$521,796, followed by theft from buildings at \$481,894.

Analysis of Larceny by value of property stolen – 1973





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Auto Theft

Auto theft is the larceny or attempted larceny of motor vehicles. Auto theft does not include autos taken for temporary use when the vehicle is returned by the taker and when prior authority has been granted or can be assumed.

1972 Summary Analysis

A total of 3,971 auto thefts were reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska in 1972.

Auto thefts accounted for 16.5 percent of all crimes against property and 15.3 percent of the total Index Offenses.

The auto theft rate for 1972 was 267.6 offenses per 100,000 population.

Almost 76 percent of the auto thefts were reported in the City of Omaha.

Law enforcement agencies were successful in clearing 16.0 percent of the auto thefts in 1972.

The age group accounting for the highest percentage arrested for auto theft, 21.0 percent, occurred in the 16 age group. Males accounted for 94.3 percent of all arrests for auto theft. Juveniles accounted for 67.8 percent of all arrests for auto theft.

74.9 percent of all persons arrested for auto theft were White, 19.3 percent were Negro, 4.6 percent were Indian and 1.3 were of other races.

The total value of autos stolen was \$912,510.

62.4 percent of all stolen autos were recovered in the same jurisdiction where they were stolen.

1973 Summary Analysis

A total of 4,651 auto thefts were reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska in 1973.

Auto thefts accounted for 11.3 percent of all crimes against property and 10.8 percent of all Index Offenses.

The auto theft rate for 1973 was 314.3 offenses per 100,000 population.

74.8 percent of the auto thefts were reported in the City of $\mbox{Omaha.} \ \,$

Law enforcement agencies were successful in clearing 12.3 percent of the auto thefts in 1973.

The age group accounting for the highest percentage arrested for auto theft, 19.3 percent, occurred in the 13-14 age group. Males accounted for 95.5 percent of all arrests for auto theft. Juveniles accounted for 71.3 percent of all arrests for auto theft.

74.7 percent of all persons arrested for auto theft were White, 17.1 percent were Negro, 7.6 percent were Indian and 0.7 percent were of other races.

The total value of autos stolen was \$1,330,062.

63.9 percent of all stolen autos were recovered in the same jurisdiction where they were stolen.




Analysis of Auto Theft by recovery data

Nebraska arrest data

The Uniform Crime Reporting program requires the reporting agencies to report on a monthly basis the number of arrests made for offenses which occurred in their jurisdiction. The arresting agency does not report the arrest if it was made for another jurisdiction. The agencies are also required to report the arrests brought in to them by the State Patrol.

A person is scored only once each time arrested, which means if a person is arrested and is wanted for several crimes, he would be scored only once for the most serious crime. Several persons may be arrested in connection with one crime and each person is counted as an arrest.

Arrest data is not an accurate measure of the number of different persons arrested because one person may be arrested several times during a year.

Volume and Rate

Law enforcement agencies in Nebraska reported 31,895 arrests for all criminal activity in 1973. This represents a 0.6 percent decrease over 1972. There were 35.0 arrests per 1,000 persons in Nebraska in 1973 as compared with 35.2 per 1,000 persons in 1972.

Arrests for Part I crimes accounted for 17 percent of the total arrests. Of these arrests, 9.2 percent were for crimes against persons and 90.8 percent were for crimes against property.

Arrest Trends

Although there was a 0.6 percent decrease in the number of arrests in 1973 as compared with 1972, there was a 19.2 percent increase in the Part I Offenses. Arrests for crimes against persons in the Part I Offenses decreased 5.1 percent while crimes against property showed a 22.3 increase over 1972. Auto Theft arrests showed the largest increase from 1972 - 1973, a 34.0 percent increase. Arrests for Forcible Rape showed the largest decrease at 28.0 percent. The percentage of increase or decrease from 1972-1973 for each of the Part I Offenses is as follows: Murder - +23.3, Forcible Rape - -28.0, Felony Assault - -0.5, Robbery - +20.5, Burglary - +30.1, Larceny - +18.6 and Auto Theft - +34.0.

Arrests for the Part II Offenses decreased 3.8 percent in 1973 as compared to 1972. Arrests for Prostitution and Commercialized Vice showed the largest percentage increase of 46.7 percent. Arrests for embezzlement showed the largest decrease of 29.7 percent.

Arrests by Age

The arrest of persons under 18 years of age accounted for 25.4 percent of the total arrests made in 1973. Juveniles accounted for 52.3 percent of the total Part I Offenses as compared to a 43.8 percent involvement in 1972. Juveniles accounted for 19.6 percent of the total arrests for offenses against persons and 55.6 percent for crimes against property. 71.4 percent of all arrests for auto theft were juveniles and 60.3 percent were for burglary. Arrests of juveniles for the Part I Offenses increased 42.5 percent in 1973 as compared to 1972. Arrests of adults for the Part I Offenses increased 1.1 percent in 1973 as compared with 1972.

The arrest of persons under 15 accounted for 8.8 percent of the total arrests and the arrest of persons 15 to 17 accounted for 16.6 percent of the total arrests. 34.7 percent of all juveniles arrested were under the age of 15. The age group of 18 through 21 accounted for 18.7 percent of all arrests.

69.0 percent of arrests made for violation of Narcotic Drug Laws were under the age of 21. 23.7 percent of all drug arrests were under the age of 18 and 45.3 were between the ages of 18 and 21.

Arrests by Sex

In 1973, 85.0 percent of the total arrests were male. Male arrests decreased 1.9 percent over 1972. Female arrests increased 7.7 percent in 1973 over 1972.

Female involvement in crimes against persons was 12.3 percent while involvement in crimes against property was 23.5 percent. The largest percentage of female involvement in the Part I Offenses was Larceny with 33.3 percent.

84.2 percent of the narcotic drug arrests were male in 1973. Males showed an increase of 32.3 in 1973 over 1972 and females showed a 20.7 increase.

Arrests by Race

In 1973, 78.6 percent of all persons arrested were White; 10.5 percent were Negro; 10.4 percent were Indian and all other races accounted for five-tenths of one percent.

Arrests for Part I Offenses had a 74.1 percent White involvement rate. Negro involvement was 20.9 percent; Indian involvement was 4.6 percent and all other races had a four-tenths of one percent involvement rate.

Disposition of Persons Arrested

All agencies who submit an arrest report must also indicate disposition data. The persons who are charged by the law enforcement agencies are not necessarily sent before a judge as charges may not be filed by the attorney. Released:No Charges Filed for the purpose of UCR refers to those released directly by the police. 90.7 percent of all arrests reported were charged by the police. 71.9 percent of all juveniles arrested were charged and 97 percent of the adults were charged.

Of the juveniles not charged by the police, 26.6 percent were handled within the department and released; 0.4 percent were referred to Welfare and 1.1 percent were referred to another police agency. 51.0 percent of those juveniles arrested for disorderly conduct were released by the police and 68 percent of the runaways were released by the police. 83 percent of the juveniles arrested for Part I Offenses were charged by the police.

Of the adults not charged by the police, two percent were released; 0.5 percent were referred to another police agency. 98.5 percent of all adults arrested were charged by the police.

Law enforcement employee data

The Nebraska Uniform Crime Reporting program also collects annual data on law enforcement employees, including the shifts and type of patrols used by the departments.

There was a 13.2 percent increase in the number of full-time employees in the county sheriffs' departments; a 7.0 percent increase in metropolitan, primary and first class cities; and a 12.4 percent increase in all other muncipalities.

In 1973, the average number of full-time law enforcement employees (both police and sheriff employees), including civilian personnel, amounted to 1.6 employees for each 1,000 inhabitants of the state. This represents an increase over the 1.4 per 1,000 inhabitants in 1972. The rate based on sworn personnel only (excluding civilian employees) amounted to 1.3 per 1,000 population, an increase over the 1.2 per 1,000 population in 1972.

County Sheriff's Departments

As of October 31, 1973, there were 567 persons employed full-time in 77 of Nebraska's 93 county sheriffs' departments; which represents a 13.2 percent increase over 1972. 426 of the total employees were sworn personnel amounting to a rate of 0.9 per 1,000 population. 141 of the employees were civilian personnel, a rate of 0.3 per 1,000 population.

Municipal Police Departments

83 municipal police departments reported a total of 1,769 full-time employees as of October 31, 1973, a 7.7 increase over 1972. 1,437 of the employees were sworn personnel which amounted to a rate of 1.6 per 1,000 population. The 332 civilian employees amounted to a rate of 0.4 per 1,000 population.

State Agencies

The State Patrol reported a full-time force of 468 in 1973, a 7.8 percent increase over 1972. 78.6 percent of the employees in 1973 were sworn personnel. The Campus Security of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln reported a full-time force of 44 in 1973, a 10.4 percent increase over the number employed in 1972. 90.6 percent of the employees were sworn personnel. Five civilians were employed by the Campuse Security in 1973 and 34 were employed by the State Patrol in 1973.

Assaults on law enforcement officers

The killing or assault of a law enforcement officer is an increasingly serious problem faced by the law enforcement administrator and should be of the gravest concern to the public at large. Such acts directly affect the functioning of proper law enforcement operations and thus reduce the ability of our law enforcement agencies to combat crime and maintain law and order. The ambitious young man who today considers a career in law enforcement must also consider the risk of being killed or assaulted by a member of the society he is sworn to protect.

One law enforcement officer in Nebraska lost his life in the line of duty in April of 1973. The 23 year old State Patrolman was shot while stopping a car on the Inter-state for drunk driving.

In 1973, there were 172 assaults on law enforcement officers. This represents a 15.4 percent increase over 149 assaults reported in 1972. While every assault does not result in personal injury to the officer involved, many of them did result in physical harm to the officer and loss of duty time in many cases. During 1973, 44.2 percent of all assaults resulted in injury to the officer with 904 man hours lost as a result of the assaults.



Crime by area

Introduction

Statewide aggregations of offense data are generally too broad to be of use in planning for crime reduction. Similarly, data for individual agencies are meaningless unless comparisons are made with other agencies.

In planning for crime reduction, three levels of data analysis have been determined as most useful. First, an identification of "high crime areas" within the state. These areas are identified on a county level, and all agencies reporting through the Uniform Crime Report (UCR) in each county are included in the total offenses for the county. Crime rate is computed on the county's total population. Counties in the upper 25 percent in both number of offenses and crime rate are designated as "high crime areas."

The second level of analysis is examination of data for selected cities and counties. For this purpose, 29 counties and 29 cities have been selected for comparison. The counties included either contain at least one first-class city (population 5,000 - 100,000) or were included to provide better geographic or racial distribution. The cities selected are either cities of the first-class or are almost large enough to be considered such. Omaha/Douglas County and Lincoln/Lancaster County will be considered separately because of their size.

The third level of analysis is an aggregation of data to the planning region level. There are 19 such planning regions in the state ranging in size from one to eight counties. Data presented on the regional level provides a broader picture of the distribution of crime across the state.

Incidence of Crime - High crime areas

During 1973, 21 counties were classified as high crime areas. (See Figures 1, 2, and 3). Almost 91 percent of the crime in the state was reported in the high crime areas during 1973. The Douglas County area alone accounted for almost 53 percent while the Lancaster County area accounted for an additional 15 percent.

The most frequently reported offense in the high crime areas during 1973 was larceny. This offense accounted for over 59 percent of the Total. The inclusion, by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, of larceny under \$50 in the index total accounts for a large portion of this offense. In the high crime areas, 51.3 percent of all larcenies involved amounts under \$50.

Crimes against persons in the high crime areas accounted for 4.5 percent of all offenses, while crimes against property were 95.5 percent of the total. This proportion is similar to that of the total state.

Incidence of Crime - Selected cities and counties

Most of the cities and counties selected for further examination are contained in high crime areas. Their inclusion in a separate section serves two purposes. First, it allows the reader to see, in general terms, the distribution of reported crimes among the major agencies in the high crime areas. Second, it permits closer examination and comparison among the state's larger cities and among the selected counties.

The mean crime rate per 1,000 inhabitants in the selected cities has varied since 1971. (1971-23.9; 1972-22.7; 1973-24.2.) However, there was an increase of 6.6 percent between 1972 and 1973. Conversely, the mean crime rate reported by the Sheriffs in the selected counties has steadily declined over the same period. (1971-13.6; 1972-12.9; 1973-11.9.)

In ranking the selected cities according to crime rate, it was observed that cities ranked high (in the upper 10) in 1971 tended to remain high during 1972 and 1973. Seven of the ten cities with the highest crime rates in 1971 remained in the top 10 during 1972 and 1973. (Alliance, Columbus, Fairbury, Fremont, Grand Island, Scottsbluff, and South Sioux City.) The three cities that were able to decrease their crime rates significantly relative to the other cities were Blair, Lexington, and Norfolk.

Because reporting by the selected counties was not as consistent for the threeyear period, a similar analysis would not be valid.

Figures 4 and 5 show the selected cities and counties as well as their incidence of crime, crime rate per 1,000 inhabitants and rank by crime rate for 1971, 1972, and 1973.

Incidence of Crime - Omaha/Douglas County

The Omaha/Douglas County area represents the highest crime area in the state. During 1973, the Omaha Police Division (OPD) and the Douglas County Sheriff reported a total of 22,489 Part I offenses. An additional 243 offenses (estimated from incomplete data) were reported by other agencies in the county. This section will deal only with data from the OPD and the Sheriff's office.

The 22,489 reported offenses during 1973, represent an 11.1 percent increase over 1972 reports. This rate of increase is higher than the state's. However, it is a smaller rise than the 13.5 percent jump experienced from 1971 to 1972.

The OPD reported 21,262 offenses during 1973. This is a 10 percent increase over 1972 reports, but a smaller rise than the 12.1 percent increase from 1971 to 1972. Similarly, the Sheriff reported a 33.2 percent increase from 1972 to 1973 which is smaller than the 52.7 percent rise from 1971 to 1972.

The crime rate per 1,000 inhabitants report by the OPD was the highest in the state at 61.3 during 1973. For the area served by the Sheriff, the crime rate was 35.0 per 1,000 inhabitants.

The most frequently reported offense for both agencies during 1973 was larceny. It represented 50.5 percent of the offenses reported by the OPD and 57.7 percent of those reported by the Sheriff.

Of the crimes reported by the OPD, 9.7 percent were crimes of violence while 90.3 percent were crimes against property. The Sheriff reported 3.6 percent of the offenses were crimes of violence while 96.4 percent were crimes against property.

'Reports from the OPD and the Douglas County Sheriff accounted for 52.3 percent of all reported offenses during 1973. Reports from the OPD alone accounted for 49.4 percent.

Incidence of Crime - Lincoln/Lancaster County

Lincoln/Lancaster County is the second largest population center in the state. They also have the second highest incidence of crime. The Lincoln Police Department (LPD) and the Lancaster County Sheriff reported a total of 6,615 Part I offenses during 1973.

There was an increase of 6.8 percent in crimes reported by the two agencies from 1972 to 1973. This was more than double the increase of 3.0 percent from 1971 to 1972.

The Lincoln Police Department reported 6,203 offenses or 93.8 percent of the county total during 1973. This represented an increase of 5.7 percent over 1972 reports. This increase compares to a 3.7 percent rise from 1971 to 1972.

The crime rate per 1,000 inhabitants reported by the Lincoln Police Department was 41.5 in 1973. The 412 offenses reported by the Sheriff's office represented 22.3 offenses per 1,000 inhabitants in the area covered by that office.

Both agencies reported larceny as the most frequent offense during 1973. It represented 71.9 percent of all reported offenses from the Lincoln Police Department and 70.4 percent of the Sheriff's reports.

Reports from both agencies represented 15.4 percent of total reported crime during 1973. Reports from the LPD accounted for 14.4 percent of the state's total.

Incidence of Crime - Planning regions

The number of reported offenses varied greatly among the Planning Regions in 1973. It ranged from 22,732 in Region 1 to 152 in Region 24. (See Figure 6.)

In all offenses except larceny, Region 1 accounted for over one-half of the state's total during 1973. Regions 1 and 2 contributed 68 percent of the state's total reported offenses during 1973. (See Figure 7.)

Figure 8 displays offenses by region as well as the distribution of offenses within each region.
