

#### Introduction

The Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice (Crime Commission) is a code level agency under the Governor. It acts as an umbrella agency for various criminal justice related programs as well as meeting various statutory duties. The Commission has nineteen appointed members and the staff cover a broad range of activities. The Nebraska Jail Standards Board is a similarly composed body with responsibilities for developing and implementing minimum standards for the state's secure facilities. The Board is staffed by the Crime Commission's Jail Standards Division.

In addition to operational and physical criteria there are reporting requirements included in the jail standards. The collection and maintenance of complete records provides planning and historical data as well as satisfying a facility's daily and operational needs. The earlier implementation of a standardized admission and release form provided for consistent data across the state. This data is reported to the Jail Standards Division and maintained by the Crime Commission's Statistical Analysis Center (SAC). The database provides a valuable look at jail use and activity within Nebraska. At the time the forms were put in place the facilities in Lancaster and Douglas Counties (including the Omaha City Jail) had in-house automated information systems and were exempted from reporting. It is hoped that they will be able to contribute detailed data in the near future to complete the picture in the state. Since those two counties account for about half of the state's jail admissions the reader is cautioned that the detailed data that follows does not necessarily mirror activity in those communities.

Currently two separate forms are used, one for adults and one for juveniles. Copies of the Nebraska Admission and Release Record and the Nebraska Juvenile Admission and Release Record appear on the following pages. The charge related and demographic data collected on both is consistent but there is additional data pertinent to juvenile issues and juvenile detention that is also collected. Several agencies submit data electronically, by diskette or tape, and others are converting to be able to as computer capabilities expand. Manuals for the completion of the forms, as well as for electronic reporting, are provided to agencies as are the forms themselves.

In addition to planning, research and for use in determining whether or not a facility satisfies jail standards and can meet program needs the data is used for monitoring compliance with certain federal and state juvenile detention initiatives by the Crime Commission's Juvenile Justice Division. The database also includes data reported from the state's secure juvenile facilities but information on those facilities is not included in this report.

Further information or information on individual facilities is available from the Jail Standards Division and the Statistical Analysis Center.

#### Active Jails in Nebraska

Detention needs, like most social issues, adapt over time to meet a communities needs. In the last few years there have been new facilities built as well as some older ones being closed or modified. Not all jurisdictions operate a jail. Many work cooperatively with another facility in the area to provide all or some of their needs. This may address limiting costs for one or more agencies or to satisfy the varying detention needs, such as required separation by age or sex.


Jail standards classify a facility by the type and length of the holds. Staffing and program requirements vary with the duration of the holds. The current classifications for jails are

Type I	detentions up to 24 hours
Type II	detentions up to 96 hours
Type III	detention length not specified.

There are currently three Type I jails, two Type II and 66 Type III jails in Nebraska, for a total of 71 jails or lockups. County jails are typically Type III while city facilities and smaller county jails usually operate as Type I or II. Although county jails are usually run by the Sheriff there are a few counties that have separate departments of corrections.

The data describes 31,803 holds in these facilities. The admissions may have been for the jurisdiction operating the facility or for other agencies.







The severity of the offense a person is charged with reflects the charges and offense at the time of admission. These could change following an arrest or court appearance. The severity of the offense is important not only to show activity in the community but also in the handling of a prisoner and the planning and procedures of a facility.

About three fourths of the admissions were for misdemeanor, or lesser, charges. This is consistent with other factors such as relatively short stays, no warrants accompanying the admission and the large number of pre-trial admissions.






