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## PREFACE

This report presents a statistical analysis of the background and characteristics of inmates admitted to and released from the Texas Department of Corrections during 1974. The information presented here was extracted from Data Processing files that are regularly updated with information furnished by the Bureau of Records and Classification.

The following is a brief explanation of the categories or populations represented in this report.

**Total Receives:** The total receives category includes all receives transactions and not just the actual persons received. In this category an inmate may show as more than one receive. It contains fifteen actual receives categories, new receives, new receives-voluntarily surrendered, received by additional sentence, received from bench warrants, received from federal bench warrants, conditional paroles, escapes, attempted escapes, paroles, paroles-voluntarily surrendered, reprieves, reprieves-medical, reprieves-violators, state hospital transfers, and others-specify.

**Total Departures:** The total departures category includes all forms of departures transactions not just discharge and paroles. Total departures is comprised of eighteen departures categories, departed by additional

sentence, bench warrants, federal bench warrants, conditional pardons, escapes, attempted escapes, paroles, paroles-hold, paroles reinstatement, reprieves, reprieves-medical, state hospital transfers, discharges-expiration of sentence, discharges-hold, discharges-court order, death, and other-specify.

New Receives: The new receives category is designed to represent actual persons received by the Department; it excludes all paperwork-only receives. It contains two actual receives categories, new receives and new receives-voluntarily surrendered.

Inmates Discharged: The inmates discharged category is designed to represent actual persons discharged by the Department; it excludes all paperwork-only discharges. It contains three actual discharge categories, discharges-expiration of sentence, discharges-hold, and discharges-court order.

Inmates Paroled: The inmates paroled category is designed to represent actual persons paroled from the Department; it excludes all paperwork-only paroles. It contains three actual parole categories, paroles, paroles-hold, and paroles-reinstatement.

Inmates On Hand: The inmates on hand category represents the actual number of inmates physically accounted for at the end of any stated work day. For the purposes of this report on hand categories are for closing December 31, 1974.

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SUMMARY

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## INSTITUTION POPULATION SUMMARY

The inmate population of the Texas Department of Corrections (TDC) is currently stabilizing at approximately 16,800 inmates. This stabilization is occurring after a four-year period of general increase from 1970 through 1973. The stabilization is occurring due to a large increase in the number of inmates making parole. In 1973 there were only 3,378 inmates released on parole while in 1974 there were 4,796 inmates released on parole. This represents a 41.9% increase in the number of paroles for 1974. A stabilization of this general nature also occurred to a lesser degree in 1972 also due to a sudden increase in the number of paroles for that year. The stabilization of the inmate population can be seen in the relation to FBI crime statistics and the state population in Table 1A. The state population growth and the inmate population are also illustrated in Figure 1.

This year the release figures for TDC have increased from the past year while the receive figures have taken a slight drop (Figure 2). In 1973 there were 10,558 total receives transactions while there were 9,198 total departures transactions. In 1974 there were only 10,473 total receives transactions while there were 10,713 total departures transactions (Figure 3). When the slight decrease in new receives is combined with the large increase in departures through parole, it indicates that the Department

INMATE POPULATION AND STATE POPULATION







should remain at about its present population level through much of the upcoming year barring a decrease in paroles.

This year, as in the past, the majority of the confined population has come from just a few areas in the state. As an example, the Houston, Dallas-Ft. Worth, and San Antonio Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas contributed 59% of the confined population as of December 31, 1974. This large percentage is, of course, to some extent accounted for by the massive population in these areas. However, it is also heavily influenced by the fact that Dallas-Ft. Worth and Houston SMSA's have two of the highest inmates per 100,000 population rates in the state (Table 1B). There are only two SMSA's which have higher rates than Dallas-Ft. Worth and Houston; these are Waco and Odessa at 216.8 and 259.2 respectively.

The offense characteristics of the confined population changed somewhat from the 1973 period due primarily to a change in the reporting procedures for 1974. In 1973 all offenses committed by an inmate were reported where in 1974 only the most serious offense committed by the inmate is recorded. This tends to increase the percentage figure of the more serious crimes like murder. For example, homicides in 1973 represented 7.5% of all offenses committed where in 1974 homicide offenses represented 12.9% of the inmate population instead of all offenses committed (Figure 4). In reality there were about the same number of inmates confined for homicides in 1973 as in 1974, the change in reported percentages being due to the changed reporting procedures.



MALE FELONS NEWLY RECEIVED

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## MALE FELONS NEWLY RECEIVED

In 1974 there were 6989 male inmates received by TDC, as compared to 7218 received in 1973. This is a 3.1% decrease in newly received males from 1973.

### SMSA OF COMMITMENT

Dallas-Ft. Worth SMSA was the single largest contributor of new male inmates with 2043 inmates comprising 29.2% of the total commitments. Second was Houston SMSA with 1394 inmates or 19.9% and third was San Antonio SMSA with 500 inmates or 7.1%.

### ETHNIC GROUP

The ethnic group breakdown of newly received males in 1974 was very similar to the breakdown in 1973, with 38.3% Black, 43.4% White, 17.8% Mexican-American, and .3% other or miscellaneous classifications.

### PRIOR OFFENSE HISTORY

Of the newly received male inmates 22.5% had previously been in TDC, and 10.5% had previously been in other prison systems. This is a slight decrease over 1973 when 23.5% had previously been in TDC and 12.7% had previously been in other prison systems.

### OFFENSE

Burglary was the most common offense among newly

received males with 2016 commitments comprising 28.8% of the total commitments. Second and third were robbery and larceny at 16.6% and 13.4% of the total commitments respectively.

LENGTH OF MAXIMUM SENTENCE RECEIVED

The median sentence for newly received males was 5 years, which is the same as the median sentence for newly received males in 1973. In addition, the number of life sentences received dropped from 363 in 1973 to 175 in 1974.

AGE AT ADMISSION

The median age for newly received males was 24 years, two years younger than the median age for newly received males in 1973. In 1974, 89.5% of the newly received males were 40 years or less of age as compared to 77.8% in 1973 who were 40 years or less of age.

FEMALE FELONS NEWLY RECEIVED

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## FEMALE FELONS NEWLY RECEIVED

In 1974 there were 399 female inmates received by TDC, as compared to 363 received in 1973. This represents a 9.9% increase in new receives over 1973.

### SMSA OF COMMITMENT

Dallas-Ft. Worth SMSA was the single largest contributor of new female inmates with 143 inmates comprising 35.8% of the total commitments. Second was Houston SMSA with 95 inmates or 23.8% and third was San Antonio SMSA with 30 inmates or 7.5%

### ETHNIC GROUP

The ethnic group breakdown of newly received females in 1974 was very similar to the breakdown in 1973, with 51.3% Black, 38.8% White, and 9.7% Mexican-American.

### PRIOR OFFENSE HISTORY

Of the newly received female inmates 11.8% had previously been in TDC, and 5.0% had previously been in other prison systems. This is a slight decrease from 1973 when 15.4% had previously been in TDC and 5.8% had previously been in other prisons.

### OFFENSE

Drug offense was the most common offense among female offenders received with 88 commitments comprising 22.0% of the total commitments for 1974. Second and third

were forgery and homicide at 17.7% and 14.0% respectively of the total commitments.

LENGTH OF MAXIMUM SENTENCE

The median sentence for newly received females was 4 years, which is the same median sentence received by females in 1973. In addition, the percentage which received sentences of 10 years or greater dropped from 18.2% in 1973 to 9.3% in 1974.

AGE AT ADMISSION

The median age for newly received females was 27 which is the same median age as the females received in 1973. In 1974, 91.2% of the newly received females were 40 years of age or less as compared to 81.2% in 1973.

MALE FELONS DISCHARGED

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## MALE FELONS DISCHARGED

In 1974 there were 3316 male inmates discharged by TDC, as compared to 3154 inmates discharged in 1973. This represents a 5.1% increase in the number of discharges over 1973.

### SMSA OF COMMITMENT

Dallas-Ft. Worth SMSA was the single largest contributor to the male discharge population with 904 inmates comprising 27.2% of the total discharges. Second was Houston SMSA with 704 inmates or 21.3% and third was San Antonio SMSA 196 inmates or 5.9%.

### ETHNIC GROUP

The ethnic group breakdown of discharged males was very similar to the breakdown in 1973, with 1240 inmates or 37.3% Black, 1443 inmates or 43.5% White, 632 inmates or 19.0% Mexican-American, and 1 inmate or .03% other or miscellaneous classification.

### PRIOR OFFENSE HISTORY

Of the discharged male inmates 1183 inmates or 35.6% had previously been confined in TDC. In addition, 575 inmates or 17.3% had previously been confined in other prison systems.

### OFFENSE

Burglary was the most common offense among the

discharged male offenders with 915 inmates or 27.5% of the total discharges. Second and third were drug offenses and larceny at 12.0% and 10.7% respectively of the total discharges.

LENGTH OF MAXIMUM SENTENCE AND ACTUAL TIME SERVED

The median sentence for discharged males was 3 years and the average time served on a 3 year sentence was 1 year 4 months and 27 days. In addition, the average time served for all males discharged in 1974 was 2 years 1 month and 19 days.

AGE AT DISCHARGE

The median age for discharged males was 28 years, which is one year younger than the median age in 1973. In addition, 83.5% of the males discharged were 40 years or less of age, as compared to 74.9% of the discharges in 1973.

"FEMALE FELONS DISCHARGED

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## FEMALE FELONS DISCHARGED

In 1974 there were 156 female inmates discharged by TDC, as compared to 161 discharged in 1973. This represents a 3.1% decrease in the number of female discharges from 1973.

### SMSA OF COMMITMENT

Dallas-Ft. Worth SMSA was the single largest contributor to the female discharge population with 54 inmates comprising 34.6% of the total female discharges. Second was Houston SMSA with 28 inmates or 17.9% and third was Austin SMSA with 15 inmates or 9.6%.

### ETHNIC GROUP

The ethnic group breakdown of discharged females was similar to the breakdown in 1973, with 93 inmates or 59.6% Black, 42 inmates or 26.9% White, and 21 inmates or 13.4% Mexican-American.

### PRIOR OFFENSE HISTORY

Of the discharged female inmates 26 inmates or 16.6% had previously been confined in TDC. In addition, 9 inmates or 5.8% had previously been confined in other prison systems.

### OFFENSE

Drug offense was the most common offense among the discharged female offenders with 26 inmates or 17.3% of

all female discharges. Second and third were forgery and fraudulent activities at 15.3% and 12.8% respectively of all female discharges.

LENGTH OF MAXIMUM SENTENCE AND ACTUAL TIME SERVED

The median sentence for discharged females was 3 years and the average time served on a 3 year sentence was 1 year 2 months and 11 days. In addition, the average time served for all female discharges in 1974 was 1 year 4 months and 20 days.

AGE AT DISCHARGE

The median age for discharged females was 26 years of age which is three years younger than the female discharges in 1973. In addition, 92.3% of the female discharges were 40 years or less of age, as compared to 78.2% in 1973.

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## MALE FELONS PAROLED

In 1974 there were 4518 male inmates paroled from TDC, as compared to 3221 paroles in 1973. This represents a 40.2% increase in the number of paroles over 1973.

### SMSA OF COMMITMENT

Dallas-Ft. Worth SMSA was the single largest contributor to the male parole population with 1248 inmates or 27.6% of all male paroles. Second was Houston SMSA with 1047 or 23.1% and third was San Antonio SMSA with 304 inmates or 6.7%.

### ETHNIC GROUP

The ethnic group breakdown of paroled male inmates for 1974 was as follows: 1766 inmates or 39.0% Black, 2110 inmates or 46.7% White, 634 inmates or 14.0% Mexican-American, and 8 inmates or .2% other or miscellaneous category.

### PRIOR OFFENSE HISTORY

Of the paroled male inmates 803 inmates or 17.8% had previously been confined in TDC. In addition, 374 inmates or 8.3% of the male paroles had previously been confined in other prison systems.

### OFFENSE

Burglary offense was the most common offense among

the paroled male offenders with 1268 inmates or 28.0% of all male paroles. Second and third were drug offenses and robbery at 14.0% and 13.8% respectively of all male paroles.

LENGTH OF MAXIMUM SENTENCE AND ACTUAL TIME SERVED

The median sentence for paroled males was 5 years and the average time actually served on a 5 year sentence was 1 year 8 months and 11 days. In addition, the average time actually served for all male paroles in 1974 was 2 years 5 months and 7 days.

AGE AT RELEASE

The median age for paroled male inmates was 26 years, which is 2 years younger than the male paroles in 1973. In addition, 87.8% of the paroled males were 40 years or less of age, as compared to 79.6% in 1973.

FEMALE FELONS PAROLED

## FEMALE FELONS PAROLED

In 1974 there were 278 female inmates paroled from TDC, as compared to 157 female paroles in 1973. This represents a 77.0% increase in the number of female paroles from 1973.

### SMSA OF COMMITMENT

Dallas-Ft. Worth SMSA was the single largest contributor to the female parole population with 98 inmates comprising 35.2% of all female paroles. Second was Houston SMSA with 66 inmates or 23.7% and third was San Antonio SMSA with 21 inmates or 7.5% of all female paroles.

### ETHNIC GROUP

The ethnic group breakdown of paroled female inmates for 1974 was as follows: 147 inmates or 52.8% Black, 106 inmates or 38.1% White, and 25 inmates or 8.9% Mexican-American.

### PRIOR OFFENSE HISTORY

Of the paroled female inmates 27 inmates or 9.8% had previously been confined in TDC and 16 inmates or 5.8% had previously been confined in other prisons.

### OFFENSE

Drug offense was the most common offense among the paroled female offenders with 71 inmates or 25.5% of all

female paroles. Second and third were forgery and homicide at 15.1% and 10.7% respectively of all female paroles.

LENGTH OF MAXIMUM AND ACTUAL TIME SERVED

The median sentence for paroled females was 5 years and the average time served on a 5 year sentence was 1 year 6 months and 5 days. In addition, the average time served for all female paroles in 1974 was 1 year 9 months and 24 days.

AGE AT RELEASE

The median age for paroled female inmates was 28 years, which is two years younger than the median age of female paroles in 1973. In addition, 88.8% of the paroled females were 40 years or less of age, as compared to 77.4% in 1973.

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## MALE FELONS CONFINED DECEMBER 31, 1974

On December 31, 1974 there were 16,211 male inmates in confinement at TDC, as compared to 16,353 on the same day in 1973. This represents a 0.8% decrease in the number of males confined in TDC.

### SMSA OF COMMITMENT

Dallas-Ft. Worth SMSA was the single largest contributor to the confined male population with 4609 inmates comprising 28.4% of all males confined. Second was Houston SMSA with 3612 inmates or 22.2% and third was San Antonio SMSA with 1294 inmates or 7.9%.

### ETHNIC GROUP

The ethnic group breakdown of males in confinement December 31, 1974 was as follows: 44.4% Black, 38.4% White, 16.9% Mexican-American, and .12% other or miscellaneous category.

### PRIOR OFFENSE HISTORY

Of the confined male inmates 5,447 or 33.6% had previously been in TDC; 2248 inmates or 13.8% had previously been in other prison systems.

### OFFENSE

Robbery was the most common offense among the currently confined male offenders with 3967 inmates or 24.4%

of the confined males. Second and third were burglary and homicide at 22.2% and 12.6% respectively of the male inmates in confinement.

LENGTH OF MAXIMUM SENTENCE

The median sentence for confined males in 1974 was 10 years, as compared to 8 years in 1973. This increase in the median sentence is due largely to the increased number of life sentences received in 1973 which are still on hand and biasing the median upward.

CURRENT AGE

The median age for confined male inmates was 27 years which is 1 year younger than the median age of males on hand in 1973. In addition, 85.7% of the confined males were 40 years or less of age as compared to 80.2% in 1973.

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## FEMALE FELONS CONFINED DECEMBER 31, 1974

On December 31, 1974 there were 622 female inmates in confinement at TDC, as compared to 597 on the same day in 1973. This represents a 4.1% increase in the number of females confined at TDC.

### SMSA OF COMMITMENT

Dallas-Ft. Worth SMSA was the single largest contributor to the confined female population with 227 inmates comprising 36.4% of all the females confined. Second was Houston SMSA with 158 inmates or 25.4% and third was San Antonio SMSA with 38 inmates or 6.1% of the confined females.

### ETHNIC GROUP

The ethnic group breakdown of females in confinement December 31, 1974 was as follows: 354 inmates or 56.9% Black, 195 inmates or 31.3% White, and 73 inmates or 11.7% Mexican-American.

### PRIOR OFFENSE HISTORY

Of the currently confined female inmates 100 inmates or 16.0% had previously been in TDC. In addition, 37 inmates or 5.9% of the females had previously been in other prison systems.

### OFFENSE

Drug offense was the most common offense among the

currently confined female offenders with 156 inmates or 25.0% of the confined females. Second and third were homicide and robbery at 20.5% and 17.2% respectively of the female inmates in confinement.

LENGTH OF MAXIMUM SENTENCE

The median sentence for confined females in 1974 was 6 years as compared to 5 years in 1973. In addition, the percentage with sentences of 10 years or greater changed from 21.6% in 1973 to 22.67% in 1974.

CURRENT AGE

The median age for confined female inmates was 28 years of age, which is the same median age as the confined female population in 1973. In addition, 86.6% of the confined females were 40 years or less of age, as compared to 81.6% in 1973.
