

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FOREWORD

This report provides statistical information about crimes, arrests, dispositions, jail population and personnel engaged in law enforcement activities in California for 1973. Information is developed from statistical reports submitted by police, sheriff and highway patrol departments in California. The accuracy of Bureau of Criminal Statistics data depends on the accuracy of the reports submitted by our contributors.

Reference data on crimes and arrests are given by jurisdiction. Trend information for the 1968-1973 period is summarized for the State, counties of over 200,000 population and Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas.

The Bureau of Criminal Statistics also publishes other program reports on superior court prosecution, and adult and juvenile probation. The Bureau's annual report for 1973, Crime and Delinquency in California, summarizes the activity and progress of the various components of the criminal justice system including trend projections. The report will be released later in the year.

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Introduction

INTRODUCTION

April 1 of this year marked the start of an intensified program of uniform crime reporting improvement. Federal (LEAA) Grant funds, effective that date, provided BCS with the means for launching this data improvement plan. Ten analytic and administrative level positions have been added to the Law Enforcement Section's team.

Perhaps most importantly, the manpower now exists to make in-depth analysis of the data being provided by over 500 police, sheriff and highway patrol departments. BCS is also able to provide special resource services to criminal justice agencies not possible before because of limited personnel. The main thrust of these services will be the improvement of the Section's crime data base to the highest point attainable. The following represent some of the Bureau's long-range plans.

Services already underway include:

1. Assumption of all Federal Bureau of Investigation crime and arrest reports on behalf of California's police, sheriff and highway patrol departments.
2. The first of a series of Uniform Crime Reporting training seminars was held for the benefit of California's law enforcement records and research personnel.
3. Development of an approach to audit police crime and incident reporting systems preliminary to an expanded program of police statistical and administrative audits planned for 1975.
4. The construction of five year crime and arrest trend tables for all police and sheriff jurisdictions exceeding 20,000 residents. These, as well as 58 county-wide trend table packets, are available to criminal justice planners and administrators upon request.
5. Making resource persons available to assist police and sheriff departments in improving their statistical reporting programs.

The long term effect of this program enhancement should be evident through the quality of crime and arrest data provided in future BCS publications.

This 1973 annual Crime and Arrest Report is more comprehensive and analytic than its predecessors. A section showing disposition of arrests by offense for adults and juveniles has been added to the 1973 report. Crime and arrest rate tables have been expanded to show the twenty-one largest counties (population in excess of 200,000) which more than double the number of counties compared in earlier reports.

To assist BCS contributors and criminal justice regional planners, several tables showing crime data breakdown by Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas have been added. Finally, a number of tables have been included which show selected county information on jail and camp populations.

A number of study areas are being explored to broaden the range of crime data topics covered in future law enforcement section publications. Present study area possibilities are:

1. Quarterly analysis of seven major crimes trends.
2. Victim - offender characteristics involved in child molestation offenses.
3. Special report on peace officers assaulted.
4. Victimization surveys using UCR definitions as a basis for making comparisons of the degree of reported and unreported crime existing at the community level.

The future benefit to BCS contributors will be the fresh knowledge and insights that can be developed through direct, frequent and mutually helpful contacts. The common goal of developing reliable crime data can be reached. This report reflects a promising beginning.

Seven Major Offenses

SEVEN MAJOR OFFENSES, 1972-1973

Table 1 lists the seven major offenses which are reported to the Bureau of Criminal Statistics (BCS) by law enforcement agencies in California to show the extent and trend of criminal activity. The seven major offenses are willful homicide, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, grand theft, and auto theft.

A total of 740,157 such crimes were reported to the police in California during 1973, up 2.2 percent from 1972. Among the seven major crimes, grand theft recorded the largest percent increase (12.8) followed by aggravated assault (9.3), while robbery was up 1.4 percent and burglary increased 2.2 percent. The number of willful homicides reported to the police rose 4.1 percent and forcible rape increased 2.7 percent. Auto theft was the only crime to show a decline (-5.8) in 1973.

Crimes against property (burglary, grand theft, auto theft) in California continued to account for about 8 1/2 of every 10 crimes in 1973. The percent increase in crimes reported for this category, however, has been less than that of crimes of violence (willful homicide, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault). In 1973, property crimes were up 1.7 percent compared to crimes of violence which rose 5.3 percent.

The crime rate in California during 1973 was 3,569 per 100,000 population, 1 percent higher than 1972. The changes in the individual crime rates per 100,000 population tend to correlate with the changes of the seven major totals.

The following tabulation shows the close relationship of the two measures.

SEVEN MAJOR OFFENSES, 1968-1973

Seven major offenses in California rose, on the average, 9.7 percent per year from 1968 through 1971. Although crimes continue to rise, this rate of increase has decidedly slowed down as is evidenced by a moderate 1.3 percent gain in 1972 and a 2.2 percent advance in 1973. It is apparent that 1972 was the turning point for a slower rate of growth for crimes in California.

Using 1968 as a base year, the seven major offenses in California have risen 34 percent during the past five years. Crimes of personal violence gained 45 percent while crimes against property rose 32 percent. The proportion of property crimes of the total seven major crimes has consistently remained at about the 85 percent level.

Burglary and auto theft are high-volume crimes within the seven major offenses. It is encouraging to note that the rate of increase for burglary since 1972 has slowed down considerably. Auto theft has declined 8.8 percent during the past two years. The following tabulation shows the percent increase in crimes for each of the seven major offenses during 1968-1973.

Crimes are often measured as a ratio to a unit of population. On that basis, the seven major offenses in California have increased from 2,827 crimes per 100,000 population in 1968 to 3,569 per 100,000 population in 1973, up 26 percent.

SEVEN MAJOR OFFENSES BY MAJOR COUNTY

Table 2 lists the twenty-one counties in California each of which has a population in excess of 200,000. The number of crimes reported by these counties comprised about 94 percent of the crimes reported to the State.

The crime rates of Los Angeles, Marin, San Joaquin, Santa Clara, Tulare and Ventura counties for 1973 declined from last year. San Joaquin County recorded the largest decline in the crime rate (-11.5) followed by Ventura County (-7.3).

The crime rate in California has risen 26.2 percent since 1968. San Francisco County was the only county in the State during 1968-1973 period to have a decline in rate (-11.2). The remaining counties all recorded increases, ranging from 4.3 percent (Contra Costa County) to 93.7 percent (San Diego County).

SEVEN MAJOR OFFENSES BY SMSA

Most statistics on crimes and arrests are presented by jurisdiction. Table 3 lists crime and crime rate per 100,000 population for 16 Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas in California along with comparisons made for 1972-1973 and 1968-1973 periods.

During 1973, the crime rates for Los Angeles-Long Beach, Oxnard-Simi Valley-SMSA registering the largest percent decline in rate (-11.5). The remaining 12 SMSAs all showed increases, ranging from 2.2 percent (Vallejo-Fairfield-Napa) to 15 percent (San Diego).

The crime rate varies widely among the SMSAs even when viewed over a six-year period. The crime rate for San Francisco-Oakland SMSA rose only 5.8 percent between 1968 and 1973, while the rate for San Diego SMSA, during the same period, jumped 93.7 percent.

Arrests

STATEWIDE ARREST TRENDS

Tables 4 and 5 list selected offense categories and geographic areas by year. Criminal arrests are routinely reported to the Bureau of Criminal Statistics by California law enforcement agencies as another means of measuring criminal activity. The 1,383,234 arrests reported in 1973 were submitted in three categories - adult felony, adult misdemeanor and juvenile arrests.

The data reveal a mixed pattern in both number and rate of total arrests reported between 1968 and 1973. Chart A reveals that the leveling off period of the last few years followed a continuously steady rise of arrests reported during the early 1960s and a sharp rise in the late 1960s through 1971. Reductions in juvenile delinquency and adult drunk arrests account for this leveling off trend. Extensive use of correctional alternatives, which are diversional, undoubtedly reduced the number of 1973 arrests reported for these two categories.


In 1973 adult felony arrests accounted for over 17 percent of all arrests reported while adult misdemeanor and juvenile arrests were responsible for almost 57 and 26 percent, respectively. Approximately one juvenile arrest was reported for every three adults arrested. Likewise, one of every four adults arrested was arrested for a felony crime. These relative proportions among the three groupings remained fairly constant throughout the five-year period shown.

Offense data in Table 4 show that nearly 48 percent of all 1973 arrests in California are alcohol or drug related. Despite many efforts to combat continued abuse in both of these areas, arrests for drugs and drunk driving rose rapidly in the time period shown. The decline in drunk arrests between 1971 and 1973 can best be ascribed to a growth in treatment referral programs for alcoholics in lieu of arrest and detention. On the other hand, the adoption of Penal Code 1000 in December of 1972 provides for the use of correctional alternatives following arrest. Nevertheless, a number of police jurisdictions no longer report drug arrests to the Bureau when they are processed as Penal Code 1000 cases. This has further contributed to the decline in drug arrest counts which still, however, remain above the 1972 level.

Of the total number arrested, Los Angeles County accounted for almost 40 percent, compared with a population representing approximately 34 percent of the State^a. The proportion of statewide arrests represented by Los Angeles County as shown in Table 5 has risen slightly each year from almost 37 percent in 1968 to 40 percent in 1973. Los Angeles County has many more arrests per capita than the average for the remainder of the State. The rate of arrests per 100,000 population was approximately 7,914 for Los Angeles County compared with 6,039 for the State less Los Angeles County. However, comparing the change in rates, it is obvious that per capita arrests in the rest of the State have not been increasing as rapidly as for Los Angeles County during the period shown, 1968 through 1973.

ADULT FELONY ARRESTS

Tables 6, 7 and 8 list felony arrest categories by: (a) Offense, (b) Counties over 200,000 population and (c) Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas (SMSAs) for the years 1968 through 1973.

The five-year comparisons in Table 6, show that the rate of arrests continued to increase through 1972. A slight decline is reflected in 1973. Between 1968 and 1973, the arrest rate per 100,000 population rose 33.7 percent. However, the increase was slowing down each year from a high of almost 16 percent between 1968 and 1969 and then reached a low point of -1.4 percent between 1972 and 1973.

A comparison of adult drug arrests during this five-year period shows that they follow a similar pattern of slowdown in the rate from the maximum increase of 38.7 percent between 1968 and 1969 to a low of 0.5 percent increase between 1972 and 1973. While conjectural, it is reasonable to conclude that recent emphasis on new approaches to the California drug problem is holding down drug felony arrests.

County comparisons of arrest rate changes, as seen in Table 7, show that six of the eight largest counties, had decreases in arrest rates between 1972 and 1973. These six counties comprise 57 percent of the State's population. This was enough to reduce the statewide arrest rate slightly despite major increases in arrest rates occurring for some other relatively large counties.

ADULT MISDEMEANOR ARRESTS

Tables 9, 10 and 11 list a series of adult misdemeanor arrest tables comparing offense, counties over 200,000 population and Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas.

The statewide rate of adult misdemeanor arrests per 100,000 population continued to increase in 1973. This rate increase is consistent with the trend for 1968 through 1973 which shows a 16 percent increase for the five-year period.

As was stated earlier, the decline in drunk arrests reflects the growing emphasis on treating liquor law offenses as social rather than criminal acts. This has resulted in the adoption of legal provisions at the local level which permit the use of treatment options other than arrests.

The drunk driving arrest rate increased almost 83 percent from 1968 to 1973, with a major increase between 1972 and 1973 of 22 percent. Considerable emphasis has been placed on apprehending drunk drivers in recent years, particularly by the California Highway Patrol, in an attempt to reduce the number of traffic fatalities.

Adult misdemeanor drug arrests increased over 15 percent in rate per 100,000 population between 1972 and 1973. However, this increase reflects with a single exception an overall rise in misdemeanor drug arrests from 1968 through 1973. The exception to this overall trend was the slight drop in adult misdemeanor drug arrests recorded for 1972.

Simple assault and petty theft show a minor decrease in rate of arrests for 1973. This was a break in the five-year spiral, which shows major increases of 34.7 and 45.2 percent, respectively, for 1968 through 1973.

The rate of arrest for Los Angeles County, the most populous and representing approximately 34 percent of the total State population, showed an increase of almost 45 percent during the five-year period from 1968 to 1973. Other counties during that same time period fluctuated from a decrease of over 33 percent in Sonoma County to an increase of over 83 percent in San Mateo County.

The data shown in Table 11 reveal that four of the largest SMSAs have substantial increases in rate of arrests between 1968 and 1973. The three showing decreases were Fresno, Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario, and San Jose.

JUVENILE DELINQUENCY ARRESTS

Tables 12, 13 and 14 are a series of juvenile delinquency arrest statistical tables comparing offense, counties over 200,000 population and Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas.

A change in the reporting forms for 1973 data enabled the Bureau of Criminal Statistics to collect data on specific offenses which had previously been combined either with other offenses or in the "all other" categories. The major change was a separation of drunk arrests and liquor law violation arrests, which had previously been combined as liquor law violations. Some of the other changes separated out were: (a) Checks, credit cards and forgery arrests, (b) All other felony level arrests and (c) Misdemeanor level drug arrests. As a result of these changes, the subtotals shown on Table 12 are not comparable between 1973 and previous years. No rate comparisons of subtotals are shown for that reason.

Comparisons of total juvenile drug arrests show a sharp increase between 1972 and 1973. This reversed the trend of recent years. Following an increase of over 23 percent between 1968 and 1969 the number of juveniles arrested for drug offenses decreased continuously between 1969 and 1972.

Statewide juvenile delinquency arrests shown in Table 12 reveal a 1.6 percent increase in rate per 100,000 population between 1972 and 1973. However, the five-year trend for 1968 through 1973 reflects a substantial decrease of 6.7 percent in rate.

During 1973, juveniles were most often arrested for misdemeanor level offenses (39 percent). Percentagewise, somewhat lower proportions of juvenile arrests occurred in the felony level (33 percent) and delinquent tendency (28 percent) offense categories.

Los Angeles County had a 7.6 percent increase in the rate of juveniles arrested for 1973 while reflecting a 5.9 percent decrease for the five-year period shown in Table 13. The State less Los Angeles County showed a 7.6 percent decrease in rate during the same five-year period. Comparing both the one-year rate change and the five-year rate change many of the extremes are somewhat surprising.

For instance, from 1972 to 1973 the rate varied from a decrease of 18.4 percent in Fresno County to an increase of 23.6 percent in Stanislaus County. Similar comparisons can be made for the five-year period shown. This probably represents changing methods over time of handling juvenile delinquents.

PRISONERS IN COUNTY JAILS AND CAMPS

Table 15 summarizes data collected from county jails and camps on the fourth Thursday of September in each of the years 1968 through 1973. The data reveal an increasing proportion of prisoners in custody who are not sentenced, from approximately 38 percent in 1968 to 52 percent in 1973. Los Angeles County has consistently been 5 to 18 percentage points higher than the State less Los Angeles in the proportion of prisoners not sentenced.

BOOKINGS

The number of persons booked into the county jail in five of the largest counties in California is shown in Table 16. These five counties represent almost 60 percent of the State's population and booked almost 400,000 persons into their facilities during 1973. This averages to almost 32,000 bookings per month or over 1,000 per day for these five counties. Los Angeles County, with bookings of over 210,000 annually, represents over 55 percent of the five county total.

The quarterly data shown reveal only slight differences between quarters with the fourth quarter of the year having the highest number of bookings for three of the five counties, including Los Angeles County.

AVERAGE DAILY PRISONER COUNT

Table 17 is a summary of the average daily prisoner counts in six of the largest county jail complexes in California. The quarterly data shown reveal a much lower average in both the third and fourth quarters. The fourth quarter is probably low due to the practice of releasing persons or delaying their sentence during the holiday seasons. The reason for the low third quarter average is unknown.

GLOSSARY

UCR--Uniform Crime Reporting

Seven Major Offenses

Crime of Violence--Homicide, Forcible Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault
Crimes against Property--Burglary, Grand Theft, Auto Theft

*Criminal Homicide--murder and non-negligent manslaughter--the willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.

*Forcible Rape--the carnal knowledge of a female forcible and against her will.

*Robbery--the taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.

*Aggravated Assault--an unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm.

*Burglary--the unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft.

*Grand theft--the unlawful taking, carrying, leading or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another. Value of \$200 or over.

*Auto theft--the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle.

Felony--Misdemeanor

Felony is a crime which is punishable with death or by imprisonment in the State prison. Every other crime or public offense is a misdemeanor except those offenses that are classified as infractions.

Delinquent Tendencies--Incorrigible, Loitering-Curfew, Truancy Runaway and All Other.
