This quarter we attended a five day Symposium on Child Sexual Abuse in Huntsville, Alabama. This was the Eleventh National Symposium on Child Sexual Abuse. The workshops were conducted all day from March 1st to March 4th. We were sent to this conference through the National Victim Center. The conference was of great benefit and offered a variety of workshops concerning Missing and Exploited Children.

The workshops attended included the topics: Dissociative Disorders, Juvenile Prostitution, and Using Games and Activities with Adolescents. The conference was extremely helpful and many of the workshops were targeted towards adolescents.

OBJECTIVE 1

Primary Prevention

1a. The Prevention Program will be enhanced by six schools per year reaching an additional 2,400 children and adults with the prevention message. Written, bilingual material will be distributed at two local arime/resource fairs a year. Reaching 5,000 individuals annually.

The Prevention Program provided the services to 40 schools. This was an increase of 70% over the three year period. These children and adults received information on missing children's issues including sexual abuse, when it's okay to say no to adults and stranger danger. Over 5,200 individuals received the prevention message. The schools served were:

- 13 Elementary Schools
- 16 Middle Schools
- 11 High Schools

The issue of missing Children was kept in the public eye through OUR TOWN attending local crime fairs and resource fairs. Through this OUR TOWN was able to reach 8920 individuals over the three years. We attended a variety of fairs to bring the issue of Missing Children to people from different walks of life. We distributed written bi-lingual material on the services that are offered at OUR TOWN (see Appendix 1), as well as other informative handouts: "What to do if your child runs away" (see Appendix 2), "Preventative tips for parents" (see Appendix 3), and "What to do if the non-custodial parent takes your child" (see

The recipients at these fairs were either parents/guardians/families or professionals working with children/youth. Through these efforts we were able to provide information on techniques, resources, and the realities of the problem of missing children.

During the period of the grant OUR TOWN was involved in several television broadcasts. On May 25th, 1994, National Missing Children's Day, we provided two interviews to local television stations - Channel 13 and Channel 9. The focus of both of the interviews was National Missing Children's Day and the services we provide at OUR TOWN. Public Service Announcements (Appendix 5), were also distributed to several local radio stations. KXCl 91.3, a local radio station, broadcast our PSA.

following the interview on Channel 13 we were asked to be a studio guest to talk about runaways. During the interview we discussed runaways, preventative steps parents can take, warning signs family members can look for, and what a parent can do if their child runs away.

After the Susan Smith case in South Carolina local and national interest in Missing Children and child abuse increased. We were contacted by Channel 4, a local television station. We were part of a television news segment on the issue of Missing Children and Child Abuse. We discussed the need to act and address all cases regarding child abduction immediately. We also discussed the need to offer parents and family members help and assistance so that child

abuse can be prevented. The OUR TOWN number (323-1706) and 1-800 number were shown after the interview. Following this news segment we received several calls from parents who wanted help and were worried about reaching the point where they may hurt their children.

1b. Two local conferences (over three years) will be conducted in a workshop-networking format. They will include social service, juvenile court, law enforcement and other professionals. The focus of the conference will be on missing and exploited youth and their families. Separate tracks on investigation and family support issues will be provided. The goal of sharing information, resources and national trends will be key.

Referrals were received from Juvenile Court, Tucson Police Department, Pima County Sheriffs Department, schools, Child Protective Services, Department of Economic Security, private therapists, Pima County Attorney's Office and self-referrals. We also received many referrals from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (we are included on NCMEC's list of non-profit organizations working with missing children). This meant that we provided a much needed service to the Tucson area, as well as other parts of the state. Many of these referrals were from parents living in Phoenix. We often gave parents support, advocacy and produced flyers. Once flyers were produced they were faxed to the parents in Phoenix. The following is a breakdown of the missing children cases seen over the three year period (see Appendix 7 for specific cases):

As can be seen from the above figures we have exceeded the proposed cases. In these cases either the primary or secondary problem was runaway or divorce/parental abduction issues.

2b. These families, facing long periods of waiting, will be provided support and connection with other families facing similar problems. A support group will be provided for parents under the direction of the new counselor staff position. The group will meet twice monthly at our office location.

Parents/families/guardians were offered a support group to attend. This group was held weekly at OUR TOWN (Appendix 8). The focus of the group was on support and problem solving. An attempt at conducting a support group specifically for parents/guardians of missing children was made and initiated on November 23rd 1993. We also distributed public service announcements to local radio stations to publicize the group (see Appendix 9). The group was held at St Josephs Hospital and was scheduled to meet twice monthly (see Appendix 10). The attendance at this specific group was minimal. After three months the group was discontinued. Parents attending the regular support group held at OUR TOWN appeared to be benefitting more from this group due to the larger attendance and supportive atmosphere. Once the youth came home or were found OUR TOWN offered families the use of our shelter. The shelter was utilized primarily with runaways. Here the youth could stay for three days. During each of these days both the youth and the parents/guardian attended daily counseling. The goal at the end of the three days was reunification of the youth with their families, stabilization and the youth returning home. This was a process aimed at increasing effective communication between parents and youth and at improving problem solving and coping skills.

OBJECTIVE 3 Development of a Dispute Resolution Component

3a. OUR TOWN will develop, implement and conduct a mediation program geared to resolution of disputes surrounding austody, visitation and interfamily issues. This program will seek to reduce the likelihood of parental abduction through provision of a reduced fee service helping separating families understand and have a consistent say in the lives of their children. Seventy families will be served over the three year length of this grant. The agency will develop a training model for staff and volunteers.

The Divorce Mediation Program was developed to provide families going through a divorce or those divorced, the ability to communicate with each other and to resolve conflicts regarding separation and visitation. Through utilization of mediation services abductions and runaways were prevented. This is a necessary addition to the community resources servicing divorcing and/or divorced parents. We received many referrals from Conciliation Court. Conciliation Court provides similar services for those parents who have a motion before the court. OUR TOWN was able to provide mediation services to those parents who had concerns regarding separation and visitation issues before the situation escalated and there was a need for court involvement.

As can be seen from the above figures we surpassed the figure of seeing seventy clients by a large margin thus indicating the need for this service.

All volunteer mediators attended the regular 36 hour mediation training. Several additional trainings and in-services were conducted for those working with custody, visitation and inter family-issues. These are listed below:

3b. We will provide in-service training to key law enforcement, juvenile court and other professionals to understand the concepts and referral mechanism in order to effectively direct families for appropriate services. A minimum of 30 professionals will receive 12 hours of service over the term of this proposal. These objectives respond to the Program Strategies for the development of a dispute resolution component to help prevent family abductions.

We conducted several trainings aimed at professional development in the area of missing children. The focus of these trainings was on the needs and issues of families of missing children and the referral process in getting these families the services they need. PROGRAM EXPOSURE

A community meeting will take place in the first quarter to let community organizations impacted by the program hear first hand about the services. A mailing to 75 to 100 agencies will be made and all will be invited to attend a two hour orientation. Material mailed at that time will provide enough information to refer families for services and provide a basic overview of the available services and target population.

In August 1992 a description of the Missing Children's Program was written and distributed to area schools. These schools were then contacted throughout August and September to ensure teachers and administrators were aware of the Missing Children's Program and how to access the services.

In April 1994 we sent a mailing to 88 local community agencies telling them of Missing Children's Day and of services we offer at OUR TOWN. We also included in the mailing our missing children's handouts (Appendix 2, 3, 4). The mailing included information on an orientation to inform professionals of the services offered at OUR TOWN. At the orientation we provided information on OUR TOWN and how to access the missing children's services.

IF MY CHILD RUNS AWAY WHAT CAN I DO?

- 1. CALL 911
 - In Arizona it is unlawful for a youth under 18 years of age to leave home without the consent of parents/legal guardian. As a result of this, parents can call 911, letting the youth know there are consequences for their actions. There is no 24-hour waiting period in Arizona. When the youth returns call 911 and notify them of the youths return. An officer will then typically meet with the youth and complete a report. Runaways are occasionally detained at Pima County Juvenile Court Center, 740-2000.
- 2. CHECK WITH YOUR CHILD'S FRIENDS

 Check with friends, school, neighbors, etc. to see if they know your child's whereabouts. Ask them to contact you if they hear from your child.
- 3. ENTER DESCRIPTIVE INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR CHILD INTO THE NCIC Ask law enforcement to enter a complete description of your child into the federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI) National Crime Information Computer Center's computer systems.

If local law enforcement can not enter the information, call the State Clearing House at 602-223-2158 and ask them to enter the information. If the State Clearing House can not enter the information, contact the fBI(623-4306), they also have access to enter information in the system.

Verify the entry to NCIC one day after contact with above organization or NCMEC.

4. CONTACT NCMEC AT 1-800-THE-LOST (1-800-843-5678)

The National Center for Missing and Exploited Children offers a variety of services including confirmation of child's entry into NCIC and assistance in the search for the runaway child.

Helping Families Help Themselves **Preventive Tips for Parents**

- 1. Teach your children their full name, address, phone number, including area code and how to call home.
- 2. Teach your children when it's okay to say no to grownups, and role play the situations.
- 3. Give your children a code word. Teach them if someone else is going to pick them up, they will know the code word, if not don't go with them.
- 4. Explain to your child who a stranger is, sometimes strangers appear nice and act friendly.
- 5. Notify, schools/daycare centers/babysitters of any divorce decrees or custody orders. Certified copies of your custody decree should be placed in your child's school files. Ask to be alerted immediately if the non-custodial parent makes any unscheduled visits to the school/day care center/babysitters and for the school to prevent the child leaving with the non-custodial parent.
- 6. File the custody decree in the non-custodial parents county.
- 7. Rvoid putting visible names on clothing or backpacks.
- 8. Keep a record on the non-custodial parent's families, friends and their addresses and telephone numbers. Keep a note of the non-custodial parent's social security number, license plate number, credit information, and financial records.
- 9. Take identification measures such as fingerprinting and taking photographs or video's of your children every 3 months.
- 10. Treat Child Support and visitation as separate issues.
- 11. Consider mediation and/or counseling for yourself and the other parent.
- 12. Talk with your children, tell them you will always love and want them, and that you will always search for them.
- 13. Always notify law enforcement of any threats of kidnapping from the non-custodial parent and keep documentation of any incidents/events.

If Your Child is Taken by the Non-Custodial Parent:

1. Call 911

There is no 24 hour waiting period in Arizona, call 911 as soon as you suspect your child has been taken. File a missing persons report with law enforcement.

2. Enter Descriptive Information About Your Child into the NCIC

Ask Law Enforcement to enter a complete description of your child into the Federal Bureau of Investigation's (FBI) National Crime Information Computer Center (NCIC) computer system.

If local law enforcement cannot enter the information, call the STATE CLEARING HOUSE at (602) 223-2158 and ask them to enter the information.

If the State Clearing House cannot enter the information contact the FBI at 623-4306 and have them enter the information.

Verify the entry to NCIC one day after contact with above organization or call NCMEC.

- 3. Contact the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC). at 1-800-843-5678. A variety of services are offered including confirmation of child's entry into NCIC and possible assistance in traveling to recover child.


