

LAW ENFORCEMENT CODE OF ETHICS


AS A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER, MY FUNDAMENTAL DUTY IS TO SERVE MANKIND; TO SAFEGUARD LIVES AND PROPERTY; TO PROTECT THE INNOCENT AGAINST DECEPTION, THE WEAK AGAINST OPPRESSION OR INTIMIDATION, AND THE PEACEFUL AGAINST VIOLENCE OR DISORDER; AND TO RESPECT THE CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHTS OF ALL MEN TO LIBERTY, EQUALITY AND JUSTICE.

I WILL KEEP MY PRIVATE LIFE UNSULLIED AS AN EXAMPLE TO ALL; MAINTAIN COURAGEOUS CALM IN THE FACE OF DANGER, SCORN OR RIDICULE; HONEST IN THOUGHT AND DEED IN BOTH MY PERSONAL AND OFFICIAL LIFE. ORGANIZATIONAL CHART





TRAINING CENTER STAFF



HISTORY

In 1969, the Eightieth Session of the Nebraska Legislature passed LB 1346, which is known as the Law Enforcement Training Bill. According to the provisions of the Bill, training for all law enforcement officers became mandatory January 1, 1972.

Following passage of the Bill, the Governor appointed six men knowledgeable in law enforcement to serve on an Advisory Council. The Council was responsible for the selection of the first Director and the site location of the Center. They meet once a month with the Center's Director in an advisory capacity.

Originally the Training Center was placed under the jurisdiction of the State Patrol; however, July 1, 1971, was the effective date on which the jurisdiction was changed. The Training Center is now a division of the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice. At that time, three members of the Commission, making up the Commission Education Committee, were selected to act as liaison between the Training Center and the Commission. The three members meet monthly with the Center's Director and the Advisory Council.

July 1, 1972, was also the effective date of the change-over of Training Center funding. Previously the Center was federally funded. The Center is now funded by the collection of \$1 Court Costs assessed on all fines for criminal charges in the State.

Preliminary planning for an addition to the present building was started in 1972. The building now being used is a nine year old structure built by the Air Force. It was vacated and leased to the State for a Training Center for \$1.00 per year. The requested addition will house classrooms, a recreation area and an indoor firearms range. The present building contains sleeping rooms for the students, offices for the staff and a kitchen and dining facility. The dining area is now used as a classroom and the students are transported to the Airport restaurant for meals.

In September, the first Director, Arthur B. Lightfoot, resigned and the Assistant Director, Edward Clinchard, was selected as Acting Director. In January of 1973, Donald G. Webb was appointed Director.

I N T R O D U C T I O N

Complexities inherent in the law enforcement service dictates that the law enforcement officer have a high degree of intelligence and the ability to exercise good judgment at all times even under extreme pressure. It is essential therefore, that the requisites for entry into the law enforcement service reflect the awesome responsibilities facing the personnel that are selected.

No person, regardless of his individual qualifications, is prepared to perform the diversified duties of the law enforcement service on native ability alone. Only through extensive training will he understand the police task and learn how to fulfill it.

SCOPE OF REPORT

This report will illuminate the progress and accomplishments during the Fiscal Year 1972-73 of law enforcement training in Nebraska.

The statistical tabulations set forth on the following pages should be carefully reviewed. They represent much more than cold facts. They are the end results of many person's labors, who unselfishly dedicated themselves in the capacity of a law enforcement instructor. Through their unselfish dedication, law enforcement practitioners have been made more effective in fulfilling their responsibilities.

It seems only fitting that this, the first report on law enforcement training in Nebraska, be dedicated to these instructors.

TRAINING CENTER EXPENDITURES

The 1972-73 Training Center Budget was \$176,274.00. During this reporting period, the Center expended \$152,470.43 or 86% of the Budget.

The Center experienced a turnover in administrative, instructional and support staff. This turnover and resultant vacant positions, were the direct causes of the under-spent Budget.

The Center's monthly expenditures ranged from a low of \$4,786.62 in November of 1972 to a high of \$18,923.32 in June of 1973. The average monthly expenditure was \$12,700.87. Refer to Appendix A.

TRAINING

The Nebraska Law Enforcement Training Center conducted sixteen courses during the Fiscal Year 1972-73. Ten of these courses were mandated courses; Basic, General Advanced, Supervision and Management and the other six, were specialized courses.

Forty-five thousand three hundred and forty-eight man hours of training were provided by the Training Center at a cost of \$1.07 per man hour of training. During the reporting period, 365 law enforcement officers were trained, of which 232 were trained in the mandated courses and 133 were trained in specialized courses.

The Center conducted seven courses in several regions of the

State. These include three mandated and four specialized courses.


The regional training was well received by the law enforcement community. There is a real problem of releasing an officer for training with the smaller departments. Regional training is a partial answer to this problem. Instead of sending officers to the Training Center, the Training Center delivers the training to the regions where a training need has been identified.

Most of the regional courses are conducted simultaneously with a training course in Grand Island. Simply put, the Training Center did not shut down because of regional training.

During the first half of the year, the Training Center's instructional staff was not at full capacity. This created a heavy work load on the remaining staff. The Center relied on federal, state and local agencies to provide guest instructors. These agencies and members who instructed in the classroom, must be highly commended for their unselfish efforts in training law enforcement officers at the Center and elsewhere throughout the State.

During the last half of this reporting period, the instructional staff was increased from one full-time instructor to 3.2 full-time instructors. In July of this year, a full-time legal instructor was added to the staff.

With the addition to the instructional staff, a marked increase in the number of staff man hours of instruction is presently being experienced. During the reporting period, 494 man hours of instruction or 23% of the total of 2,107 man hours of instruction were conducted by the Training Center Staff. It is anticipated that this percentage will increase greatly this year, along with a concurrent reduction in the number of man hours of instruction provided by guest instructors.

This is not to say that the Training Center plans to eliminate guest instructors. The importance of providing information

from the federal, state, county and local agencies is recognized. The Center will continue to call upon these agencies to provide their expertise and lay the foundation of inter-agency cooperation.

INSTRUCTIONAL STAFF

The Training Center instructional staff has a diversity of law enforcement experience and education that permits them to develop areas of expertise in law enforcement administration, law enforcement supervision, criminal law, traffic supervision,

criminal investigation, youth and officer relationship, to name a few. They are ever mindful of the necessity for self-improvement. Students as well as fellow instructors evaluate each instructors' presentation. This provides the staff with the data necessary to permit them to constantly improve their presentation, qualitatively as well as quantitatively.

PLANNING AND PROGRAMMING

The Fiscal Year 1973-74 promises to be a record-breaker for the Training Center. A greater variety of specialized courses will be offered to meet the law enforcement training needs of Nebraska. A training calendar is scheduled through December 1974 and it is fully expected that several additional courses will be added. Refer to Appendix B.

In addition to an annual training calendar, the Center will notify all law enforcement agencies 60 days in advance of each scheduled course. This service is designed to provide enough advance notice so that local scheduling problems can be minimized.

The Training Center hopes to coordinate training activities with other training schools and institutions of higher education engaged in part-time law enforcement training. This is desirable to insure that the maximum number of officers are being trained with the maximum effect.


CERTIFICATION

The Training Center certified 232 law enforcement officers who received their mandated training at the Center, Nebraska State Patrol Training School, the Lincoln Police Department Training School and the Omaha Police Division Training School. During

this period, 516 law enforcement officers were trained in Nebraska. The Training Center trained 365 officers or 71% of the officers trained in the State during the Fiscal Year 1972-73.

A further breakdown of this statistic reveals that the 232 officers trained by the Center in mandated courses, represent 63% of the officers certified by training at the Center. Additionally, the 133 officers trained by the Center in specialized courses represent 89% of the officers who received specialized training in the State.

INSTRUCTORS

In addition to certifying law enforcement officers who successfully complete training courses, all law enforcement instructors are certified by the Training Center. These instructors fall into two categories; general and professional. General instruc-

tors do not hold a professional degree, but have an expertise and background in law enforcement or a related area. Refer to Appendix C.

Professional instructors hold professional degrees. They additionally have an experience background in law enforcement or an educational background in law enforcement or a related area. Refer to Appendix D.

The instructional certificate is good for five years after which time each instructor must apply to the Training Center for a renewal of their instructional certificate. Each instructor must be recommended by the Director of the Training Center or one of the three training schools.

In addition to certifying all instructors utilized by the law enforcement training schools, the Crime Commission charged the Center with the responsibility of certifying instructors, both general and professional, that are utilized in the In-service Corrections Training Programs of the State Division of Correctional Services and the Douglas County Sheriff's Office. Refer to Appendix E.

RECORDS

The Training Law mandates law enforcement training for all law enforcement officers hired on or after January 1, 1972 and for all officers promoted in rank on or after that date. In order to provide the courses necessary to meet the mandatory training needs of Nebraska, a comprehensive records system is being established. The Center is in the process of implementing this system that will identify every law enforcement officer in Nebraska, by name, by date hired, by date promoted and by employing agency. Refer to Appendix F.

PUBLICATIONS

In May of this year, the Center published a Manual on Field Training to be distributed to 15 law enforcement agencies on a pilot project basis. The Center recognizes the importance of in-service training at the local level. It is a process by which an individual recruit receives formal instruction on-the-job for special and defined purposes.

As part of the recruit training process, a trainee will be assigned to a field training officer or coach who is a law enforcement officer especially prepared by experience and/or training for this purpose. This training experience is designed to run approximately 12 weeks and the Manual is to be utilized as a guide by the field training officer (coach).

Specialized method of police work is widely recognized. Formal classroom training and limited demonstrations cannot teach the recruit all he needs to know; therefore, the recruit needs on-the-job training which is the purpose of the Manual.

The field training phase is intended to give the new recruit instruction, directions, supervision, guidance and experience so

he may develop good judgment, efficiency and good habits of conduct and appearance. Field training will serve as an evaluation of both the recruit and the curriculum offered at the Law Enforcement Training Center. The field training period also serves to aid in determining if the recruit meets all the requirements to become a permanent member of the force.

Several other publications are in the developmental phase, including a Manual on Corrections Training, The Nebraska Sheriffs' Manual, Model Policy Manual for Law Enforcement Administrators, to name a few. These publications will be distributed to law enforcement administrators at no cost to them.

The Training Center will publish its first monthly Training Bulletin in September of 1973. The Bulletin is designed to inform the law enforcement community of various court decisions that affect their daily activities. These decisions will be related to the Nebraska Law Enforcement Officer and Nebraska Law. In addition to court decisions, the latest investigative procedures and techniques and technological advancements that also affect daily activities will be covered. This publication will be distributed to every law enforcement officer in Nebraska that is recorded in the Training Center's file. This is one of the many continuing services that the Center feels is so vital in improving the law enforcement service at the State, county and local level.

PROJECTION FOR 1973-74

Year 1973-74 promises to be a fruitful year for the Training Center. The construction of the new facilities, which includes two classrooms, indoor firing range and a cafeteria will increase programming and the overall scope of law enforcement training.

The Department of Motor Vehicles' "Highway Safety Program" has assigned a mobile training lab to the Center for regional training. The mobile lab will be utilized in police traffic service training and the National Alcohol Safety Action Project.

New specialized courses are scheduled for 1973-74. These include General Law, Youthful Offenders, Criminal Investigations, Narcotics Enforcement, Traffic Enforcement and Accident Investigation. Refer to Appendix B.

The Center has received several requests for consulting services from law enforcement agencies. A records survey is planned for the Wayne Police Department in late October or early November. The written reports will contain information that is practical and significant and that will assist administrator's efforts toward improvement and expansion of law enforcement services to the community.
