1973 COUNTY JAIL AND DETENTION FACILITY REPORT

Contained within this bulletin is state-wide information on adult and juvenile confinements within the county correctional facilities in the state of Wisconsin during calendar year 1973. Included in the broad category of county correctional facilities are county jails, Brown County Reforestation Camp, three juvenile detention centers in Milwaukee, Racine and Dane Counties, and the Milwaukee House of Correction. City and municipal lock-ups are not included.

Although the Division of Corrections has no direct administrative authority over county correctional facilities, it does have a statutory responsibility for collecting and publishing state-wide information on populations held and programs of treatment, employment, and reformation.

Data for this bulletin were gathered and reported by personnel of the various county correctional facilities on two documents. Both documents summarize calendar year confinements at each respective facility, one form reporting adult information and the other reporting juvenile information. After the forms were completed they were sent to the Division of Corrections, where the data were checked for consistency, assembled for presentation in tabular form, and the summary narrative was written.

This annual county jail and detention facility report has been widely criticized in recent years for providing only meager, historic, aggregate, annually-summarized statistics. This criticism has come about with the increased public concern and interest in the total criminal justice system, of which the county correctional facilities are an integral part, and a part felt by many to be in serious need of improvement.

There has been increased demand by planning agencies, local and state government, criminal justice agencies in Wisconsin and other states, and by the general public for more meaningful information about county correctional facilities and the large number of people confined and detained within them. To satisfy these demands for more meaningful data, a totally revised information gathering system would be required, one which would collect individualized offender-based information on each detention within the county facilities.

The task of revamping the information gathering system for county correctional facilities would be a large undertaking, requiring a great deal of close communication and cooperation among the varied agencies within Wisconsin's criminal justice system. Although the task would be complex and costly, it must be accomplished to meet the increasing need for up-to-date, accurate, and purposeful data.

Initial steps are already being undertaken to improve the statewide reporting system. The Wisconsin Division of Corrections has received a federal grant through the Wisconsin Council on Criminal Justice funding two professional positions to:

- increase the capability to study persons detained and incarcerated within the county correctional facilities;
 and
- 2) develop a uniform recordkeeping and reporting system to record significant information for the purposes of planning, program development, and program evaluation.

Summary of 1973 County Jail and Detention Facility Data

There were over 80,000 reported confinements in county correctional facilities during calendar year 1973, including over 62,000 adult and nearly 18,000 juvenile confinements (Tables 1 and 5). The term "confinements" is used here specifically because the figures do not represent the number of different individuals confined, but rather, represent the total number of confinements. It is known that many

individuals were confined in county correctional facilities more than once during the 1973 calendar year. However, there are no data specifying an unduplicated number of people held.

Each table within this bulletin is categorized by institution of confinement (detaining facility) and sex.

Information on adult confinements presented in Tables 1 and 3 is broken down into two further categories, number held and number sentenced. Number of adults sentenced (to a county correctional facility) is but one type of disposition or status which can result from being held in a county correctional facility. An adult arrested and held in a county jail can have many possible arrest dispositions. Some of the possible dispositions are being dismissed, given a fine, given a term of probation, sentenced to a county correctional facility, and sentenced to a state correctional facility. During 1973, approximately 27 percent of all adult confinements had been reported as also sentenced to the county correctional facilities.*

As would be expected, the more populous counties generally had the greater number of confinements; e.g., during 1973, Milwaukee County institutions accounted for 25 percent of all adult confinements, 30 percent of all the adult sentences, and 29 percent of all juvenile detentions. State-wide, females accounted for seven percent of the total adult confinements, three percent of the total adult sentences, and 32 percent of the total juvenile detentions.

* The percentage of sentenced cases to the total number of adult confinements can only be approximated because of a lack of uniformity in recordkeeping within the various county jails. In some jails a person held in a jail, released on bond, and later sentenced to the jail would be counted as being held once with the disposition of being sentenced. Other jails would record the person as being held twice with the first disposition of being released on bond and the second disposition of being sentenced to the jail.

Within the publication, Crime and Arrests 1973, Wisconsin's Crime Information Bureau reported that during 1973, there were 62,323 juvenile male arrests and 21,215 juvenile female arrests. Coupled with the detention totals found in Table 5, it can be determined that, of all the juvenile female arrests, almost 27 percent resulted in detention. Of all the juvenile male arrests, under 20 percent resulted in detention. Juvenile females thus had a substantially higher detention rate than did juvenile males.

There was a five percent increase in the number of juvenile confinements during calendar year 1973 over 1972 (Table 5). The number of adult confinements increased over seven percent, while the number of adult confinements with an actual sentence increased 38 percent over calendar year 1972.

Table 2 reports confinements by reason for holding: alcohol violations, drug violations, alleged mental illness (for adults only), and all other types. One out of four adult confinements and about 1 out of 20 (slightly over five percent) juvenile confinements were for alcohol violations (Tables 2 and 5). Drug violations accounted for slightly over four percent of total adult and juvenile confinements. There were 496 adult confinements for reason of alleged mental illness, which represented 43 fewer confinements than for 1972 and 133 fewer confinements than for 1971.

Information in Table 4 relates to how long juveniles were detained in county correctional facilities. Of the total number of juvenile confinements, 31 percent were for a duration of under one day, 36 percent for one to two days, and the remaining 33 percent for over two days. Under nine percent of all juvenile detentions lasted over ten days. It should be noted that a great majority (79 percent) of the detentions lasting over ten days occurred in juvenile detention centers, whereas the detentions of short duration most commonly occurred in the county jails. Detention center confinement (Milwaukee, Racine, and Dane Counties) accounted for slightly over 42 percent of the total juvenile confinements.

During the first full week of January, 1974, county personnel were asked to make two one-day counts of adults and juveniles confined in their facilities. The counts were taken on specified days, one during the week and the other on a weekend. Exact counts are shown in Tables 3 and 6. Total one-day counts of juveniles held on both weekday and weekend were similar in number to the counts taken one year ago. However, one-day counts of adults held and adults sentenced had increased about 25 percent over counts taken in 1973.

There were no reported adult deaths or suicides in county penal institutions during 1973. Twenty-six people are reported to have escaped from the jail facilities and 325 adults with outside privileges under the Huber Law are reported to have walked away during the calendar year.
