

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INTRODUCTION

The objectives of this agency are to provide protection to the community and to provide services designed to rehabilitate the offender in a manner to permit him to remain within the structure of our society. In addition, we are charged with the responsibility of providing the offender with adequate supervision that is most apt to eliminate further acts of delinquency. We are to assist the offender to locate proper residence and employment that will sustain his needs during the entire term of the sentence on parole or probation and to encourage him to seek additional education or vocational training as required to obtain his or her goals for the future.

In addition, prior to every sentencing in our district courts, we conduct an investigation into the offenders' background and submit a report to the court along with a recommendation regarding the sentence. We also investigate the background of persons seeking pardons, restoration of civil rights, and similar types of applications.

In addition to the administrative offices, the agency has four primary district offices and three suboffices. The major offices are in Las Vegas, Reno, Carson City, and Elko. We have one man suboffices in Fallon, Henderson, and Ely.

LAS VEGAS

There are three primary units within the Las Vegas office. These units include the Investigation Unit, Supervision, and Intensive Supervision. The Intensive Supervision Unit is comprized of a small team of highly trained officers who spend a majority of their time in the field, rather than in the office. They deal primarily with drug cases and other offenders who need a maximum of assistance.

The Investigation Unit is responsible for any type of investigation assigned to the agency, and the Supervision Unit supervises those persons on parole or probation not designated as high risk cases. In addition, the Las Vegas Office has a full-time psychologist and also has a counselor assigned from the Division of Rehabilitation to work directly with persons on parole or probation.

The Reno Office does not have an Intensive Supervision Unit. Aside from that difference, the structure and resources are identical to that of Las Vegas.

In the smaller offices, we do not have the capability for specialization. Therefore, each officer assigned in a rural office performs all functions of the parole and probation officer.

State-wide, the department works very closely with other agencies and community resources. As it is impossible for the officer to be expert in all matters, we rely heavily on Employment Security, service clubs, church groups and volunteer organizations.

The administrative offices of the department are located in Carson City. In addition to normal administrative duties, the office also conducts parole and probation activities of a specialized nature. One person is assigned full-time to the area of Pre-Parole, working with inmates who have received parole dates but are not yet released. An attempt is made, with the assistance of district offices, to locate residence, employment, and other similar matters necessary to establish prior to the release of any individual on parole.

The Work Release program, initiated in July 1973 is also coordinated from the Central Office and one person is assigned full-time to that function. Program development is a key responsibility in both the Pre-Parole and Work Release areas.

The office also coordinates all interstate movement of convicted persons who apply for parole or probation supervision in Nevada from other states or who are leaving the State of Nevada following the granting of probation or parole. As Nevada does have many visitors, the Interstate Office is an important function for us. Central Office is also responsible for the return of all fugitives who have absconded parole or probation.

CASE ACTIVITY

The majority of the work conducted by the department pertains to probation matters. Paroles from the Nevada State Prison comprize between 10 to 15% of our total caseload. The remainder are probationers and persons supervised from other states.

Because of a total lack of capability in keeping track of persons once they have been released from supervision, success rates can only be measured by the percentage of honorable discharges granted from parole and probation. In the area of probation, honorable discharges are granted in approximately 85% of all cases. In the area of parole, honorable discharges are granted in approximately 70% of all cases. There are currently approximately 1500 persons under the supervision of the agency.

In fiscal year 1973-74, we opened 938 Nevada probation cases and closed 701 cases or 75% terminations compared with new cases. These figures do not include persons in fugitive status or revocations. By contrast, in 1971-72, we opened 763 cases and closed 408, a closing of 53% in comparison to cases opened.

In addition to Nevada probation cases closed in fiscal year 1973-74, we also closed 124 parole cases and 278 compact cases for a total of 1103 cases closed by means other than revocation.

CONVICTIONS

The workload for the Department of Parole and Probation is determined primarily by local convictions. For this reason, the needs and size of any district office is determined primarily by the local conviction rate, rather than population or crime rate.

As most data contained in this report refers to convictions, it does not necessarily reflect increases or decreases in crime, but rather only the rate of conviction. Persons interested in data pertaining specifically to crime rate should contact the Commission on Crime, Delinquency and Corrections (Crime Commission) located in Carson City, Nevada.



PRE-SENTENCE INVESTIGATIONS REFERRED TO DISTRICT COURTS




PRE-SENTENCE INVESTIGATIONS BY CRIME CATEGORY

1972-73 1973-74




PRE-SENTENCE INVESTIGATIONS BY CRIME CATEGORY

PRE-SENTENCE INVESTIGATIONS BY CRIME CATEGORY


CRIMES AGAINST PERSON

PRE-SENTENCE INVESTIGATIONS BY CRIME CATEGORY


NARCOTICS CRIMES

PRE-SENTENCE INVESTIGATIONS BY CRIME CATEGORY


SEX CRIMES
