

## PREFACE

This report, one in the series on Capital Punishment published as part of the National Prisoner Statistics (NPS) program, provides information on prisoners under sentence of death during calendar year 1974. The total number of such prisoners is presented on a national, regional, and State basis both for the beginning of the year and for the end. Inmates are differentiated by age, sex, race, marital status, level of educational attainment, legal status at the time of arrest, offense for which sentenced, and duration of stay on death row. The report also gives data on the number of new death sentences meted out and on the number of sentences disposed of by means other than execution. It also includes information showing trends in executions during the period from 1930 to 1967, the year of the most recent execution in the United States, and data on developments affecting the status of capital punishment laws during 1974.

Two changes in format initiated in the report covering the years 1971-72, carried over into the 1973 study, also have been incorporated in this report. First, the various types of transactions resulting in the removal of the death sentence—including commutation, resentencing, granting of new trial, and reversal of judgment—are combined into a single category. Second, the official count of inmates under sentence of death now includes escapees, persons returned to the courts for further adjudication, and inmates transferred from death row to such noncorrectional institutions as mental hospitals.

Based on a voluntary reporting system, the NFS program was instituted to collect and interpret data on inmates of State and Federal correctional institutions. The program was initiated by the Bureau of the Census in 1926 and was transferred to the Bureau of Prisons in 1950 and to the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration (IEAA) in 1971. Since 1972, the Bureau of the Census, acting as collecting agent for IEAA, has had responsibility for compiling the relevant statistical data.

## GENERAL FINDINGS

As of yearend 1974, there were 254 prisoners under sentence of death in the United States—an increase of about 61 percent over the 158 persons on death row a year earlier.¹ This sharp upturn was in contrast to steep declines in the death row population recorded for the years 1972 and 1973. During 1974, 151 persons received the capital penalty, 52 persons were removed from death sentence status, and another 3 died while in that status. All persons remaining on death row at yearend 1974 were under the jurisdiction of State correctional authorities, there having been no immates under sentence of death in Federal prisons at any time during the year. One prisoner, being held under sentence of death by District of Columbia authorities at the beginning of 1974, was relieved of the penalty prior to December 31.

The marked growth during 1974 in the number of prisoners sentenced to death resulted both from a rise over the previous year in the number of capital penalties imposed and a decline from earlier years in the proportion of death row inmates who had the penalty removed. The number of death sentences meted out in 1974 was the largest in any year since at least 1961, more than 3 times the number handed down in 1973, and more than twice the number for 1972. On the other hand, the number of death row inmates who underwent sentence changes was the lowest recorded since 1966.

Subsequent to the U.S. Supreme Court ruling in the case of <u>Furman</u> v. <u>Georgia</u>, June 29, 1972, to the effect that the death penalty, as imposed up to that time, constituted "cruel and unusual punishment" in violation of the Eighth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States, many States began to revise their death penalty statutes in an

effort to comply with the finding of the Court. Also, most States began to review death sentences handed down before the <u>Furman</u> decision. During the last half of 1972 and most of 1973, the status of large numbers of prisoners sentenced to death was altered as a result of those reviews. Except in a few States, where modification in death penalty statutes was made soon after the <u>Furman</u> decision, relatively few death sentences were meted out during the period.

By 1974, the process of reviewing pre-Furman death sentences had been largely completed and the impact of changes in death sentence status had been reduced. Moreover, by the end of 1974, more than half the States had enacted revised death penalty statutes; as a result, more States were meting out death penalties—18 States having handed down death penalties during 1974, as compared to 7 States in 1973.

At the beginning of 1974, 18 States and the District of Columbia held prisoners under sentence of death, whereas 32 States held no such prisoners. By the end of that year, 23 States had at least one death row inmate. During 1974, the number of prisoners being held for execution increased in 15 States, including 7 which had hild no such prisoners at the start of the year. The number of persons under sentence of death declined in 11 jurisdictions, including 3 (Alabama, the District of Columbia, and New York) in which the number was reduced to zero.

Regionally, the South<sup>2</sup> held the largest proportion of death row immates in the country, accounting for somewhat over two-thirds of the Nation's prisoners condemned to capital punishment. Twelve of the 17 southern jurisdictions had prisoners on death row compared to 2 of the 9 States in the Northeast region, 4 of the 12 States in the North Central region, and 5 of the 13 States in the West. Among individual States, North Carolina, with 65 persons on death row, had the largest number of prisoners awaiting execution at the end of 1974 and alone accounted for over one-fourth of the total. It was followed by Florida, with 36 prisoners, and California, with 22. Combined, these three States accounted for almost half the total death row population in the United States.

As of yearend 1974, the typical death row inmate was a 27 year-old male high school dropout who had been sentenced to death for murder approximately 10 months earlier. Blacks accounted for slightly more than 51 percent of all prisoners under sentence of death. Except for seven members of other races (American Indians and Orientals), the remainder were whites.

The median age of prisoners under sentence of death at yearend 1974 was 27 years, several years younger than that for previous years. The youngest inmate of death row was 15 years old, and the oldest, 73. The median age varied only slightly by region, ranging from a low of 26 in the South to a high of 31 in the North Central States. By State, the lowest median age, 23 years, was found in Oklahoma and New Mexico, and the highest, 33 years, in Utah.

As in past years, males predominated overwhelmingly on death row. At the end of 1974, three women, one in Georgia and two in North Carolina, were under sentence of death. Only one woman (one of the two in North Carolina) was sentenced during the year. Another woman in Georgia, under sentence of death at the beginning of 1974, was relieved of that sentence by year's end.

Blacks historically have made up a proportion of the death row population in excess of their representation in the national population. At the close of 1974, they comprised slightly more than half the total. On a regional basis, blacks accounted for the highest proportion (67 percent) of those under sentence of death in the North Central States. This is in contrast to the general pattern of previous years, when the proportion of blacks among death row prisoners was highest in the South. The lowest proportion of blacks on death row was found in the West (30 percent), followed by the South (55 percent), and the Northeast (61 percent). When considered in relation to the proportion of blacks in the regional population, black overrepresentation on death row was less pronounced in the South than in each of the other three regions.

Two hundred twenty-two inmates, or about 87 percent of those on death row at yearend 1974, were sentenced for murder. In addition to their murder sentences, two of these inmates also bore convictions for rape and three others had areon convictions. Among the remaining 32 inmates, 29 were sentenced for rape, one for burglary, one for areon, and one for assault while serving a life sentence. As was true in 1973, all death sentences for rape had been handed down by jurisdictions in the South. Whereas approximately half of the Nation's inmates under sentence for murder were black, 69 percent of those under sentence for rape were black.

Almost three-fifths of all immates awaiting execution on December 31, 1974, had been sentenced during 1974, the remainder having been held over from previous years. Thus, the median length of death row incarceration for all prisoners as of yearend 1974—10 months—was substantially lower than the median time of approximately 3 years as of yearend 1972 and 1973. A total of 25 prisoners had spent more than 8 years on death row, the longest period of time being 25½ years. Regionally, inmates in the Northeast recorded the highest median time elapsed on death row—45 months—and the West recorded the lowest—6 months. Among States with more than five prisoners, Pennsylvania had the highest median time, 73 months, followed by California with 36 and Massachusetts with 34.

More than one-fourth of those on death row had been sentenced under statutes predating the Furman decision of June 1972. Of 151 prisoners sentenced during 1974, 149 were convicted under post-Furman laws. In Massachusetts and Virginia, which had pre-Furman statutes requiring mandatory death penalties for certain types of murder, death sentences were imposed under the old laws upon one person in each State.

Information on the level of educational attainment at the time of first imprisonment for a capital offense was obtained for 229 of the 254 prisoners on death row. Of the 229, 79 percent had completed the eighth grade, 26 percent had completed high school, and 5 percent had some college training. These figures indicate that death row immates had a much lower level of education than the male civilian population age 18 and over (the most rearly comparable group), among whom 86 percent had completed the eighth grade and 55 percent had a high school diploma. Overall, blacks

on death row had a somewhat higher educational level than whites. Whereas 69 percent of the whites had completed eighth grade and 23 percent had graduated from high school, the corresponding figures for blacks were 83 and 27. In contrast, however, 6 percent of whites and 3 percent of blacks had some college training.

Among the 247 inmates for whom information was gathered concerning their marital status at the time of imprisonment, 43 percent had never been married, 37 percent were married, 17 percent were divorced or separated, and 3 percent were widowed. These figures show that prisoners on death row were much more likely to have never been married, or to have been divorced or separated, then their counterparts in the civilian population at large. Among the male civilian population age 18 and over in the general population, only 20 percent had never been married and 5 percent were divorced or separated. Black inmates were more likely than white ones to never have been married, the proportion being 48 percent as compared to 37 percent for whites.

Of 214 death row prisoners for whom legal status was reported, 24 percent had been under the jurisdiction of court or correctional authorities at the time of arrest for offenses leading to the capital sentence. Of these, 26 had been on parale, 10 were escaped convicts, 9 were in prison, and 6 were on probation. The remaining 163 prisoners had not been under court or correctional jurisdictions at the time of arrest.

### DEATH SENTENCES IMPOSED

Death sentences were imposed on 151 persons during 1974. Of the total, 132, or 87 percent, were for murder; 17, or 11 percent, were for rape; one was for burglary; and one was for arson. Two States—North Carolina with 46 sentenced persons and Florida with 24—accounted for 46 percent of the total. Blacks and whites each accounted for 48 percent of those receiving death sentences. The remaining six persons, including the only woman sentenced during the year, were members of other races.

Persons committed to death row during 1974 were, on the average, young, almost 54 percent having been under 25 years of age. However, 11

persons age 40 and over received the death penalty. Approximately 8 percent of those sentenced had completed the cighth grade, and 27 percent had finished high school. In contrast to the situation that prevailed in 1973, whites who received death sentences in 1974 generally had a higher educational level than their black counterparts. Whereas the proportions of blacks and whites with grade school educations were equivalent, some 31 percent of whites had completed high school, compared to 24 percent of blacks. Similarly, 8 percent of whites had attended college, compared to only 1 percent of blacks.

of the 147 newly committed inmates for whom marital status was available, 46 percent had never been married, 34 percent were married, 18 percent were divorced or separated, and 2 percent were widowed. Blacks were more likely than whites never to have been married. Among persons for whom prearrest legal status was known, 30 out of 124 sentenced to death during 1974 had been under the jurisdiction of court or correctional authorities, 15 having been on parole, 8 escaped from prison, 5 in prison, and 2 on probation. The remaining 94 persons were not under legal custody or supervision at the time of arrest.

## DISPOSITIONS FROM THE DEATH PENALTY

A total of 52 death row inmates experienced sentence changes during 1974, mostly as the result of commutations, resentencings, reversals of judgment, or grants for new trials. An additional three died while under sentence for murder. Among those who received dispositions from the death penalty, most were white. Forty-nine of the inmates whose status underwent change had been sentenced for murder, and three had been sentenced for one of three offenses—rape, kidnaping, and burglary. The median age of those removed from under sentence of death during 1974 was 33 years, compared to 27 years during 1973. The median length of time spent on death row by this group was 55 months, the highest such figure since at least 1961. Of the total of 55 inmates who either experienced status changes or died during 1974, more than half had spent over 4 years on death row.

#### **EXECUTIONS**

The year 1974 was the seventh in a row during which there were no executions of prisoners under sentence of death in the United States. The last such execution took place in Colorado on June 2, 1967. During the period 1930-67, 3,859 persons were executed under civil jurisdiction—3,826 by State authorities and 33 by the Federal Government. Of the total executed, 3,334, or 86 percent, had been convicted of murder; 455, or 12 percent, had been sentenced for rape; and the remainder had been found guilty of such offenses as robbery, kidnaping, burglary, sabotage, aggravated assault, and espionage.

Some three-fifths of the executions in the United States during '1930-67 were carried out in the South, as shown below. The largest single

number of executions (366) took place in Georgia, followed by New York (329). Three other States—California, North Carolina, and Texas—each carried out more than 200 executions during the 1930-67 period.

Over the 38-year period, blacks accounted for 54 percent of those executed, whites for 45 percent, and members of other races for 1 percent. The proportion of executions involving blacks varied significantly from year to year. Blacks made up some 72 percent of all those executed in the South during 1930-67; corresponding proportions for the Northeast,

During this period, the U.S. Army (including the Air Force) carried out 160 executions—148 in 1942-50; 3 each in 1954, 1955, and 1957; and 1 each in 1958, 1959, and 1961. Of the total, 106 were for murder (including 21 involving rape), 53 were for rape, and 1 for desertion. The U.S. Navy has executed no one since 1849.

North Central Region, and the West were 29 percent, 36 percent, and 16 percent, respectively. The imbalance in the proportion of executions involving blacks was most pronounced with respect to rape. Whereas blacks accounted for 49 percent of those executed for murder during 1930-67 (and 44 percent of those executed for "other" offenses), they made up 89 percent of those put to death for rape. In 9 of the years during the 1930-67 period, blacks constituted all of those executed for rape, and only in 3 years did the proportion fall below 80 percent. With the exception of seven executions in Missouri, all executions of blacks for rape took place in the South.

Of the total of 42 executions involving members of races other than white and black, 19 concerned American Indians; 13, Filipinos; 8, Chinese; and 2, Japanese. Except for two American Indians executed for rape, all had been convicted of murder. During 1930-67, a total of 32 women were executed, including 2 who were put to death by Federal civil authorities.

## STATUS OF DEATH PENALTY LAWS

By yearend 1974, 28 States had enacted revised death penalty statutes that provided the courts with authority to invoke the death penalty for a limited number of crimes, usually specific types of murder, rape, or treason. An additional 13 jurisdictions (12 States and the District of Columbia) had death penalty statutes predating the Furman decision of June 29, 1972, although courts in at least three of these jurisdictions (Kentucky, Maryland, and Missouri) had declared the existing legislation unconstitutional in light of the Furman decision. The remaining 10 States had no statutory provisions for capital punishment. The Federal Criminal Code contains death penalty statutes predating the Furman decision; in addition, an anti-hijacking act passed in 1974 provides for the capital punishment of individuals found guilty of aircraft piracy resulting in death.

Revised capital punishment statutes have been designed to comply within the U.S. Supreme Court ruling to the effect that, under the old laws, the death penalty tended to be imposed in an arbitrary and capricious manner, inconsistent with the Eighth Amendment prohibition against "cruel

and unusual punishment." The revised statutes reflect the goal of eliminating the discretionary, if not discriminatory, application of the death penalty by requiring that it be mandatory for persons found guilty of committing certain crimes. Specifically defined types of murder, such as the killing of a law enforcement official, murder by a prisoner serving a life sentence, murder for pecuniary gain, and murder during the perpetration of a felony are included among the relevant offenses. Some States continue to authorize the death penalty for premeditated murder, for rape, and, more rarely, for treason. In addition to stipulating in detail the types of offenses requiring the death penalty, many of the revised statutes also make imposition of capital punishment contingent upon the existence of at least one aggravating circumstance and no mitigating circumstances to the crime. These circumstances, varying according to jurisdiction, are spelled out separately in the statutes and are generally weighed by the jury or judge at separate sentence hearings.

In addition to the revised laws, pre-Furman statutes in several States provide mandatory death penalties for certain types of murder, in the manner of some of the newly enacted ones. In Massachusetts, for example, the law provides for a mandatory death penalty for murder in conjunction with the commission of rape; in Virginia, the death penalty is mandatory for the murder of a correctional institution employee by an inmate thereof. In each of those States, the death penalty was imposed under these statutes in the aftermath of the Furman decision. Further court tests are pending as to the constitutionality of existing capital punishment statutes, whether pre-Furman or revised.

## **METHODOLOGY**

This report is based upon information for 1974 provided by correctional authorities in the 50 States and the District of Columbia in response to a mail canvass and upon historical data appearing in previous reports in the <u>Capital Punishment</u> series.

In the mail canvass, each jurisdiction was asked to complete a form for each prisoner under sentence of death during 1974, providing information on such characteristics as sex, race, date of birth, offense for which sentenced, legal status at time of arrest, marital status and educational attainment at time of imprisonment, date of first sentence to death, and status as of December 31, 1974. Included in the count were condemned persons in States granting principal jurisdiction to the county of conviction if such persons had at any time entered a State correctional facility. Excluded were prisoners under sentence of death who remained within local correctional systems pending exhaustion of the appellate process or who for other reasons had not been committed to prison at the time of the canvass. If a capital sentence was imposed for more than one offense, only the most serious was tallied, although secondary offenses were footnoted. Multiple counts of the same offense were treated as a single offense. Incomplete data, as well as information inconsistent with earlier years, were augmented or clarified through telephone followups to the mail canvass. The final response rate was 100 percent.

CHART 1. PRISONERS UNDER SENTENCE OF DEATH: DECEMBER 31, 1974





CHART 2. PRISONERS EXECUTED UNDER CIVIL AUTHORITY IN THE UNITED STATES: 1930-74

In the case of <u>Purman</u> v. <u>Georgia</u>, June 29, 1972, the U.S. Supreme Court found that, as being administered, the death penalty constituted "cruel and unusual punishment" in violation of the Eighth Amendment to the U.S. Constitution. The revised statutes, most of which provide a mandatory death penalty for specified types of murder, represent an attempt on the part of the States to enact capital punishment statutes that will eliminate the possibility of arbitrary application and thus conform to the standards set down in the <u>Purman</u> decision. The constitutionality of such statutes remains to be determined by the courts.

Death penalty retained for treason.

Death penalty retained for the crime of killing a police officer or prison or jail guard while performing his duties, and in cases where the jury recommends the death penalty and the defendant commits a second capital felony after time for due deliberation following commission of first capital felony.

\*Death penalty retained for persons found guilty of killing a police officer acting in line of duty and for prisoners under a life sentence who murder a guard or inmate while in confinement or while escaping from confinement.

\*Death penalty retained for persons convicted of committing murder while serving a life sentence for any offense.

\*Death penalty retained for rape.

\*Death penalty retained for treason and for first-degree murder committed by a prisoner serving a life sentence for first-degree murder.

\*Death penalty retained for persons convicted of first-degree murder who commit a second "nurelated" murder and for the first-degree murder of any law enforcement officer or prison employee performing official duties.

\*Death penalty retained for treason. Partial abolition voted in 1846 but not put into effect until 1847.
