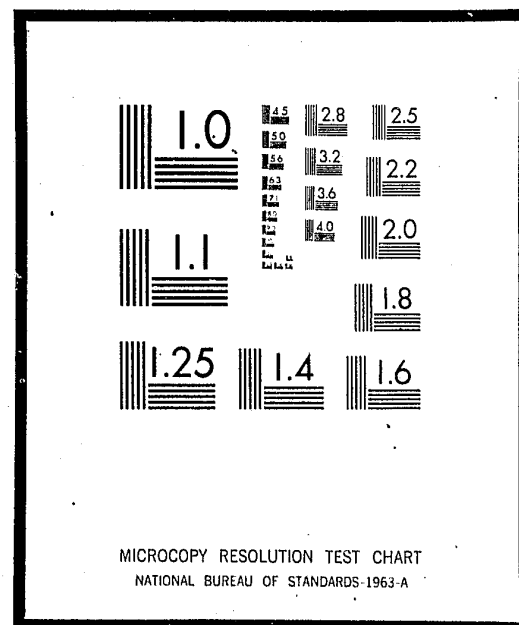

## PREFACE

This report reflects the correctional system for the Commonwealth of Virginia under the administration of the Department of Welfare and Institutions before the Departmental break on July 1, 1974, at which time the Department of Corrections came into existence and assumed administration of the correctional system.

Information in this report was compiled into the following annual statistical report by the Department of Corrections, Bureau of Management Information and all questions, remarks or requests relating to the statistics should be referred to this agency.

This brief narrative summary is a synthesis of significant facts and/or trends developed from an analysis of the 1974 fiscal year statistical report of new felon and misdemeanor commitments and felons confined in the Virginia Penal System.

Felons Committed to the Virginia State Penal System  
During the Year Ended June 30, 1974

Number of Commitments: A total of 2,061 new felons were committed to the State Penal System during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1974. This was a decrease of 169 or 7.6% from the 1973 figure of 2,230 (and represents the second largest number of new commitments ever to enter the Penal System in any fiscal year).

The average annual commitments for the past ten years is 1,820.

Race and Sex: A breakdown of the 2,061 commitments by race shows that 956 or 46% were white and 1,105 or 54% were non-white; only 84 or 4% were female.

Age: The median age for new commitments was 25.

Court Committed From: A review of the 2,061 new commitments indicates that 1,100 or 53% were received from courts in the Cities, while 961 or 47% were received from county courts. As in previous years, a large number of commitments were received from the two major urban areas of Richmond and Norfolk. Richmond, which represents 5%\* of the total State population, accounted for 13% of the new commitments, and Norfolk, which represents 6%\* of the total State population, accounted for 9%.

Offenses: A review of the types of offenses committed by new felons shows that 824 or 40% were committed for offenses against property and 832 or 40% were committed for offenses against persons.

Of the total felons committed for 1974, 14% or 293 were sentenced for drug violations, which represents a decrease from the previous year when 17% of the total commitments were for such violations. This is the second consecutive year in which a decrease has been noted in this type of offense.

Length of Sentence: A study of the length of sentences showed that 1,346 or 65% of the commitments received a sentence of 5 years or less. Life sentences were received by 1.7% of the felons.

Intelligence: A study of the IQ level of the new commitments tested shows an increase in the number of severely and moderately retarded commitments. There had been a decrease noted in the level of these classifications, from 14% in 1965 to 4% last year. This year's figure is 5%. The number tested to be in the normal range has increased to 49%.

Military Service: Of the felons committed, 567 had served in the Armed Forces. Of these, 31% had received an undesirable, bad conduct or dishonorable discharge or were in the service at the time of the offense and had not yet received a discharge at the time of commitment. Discharges for these persons are usually other than honorable.

Habits: The number of prisoners with known history of drug usage at the time of commitment was 792 or 38%. In 1973, 40% were in this group. This is only the second year since 1965 that there has not been a large increase in this group.

Juvenile Record: Of the 1,759 juvenile records available, 613 or 35% of the commitments had a juvenile record and 1,146 or 65% did not. This is a significant change from last year, when 50% of the commitments had a juvenile record and 50% did not. Of further interest, 21% or 362 of these had been previously committed to a State Training School.

Felons Confined to the Virginia Penal System  
On June 30, 1974

Number of Prisoners Confined: On June 30, 1974 there were 5,447 felon prisoners in the State Penal System. This is a increase of 369 prisoners over the 1973 population figure of 5,078 and is the largest number of felons confined at the end of a fiscal year since 1964.

Race and Sex: Of the felons confined at the end of the fiscal year, 2,273 or 42% were white and 3,174 or 58% non-white. Female prisoners constituted 3% of the total population.

Age: The median age for prisoners in the penal system on June 30, 1974 was 24 years.

Length of Sentence: Of the felons confined 26% or 1,406 were serving sentences of 20 years or more and 6% or 324\*\* of these were serving life sentences. The median length of sentence is approximately 9 years. This includes additional time received after confinement for recidivism, escape and/or additional offenses.

Number Committed: There were 1,603 misdemeanants admitted to the State Penal System during the fiscal year 1974. This was a decrease of 335 or 17% from the previous year. The total includes persons sentenced to indeterminate sentences under Sections 18.1-200 and 18.1-200.1 of the Virginia Code. Also included are non-support cases committed to the Correctional Field Units.

The main factor contributing to the large decrease in the number of misdemeanants committed to State facilities is that the courts are choosing to handle these offenders at the local level.
