

RESIDENTS IN WISCONSIN  
ADULT CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTIONS  
ON DECEMBER 31, 1974  
WITH FIVE-YEAR TRENDS FOR 1970-1974

This bulletin contains information concerning 2,501 male and 85 female residents in Wisconsin Adult Correctional Institutions on December 31, 1974. The increase in population over the previous year was 21 percent for males and 13 percent for females. Kettle Moraine Correctional Institution, having been converted to an adult facility on November 19, 1974, housed 61 males at the end of the year.

Residents convicted of felonies comprised about 98 percent of the population, approximately the same as a year ago. Of the remaining two percent the misdemeanor category was down slightly, the sex crimes proportion remained the same, and "not reported" (referring to residents held temporarily in institutions pending revocation hearings) showed a slight increase as compared to a year ago.

Almost 81 percent of the male residents were committed as new admissions, up two percentage points from 1973. Readmissions with new sentences decreased by two percentage points. New admissions for females comprised 94 percent, up four percentage points from 1973. Readmissions without new sentences make up two percent. Compared to a year ago, this represents a decrease of four percentage points.

Ethnic groups for males were proportioned about the same as last year. Of interest may be the slight change in ethnic groups of the female population. Non-whites comprised 51 percent, and a year ago the proportions were reversed.

Median age of residents in various institutions remained about the same as the previous year. Residents at Kettle Moraine Correctional Institution had a median age of 24.3 years. Almost 84 percent of the residents were under age 30.

About 42 percent of the male population had sentences under five years and 28 percent, five years less than 10. These proportions were almost the same the previous year. Sentences under five years had been received by 58 percent of the female population and five years less than 10 by 16 percent. Compared to 1973, this reflected a decline of three percentage points in the "less than 5 years" category and almost nine percentage points in the "5 years less than 10" category.

Milwaukee County commitments comprised almost half of the male population, about the same as a year ago. Females from Milwaukee County comprised 53 percent of that population, down six percentage points from 1973.

For males, time in institution categories were about the same as the previous year, but some change was noted for females. Length of stay under a year declined by 12 percentage points while length of stay of one year less than one and one-half increased almost 12 percentage points from 1973. Fluctuations in other length of stay categories were minor.

The above table shows offense over a five-year period for male populations. Table B presents comparable data for females. In prior bulletins, male and female populations were combined, making the table more complex than necessary.

In 1970, the proportion of male residents incarcerated for offenses against persons was just over 30 percent. Over the next two years the proportion increased to about 38 percent and has remained at that level. Burglary and theft have remained fairly stable over the five-year period, comprising almost 38 percent in 1974. Forgery and worthless check offenses declined each year, from 8.3 percent of the population in 1970 to 6.6 percent in 1974.

Females incarcerated for offenses against persons comprised 29 percent of the 1970 population and increased steadily to 38 percent in 1973. The 1974 level was almost 34 percent. The proportions for burglary and theft fluctuated each year from a high of 12.8 percent in 1971 to a low of 6.6 percent in 1973. In 1974, it was 8.2 percent. The proportion of females incarcerated for forgery and worthless checks increased from about 20 percent in 1970 to 37 percent in 1974.
