PAROLE AND PROBATION SERVICES

In accordance with Chapter 247.29 through 247.32 of the Code of Iowa, the following report was submitted by the Parole Board and attached is a report of the Bureau of Adult Correction Services regarding Parole and Probation Services.

Supervision of parolees and probationers is provided by the Community Services Division of the Bureau of Adult Correction Services. In addition, parole and probation staff provide pre-sentence investigation services to the District Courts and work closely with other agencies in the community.

Since the field staff are key elements in the re-integration of the offender into the community, a cooperative relationship is required with the institutional staff and other Community Services staff located at the Riverview Release Center at Newton and half-way houses at various locations around the state.

Agents have the responsibility of receiving probation cases from the District Court and parole cases from the institutions in the Bureau after the Board of Parole has authorized their release. The Release Center and half-way houses have been more frequently used than in the past for temporary housing of individuals needing additional support while having problems which do not warrant a revocation. Adults on parole and probation provide for their own maintenance. While employed, they can contribute to the support of their families thus reducing ADC rolls, and remain in the community as tax payers, not tax users.

As of the end of this reporting period, 50 agents were supervising a total 2130 adult parolees and probationers. Of the total, 1198 were probationers, 416 were parolees, 222 were misdemeanors, and 294 were parolees and probationers residing in Iowa, transferred from other states through the Inter-State Compact on Parole and Probation.

During the 24 month reporting period, 2781 pre-sentence investigations were prepared for the District Courts of Iowa. In showing total work-load, one pre-sentence investigation is commonly weighed to be equal to a supervision case-load of five parolees or probationers.

Parole and probation services are supervised by eight district supervisors, one located in each of the eight judicial districts. The additional responsibilities related to the expansion of community-based correctional programs necessitated the restructuring of central administration to include three parole and probation administrators, one special projects director, one resource and program planner and one chief parole officer. Clerical support is either provided by positions assigned to the Bureau or through cooperative arrangements with other Department of Social Services units and other agencies.

Escort service for the Bureau is also provided to relieve time spent by agents in returning violators and absconders to the institutions.

Services as of this reporting date are provided by fifty (50) parole and probation officers. Legislation mandating pre-sentence investigations in all felony cases will result in the addition of eleven (11) new positions which have been funded through a supplemental appropriation.

With the continued, careful selection of persons for release on parole by the Board of Parole; smaller caseloads of probationers and parolees supervised by agents; greater use of community resources to continue treatment; the Bureau and the Department of Social Services are providing more services to District Courts of Iowa and to more people than ever before and at a cost to the taxpayer for less than the cost of institutional services.

STAFF DEVELOPMENT

Grants of Federal Funds are made directly from the Department of Justice to schools and colleges in Iowa. Agents apply for grants to study special courses to improve their skills and ability to supervise. The Department of Social Services has stipends available to Bureau employees to take special courses while working full time to improve skills and gain knowledge. This method may be used to attain a B.A. or M.A. degree. Administrators and supervisors are also participating in management training programs at the Center for Labor and Management of the University of Iowa.

All staff are required to attend an intensive week long orientation and training session conducted by the Bureau which addresses itself to the entire spectrum of the Criminal Justice System. Staff are also scheduled to visit each institution for a one week introduction and orientation program.

Each year, a small number of selected staff attend national conferences such as the National Institute on Crime and Delinquency, the American Correctional Association meeting and the Interstate Compact Administrator's Association meeting.
