RESIDENTS IN WISCONSIN ADULT CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTIONS ON JUNE 30, 1975 WITH FIVE-YEAR TRENDS FOR 1971-1975

HIGHLIGHTS

Felony offenders comprise 99 percent of the adult male institutional population. The remaining one percent is made up of misdemeanant and sex deviate offenders and four residents who are categorized as "not reported." Female felons are 99.1 percent of their population and one resident is in the "not reported" category. "Not reported" consists of residents who were held in institutions pending revocation hearings on June 30, 1975.

New admissions are 82 percent of the male residents. A year ago this proportion was 79 percent. New admissions for females comprise about the same proportion as last year, just under 94 percent.

Offense categories for male residents are proportionately about the same as a year ago. Proportions for females show some differences. Murder decreased by 4.8 percentage points from last year and robbery increased by 2.4 percentage points. Worthless checks show an increase of 4.7 percentage points, while incarcerations for drug violations declined by about the same proportion.

White male residents, including 1.3 percent of Mexican origin, are about 61 percent of total males. Last year this proportion was about 63 percent. White females, including the less than one percent of Mexican origin, comprise just under 47 percent of total females. A year ago the white proportion was almost 52 percent.

Median age for both males and females is slightly less than 25.5 years. A year ago it was just under 26 and 25 years for males and females, respectively, so age has changed very little.

Proportions of male residents in length of sentence categories show no significant change from last year. Proportions of females with sentences of "2 years, less than 3" declined by five percentage points from a year ago, and those with combined sentences of "3 years, less than 5" increased by 10 percentage points. Five years, less than 10 decreased four percentage points.

Milwaukee County commitments are just over 49 percent of total males, almost the same as a year ago. For females, this proportion is 60.5 percent, up 10 percentage points from last year.

The male population is at the highest level for all five years, having increased almost 18 percent from a year ago and 37 percent from the 1973 level. Residents incarcerated less than two years make up about three-fourths of the population, a level that has prevailed for all five years. All other time in institution categories also remained fairly constant for the entire period.

The female population has increased almost 38 percent from a year ago, and 49 percent from the 1973 level. The highest population was at the beginning of the five-year period, on June 30, 1971. Incarceration for "less than 6 months" rose by 10.5 percentage points from a year ago, after declining 16.2 percentage points from 1973. Combined categories, including "6 months, less than 2 years," showed an opposite trend by declining 10.7 percentage points from 1974, after increasing 13.2 percentage points from 1973. Females incarcerated more than two years comprise slightly under 13 percent of the resident population.
