# ALERT TELECOMMUNICATIONS NETWORK ACTIVITY 1975 BY ELEMENTS OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE









#### COST OF SOFTWARE SYSTEMS



#### ACCOMPLISHMENTS ALERT II SYSTEM - 1975

Completed the collection and storage of crime information which will be used by the Response Time Study Group to assess the accuracy of information collected.

Produced related payroll information with respect to Deferred Compensation Programs.

Enhanced the accuracy of information reported on stolen property by increasing the edits, thereby rejecting some erroneous codes previously accepted into UCR reports.

Produced an in-depth analysis report of all pedestrian accidents for prior years 1973 and 1974.

Revised the ASAP (Alcohol Safety Action Program) report to provide for Race/Sex factor, Court related information and elimination of unnecessary information.

Provided for raises in Blue Cross/Blue Shield premiums applicable to department members.

Implemented edits for accuracy of Mo. Driver License Number in the Alert System, rejecting those that are invalid.

Provide a list of KCMOPD Sergearts by Date of Rank Sequence to be used in Personnel Management related functions.

Produce arrest information related to attempt rapes, rapes, and disposition data.

Revised County Corrections report to exclude from master list of inmates those that are out on release.

Revised the daily operations summary program to reflect computer down time as a result of hardware malfunctions (other than computer malfunctions).

Programmed for Automatic Relay to KBI of Wanted Persons Hits made by Kansas terminals.

Revised the automated administrative file index system to provide for new categories of letters on file.

Implemented NCIC missing persons file to Missouri State Highway Patrol Terminal for Missouri Agencies and direct to NCIC for Kansas Agencies using the Alert System.

Implemented TSO (Time Sharing Operation) and as a result practically eliminated key punch operations in data collection.

Produced reports reflecting information used in the Sergeants and Detective Assessment Center.

Implemented procedures which provide capability to retrieve an officers current unit of assignment for entry on the Court Docket.

Created a program which reflects a report of all nolle-processed cases.

Revised Expired License programs to include 1975 and to produce more useable reports.

Enhanced edits of offense entries thus decreasing the number of errors to be corrected before running monthly offense reports.

Found and corrected a problem that caused "R" type General Index records to be deleted in error. The absence of these records caused offense records to not be written on the monthly and year-to-date tapes.

Developed a series of programs affected by the dispositions that were entered too late to be on the monthly tapes.

Modified the majority of the programs affected by the Security Header P.I.

Implemented computerized mapping portraying crime indices.

Converted a major portion of the ALERT System to IMS for implementation on January 1977.

Implemented virtual operating system as the new executive control program thereby increasing the capabilities of the system 370/158.

Implemented the Houston Auto Spool Program (HASP) to better manage the ALERT system's batch programming scheduling and throughput.

Installed 3330-11 disk drives to provide more data storage facilities.

Developed procedures to parallel test systems converted to IMS with the on-line ALERT system.

Made modifications to the ALERT T.P. system to enhance performance.

Developed programs to objectively measure performance of the system.

Installed 3767 terminals to replace 2740 terminals at many locations on the ALERT system.

Began operating the system console in "Display Mode", a technique designed to enhance system operation.

Modified the Systems Maintenance Facility (SMF) to keep better account of the use of system resources.

Developed in house IMS/TCAM interface through providing easy conversion from FASTER to IMS. A cost savings of \$500 per month.

Created a program to retrieve active transactions on the TCAM message queues data set, storing them on tape for subsequent requeing after a TCAM cold start, thus providing improved system integrity.

Modified newsletter programs to produce separate 'MULES' activity page, separate 'ALECS' activity page, combine Criminal Justice activity page and made general history file changes.

Automated the process of sending a reminder notice to parties who have requested a court date on a parking case.

Automated the parking ticket process to the extent that all unpaid tickets where the owner has been identified will result in a warrant being generated without clerical intervention.

Automated the process of sending out final notices to all people who were not identified in first 10 days after ticket was issued.

Made operational change in manner of serving warrants, which allows the warrant to remain in its place of origin (court) and yet be served by the police. This cuts down on clerical handling and minimizes mistakes.

Developed a pre-trial screening report for GOS arrests.

Through utilization of SPSS (Statistical Package for the Social Sciences) promotional testing results and human resources questionaire results have been analyzed.

The SPSS programs for descriptive and inferential statistics have been satisfactorily used to analyze assessment center results and job satisfaction measurements.

SPSS programs have been used to evaluate the reliability of assessment center ratings.

SPSS printouts have provided information as to how employees view the organization, what variables influence job satisfaction, preferred job assignments, and supervisor-subordinate relations.

The principal SPSS programs utilized to date have been those for descriptive statistics, correlations, tests of significance, and analysis of variance.

Additional uses of SPSS include problem analysis for potential programming in the areas of juvenile delinquency and aid to elderly victims.
