

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The Nebraska Uniform Crime Reporting Program

Introduction

The counterpart of the Nebraska Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program is the national UCR program, which is under the direction of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). This national program is the result of a need for nation-wide and uniform compilation of law enforcement statistics. Uniform Crime Reports were first collected in 1930 after being developed by a committee of the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP). Today the IACP continues to serve in an advisory capacity to the FBI in its operation of the program. In 1966, the National Sheriffs' Association (NSA) established a Committee on Uniform Crime Records to serve in an advisory capacity to the national UCR program while actively encouraging sheriffs throughout the nation to participate in the program.

During the last several years, the direct collection of Uniform Crime Reports has been transferred to individual states. Currently 36 states have operational UCR programs. As in many states, Nebraska's UCR program will become a component of the criminal justice information system.

The Nebraska UCR Program

The Nebraska UCR program involves the compilation, classification and analysis of crime statistics reported by law enforcement agencies in the State in accordance with guides and regulations prescribed by law.

The statute creating the Nebraska UCR program is incorporated into the same statute which created the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice, hereafter referred to as the Commission. The portion of this statute relating to UCR is reproduced below:

Nebraska Revised Statutes

Chapter 81-1425

"(6) collect, develop and maintain statistical information, records, and reports as the Commission may determine relevant to its functions."

Chapter 81-1426

"Public officers and agencies; information, records, reports; furnish to the Commission:

"(1) The Commission may obtain from all public officers or agencies whose functions include the control, apprehension, trial, or correction of criminal offenders in this state, such information, records, and reports as the Commission may determine relevant to its functions.

"(2) It shall be the duty of all public officers and agencies whose functions include the control, apprehension, trial, or correction of criminal offenders to provide such information, records, and reports as the Commission shall reasonably require."

Nebraska's UCR program became operational on January 1, 1971. Commencing on that date all crime statistics flow through one central agency, this Commission, before submission to the national UCR program. The State Patrol, all sheriffs' departments and all police departments of municipalities of 1,000 population and over are required to submit Uniform Crime Reports by the seventh day after the end of the month. All Uniform Crime Reports are verified and all mathematical computations are checked.

Any errors or questionable data are corrected by telephone contact with the agency in question. After verification and processing of data, a magnetic tape is built and submitted to the national UCR program.

This Commission publishes quarterly and annual reports based upon data submitted. The quality of these reports is hampered by agencies who have refused to participate in the UCR program and by those who have not reported for all months. In a state program such as this, data from all agencies is needed in order to portray crime in the state.

Another area of concern in the UCR program is uniformity in reporting. The Nebraska UCR program utilizes the same offense classifications as the national program. The offense classifications are as follows:

Part I Offenses

(1) Homicide—

(a) Murder—any unlawful killing of a human being in which the element of malice aforethought was present in the murder. Manslaughter—any unlawful killing of a human being without the element of malice aforethought.

(b) Death by Negligence—any death that occurs because of the negligence of some person other than the victim and that is not in the commission of an unlawful act.

(2) Rape—

(a) Rape by Force—the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will, but excluding statutory rape and other sex offenses.

(b) Assault to Rape—all assaults and attempts to rape.

(3) Robbery—the felonious and forcible taking of the property of another against his will by violence or by putting him in fear. Robbery differs from larceny in that it is aggravated by the element of force.

(a) Armed Robbery-Any Weapon—when any object is so employed as to constitute force or the threat of force, it will be considered a weapon. This would include firearms, knives, clubs, brass knuckles, blackjack, broken bottles, acid, ex-

- plosives, etc. Cases involving possible pretended weapons or cases involving weapons not seen by the victim but which the robber claims to have with him should be counted in this category.
- (b) **Strong Arm-No Weapon**—includes muggings and similar offenses when no weapon is used but strong-arm tactics are employed to deprive the victim of his property. This is limited to hands, arms, fists, feet, etc. As in armed robbery, all attempts are included.
- (4) **Assault**—an attempt or offer, with unlawful force or violence, to do physical injury to another. General Rule—all assaults will be classified in the following categories, excluding assaults with intent to rob or rape.
- (a) **Gun**—all assaults and attempted assaults involving the use of any type of firearm. This includes revolvers, automatic pistols, shotguns, zip guns, rifles, pellet guns, etc.
 - (b) **Knife or Cutting Instrument**—all assaults and attempted assaults involving the use of cutting or stabbing objects such as knives, razors, hatchets, axes, cleavers, scissors, glass, broken bottles, daggers, ice picks, etc.
 - (c) **Other Dangerous Weapon**—assaults or attempted assaults when any object other than a gun, knife or cutting instrument is used. This includes clubs, bricks, jack handles, bottles, explosives, acid, lye, poison, scalding water and cases of attempted drownings, burnings, etc.
 - (d) **Hands, Fists, Feet, Etc. (Felony)**—any assaults with hands, fists, feet, etc. which could result in a felony conviction. In order to be classified as a felony, the victim must suffer great bodily harm.
- (5) **Burglary**—any unlawful entry or attempted forcible entry of any structure to commit a felony or larceny. For Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, burglary with larceny is classified and scored only as burglary; the larceny is excluded. Breaking and entering of a motor vehicle is classified as larceny.
- (a) **Forcible Entry**—all offenses where force of any kind is used to unlawfully enter a locked structure to commit a felony or with intent to steal something. This includes entry by use of a master key, celluloid or other device that leaves no outward mark but is used to open a lock. Concealment inside a building followed by breaking out of the structure should also be scored here.
 - (b) **Unlawful Entry-No Force**—No evidence of forcible entry.
 - (c) **Attempted Forcible Entry**—when determined that forcible entry has been attempted.
- (6) **Larceny-Theft (Except Auto Theft)**—the unlawful taking of the property of another with intent to deprive him of ownership. This involves all larcenies and thefts resulting from pocket picking, purse snatching, shoplifting, larceny from auto, larceny of auto parts and accessories, bicycle theft, larceny from buildings and larceny from any coin-operated machines. Any theft that is not a robbery or any theft that does not result from a breaking and entering will be scored here. Embezzlements, unlawful conversions, larceny by bailee, frauds or bad check cases are excluded.

(7) **Motor Vehicle Theft**—larceny or attempted larceny of automobiles. All thefts and attempted thefts of motor vehicles are included. This includes all vehicles which can be registered as a motor vehicle in this state. Those incidents in which the alleged offender had lawful access to the vehicle as in a family situation or the unauthorized use by others having lawful access to the vehicle such as chauffeur, employee, etc. are excluded.

Part II Offenses

- (8) **Other Assaults (Misdemeanor)**—consists of all assaults and attempted assaults which are simple or minor in nature.
- (9) **Arson**—includes all arrests for violations of state laws and municipal ordinances relating to arson and attempted arson.
- (10) **Forgery and Counterfeiting**—all offenses dealing with the making, altering, uttering or possessing with intent to defraud anything false in the semblance of that which is true.
- (11) **Fraud**—fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretense. Includes bad checks, confidence games, etc.
- (12) **Embezzlement**—the misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody or control.
- (13) **Stolen Property**—all offenses of buying, receiving, possessing or concealing stolen property as well as all attempts to commit any of these offenses.
- (14) **Vandalism-Destruction of Property**—all willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement or defacement of any public or private property, real or personal, without the consent of the owner or person having custody or control, by cutting, tearing, breaking, marking, painting, drawing, covering with filth or any other such means as may be specified by law or ordinance.
- (15) **Weapons**—includes violations of weapon laws such as manufacture, sale or possession of deadly weapons; carrying deadly weapons; furnishing deadly weapons to minors; aliens possessing deadly weapons, and all attempts to commit any of the above offenses.
- (16) **Prostitution and Commercialized Vice**—include in this class the sex offenses of a commercialized nature such as prostitution; keeping bawdy house, disorderly house or house of ill repute; pandering, procuring, transporting or detaining women for immoral purposes, etc. and all attempts to commit any of the above.
- (17) **Sex Offenses**—includes all sex offenses other than forcible rape, prostitution and commercialized vice. This encompasses offenses against chastity, common decency, morals and the like such as adultery and fornication, buggery, incest, indecent exposure, sodomy, carnal abuse (no force) and all attempts to commit any of the above.
- (18) **Narcotic Drug Laws**—statistics for these arrests are requested on the basis of the narcotics used. This includes all arrests for the violation of state and local ordinances, specifically those relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing and
- making of narcotic drugs. Four divisions of narcotic drugs are recognized. These are
- (a) opium and cocaine and their derivatives (morphine, heroin, codeine),
 - (b) marijuana,
 - (c) synthetic narcotics which can cause true addiction (demerol, methadones) and
 - (d) other dangerous nonnarcotic drugs (barbituates, benzedrine).
- (19) **Gambling**—includes all charges relating to promoting, permitting or engaging in gambling. This classification is broken into three divisions:
- (a) bookmaking (horse and sport book),
 - (b) numbers and lottery and
 - (c) all other gambling.
- (20) **Offenses Against Family and Children**—includes all charges of nonsupport, neglect or abuse of family and children such as desertion, abandonment or nonsupport, neglect or abuse of child, or nonpayment of alimony.
- (21) **Driving Under the Influence**—limited to driving or operating any vehicle while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotic drugs.
- (22) **Liquor Laws**—with the exception of drunkenness and driving under the influence, all state or local liquor law violations are placed in this class. Federal violations are not included. Include manufacturing, selling, transporting, furnishing as in maintaining unlawful drinking places, bootlegging, operating a still, furnishing liquor to a minor and using vehicle for illegal transportation of liquor.
- (23) **Drunkenness-Intoxication**—includes all offenses of drunkenness or intoxication with the exception of driving under the influence. This generally encompasses drunk and disorderly behavior and public intoxication.
- (24) **Disorderly Conduct-Disturbing the Peace**—include all disorderly persons who can not be classified under offenses 1 through 23 or under offense 25.
- (25) **Vagrancy**—include arrests for failure of an individual to give a good account of himself, begging, loitering, etc.
- (26) **All Other Offenses**—include all violations of state and local laws not otherwise classified.
- (27) **Suspicion**—limited to suspicion arrests when the persons arrested are released by the police.
- (28) **Curfew and Loitering Law Violations**—(Juveniles) all arrests made for violations of local curfew or loitering ordinances.
- (29) **Runaways**—(Juveniles) limited to juveniles taken into custody who have run away from the reporting jurisdiction.

Crime Index Trends

Introduction

One of the purposes of the Uniform Crime Reporting Program is to measure the extent of crime in the State. The crime index offenses are used as the measuring tool. The crime index offenses are:

1. Murder, Manslaughter
2. Forcible Rape
3. Robbery
4. Felony Assault
5. Burglary
6. Larceny/Theft
7. Motor Vehicle Theft

Law enforcement agencies are required to submit a monthly report of how many of these offenses were reported or known to them. Of course, the reporting of these offenses depends on the attitude of the citizens towards reporting of crime to the law enforcement agency. A change in the victim's attitude towards reporting of crime will cause a change in the number of offenses known to the police, reflecting either an increase or decrease in crime. Individuals reviewing the data in this publication should keep this fact in mind. Caution should be exercised in making direct comparisons of crime and arrest data reported by law enforcement agencies. Below are some of the conditions which will by type and volume, affect the crime that occurs from place to place:

Density and size of the community population and the metropolitan area of which it is a part.

Composition of the population with reference particularly to age, sex and race.

Economic status of the population.

Relative stability of population, including commuters, seasonal and other transient types.

Climate, including seasonal weather changes.

Educational, recreational and religious characteristics.

Standards governing appointments to the police force.

Policies of the prosecuting officials and the courts.

Attitude of the public towards law enforcement problems.

The administrative and investigative efficiency of the local law enforcement agency, including the degree of adherence to crime reporting standards.

Crime and Population, 1971-1975

Crime reported during 1975 reflected a 46 percent increase over 1971. Nebraska's population has increased 2.2 percent over 1971 and the crime rate per 1,000 population has increased 43 percent. Although crime continues to increase, it has not increased as much as it did in 1974. During 1974, 8,189 more crimes were reported than in 1973 and there were 4,045 more crimes reported in 1975 over 1974.

According to population groupings, cities of 100,000 to 250,000 population (the City of Lincoln) had the greatest increase in crime over 1971, a 64 percent increase. Cities of 250,000 and over population (the City of Omaha) had a 38 percent increase over 1971, however, it was the only group reporting a decrease in 1975 over 1974.

Cities of 5,000 to 100,000 population had a 51 percent increase over 1971, cities under 5,000 population had a 62 percent increase over 1971. Counties had a 42 percent increase over 1971. The State agencies, which report offenses occurring on State property, had a 31 percent increase over 1971.

The crime rate, or the chances of becoming a victim of an index offense, for the State in 1975 was 35.6 offenses per 1,000 population. Of those cities over 5,000 population, the City of South Sioux City had the highest crime rate in 1975, 85.5 offenses per 1,000 population. Douglas County, excluding those cities that submit UCR's, had a crime rate of 99.8 offenses per 1,000 population.

Crime Index Offenses, 1971-1975

The crime index offenses have increased 46 percent over 1971. Robbery has had the greatest increase, 157 percent, over 1971. Murder, manslaughter has increased 76 percent, forcible rape has increased 43 percent, felony assault has increased 41 percent, burglary has increased 42 percent, larceny-theft has increased 53 percent and motor vehicle theft has decreased seven percent over 1971.

Although six of the seven index offenses have increased since 1971, some of them have decreased in 1975 as compared to 1974. Robbery decreased 0.3 percent, burglary decreased two percent and motor vehicle theft decreased 17 percent in 1975 over 1974.

Percent of State's Total Crime by Population Groups, 1971-1975



Crime and Population in Nebraska, 1971-1975



Murder, Manslaughter, 1971-1975



Forcible Rape, 1971-1975



Robbery, 1971-1975



Percent Change Over 1971



Percent Change Over 1971



Percent Change Over 1971




Offense Data, 1975

This section contains a detailed analysis of the index offenses reported to the Commission by law enforcement agencies. Estimates are not included for those agencies which did not report for all twelve months of 1975.

Crime Rates

The crime rate is the number of offenses per 1,000 population. To compute the crime rate, divide the population by 1,000 and divide the number of offenses by that answer. The 1975 estimated population for Nebraska is 1,546,000 as provided by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Clearances

For UCR purposes, an Index Offense is cleared when a law enforcement agency has identified the offender, there is enough evidence to charge him and he is actually taken into custody. The arrest of one person can clear several crimes or several persons may be arrested in the process of clearing one crime.

Exceptional clearances are included in the total number of clearances. An offense may be exceptionally cleared when it falls into one of the following categories:

1. The offender commits suicide.
2. A double murder occurs (two persons kill each other).
3. The offender dies after making a confession.
4. The offender is killed by a law enforcement officer.
5. The offender confesses to committing the crime while already in custody for another crime or serving a sentence.
6. The offender is prosecuted in another city for a different crime by federal, state or local authorities, or for the same offense, and the other jurisdiction refuses to release the offender.
7. Another jurisdiction refuses to extradite the offender.
8. The victim of a crime refuses to cooperate in the prosecution.
9. The offender is prosecuted for a less serious charge than the one for which he was arrested.
10. The offender is a juvenile who is handled by a verbal or written notice to the parents in instances involving minor offenses such as petit larceny.

Volume

A total of 57,541 index offenses were reported or known to law enforcement agencies in 1975. Of these offenses 1,966 were unfounded due to false or baseless complaints leaving a total of 55,575 actual offenses.

The violent crimes of murder, manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery and felony assault accounted for 7.2 percent of the total actual offenses. The property crimes of burglary, larceny-theft and motor vehicle theft accounted for 92.8 percent of the total actual offenses.

Felony assault accounted for 55.8 percent of the violent crimes and larceny-theft accounted for 70.4 percent of the crimes against property. Larceny-theft was the most prevalent of all crimes, accounting for 65.4 percent of the total actual offenses.

Crime Rates

Based on an estimated population of 1,546,000, the crime rate per 1,000 population was 35.9 in 1975. The crime rate for violent crimes was 2.6 per 1,000 population. The crime rate for crimes against property was 33.4 per 1,000 population. Larceny-theft had a crime rate of 23.5 per 1,000 population.

Clearances

A total of 13,117 index offenses were reported cleared during 1975. The percentage of clearances for the index offenses was 23.6 percent. Murder, manslaughter had the greatest percentage of offenses cleared, 84.8 percent. Violent crimes had a clearance rate of 58.3 percent. Crimes against property had a 20.9 percent clearance rate.

When comparing the number of clearances with the number of offenses reported during the year, it was noted that a larger percentage of violent crimes are cleared than property crimes. This can be attributed to the fact that there are more property crimes to be solved and police investigations of violent crimes are usually more intense. The element of confrontation between the victim and the perpetrator, as well as witness identification of the perpetrator, contributes to the higher rate of clearance.

Special Survey

During October and November of 1975, a special survey was conducted on thefts of citizens' band (CB) radios. The 120 participating agencies reported 511 radios stolen in October and 428 stolen in November. The approximate total value of the stolen radios was \$164,782. CB radios were stolen out of 882 vehicles with 64 percent of the vehicles being forcibly entered. During October and November, 84 CB radios were recovered and only 45 could be positively identified by the owners.

Murder, Manslaughter

Murder is defined as the unlawful killing of a human being in which the element of malice aforethought was present. Manslaughter is defined as any unlawful killing of a human being without the element of malice aforethought. Suicides, accidental deaths and justifiable or excusable homicides are excluded.

Volume and Rate

During the calendar year 1975, a total of 66 murders were reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska. Murder, manslaughter accounted for 1.7 percent of all violent crimes (murder, manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery and felony assault) and one-tenth of one percent of all Index Offenses. In 1975, there were .04 murders per 1,000 population. Of all murders, 54.5 percent occurred within the City of Omaha.

Murder, Manslaughter Analysis

The Nebraska UCR program collects additional information regarding all reported murders. This additional information is the date of the homicide, age, sex, and race of the victim, type of weapon(s) used, and circumstances surrounding the murder.

Of the victims, 63.6 percent were white, 31.8 percent were Negro and 4.5 percent were Indian. Males were victims in 72.7 percent of the murders committed. The majority of the victims ranged between the age of 18 and 29.

The age group, 30-34 years, accounted for the highest percent of persons arrested for murder, 17 percent. Males accounted for 77 percent of all persons arrested for murder.

Of all persons arrested for murder, 50 percent White, 44 percent were Negro and 6 percent were of other races.

Firearms were used in 71.2 percent of all murders. The use of a knife was involved in 12.1 percent of all murders.

A total of 56 murders was cleared during 1975.

Forcible Rape

Forcible Rape is defined as the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will. All assaults and attempts to rape are counted, but carnal abuse, without force (statutory rape) and other sex offenses are not included.

Volume and Rate

During 1975, law enforcement agencies in Nebraska reported a total of 296 forcible rapes. Forcible rape accounted for 7.4 percent of all violent crimes (murder, manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery and felony assault) and 0.5 percent of all Index Offenses. In 1975, there were 0.2 forcible rapes per 1,000 population. Since forcible rape is a crime against the female population, the crime rate is 0.4 per 1,000 female population. Of all reported forcible rapes, 60.1 percent occurred within the City of Omaha.

Analysis of Forcible Rape

Rape by force accounted for 72.6 percent of all forcible rapes and 27.4 percent were attempts to rape.

The age group accounting for the highest percentage of persons arrested for forcible rape, 14 percent, occurred within the 25-29 age group. Juvenile arrests accounted for 23 percent of all persons arrested for forcible rape.

Of all persons arrested for forcible rape, 59 percent were White, 38 percent were Negro, and two percent were Indian.

A total of 183 forcible rapes was cleared during 1975.

Rape Circumstances

Law enforcement agencies are asked to submit a supplementary report on the circumstances surrounding any forcible rape. Supplementary reports were received on 111 forcible rapes; the Omaha P.D. did not submit any supplementary reports. Victims under the age of 25 accounted for 78.4 percent of the total victims and 55.2 percent of those victims were between the ages of 18 and 24. The victim knew the perpetrator(s) in 28 percent of the rape situations. The perpetrators unlawfully entered the victim's residence in 21.6 percent of the situations. In 14 of the rape situations, there was more than one perpetrator involved.

Robbery

Robbery is the taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear. Robbery takes place in the presence of the victim. The victim, who usually is the owner or person having custody of the property is directly confronted by the perpetrator and is threatened with force or fear that force will be used. Robberies are reported in the following categories: gun, knife or cutting instrument, other dangerous weapon and strong arm—no weapon.

Volume and Rate

During the calendar year 1975, a total of 1,399 robberies were reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska. Robbery accounted for 35.1 percent of all violent crimes (murder, manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery and felony assault) and 2.5 percent of all Index Offenses. In 1975, there were 0.9 robberies per 1,000 population. Within the City of Omaha, 86.6 percent of all robberies occurred.

Analysis of Robbery

A gun was used in 48.2 percent of all robberies, a knife or other cutting instrument was used in 9.6 percent, other dangerous weapons were used in 3.3 percent and strong arm tactics were used in 38.9 percent of all robberies.

A total of 460 robberies was cleared by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska in 1975.

Of all robberies, 48 percent occurred on streets, highways, alleys, etc. Robbery of a commercial house accounted for 22.1 percent and the robbery of a person in his home accounted for 11.2 percent of all robberies.

The age group of 17 accounted for the highest percentage, 14 percent, of all persons arrested for robbery. The arrest of males accounted for 91 percent of all arrests for robbery.

Of all persons arrested for robbery, 38 percent were White, 59 percent were Negro and three percent were Indian.

Felony Assault

Felony assault is an unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. Felony assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily injury.

Volume and Rate

During calendar year 1975, there were 2,220 felony assaults reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska. Felony assault accounted for 55.8 percent of all violent crimes (murder, manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery and felony assault) and four percent of all Index Offenses.

The felony assault rate for 1975 amounted to 1.4 felony assaults per 1,000 population.

Of all felony assaults, 50.2 percent occurred within the City of Omaha.

A total of 1,622 felony assaults were cleared in 1975.

Analysis of Felony Assault

A gun was used in 27.2 percent of all felony assaults and hands, fists, feet were used in 30.6 percent. The use of other dangerous weapons accounted for 23.9 percent and the use of a knife accounted for 18.3 percent of all felony assaults.

The age group of 25-29 accounted for the highest percent of persons arrested for felony assaults, 18 percent. Arrests of males for felony assaults accounted for 87 percent of all arrests for felony assault.

Of all arrests for felony, 62 percent were White, 32 percent were Negro, five percent were Indian and one percent were of other races.

During 1975, agencies provided victim/offender relationships on each assault reported, including misdemeanor assaults. The assault would be categorized as either relationship established or stranger-to-stranger. Victim/offender relationships were received on 2,285 assaults. The victims of assaults knew the perpetrator in 61.4 percent of the incidents, and did not know the perpetrator in 38.6 percent of the incidents.

Burglary

Burglary is defined as any unlawful entry or attempted forcible entry of any structure to commit a felony or larceny. Burglary is divided into three categories: forcible entry, unlawful entry—no force, and attempted forcible entry.

Volume and Rate

During calendar year 1975, a total of 11,710 burglaries were reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska. Burglary accounted for 22.7 percent of all crimes against property (burglary, larceny-theft and motor vehicle theft) and 21.1 percent of all Index Offenses. In 1975, there were 7.6 burglaries per 1,000 population. The City of Omaha accounted for 44.6 percent of all reported burglaries.

Analysis of Burglary

Of all burglaries, 73.9 percent were the result of forcible entries and 21.8 percent were unlawful entries with no force used to enter the structure. Attempted burglaries accounted for 4.4 percent of the total reported burglaries.

Of all reported burglaries, 59 percent involved residences and 41 percent involved non-residences. Of the residential burglaries, 37.2 percent occurred during the night, 27.7 percent occurred during the day and the time was unknown in 35.1 percent. Non-residential burglaries occurred most frequently during the night, 70.2 percent, the time of entry was unknown in 25.4 percent and entries during the day accounted for 4.4 percent.

The age group of 13-14 accounted for the highest percentage of persons arrested for burglary, 14 percent. Male arrests accounted for 96 percent of all arrests for burglary and juveniles accounted for 56 percent.

Of all persons arrested for burglary, 80 percent were White, 15 percent were Negro, four percent were Indian and one percent were of other races.

A total of 2,214 burglaries were cleared during 1975.

Larceny-Theft

Larceny-theft is the unlawful taking of the property of another with intent to deprive him of ownership. Larceny-theft as an Index Offense includes larcenies under \$50 in value.

Volume and Rate

During calendar year 1975, a total of 36,326 larceny-thefts were reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska. Larceny-theft accounted for 70.4 percent of all crimes against property (burglary, larceny-theft and motor vehicle theft) and 65.4 percent of all Index Offenses. In 1975, there were 23.5 larceny-thefts per 1,000 population. Of all larcenies, 38.2 percent occurred within the City of Omaha.

Analysis of Larceny-Theft

Of the total larcenies reported, 45.2 percent were under \$50 in value, 38.7 percent were \$50-\$200 in value and 16.1 percent were over \$200 in value. The theft of motor vehicle parts and accessories accounted for 22.4 percent of all thefts. Thefts from motor vehicles, other than parts and accessories accounted for 17.6 percent of all thefts.

The age group of 13-14 accounted for the highest percentage of persons arrested for larceny-theft, 15 percent. Male arrests accounted for 62 percent of all larceny-theft arrests and juveniles accounted for 55 percent.

Of all persons arrested for larceny-theft, 79 percent were White, 17 percent were Negro, three percent were Indian and 0.4 percent were of other races.

A total of 7,519 larceny-thefts were cleared during 1975.

Motor Vehicle Theft

Motor vehicle theft is defined as the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle. Thefts of farm equipment, bulldozers, airplanes and construction equipment are not included in the definition of a motor vehicle. Motor vehicle theft is divided into the following categories: autos, trucks and buses, and other vehicles.

Volume and Rate

During calendar year 1975, 3,558 motor vehicle thefts were reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska. Motor vehicle theft accounted for 6.9 percent of all crimes against property (burglary, larceny-theft and motor vehicle theft) and 6.4 percent of all Index Offenses. In 1975, there were 2.3 motor vehicle thefts per 1,000 population. Of all motor vehicle thefts 60 percent occurred within the City of Omaha.

Analysis of Motor Vehicle Theft

During 1975, law enforcement agencies provided additional information regarding types of motor vehicles stolen. The agencies reported that 2,564 autos, 420 trucks and buses and 574 other vehicles were stolen.

During 1975, 2,902 motor vehicles were recovered; 81 percent were recovered within the same jurisdiction where they were stolen, 19.1 percent were recovered in another jurisdiction.

The age group accounting for the highest percentage of persons arrested for motor vehicle theft, 20 percent, occurred in the age group of 13-14. Male arrests accounted for 92 percent of all motor vehicle theft arrests and juveniles accounted for 65 percent.

Of all persons arrested for motor vehicle theft, 83 percent were White, 11 percent were Negro, five percent were Indian and two percent were of other races.

A total of 1,063 motor vehicles thefts was cleared in 1975.

Arrest Data, 1975

The Uniform Crime Reporting program requires the reporting agencies to report on a monthly basis the number of arrests made for offenses which occurred in their jurisdiction. The arresting agency does not report an arrest if it was made for a violation in another jurisdiction. The reporting agencies are required to report State Patrol arrests in their jurisdictions.

A person is scored only once each time arrested, which means if a person is arrested and is wanted for several crimes, he would be scored only once for the most serious offense. Several persons may be arrested in connection with one crime and each person is counted as an arrest.

Volume and Rate

Law enforcement agencies in Nebraska reported 57,431 arrests in 1975 for Part I and Part II offenses. This represents a 0.6 percent increase over 1974 arrests. There were 37.1 arrests per 1,000 persons in Nebraska in 1975 as compared with 37.0 arrests per 1,000 persons in 1974.

Arrests for Part I offenses accounted for 20.8 percent of the total arrests. Of the arrests for Part I offenses, larceny-theft accounted for the greatest portion of the arrests, 62.5 percent. The highest percentage of arrests for Part II offenses involved drunkenness, intoxication.

During 1975, arrests for crimes of violence (murder, manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery and felony assault) accounted for 13.1 percent of all arrests for Part I offenses and 2.7 percent of the total arrests.

Arrests for crimes against property (burglary, larceny-theft and motor vehicle theft) accounted for 86.8 percent of all arrests for Part I offenses and 18 percent of total arrests.

Arrests for Part I offenses increased six percent over arrests for Part I offenses in 1974. Forceable rape showed the greatest increase of 26 percent. Arrests for death by negligence, burglary and motor vehicle theft all decreased over 1974.

Arrests for Part II offenses decreased 0.7 percent over 1974 arrests for Part II offenses. Arrests for embezzlement reflected a 71 percent increase over 1974.

Arrests by Age

The number of persons under the age of 18 (juveniles) arrested during 1975 decreased six percent over 1974. Arrests of juveniles for Part I offenses also decreased three percent over 1974. The arrests of persons age 18 and over (adults) increased three percent over 1974. Adult arrests for Part I offenses increased 18 percent over 1974.

Of the arrests for the index offenses (murder, manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, felony assault, burglary, larceny and motor vehicle theft), 81 percent were under the age of 25, and of those, 64 percent were under the age of 18. The age group of 13-14 accounted for the

greatest number of arrests in any age group for the index offenses.

The arrests of persons under the age of 25 accounted for the following percentages of the total arrests for each index offense: murder, manslaughter, 40 percent; forcible rape, 66 percent; robbery, 76 percent; felony assault, 57 percent; burglary, 89 percent; larceny-theft, 81 percent; and motor vehicle theft, 89 percent.

Of those arrests for index offenses involving persons under the age of 25, persons under the age of 18 accounted for 28 percent for murder, manslaughter, 34 percent for forcible rape, 49 percent for robbery, 36 percent for felony assault, 63 percent for burglary, 67 percent for larceny-theft and 73 percent for motor vehicle theft.

Arrests by Sex

In 1975, males accounted for 83.1 percent of all arrests. Males accounted for 73.7 percent of the arrests for Part I offenses and 85.6 percent of all arrests for Part II offenses. Total male arrests decreased 0.6 percent over 1974 and female arrests increased seven percent. As in the past years, the female arrests have increased more than the male arrests. Male arrests for Part I offenses increased four percent over 1974. Female arrests for Part I offenses increased 14 percent. Male arrests for Part II offenses decreased one percent and female arrests increased four percent.

Females were arrested for larceny-theft more times than any other offense. The greatest number of male arrests were recorded for drunkenness-intoxication.

Arrests by Race

A distribution analysis of total arrests by race for the year 1975 indicates that 80.4 percent of all arrests were White, 10.2 percent were Negro, 8.6 percent were Indian and 0.8 percent were of other races. The arrest involvement by race for the Index Offenses revealed that 76.3 percent were White, 19.9 percent were Negro, 3.2 percent were Indian and 0.6 percent were of other races.

An analysis of arrests by race for crimes of violence (murder, manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery and felony assault) revealed that 52.5 percent were White, 42.7 percent were Negro, four percent were Indian and 0.8 percent were of other races.

An analysis of arrests by race for crimes against property (burglary, larceny-theft and motor vehicle theft) revealed that 79.9 percent were White, 16.4 percent were Negro, 3.1 percent were Indian and 0.6 percent were of other races.

An analysis of arrests by race for Part II offenses revealed that 81.4 percent were White, 7.7 percent were Negro, 10.1 percent were Indian, and 0.9 percent were of other races.

Percent of Adult-Juvenile Involvement in Total Index Offenses Based Upon Arrest Data



Dispositions of Persons Handled by Police

The Nebraska UCR Program collects police disposition data on all persons handled by the police. Adult disposition categories are: (1) charged by the police, (2) handled within the department and (3) referred to other police agency. The juvenile disposition categories are: (1) charged by the police, (2) handled within the department, (3) referred to welfare agency and (4) referred to other police agency.

"Charged by the police" refers to those persons who are referred to the proper prosecuting authority. Those persons who are categorized as "charged" are divided into (1) arrested, held for prosecution or (2) summoned, notified or cited.

Not all persons arrested are referred to a prosecutive authority by the police but are instead dealt with in other ways. A person may be held overnight without any formal charges being filed. Runaways often times are held until parents or relatives pick them up and no further action is taken. A person may also be scored as "handled within the department" when the victim refuses to bring charges against the alleged offender and the incidence is settled between the two.

A juvenile may be referred to a welfare agency, either public or private, by the arresting agency. However, if the referral is made by the proper prosecuting authority, the person would be categorized as "charged." An arrested person who has also committed a crime in another

jurisdiction and who is referred to that jurisdiction for prosecution, is categorized as "referred to other police agency." A juvenile who commits a crime outside the jurisdiction in which he resides may be referred to his home jurisdiction for prosecution and is scored as "referred to other police agency."

During 1975, the police charged 90.8 percent of all persons handled. "Adults charged" accounted for 97.5 percent of the total adult arrests and "juveniles charged" accounted for 72.4 percent of all juvenile arrests. Persons handled within the department accounted for 8.3 percent of the total arrests. Juveniles referred to a welfare agency accounted for 1.2 percent of the total juvenile arrests. Persons referred to another police agency accounted for 0.6 percent of the total arrests.

In 1975, the UCR agencies were asked to submit court dispositions on those persons charged. Since 1975 was the first year of collecting such data, not all agencies could provide all the necessary data. A total of 70 agencies, 33 percent, provided disposition data on 19,823 persons charged by police.

Of the 19,823 persons charged and referred to criminal or adult court, 68.3 percent were guilty of a lesser offense, 12.5 percent were acquitted or otherwise dismissed and 15.0 percent of the cases were still pending. Referrals to juvenile court accounted for 51.2 percent of the total juveniles charged by police.

Law Enforcement Employee Data

The Nebraska Uniform Crime Reporting Program also collects data pertaining to law enforcement personnel on an annual basis. Law enforcement agencies are surveyed each year on the number of full-time personnel employed, the number of sworn personnel by sex, and the number of civilian personnel.

As of October 31, 1975, there were 2,616 persons employed full-time in 195 law enforcement agencies, excluding the 494 employed by the State Patrol. These 2,616 employees represented an average of 1.7 persons for every 1,000 persons in the State. Of the full-time employees, 2,030 were sworn personnel, which represented an average of 1.3 persons per 1,000 population. Civilian personnel accounted for 22.6 percent of the total full-time employees, and represented an average of 0.4 persons per 1,000 population.

Female personnel accounted for three percent of the total sworn personnel and 68.4 percent of the civilian personnel.

County Sheriff's Departments

As of October 31, 1975, a total of 705 persons were employed in 86 county sheriff's departments, representing 1.5 persons per 1,000 population. Sworn personnel accounted for 70 percent of the total employees, 1.1 persons per 1,000 population. Civilian personnel accounted for 31 percent of the total employees representing an average of 0.5 persons per 1,000 population. Female personnel accounted for five percent of the total sworn personnel and 60 percent of the civilian personnel.

Municipal Police Departments

As of October 31, 1975, a total of 1,911 persons were employed full-time by 109 municipal law enforcement agencies, representing 1.8 persons per 1,000 population. Sworn personnel accounted for 80 percent of the total employees, 1.4 persons per 1,000 population. Civilian personnel accounted for 20 percent of the total law enforcement employees representing 0.4 persons per 1,000 population. Female personnel accounted for two percent of the total sworn personnel and 73 percent of the total civilian personnel.

Nebraska State Patrol

As of October 31, 1975, a total of 494 persons were employed full-time by the Nebraska State Patrol. Sworn personnel accounted for 77 percent of the total employees. There were 41 female civilian employees and no females employed as sworn officers.

Assaults on Law Enforcement Officers

The Nebraska Uniform Crime Reporting Program also collects data on every law enforcement officer assaulted or killed. During 1975, there were a total of 309 assaults on law enforcement officers. There were 252 assaults on municipal officers, 41 assaults on officers of county sheriff's departments, 15 assaults on State patrolmen, and one assault on an officer of the Campus Police of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln.

Most of the assaults, 29 percent, occurred while responding to disturbance calls and 25 percent occurred while attempting to make an arrest. The officer was assaulted with hands, fists or feet in 68 percent of the assaults and 58 percent of these assaults resulted in injury to the officer. A total of 293 assaults on police officers were cleared during 1975.


