


Dear Governor Moore:

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
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The Governor's Committee on Crime,
Delinquency and Correction

The Governor's Committee on Crime, Delinquency and Correction (GCCDC) was formally created by Executive Order in August, 1968. Pursuant to the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968, the GCCDC was designated as the State Planning Agency for West Virginia. The original mandates of the Executive Order and the Congressional action charged the GCCDC with developing a comprehensive criminal justice plan to channel federal funds into improvements for West Virginia's system of criminal justice.

The Law Enforcement Assistance Administration (LEAA), created by Congress in the aforementioned Act, approves the annual comprehensive plan and releases the federal dollars in a block grant so that the GCCDC may proceed to award funds to projects which meet the requirements of the Comprehensive Plan. The law requires all federal funds to be matched by state and local dollars. The West Virginia Legislature appropriates the state matching funds and the County Commissions and City Councils appropriate the local matching funds. The Comprehensive Plan deals with all areas of criminal justice including law enforcement, courts, prosecution, juvenile delinquency, corrections, juvenile detention, crime prevention, drug abuse, etc. Training of criminal justice personnel has been and will continue to be a number one priority for the GCCDC.

Structure and Membership of
The Committee

The Committee, which meets monthly, is representative of the various components of the entire criminal justice system in West Virginia. Operating under the guidelines of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act, this diverse representation gives a multi-disciplined approach to the definition, development and correlation of problems, goals, priorities and programs to improve justice and reduce crime. The members of the Committee are appointed by the Governor, receive no salary and take time from their personal employment to perform their Committee function which consists of reviewing applications, approving projects and awarding funds to State agencies and local units of government under the appropriate program areas as set forth in the State Plan. The most important aspect of Committee work is the annual development of a Comprehensive Criminal Justice Plan which is submitted to the Governor and then to LEAA. 

STRUCTURE AND FUNCTIONS OF
THE STAFF

The Governor's Committee on Crime, Delinquency and Correction's staff has four organizational components which are as follows: the Office of Executive Director; the Division of Program Development; the Division of Program Management; and the Support Services Division. These four organizational components are responsible for developing, administering and awarding all Part B, Part C, Part E and discretionary funds under the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 as amended.

The primary responsibilities for each major component of the GCCDC's staff are as follows: (1) Office of the Executive Director - The Office of the Executive Director is responsible for the overall operation, management and control of the GCCDC. This office has six personnel assigned to carry out its responsibilities. In addition to the general management and administration of the LEAA program in West Virginia, the Office of Executive Director also contains an organizational component which is the GCCDC Office of Audit. The two auditors employed by the State Planning Agency (staff of the GCCDC) work independently of any component within the SPA and work directly under the Executive Director; (2) Program Development Division - The Program Development Division of the SPA is responsible for developing the Comprehensive Criminal Justice Plan for the State of West Virginia. This Division has ten staff members and is responsible for the evaluation of projects funded, research in the field of criminal justice and general planning and oversight of responsibility for the State's efforts to reduce crime and improve justice; (3) Division of Program Management - The division of Program Management is responsible for project planning, application development, project awards and project management of all subgrants awarded by the GCCDC. Included within this responsibility is fiscal and programmatic project monitoring. The Program Management Division has nineteen staff positions and is the primary organizational element responsible for effective projects designed to reduce crime and/or improve the system of justice; and (4) The Office of Support Services - The Office of Support Services is responsible for providing important administrative and management services to the entire Agency. Examples of these services are as follows: automated grants management information system; personnel; accounting; travel; office space and supplies; etc. The Support Services Division has six staff positions.

HIGHLIGHTS AND ACTIVITIES

FY 1976

The twelve month period from July 1, 1975, to June 30, 1976, proved to be a time of important actions on the part of the Committee and increased workload for the staff. The following outline indicates the highlights and activities of both the Committee and the Staff during this period.

Committee Activities

- The Committee reviewed and approved 262 subgrant applications for federal and state funds.
- The Committee held 11 meetings throughout this 12 month period.
- The Committee held a Workshop in Pipestem, West Virginia and reviewed and approved the Comprehensive Criminal Justice Plan for FY 1976.
- The Committee held a two day Workshop at West Virginia State Police Academy and initiated efforts towards developing standards and goals for the Criminal Justice System in West Virginia.
- The Committee approved funds for many new and innovative programs for the Criminal Justice System in West Virginia.

Staff Activities

- The staff prepared 229 applications for local units of government.
- The staff maintained fiscal controls over 33.6 million federal dollars received to date.
- The staff developed 33 applications for state agencies.
- The staff developed the FY 1976 Comprehensive Criminal Justice Plan.
- The staff developed the FY 1976 Part B Planning Grant Application.
- The staff reviewed fiscal and program content, civil rights compliance and program compliance of the 262 applications approved by the Committee.
- The staff completed detailed evaluations of ongoing projects within the criminal justice system.

This chart indicates the federal funds awarded by the GCCDC and the state and local funds which matched the federal funds between July 1, 1975 and June 30, 1976.




