

The source of the information is the Fiscal Yea. 1972 Planning Grant applications submitted under Part B. Title I of P.L. 90-351, the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act.

SUMMARY

SECTION I - State Planning Agency Staff Data

The total number of full time State Planning Agency personnel on board increased from 845 in Fiscal Year 1971 to 1114 in Fiscal Year 1972, an increase of 31.8%. The number of professionals employed increased 30.4% from 556 in Fiscal Year 1971 to 725 in Fiscal Year 1972. The average level of staffing in State Planning Agencies (expressed as a percentage of authorized personnel) increased slightly from 81.8% Fiscal Year 1971 to 83.1% Fiscal Year 1972.

An analysis of the number of professionals with expertise or responsibilities in specific functional areas revealed that the most significant increase in staffing was in the category "Other," which includes such areas as information systems, community organization, fiscal administration, research, statistics, and public administration.

The totals are greater than the total number of SPA professionals because in cases where a staff member has appropriate background in more than one area, he was counted as having expertise in more than one area.

The percentage of staff with responsibilities or specialities in areas of criminal justice (including Police, Riots and Disorders, Organized Crime, Courts, Corrections, and Juvenile Delinquency) has decreased from 46% in Fiscal Year 1971 to 36% in Fiscal Year 1972. Consequently the percentage of staff other than criminal justice specialists (including Planning, Grant Administration and Other) increased from 54% to 64%.

A. Guidelines to Numberical Breakdown of Supervisory Board Personnel.

These breakdowns use the same classification guidelines as used in Fiscal Year 1971. Treatment of some of the unusual areas is discussed below:

Almost all persons are counted only once in their representation. The major exception to this is in the case of Juvenile Court Judges and Juvenile Corrections personnel who are counted both under "Courts" or "Corrections" and "Juvenile Delinquency." Representation is determined by one's current position and not by former position or employment prior to retirement; therefore, retired persons are counted under "Citizen Interest."

State Senators and Representatives may be represented under either State or Local, but for the purpose of this breakdown as "Local," since it is assumed that their primary interest is in the well-being of their constituency. Other examples of "Local" persons are State's Attorneys, District Attorneys, County Attorneys, Federal employees, District, Circuit. County and Municipal Court Judges are also considered "Local" while Supreme and Superior Court Judges are counted as "State."

The Courts, Prosecution and Defense category includes all persons who prosecute for State, local and Federal Courts, all attorneys engaged in private practice, Public Defenders, Legal Aid employees, judges and court administrators.

"Juvenile Delinquency" is generally represented by persons involved in other aspects of law enforcement; juvenile delinquency representation thus includes Juvenile Court Judges, Juvenile Corrections personnel, and Police assigned specifically to juvenile areas. In addition, high school principals are included in this category.

Included in the Locally Elected Executive Officials category are those persons elected to policy-making positions at the local level such as mayors, councilmen, city managers, selectmen, aldermen, town treasurers and trustees, and county commissioners and supervisors. Also included are assistants to the mayor and representatives of urban and municipal leagues who, while not directly elected, are usually appointed by the mayor.

The "General Public Administration" category, originally designated for Governors, State Senators and State Representatives, has become a catch-all for those persons employed by State and local government in non-law enforcement related capacities. Some examples are Civil Defense, Department of Finance, Department of Mental Health, Department

of Human Resources, Board of Pharmacy, State Planning Office, Civil Rights Commission and Bureau of Public Administration.

A comparison with the Fiscal Year 1971 breakdown shows that the Supervisory Boards are less functionally oriented in FY 72. In Fiscal Year 1971, there were 63% functional specialists and 37% generalists, while in Fiscal Year 1972, there are 59% functional specialists and 41% generalists.

Local/State representation breaks down to 59% Local to 41% State.

LEAA has been criticized as a Police-dominated funding organization. From the standpoint of Supervisory Boards, however, this is unwarranted. In Fiscal Year 1971, Police representation was about 22% of total Board membership and in Fiscal Year 1972, 21%. Non-Police representation is up to 79% in Fiscal Year 1972 from 78% in Fiscal Year 1971.

SECTION III - Regional Planning Data

Continuing as a significant factor in regional planning data is the increased SPA responsiveness to the needs of large cities for planning funds.

Twenty-two States have included funding to regions composed of one city and its metropolitan area, an increase of 11 over last year. Of these, 7 specifically list the areas. The 22 States are Alaska, Connecticut, Delaware, Georgia, Hawaii, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Texas, Washington, and Wyoming.

Eight States have funded cities by the "pass through" process used by the regional planning units. They are Colorado, Idaho, New Hampshire, New Mexico, Puerto Rico, South Dakota, and Utah. Thus, 30 States are giving special attention to their larger cities and their metropolitan areas in allocating planning funds.

The basis for allocation of planning funds in 21 States in Fiscal Year 1971 was strictly population, a base amount plus population, or a formula that divided funds equally among regions regardless of population or other factors. In Fiscal Year 1972, the number of States using these types of allocation formulas remained at 21. The number of States in which crime indices are definitely a factor in the allocation of funds was 15 in Fiscal Year 1972, a decrease of 3 from Fiscal Year 1971.

In Fiscal Year 1972, 39 States have formal regional planning structures, a decrease of 4 over last year. Seven State Planning Agencies pass funds directly to local units of government, an increase of two over last year. Four U.S. Territories and also the District of Columbia do not have local units of government, a condition which makes the 40% fund distribution plan requirement not applicable.

The number of regions per State varies from 2 in West Virginia to 26 in Nebraska. The average number of regions in States which have regions is 10.2 in Fiscal Year 1972; a decrease of 0.2 regions per State over last year.

Regional policy boards do not exist in Kansas, although the procedures exist, or in Louisiana despite both States being divided into regions. The State of Florida has no State, regional or metropolitan planning entities. Existing planning regions are single-purpose and non-uniform. Regional Policy Boards appear in every other State in which a regional planning structure has been established. The role and authority of these Boards, however, vary greatly from State to State from ones whose powers are strictly advisory to ones that are largely responsible for setting priorities and developing programs, which are subject only to final approval at the State level.

Of the 39 States which designated specific amounts of planning funds to be distributed among its regions, allocations range from a low of \$2,756 in Utah, to a nigh of \$390,000 in New York. The range in Fiscal Mear 1971 was from \$681 in Iowa to \$537,227 in California.

Finally, SPA services are provided in lieu of planning funds in only 3 States in Fiscal Year 1972, Montana, Hawaii, and the Virgin Islands, as compared with only Montana and Hawaii last year.

SECTION IV - Salary Scale For Top Level Positions

The average annual salary for Executive Directors of State planning agencies as recorded in the Fiscal Year 1972 Planning Grant applications is \$20,235; the median salary is \$19,478. The average annual salary of the next highest paid State Planning Agency official, usually the Deputy or Assistant Director, is \$16,401 or about \$3,800 less; the median salary of the second highest paid official is \$16,000.

The salary range for top level positions within the State Planning Agencies was wide. The highest salary for a Director being \$38,006 paid by New York, the lowest salary for a Director was \$12,780 paid by South Dakota. Assistant Director salaries ranged from \$28,000 paid by New York to \$9,000 paid by American Samoa.

An analysis of these annual salaries reveals that the average salary scale for Directors is significantly higher in the Mid-Atlantic 1/ region of the country. The average annual salary of the Executive Director in New York, New Jersey, Delaware, Maryland, Pennsylvania, District of Columbia, and West Virginia is \$25,445.

The next highest level of salaries is paid to the Executive Directors in the Western States, including Alaska, California, Hawaii, Idaho, Nevada, Oregon, Washington, Colorado. Montana. and Wvoming: being \$20,771. The southwest States (Arizona, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Texas) are next with a \$20,049 average yearly salary. The mid-western States (Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Ohio, Wisconsin, Iowa, Missouri, Kansas, Nebraska. North Dakota, and South Dakota) follow with an average of \$19,587; next are the New England States (Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island and Vermont) at \$18,844; and the southern States (Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia, Arkansas, and Louisiana) at \$18,063. The lowest salaries are paid in the territories (Puerto Rico, Guam, Virgin Islands, and American Samoa), the average salary being \$18,163.

Connecticut

Some cities may receive direct funds, but generally grants will be made to Connecticut's seven planning regions. Grants range from \$17,460 to \$59,287 and are based on geographic area and population distribution.

Maine

\$97,200 in Planning Grants are made available to seven Regional Planning and Development Districts and area Law Enforcement Advisory Committees with special funding consideration for the four recognized urban areas which are relatively coincidental with high crime areas.

Massachusetts

In Massachusetts, local units are funded directly, as there is no regional structure. Grants are based on population as related to crime index and rate, and range from \$23,000 to \$150,000.

New Hampshire

The three planning regions in New Hampshire are funded directly, and they in turn fund local units. Distribution is based on population in relation to the crime incidence, and grants range from \$21,000 to \$24,720.

Rhode Island

Rhode Island has nine regions, which are the only units directly funded. Grants ranging from \$3,478 to \$22,560 are based on population and crime index.

Vermont

Funds will be granted only to the five regions in Vermont, on the basis of population. The funding range is not yet known.

Region III

Delaware

There are no planning regions in Delaware. Local units of government are funded directly, based on population and need.

Maryland

Grants of \$49,000 to \$254,000 will be made to the five planning regions as well as to local units. Funding is based on population and special studies as to need.

Pennsylvania

Pennsylvania's light planning regions are funded, as well as the two major cities and four major counties. Funding is based on such factors as crime incidence, degree of urbanization, geographic size and demographic characteristics, and ranges from \$75,000 to \$132,312.

Virginia

Twenty-two planning regions in Virginia will receive grants of \$10,000 or more and will in turn fund local units. Grants will be based on a base population figure and population density.

West Virginia

Although 9 regional planning units have been authorized, only two regional offices have been established and funded in West Virginia, the other regions having waived their request for funds. The 40% funds will be equally divided between these two regions, with each receiving \$70,000.

District of Columbia

The 40% fund distribution requirement is not applicable. All planning and services will be carried out by the government of the District of Columbia.

Alabama

One city and one county have allocations established for planning units. Other cities and counties will qualify for planning funds if the needs, circumstances and program justifies spending. \$43,000 or 18.12% of the 40% local share has been awarded directly to the City of Birmingham and Jefferson County. Anticipated funding to additional cities is estimated at approximately 20% to 25% of the 40% share.

Florida

A sufficient level of funding will be made available to the State's major cities and counties to enable them to conduct a comprehensive planning effort by making available to them the full 40% of the 1972 planning allocation. One hundred percent of the 40% portion will be awarded directly to local units of government.

Georgia

Nineteen regions will receive 50% of Georgia's planning money, based on applications received and need. In addition, grants will be made to the Department of Dublic Safety, Department of Corrections and the Division of Children and Youth, as well as to Atlanta and Fulton County. Grants range from \$18,150 to \$55,000.

Kentucky

Only the 16 planning regions will be directly funded with grants ranging from \$11,000 to \$85,000. Funds will be distributed by establishing an \$11,000 base and adding to it, using crime index as the criterion.

Mississippi

Mississippi's four planning regions will receive grants of \$41,116 to \$44,268, with funding waived by Jackson and Harrison counties. The basis of funding is population.

North Carolina

Forty-five percent of North Carolina's planning funds will go to the 17 planning regions, in grants ranging from \$14,000 to \$50,000, with a special \$12,000 grant to Charlotte. The state has established a base grant of \$14,000 for each region which is then added to on the basis of population.

South Carolina

South Carolina's 40% funds will be distributed to the 10 planning regions, each receiving a base allocation of \$8,000 plus additional funds based on their population. Grants will range from \$12,685 to \$35,981.

Tennessee

Nine planning regions, as well as individual local units, will receive planning funds ranging from \$16,788 to \$72,680. Funds will be

ILLINOIS

Local units and the 21 planning regions in Illinois will be funded directly. Funding basis and range are not available at this time.

AMAICHI

Grants ranging from \$37,482 to \$94,199 will be awarded to Indiana's eight planning regions as well as local units. A base award of \$5,000 is given, plus additional funds based on population.

MICHIGAN

Fifteen planning regions in Michigan will receive planning funds in grants of \$21,000 to \$110,000. Distribution is based on population and population density.

MINNESOTA

Minnesota has seven planning regions, but, except for the region comprised of the Twin Cities, local units are funded directly. Grants based on population, crime rate, and area will range from \$24,000 to \$103,000.

OIHO

Robert S. Weddle

Director of Public Relations and Public Information

Immediately before joining the Council staff in June, 1970, Weddle was production manager of the University of Texas Press, having previously been engaged in newspaper work in Texas more than 20 years. He has been a reporter for the Lubbock Avalanche-Journal, night bureau manager for United Press in Dallas, information specialist with Texas A & M College, city editor of the Sherman Democrat, and owner-publisher of the Menard News.

Weddle holds the Bachelor of Arts degree from Texas Tech University and is the author of two books and a number of articles appearing in magazines and journals. We was presented the Amon G. Carter Award by the Texas Institute of Letters in 1969 in recognition of his writings in history, is a fellow of the Texas State Historical Association, and the holder of various awards for his newspaper work, for both writing and community service. Weddle has been a director of West Texas Press Association and secretary-treasurer of Texas Press Association. During World War II he served as a naval reserve officer aboard ship in the pacific.

2. Advisory Board

As the advisory beard for the state planning agency for criminal justice, the Criminal Justice Council has the following responsibilities:

--Advising the Governor on all law enforcement matters.

-- Overseeing, reviewing, and approving the preparation, development, and periodic revision of a comprehensive statewide plan to carry out new and innovative approaches for the improvement of criminal justice throughout the state.

--Defining, developing, and correlating programs and projects for the state and units of general local government in the state under the comprehensive

-- Establishing priorities for the improvement of criminal justice

throughout the state.

-- Encouraging and evaluating applications for financial assistance to state agenetes, units of general local government, and combinations of such units to enable them to participate in the formulation and implementation of the comprehensive state plan.

The responsibilities for state plan development and implementation reside with the Governor. The Governor's responsibilities under this arrangement include creation of the state planning agency for law enforcement, appointment of state and local members of the Council, chairmanship of the Council, selection of staff, and final authority for all actions taken by the state planning agency.

a. Composition

The Criminal Justice Council is composed of 22 members appointed by the Governor, representing police, sheriffs, prosecution, courts, juvenile processes, education, law enforcement training, general local government, state government, and interested citizens. Members of the Criminal Justice Council are:

The Honorable Preston Smith
Governor of Texas
(Chairman and Chief Administrative Officer)

Governor Smith received the Bachelor of Business Administration degree from Texas Technological College. He continued to build a theater business in Lubbock, which he started to help pay his way through college. After building a profitable business, he entered politics as a member of the House of Representatives from the Lubbock district. After serving six years in the House, he was elected and served six years in the Senate and six years as lieutenant governor.

With extensive experience in business and government already behind him, Preston Smith was elected Governor in 1968 and became the 39th Governor of Texas on January 21, 1969. Since taking office, he has maintained an "open door" approach to government and the Governor's Office, seeking the counsel and involvement of all the people as the best stimulant for a more representative government.

James A. Turman, Ph. D. Executive Director, Texas Youth Council

Dr. Turman's educational background consists of a BS degree from Abilene Christian College and MA and Ph. D. degrees from the University to Texas. He also holds a distinguished visiting professorship in the behavioral sciences at Howard Payne College. The major part of his adult lifetime has been spent working with youth. In addition to the position of executive director of the Texas Youth Council, which he has held since 1957, he has also served as the Texas State Administrator of the Interstate Compact for Juveniles, director of institutions of the State Youth Development Council, the forerunner of the Texas Youth Council, and in private and state capacities as a clinical psychologist and consultant on juvenile delinquency. Dr. Turman is a member of numerous professional associations such as the American Psychological Association and the Texas Psychological Association and is on the Board of Directors of the American Correctional Association.

In 1965 Dr. Turman was a United States delegate to the United Nations Conference on Crime and Delinquency in Stockholm, Sweden.

Director of the Texas Department of Public Safety

Colonel Speir has served as a patrolman, captain, major, regional commander, and assistant director of the department. Prior to entering the Department of Public Safety, he served as a high school principal, having graduated with honors from East Texas State University.

Wilson Speir is past president of the Texas Police Association and is presently serving on the executive committee of that association. He is past president of the Texas South Plains and Eastern New Mexico Peace Officers Association and the Capital Area Law Enforcement Association. In 1967 House Speaker Ben Barnes appointed him to the Commission on Law Enforcement Procedures.

Crawford C. Martin Attorney General of Texas

General Martin is a graduate of the University of Texas Law School. His first official act as attorney general was the creation of the Crime Prevention Division within the Attorney General's office. He brings to the Council 14 years of experience as a Senator during which time he was the sponsor of some of the state's most significant legislation. He held major committee positions, including chairmanship of the Senate committee handling appropriations. He has served on virtually every standing Senate committee.

Before being elected to the State Senate, General Martin was Mayor of his selection as attorney general in 1966.

Major General Ross Ayers Adjutant General of Texas

General Ayers, a veteran of World War II, began his military career in 1931 when he enlisted in Service Battery, 131st Field Artillery Battallion, his responsibilities in various assignments with commendation and honors. In 1947 he was promoted to the rank of lieutenant colonel and served as assistant executive officer, 36th Infantry Division Artillery, during 1960. He was reassigned as division artillery executive officer, 36th Infantry Division, officer of the 36th Infantry Division Artillery in 1961. He was assigned as commanding 36th Infantry Brigade (separate), General Ayers was assigned as the commanding when he became the adjutant general of Texas.

General Ayers brings experience to the Council in the areas of emergency planning in both national disasters and civil disorders as well as having experience in many local and state civic functions.

Wallace D. Beasley
Executive Director of the
Texas Commission or Law Enforcement Standards and Education

Prior to becoming director of this agency, Mr. Beasley was coordinator of the Police Training Division, Engineering Extension Service, Texas A & M University, for 25 years. He is the author of many police training articles which are used in police training today. His BS degree is from Abilene Christian College.

For many years, Mr. Beasley's main emphasis in police training has been to bring professionalism to the law enforcement officer. He has the reputation for knowing more Texas policemen by name than any other person in the state.

Louie Welch Mayor of Houston

Mayor Welch holds the Bachelor of Arts degree in history from Abilene Christian College, where he graduated magna cum laude in 1940. That institution named him outstanding alumnus in 1966. He presently is serving his third cerm as mayor of Houston, to which post he first was elected in 1963. He previously served as councilman-at-large, 1950-1952 and 1956-1962. Mayor Melon has been president of the Marris County Mayors' and Councilman's Association, the Texas Association of Mayors and Councilmen, and the Texas Municipal League, and is a former member of the Houston Real Estate Board, Texas Real Estate Board, and Mational Association of Real Estate Boards. He also was president of Louie Welch Company, Inc., a real estate and investment firm.

George J. Beto, Ph. D. Director of the Texas Department of Corrections

Dr. Beto received his MA and Ph. D. degrees from the University of Texas at Austin. He has served as an instructor and president of Concordia College, Austin, Texas, and visiting instructor for the University of Texas. Dr. Beto also has served as president of Concordia Theological Seminary in Springfield, Illinois, and was a member of the Illinois Parole Board.

Dr. Beto has served as a member of the Texas Board of Corrections and as a consultant to the President's Commission on Law Enforcement and Administration of Justice. He is a member of the National Advisory Council on Correctional Manpower and Training, and president of the American Correctional Association.

Roy Barrera Practicing Attorney

Mr. Barrera, a former Texas secretary of state, has had experience both as a prosecutor and as a defense lawyer. He served as assistant district before resigning in August, 1957, to establish his own law firm. Mr. Barrera is a veteran of the Korean conflict, having served in the United States Army. He is a former president of the Board of Trustees of Edgewood Independent area, including activities of Boy Scouts and the State Historical Survey active member of the Criminal Law and Procedure section of the State Bar of Texas. He is a graduate of the St. Mary's University School of Law, San Antonio.

Art Flores Mayor of Eagle Pass

Mayor Flores was elected to that city's top post in 1966 and re-elected in 1968. He is a past president of Region 7, Texas Municipal League, and a member of the Board of Directors of the Inter-American Education Center, Texas Regional Export Expansion Council.

Judge of the 139th District Court and Presiding Judge of the 5th Administrative Judicial District

Judge Guerra was appointed as a district judge in 1954 and has been re-elected continuously since that time. Judge Guerra's docket includes criminal and civil cases and juvenile offenders. He resides in McAllen.

Edward W. Guinn, M.D. Fort Worth City Councilman

Dr. Guinn was elected to the Fort Worth City Council in 1967. He is a member of the Board of Trustees of the Tarrant County United Fund and Community Services, Inc., and of the Tarrant County Community Council. He is active in a number of other professional and community organizations.

W. B. (Bill) Hauck Sheriff of Bexar County

Sheriff Hauck has been in law enforcement work since 1931 with the exception of service in World War II in the U.S. Navy. He was appointed sheriff of Bexar County in 1962 and has served continuously in that office since. He inaugurated and operated the first combined city-county jail in Texas and deputies.

Noah Kennedy Judge of the 148th Judicial District Court

Judge Kennedy was appointed district judge in 1969 while serving as the county judge of Nueces County since his election to that post in 1958. He has previously served as county attorney. He is currently the president of the South Texas County Judges and Commissioners Association and a Board member of the Coastal Bend Regional Planning Commission. In 1959 he was named one of the five outstanding young Texans by the State Junior Chamber of Commerce. He resides in Corpus Christi.

J. C. (Pepe) Martin, Jr. Mayor of Laredo

Mayor Martin is a South Texas rancher who has been mayor of Laredo since 1954. He is a director of the Texas Research League, has been a member of the Texas A & I University Board of Directors since 1958, and is currently serving as president of that Board. He was named "Mr. South Texas" in 1965 and is active in numerous civic and community organizations.

Judge, Court of Criminal Appeals

Judge Roberts was appointed district judge in 1961 and served 10 years. The is the current chairman of the judicial section of the State Dar of Texas and is a past president of the County and District Attorneys Association of Texas. Judge Roberts was elected judge, Texas Court of Criminal Appeals, in 1970, to take office January 1, 1971.

O'Brien Thompson Former City Commissioner of Amarillo and Past President of the Texas Municipal League

Mr. Thompson is a member of the National Budget and Consultation Committee of United Community Funds and Community Councils, Inc., a group concerned with research and action on national social problems. Mr. Thompson is chief chemist with Texaco in Amarillo. He is active in all aspects of civic affairs as well as governmental planning.

Carol Vance District Attorney of Harris County

Mr. Vance was appointed district attorney in 1966 and has been elected twice since that time. He was recently named executive director of the Texas Law Enforcement Legislative Council, is chairman of the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement Procedures, treasurer of the National District Attorneys' Association and past chairman of the Criminal Law Section of the State Bar of Texas.

Frank Dyson Chief of Police, City of Dallas

Chief Dyson began his service with the Dallas Police Department as a patrolman in November, 1950. Since then he has served the department as sergeant in the Patrol Division, lieutenant in the Vice Division, captain in the Patrol Division, and in the Identification Division. He was promoted to deputy chief in July of 1968 and placed in command of the Special Operations Division; to assistant chief in June, 1969, in charge of program management; and to chief of police in December, 1969.

Chief Dyson has attended the Northwestern University Traffic Institute and the FBI National Academy. He holds the BS degree from Sam Houston State University.

Chief Dyson has instructed at El Centro Junior College on the subject of police administration and is presently a member of the faculty at the Southwestern Police Academy, where he teaches police planning. He is an active member of the Texas Police Association and the FBI National Academy Associates.

David Wade, M.D. Commissioner, Texas Department of Jental Health and Mental Retardation

A native of Jacksonville, Arkansas, Dr. Wade is a graduate of the University of Arkansas Hedical School, took resident training in psychiatry at the Galveston rsychopathic Hospital, and served a visiting residency at the New York Psychiatric Institute. After serving as both assistant superintendent and superintendent of the State Psychopathic Hospital at Galveston, he came to Austin in 1943 as clinical director for the Texas State Hospital System. He later was superintendent of the Austin State School and of Rusk State Hospital. In private practice as a psychiatrist in Austin from 1945 to 1967, he served temporarily in the fall of 1969 as first commissioner of the new Texas Rehabilitation Commission. He is a past president of the Texas Neuropsychiatric Association, the Seventh District Medical Society, the Texas Medical Association, and the Texas Rehabilitation Association. At the time he was named to his present position in August, 1970, he was director of the Office of Comprehensive Health Planning.

Frank Lombardino State Representative, Bexar County

A successful San Antonio businessman, Mr. Lombardino is owner and manager of the San Antonio Creditors' Association and is president of the Houston Creditors' Association and of Lombard's, Inc. A native of New York, he came to Texas with the Air Force in 1945, then moved to San Antonio upon receiving his discharge. Employed by the San Antonio Police Department 5 1/2 years, he attended San Antonio College and St. Mary's University during that time. He has served in the Texas House of Representatives since January, 1967.

Elliott T. Bowers, Ed.D. President, Sam Houston State University

Dr. Bowers became president of Sam Houston State University in 1970, after having served the institution as student union director, director of testing and guidance, associate dean and dean of students, vice president and vice president for university affairs, and acting president.

He holds the Bachelor of Science and Master of Arts degrees from Sam Houston State and a doctorate in education from the University of Houston.

Long active in civic affairs in Huntsville, he has served as director and president of the Chamber of Commerce, director of the Kiwanis Club, president of the Wesley Foundation Board, and chairman of Salvation Army and American Cancer Society units. He also has filled responsible positions in numerous educational organizations, on state, regional, and national levels.

b. Representative Character

The Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968, in Section 203(a), provides that a state planning agency "be created or designated by the Chief Executive of the State and be subject to his jurisdiction. The State Planning Agency shall be representative of law enforcement agencies of the State and of the units of general local government within the State." The following documentation is offered as evidence that the requirements of the Act and the criteria of the Mitchell-Finch directive of February 13, 1969, on state planning composition requirements have been met in the appointment of the Criminal Justice Council.

Representing state government are: Preston Smith, Governor of Toxas; Crawford C. Martin, Attorney General; Wallace Beasley, Director of the Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education; Dr. George Beto, Director of Texas Department of Corrections; Major General Ross Ayers, Adjutant General of Texas; Dr. David Wade, Commissioner of the Texas Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation; Colonel Wilson E. Speir, Director of the Department of Public Safety; Dr. Elliott P. Bowers, President of Sam Houston State University; Dr. James Turman, Executive Director of the Texas Youth Council; Frank Lombardino, State Representative, San Antonio; Truman Roberts, Judge, Court of Criminal Appeals.

Representing a balance between state government and units of local. government and local law enforcement agencies are 10 representatives of state government and 12 representatives of units of local government and local criminal justice agencies.

c. Operation

The Criminal Justice Council is the advisory board for the state planning agency for criminal justice. The Council's statutory responsibilities are: To develop a comprehensive plan for the improvement of criminal justice throughout the state; to define, develop, and correlate programs and projects for the state and the units of general local government in the state for improvement of criminal justice; and to establish priorities for improvement of criminal justice throughout the state.

With these statutory requirements as a guideline, the Council's specific responsibilities include: Preparation, development, and revision of comprehensive plans based on an evaluation of criminal justice problems within the state; definition, development, and correlation of action projects and programs under such plans; establishment of priorities for criminal justice improvement in the state; encouragement of grant and project proposals from state units of local and government for criminal justice planning and improvements; evaluation of applications for financial assistance and the awarding of funds to units of government; encouragement of regional and metropolitan area planning efforts, action projects, and cooperative arrangement coordination of the state's criminal justice plan with other programs relating to, or having an impact on, criminal justice.

The operations of the Criminal Justice Council are governed by the procedures outlined below:

Article I: Offices

The Criminal Justice Council shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the Governor of Texas and shall function under the executive branch of the government of the State of Texas. An agency to be known as the Criminal Justice Office will be organized for staff support to the Governor and the Criminal Justice Council with offices in Austin, Texas.

Article II: Regular Meetings

- Section 1. All meetings of the Council shall be held in Austin, Texas, or at such other places as may be fixed by the Council.
- Section 2. Regular meetings of the council shall be held not less than quarterly at a date and time to be set by the Council.
- Section 3. Written or printed notices of the meeting stating the place, day, and hour of the meeting shall be delivered, either personally or by mail, by or at the direction of the Governor, to each member of the Council.
- Section 4. The chairman of the council will preside over all meetings of the Council. In his absence his duly designated representative shall preside.

Article III: Special Meetings

Section 1. Special meetings of the Council may be held at such time and place as shall be stated in the notice of the meeting or in a duly

Colorado

Thirty-four per cent of Colorado's planning funds are distributed to the 12 regions, and \$10,000 is passed through to Denver. Awards are based on population and geographic area.

Montana

Forty per cent of Montana's planning grant will be made available to local units of government through the direct services of the State planning Agency in lieu of subgranting cash. A waiver was obtained from the five planning regions for the 40% local share cash pass-through requirement.

North Dakota

North Dakota has requested a partial statutory waiver of the 40% local share requirement so that 20% of their planning funds would go directly to local units and 80% to the state. Grants will be based on need and will range from \$2,000 to \$10,000.

South Dakota

Six planning regions in South Dakota will pass-through funds to local units. Grants to the regions will be made on a per capita basis ranging from \$77,536 to \$145,880.

Utah

Utah's nine multi-county planning regions will receive grants ranging from \$2,756 to \$20,782. Distribution will be based on a \$1,000 base award plus additional funds according to population.

Wyoming

There are seven planning regions in Wyoming which will be funded along with local units. Each region or unit will receive a \$5,000 base grant with additional funds awarded on the basis of population. Grants will range from \$7,680 to \$11,121.

- (5) The state council on criminal justice shall exercise its powers and perform its duties and functions under the department of local affairs and the executive director thereof as if the same were transferred to the department by a type 1 transfer, as such transfer is defined in the "Administrative Organization Act of 1968", being article 28 of this chapter.
