

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## INTRODUCTION

California's juvenile justice process involves the combined efforts of law enforcement agencies, probation departments, the juvenile court, and county and state correctional facilities. Law enforcement agencies are responsible for investigating and apprehending, the probation department for prosecuting if deemed appropriate, the court for adjudicating and determining the type of disposition, and the probation department again for managing local rehabilitation and correctional programs, i.e., probation supervision, correctional camps and schools. In some situations, delinquents are committed to state correctional facilities (California Youth Authority).

Of each 1,000 juvenile arrests reported in 1974:

- 424 were released, handled informally, or referred to other local governmental agencies by the arresting agency.
- 375 were released, placed on informal probation, or referred to other local governmental agencies by the probation department.
- 201 reached juvenile court, and of this total:
  - 100 were released or had their existing probation status maintained
  - 78 were made wards of the court and placed on formal probation
  - 16 were placed on non-ward probation
  - 5 were committed to the California Youth Authority (CYA)
  - 2 were remanded to adult court

## JUVENILE ARRESTS

GENERAL TREND 1969-1974: UP 3.6 percent  
1974 OVER 1973: UP 12.6 percent

California law enforcement agencies reported 408,131 juvenile arrests in 1974. This means that possibly as much as 13 percent of the state's youth population between the ages of 10 and 17 (3,144,000) were arrested during the year. The number of juveniles arrested was up 12.6 percent from 1973. This percentage figure more than quadrupled the 2.7 percent arrest increase of 1973 over 1972. The 1974 statistic is doubly significant in that from 1970 until 1972, there had been a downward trend in juvenile arrests. Of the 1974 arrest totals, law enforcement agencies referred 239,060 or 58 percent, to probation departments for further disposition including possible court adjudication. Of the remainder, 160,114 or 39 percent, were released or otherwise had their cases handled by the arresting agency, and 13,108 or 3 percent, were referred to other governmental agencies. (See Table 1.)

## JUVENILE DETENTION

### *Juvenile Hall Admissions*

GENERAL TREND 1969-1974: DOWN 3.4 percent  
1974 OVER 1973: UP 4.0 percent

When a law enforcement officer physically delivers a minor to the probation department, he most often does so by booking him at the county juvenile hall. These facilities provide for short-term detention of juvenile offenders pending their court appearance. Occasionally, juvenile halls are used for the temporary housing of homeless children (dependents) and for the post-court correctional custody; however, their prime function is detention.

In 1974, a total of 153,746 juveniles were admitted to juvenile halls in California counties. (See Table 24.) This is a 6.4 percent increase over 1973. Mirroring arrest statistics, juvenile hall admissions fell after 1969, dropping to a low of 139,841 in 1972, before the 1973 figure reversed the trend with a 3.3 percent increase.

The resident juvenile hall population on December 31, 1974 was 3,701. (See Table 24.) This was a 7.1 percent decrease from the same date in 1973, when a total of 3,982 juveniles were in custody.

Failure to adjust/runaway was the most frequent reason for admission to juvenile halls in 1974, with 24,398 cases, or 16.2 percent. (See Table 25.) Incorrigibility/sexual delinquency accounted for 20,170 admissions, or 13.4 percent. Burglary, with 15,107 admissions, accounted for 10.1 percent, and was the third largest admissions category replacing drug law violations which held that position in 1973.

Youths arrested for homicide showed the largest increase among the admissions for specific offenses, up by 45.5 percent from 1973 to 1974. Theft followed with a 27.6 percent increase and assault admissions ranked third, increasing by 17.7 percent.

In general, admissions for delinquent tendencies (runaway, truancy, incorrigible, sexual delinquency, failure to adjust, curfew, loitering) were down by 2.6 percent from 1973 to 1974. Within the delinquent tendency group, only admissions for loitering/trespassing/curfew violations showed an increase (4,542 for 1974 versus 3,953 for 1973).

#### INITIAL (NEW) REFERRALS

GENERAL TREND: 1969-1974: UP 12.6 percent

1974 OVER 1973: UP 8.5 percent

California probation departments reported 178,332 initial (new) referrals from law enforcement agencies, schools, parents, and other sources in 1974. (See Table 6.) These were juveniles who were not on probation at the time of referral. The term "initial" as used here does not imply that the minor had not been in trouble before, only that he was not on probation or California Youth Authority (CYA) parole at the time of referral. The 1974 figure was up 8.5 percent over 1973 and up 12.6 percent from 1969.

#### Source of Referrals

Law enforcement agencies were the single largest contributing source of new referrals, accounting for 89.3 percent in 1974. This figure was up 1.5 percent from the 87.8 percent recorded in 1973. Courts and schools were the next largest referral sources, with 3.3 and 3.0 percent respectively. (See Table 6.)

#### Referral Offenses

Of the 178,332 initial (new) referrals reported in 1974, crimes against property accounted for 33 percent. This category (burglary, theft, and motor vehicle theft) was up by more than 3 percent over 1973. (See Table 5.)

The following table shows that referrals for crimes against persons (homicide, forcible rape, assault, and robbery) were also up, accounting for 8.1 percent of all initial referrals in 1974 as opposed to 7.6 percent in 1973. Drug offense referrals dropped from 13.7 percent in 1973 to 13.2 percent in 1974. Referrals for delinquent tendencies decreased from 32.2 percent in 1973 to 25.1 percent in 1974.

#### Characteristics of Juvenile Offenders

The median age of juveniles initially referred to probation departments in 1974 was 15.7 years. (See Table 8.) This dropped from 16.0 years in 1973. Females accounted for 28.6 percent of new referrals in 1974 as opposed to 28.0 percent in 1973. (Data not shown.)

#### Initial (New) Referrals Closed at Intake

GENERAL TREND 1969-1974: DOWN 7.9 percent

1974 OVER 1973: UP 6.0 percent

Of 178,332 initial referrals in 1974, California probation departments closed 98,657 cases following the probation officer's investigation. (See Table 7.) Of the cases closed, 12,682 were transferred to other agencies, including other county probation departments, and 85,975 cases were closed at intake. Those cases closed at intake amounted to almost half (48.2 percent) of all initial referrals. In terms of dispositions made of juvenile arrests, however, these releases by the probation department amounted to only 211 of each 1,000, which places their overall significance in better perspective. On the whole in 1974, 9.5 percent more initial referrals had their cases closed at intake than in 1973 and the 1974 figure was up 26.6 percent from that of 1969.

### *Informal Probation (Welfare and Institutions Code, Section 654)*

GENERAL TREND 1969-1974: UP 15.7 percent  
1974 OVER 1973: UP 8.7 percent

Probation departments placed 25,951 juveniles on informal probation in 1974 as provided by Welfare and Institutions Code, Section 654. (See Table 7.) These juveniles accounted for 14.6 percent of the 178,332 initial (new) referrals to probation. Informal probation permits a minor to be placed under supervision on the basis of a contract between his parents or guardians and the probation department. The use of this treatment alternative was up 8.7 percent in 1974 over 1973, and up 15.7 percent over the five-year period from 1969 to 1974.

#### *Initial Petition Filings*

California probation departments initiated formal court action for approximately 30 percent of the initial referrals, filing 53,724 initial petitions in 1974. (See Table 7.) This figure was up 6.0 percent over 1973 when 50,679 initial petitions were filed; but the 1974 statistic amounted to a slightly smaller percentage of total initial referrals (30.1 percent for 1974 versus 30.8 percent for 1973). Overall, filings of initial petitions are still down by 7.3 percent from 1969.

#### JUVENILE COURT

In terms of each 1,000 juvenile arrests, only 201 reached juvenile court for disposition--the rest having been handled at the law enforcement or probation department levels.

#### *Dispositions of Initial Petitions*

GENERAL TREND 1969-1974: DOWN 5.1 percent  
1974 OVER 1973: UP 7.6 percent

Juvenile court dispositions resulting from initial (new) petitions were up 7.6 percent from 1973. This increase almost doubled the increase from 1972 to 1973. Of 55,388 dispositions in 1974 the largest percent resulted in juveniles being declared wards of the court and placed on formal probation (56 percent). These 31,004 declarations amounted to 76 of each 1,000 juvenile arrests. Of the remaining dispositions, 16,864 (30.4 percent) resulted in a dismissal of the delinquency petition; 6,517 (11.8 percent) resulted in non-ward probation (725a W&I Code) for six months; 666 (1.2 percent) were remanded to adult court; and 337 (0.6 percent) were committed to the California Youth Authority. (See Table 13.)

Of the various disposition alternatives, only remands to adult court showed a decrease in 1974 (down 1.9 percent). All others showed increases: dismissals were up 7.6 percent, non-ward probation was up 17.5 percent, CYA commitments were up 11.6 percent and declarations of wardship were up 5.9 percent.

The increase in non-ward probation completely reversed the 1973 figure, which was down 10.1 percent from 1972. The number of remands to adult court also reversed from 1973 when they increased 33.4 percent over 1972. CYA commitments increased for the third straight year, although the 1974 increase was slightly smaller than that of 1973.

#### *Dispositions of Subsequent Petitions*

GENERAL TREND 1969-1974: Data are not comparable  
1974 OVER 1973: UP 6.4 percent

In 1974, there were 26,613 subsequent petition dispositions on juveniles who were already under active supervision either as probationers or as CYA parolees. (See Table 16.) This figure was up 6.4 percent from 1973, reversing a 5.2 percent decrease from 1972. Of those adjudicated, 90.1 percent had their prior formal or non-ward probation status maintained (up from 89.2 percent in 1973); 2.7 percent had formal probation status initiated (down from 2.9 percent in 1973); and 7.2 percent were either certified to adult court for prosecution or committed to CYA (down from 7.9 percent in 1973).

#### PROBATION CASELOAD

GENERAL TREND 1969-1974: DOWN 27.8 percent  
1974 OVER 1973: UP 6.0 percent

As of December 31, 1974, there were 63,599 juveniles under active probation supervision in California. This figure is composed of those on formal probation, non-ward probation (725a W&I Code) and informal probation (654 W&I Code). (See Table 3.)

## REMOVALS FROM PROBATION

As used here, the term removal refers to any change in probation supervision status. It may be accomplished by release or discharge from probation, escalation to a more advanced supervision level, remand to adult court, or commitment to CYA.

California probation departments supervise juveniles on all three levels of probation: formal, non-ward, or informal, as provided by the W&I Code.

Removal statistics for 1974 are summarized as follows (see Tables 21 and 22):

### *Informal Probation*

Case closed - 20,140 (85.0 percent)

Petition filed - 3,549 (15.0 percent)

### *Non-Ward Probation*

Dismissed/discharged - 4,803 (85.7 percent)

To formal probation - 798 (14.2 percent)

### *Formal Probation*

Discharged - 26,544 (94.9 percent)

To CYA - 1,218 (4.4 percent)

To adult court - 193 (0.7 percent)

Juveniles in the failure to adjust/runaway category spent more time on formal probation in 1974 than juveniles in any other offense category. (See Table 19.) Their median time period was 20.3 months, an increase from 19.7 months in 1973. In 1974, the overall median time for juveniles on formal probation for all offenses was 14.1 months, a decrease from 14.5 in 1973.

By way of comparison, among the specific offenses (602 W&I Code), juveniles on formal probation for homicide spent the shortest time under supervision with a median time of 10.6 months.

## COUNTY CORRECTIONS

### *Commitments to County Correctional Facilities*

GENERAL TREND 1969-1974: DOWN 33.9 percent

1974 OVER 1973: DOWN 23.3 percent

County-level correctional facilities, such as camps, ranches, homes and schools, are used for post-court treatment of juvenile offenders. These facilities, as well as juvenile halls, are maintained by the county probation department. They provide long-term detention and treatment following court commitment.

Excluding data from Los Angeles County (data not available), juvenile courts committed 4,512 youths to county camps, ranches, homes and schools in 1974. (See Table 26.) This figure was down by 23.3 percent from 1973 and was down 33.9 percent from the 1969 statistic.

In 1974, burglary was the most frequent reason for commitment with 880 cases, up 20.9 percent from 1973. Commitments for failure to adjust/runaway were second with 741 cases, but virtually were unchanged over 1973. (Data not shown.)

Overall, for 1974, commitments for specific offenses (602 W&I Code) were up approximately 10 percent while commitments for delinquent tendencies were down 1.8 percent. (Data not shown.)

## CRIMINAL JUSTICE GLOSSARY

### GENERAL TERMS

**ARREST:** "taking a person into custody, in a case and in the manner authorized by law. An arrest may be made by a peace officer or by a private person." (P.C. 834)

**CALIFORNIA YOUTH AUTHORITY (CYA):** the state agency which has jurisdiction over and maintains institutions as correctional schools for the reception of wards of the juvenile court and other persons committed from justice, municipal, and superior courts.

**CRIME:** "an act committed or omitted in violation of law forbidding or commanding it . . ." (P.C. 15)

**DRUGS:** (a) a substance officially recognized as such; (b) intended for medical use; (c) a non-food, used to change the structure or function of the body and; (d) substances intended for use as a component in (a) through (c) above.

**JUVENILE:** a person 17 years old and under.

**JUVENILE COURT:** specifically delegated to adjudicate juvenile offenders usually with bifurcated proceedings.

## JUVENILE PROCESSING TERMS

**CLOSED AT INTAKE:** case is closed by the probation department at the time the juvenile is referred, following an investigation of the juvenile's circumstances and nature of the alleged offense. No further action is taken.

**DELINQUENT ACTS:** those acts described under Welfare and Institutions Code Section 602 which involve violations by a juvenile of any law or ordinance defining crime, or the violation of a court order of the juvenile court.

**DELINQUENT TENDENCIES:** unreasonable or incorrigible behavior as described under the Welfare and Institutions Code Section 601.

**DISCHARGE:** juvenile is removed from probation supervision for any reason other than remanded to adult court or released to CYA.

**DISPOSITION:** action taken as a result of an arrest; for example, handled within the police department, informal probation, or court ward.

**INFORMAL PROBATION:** of a minor, in lieu of filing a petition, for a period not to exceed six months. The supervision is based on a contractual agreement between the probation officer and the minor's parents or guardian provided for under Welfare and Institutions Code Section 654.

**INITIAL PETITION:** a petition filed in juvenile court for a minor who is currently not under active probation supervision or on parole from CYA alleging that the minor has committed a delinquent act.

**INITIAL REFERRAL:** a juvenile who is not actively being supervised or on CYA parole, is brought to the attention of the probation department for alleged behavior under Welfare and Institutions Code Sections 601 or 602.

**JUVENILE HALL:** a county-operated facility used both for temporary detention of juvenile offenders pending their court appearance or dependency cases, and in some instances, for short-term (up to 180 days) rehabilitative purposes.

**PAROLE:** the supervision of juveniles in the community after early release from one of the California Youth Authority institutions.

**PETITION:** the formal presentation to the court of information surrounding the alleged offense by a juvenile, similar to a criminal complaint for an adult.

**PROBATION:** supervision of a juvenile in the community as an alternative to institutionalization for offenses committed.

**PROBATION - FORMAL:** a probation grant in which the minor is declared a ward of the juvenile court and placed on formal probation for an indeterminate amount of time.

**PROBATION - NON-WARD:** a probation grant without wardship from juvenile court for a specific time not to exceed six months as described under Welfare and Institutions Code Section 725a.

**REMAND TO ADULT COURT:** juvenile is referred to adult court because he is unfit for juvenile court under provisions of Welfare and Institutions Code Section 707.

**SUBSEQUENT PETITION:** a petition filed on behalf of a juvenile who is already on ward or non-ward court probation or who is a ward of the court under California Youth Authority jurisdiction.

**VIOLATION:** the suspension of a juvenile's probation or parole because the juvenile did not adhere to the conditions of his probation.

**WARDSHIP:** state or condition of being under the legal guardianship, or custody, of the juvenile court.
