This report is one of a series to make data available on the population in the facilities of the New York State Department of Correctional Services. The material in this publication cover reported inmate characteristics at the time of commitment and include the following selected items: Reason for Commitment, County of Commitment, Race or Nationality, Minimum and Maximum Sentence, Dangerous Drug Usage, Education, Prior Adult Criminal Record and Present Age. In addition, summary figures are shown for all facilities combined and for both sexes along with percent distributions. Summary totals are also provided for the four basic types of correctional facilities: General Confinement, Reception and Classification, Camps and Specialized Facilities.

H I G H L I G H T S

NCJRS

1. 97.3% of the inmate population are males.

2. 94.9% of male inmates were committed as felons while 5.0% were committed as Youthful Offenders. 98.6% of female inmates were committed as felons and 1.2% were committed as Youthful Offenders.

ACQUISITIONS

3. Highest percentages of males under custody were committed for the following felonies: 35.7% for robbery; 11.7% for homicide; 10.2% for dangerous drugs and 9.9% for burglary. 33.6% of females under custody were committed for dangerous drug felonies; 24.5% for homicide and 15.6% for robbery.

4. 69.2% of male inmates were committed from New York City while 63.2% of females were committed from that area. 19.2% of male inmates were committed from upstate counties with 200 or more inmates under custody while 23.5% of female inmates were committed from such counties.

5. 73.2% of the male population and 78.1% of the female population are non-white.

6. Specified minimum sentences were received by 44.8% of the male population while 46.2% of the female population received such minimums. 25.7% of the male population received specified minimum sentences of over 30 months while 18.4% of the female population fell in this category.
7. 41.0% of the male population received maximum sentences of over five years (excluding life or death sentences) while only 27.5% of the female population fell in this category. Conversely, 28.7% of females received maximum sentences of life or death while only 11.7% of males received a life or death maximum.
8. 58.3% of the male population had a record of dangerous drug usage and 46.6% of the female population. Only 12.5% of the male drug user population had committed drug law violations while 42.5% of the female drug user population had committed dangerous drug crimes.
9. While 21.4% of male inmates had either graduated from high school or had received some college or special vocational training in addition, 26.8% of female inmates fell in this category.
10. 58.2% of the male population had one or more previous local, state or federal commitment, but only 34.7% of the female population had a prior commitment.
11. Of the total population, 14.8% were under 21 years of age on December 31, 1975. However, only 8.8% of women under custody were under 21 while 15.0% of males were in this category.
