### PROBATION AND PAROLE TERMINATIONS 1975

- Nine out of 10 adult male probationers and 7 out of 10 parolees successfully completed supervision in calendar year 1975. This was also true for 9 out of 10 female probationers and parolees.
- 2. White male probationer and parolees completed supervision with a greater degree of success than did non-whites. White female probationers were more successful than non-whites. The reverse was true for female parolees. (See Table 5.)
- Adults supervised in counties other than Milwaukee completed probation or parole supervision with a greater degree of success. (See Table 2.)
- 4. Male and female probationers and female parolees who were employed full time were successful in 9 out of 10 cases; male parolees in 8 out of 10 cases. (See Table 9.)
- 5. Male probationers and parolees and female probationers who earned at least \$400.00 per month were successful in 9 out of 10 cases.

  All female parolees in that income range were successful.

  (See Table 10.)
- 6. About three-fourths (76 percent) of juvenile male probationers and seven-tenths of the juvenile male aftercare cases successfully completed supervision. Nine-tenths of the juvenile female probationers and eight-tenths of the females on aftercare were also successful.
- 7. Three-fourths of the juvenile male probationers who were not enrolled in school successfully completed supervision. Those not enrolled in school while on aftercare status were successful in 8 out of 10 instances. (See Table 29.)

8. All juvenile female probationers not enrolled in school successfully completed supervision. Eight out of 10 girls on aftercare who were not in school were also successfully terminated. (See Table 29.)

This bulletin is designed to provide information on the 9,464 persons (8,401 adults and 1,063 juveniles) who were removed from Division of Corrections probation and parole caseloads during calendar year 1975. The two major reasons for termination of supervision are the successful completion of the probation or parole term or revocation of supervision because of law or rules violations. Period of probation or parole supervision is quite short for many juveniles, ending when age 18 is reached.

Data concerning adult probation and parole terminations are presented in Tables 1 through 17. A total of 7,289 men and 1,112 women were removed from supervision during 1975. Data for 67 male probationers, 18 male parolees, and 3 female probationers who died while on supervision as well as for one male Central State Hospital case are included only in Table 1. Tables 16 and 17 provide information only for cases in which supervision terminated because of revocation. Tables 18 through 39 contain information on the 851 boys and 212 girls removed from juvenile probation or aftercare supervision during the same time period. Information for one boy who died while on aftercare appears only in Table 1. Tables 38 and 39 deal only with juveniles whose supervision was revoked.

#### Adult Male Terminations

A total of 6,278 probationers and 909 parolees were removed from field case load during 1975. Probationers completed supervision successfully in 9 out of 10 cases; parolees in 7 out of 10 cases.

Table 9 indicates that there is a relationship between the maintenance of employment and the successful completion of probation or parole supervision. Nine-tenths of the probationers and eight-tenths of the parolees reported as having generally full-time employment successfully completed supervision. Roughly two-thirds of the men reported as being generally unemployed successfully completed probation or parole terms.

Men on probation and parole with monthly incomes of at least \$400.00 were more often successful than those who earned less. Men who resided in Milwaukee County were less likely to successfully complete supervision than those living in other areas of the state. White males, whether probationers or parolees, were more often successful than were non-whites.

Slightly less than one-third (30 percent) of the probationers and about two-fifths (43 percent) of the parolees who were revoked were convicted of new offenses or were revoked in lieu of conviction. One-third of the probationers and almost one-third (30 percent) of the parolees reported as unsuccessful had a property offense as the most serious violation associated with revocation. Less than ten percent of the revoked probationers, as contrasted with 19 percent of the parolees, were revoked because of involvement in crimes against persons.

#### Adult Female Terminations

Supervision of 1,053 probationers and 56 parolees was terminated in 1975. Nine out of 10 women successfully completed supervision. Probationers who were employed full or part-time were generally more successful than those who were unemployed. Parolees who were unemployed were slightly more successful than those who were employed. Probationers and parolees who had some reported monthly income were more likely to be successful than those who did not.

One quarter of the unsuccessful probationers and three-fourths of the unsuccessful parolees had been convicted of a new offense or revoked as a substitute for conviction on a new offense. One-half of the unsuccessful parolees and almost one-third of the unsuccessful probationers had a property offense associated with revocation.

#### Juvenile Male Terminations

A total of 851 juvenile males, 261 probationers and 590 aftercare cases were terminated in 1975. Boys on probation were successfully terminated in 8 out of 10 cases, while those on aftercare completed supervision successfully in 7 out of 10 instances.

The fact that a probationer was enrolled in a school program seemed to have little relationship to successful termination. Boys who were not enrolled in school while on aftercare were more often successful than those participating in educational programs. Non-students, of course, tended to be boys who were older and more fully employed.

#### Juvenile Female Terminations

Two hundred and twelve girls (68 probation cases and 144 aftercare cases) were terminated during 1975. Probationers were terminated successfully in 9 out of 10 cases and those removed from aftercare supervision were successful in 8 out of 10 cases.

There seemed to be little relationship between enrollment in school and success on either probation or aftercare supervision. All girls on probation who were not enrolled in school successfully completed supervision. Again, employment and age were probably more importantly related variables with success than was student status.
