



SUMMARY OF A YOUTH ASSISTANCE SERVICE SYSTEM

In August, 1971, the Office of Youth Opportunity Services submitted to Mayor-Commissioner, Walter E. Washington, a "Comprehensive Plan" for the Prevention, Control and Treatment of Juvenile Delinquents. This plan, entitled "Youth Assistance Service System", was developed under a planning grant from the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare and guidelines were established by the Juvenile Delinquency Act of 1968. This effort also embraces the significant and relevant principles embodied in Public Law 91-358, "Reorganization of District of Columbia Courts" as they relate to and impact upon youthful residents of the District of Columbia.

The purpose of this Comprehensive Plan is to provide a guide and a format through which services for children and youth can be readily identified and utilized, and further enable youth to function successfully in society and prevent them from engaging in anti-social behavior and delinquent acts.

The "Youth Assistance Service System", which has as its operational nucleus the 9 Youth Assistance Centers, is essential as we move to reduce delinquency in the District of Columbia in that these centers may be instrumental in diverting youth from the Juvenile Justice System. Our Pilot Youth Assistance Center has been funded by a L.E.A.A. FY-72 block grant and is scheduled to be operational by the fall of 1972. Grant applications are being reviewed by the Model Cities Commission for two Youth Assistance Centers in the Model Cities Area. Private foundation grants are being prepared for a Youth Assistance Center in the Georgetown Area. The FY-73 District of Columbia Budget request includes funding for continued operation of five Youth Assistance Centers, that would be initiated under grant funding, and projections to expand over the next four years, until all nine Youth Assistance Centers are fully operational.

The establishment of the Youth Assistance Service System in the District of Columbia would most assuredly have national significance as an operational model for Delinquency Prevention that could be readily inspected by planners from neighboring states in our region: Maryland, Virginia, Delaware, Pennsylvania, and West Virginia. Implications of this model in the District as to accessibility for the seat of our Federal Government further amplify the impact on a National Scale.

One essential factor in the establishment of a Youth Assistance Service System is the development of community ties that would enhance and attract funding from varied sources.

The Office of Youth Opportunity Services is fortunate in this regard in that we have a history of community based multiple funded projects over the past four (4) years. Our prime linkage with the citizenry is through the Neighborhood Planning Council structure. However, as the centers are firmly established, a closer linkage will be provided through our twenty two (22) Youth Courtesy Patrols. These patrols will be an integral component of the centers' out-reach team. Members of these patrols, who are community youth themselves, will be able to readily identify other youth who are most in need of the services provided by our Youth Assistance Centers.




YAC PROCEDURES

1. The Receptionist- opens the mail and matches up any #2 copies of the Initial Referral Form with existing cases on file. Thus the match will be completed and returned to the referral source. Others will be held until copy #1 is received. All Referral and Enrollment Forms or Status and Termination Forms will be sent directly to the Filing Office(s).
2. The youth will enter in one of three (3) ways:
 - a. As a walk-in If the youth enters this way, the Receptionist - fills out the Initial Referral, retains copies #2 and #3 in a file at her desk, and has youth obtain parent's signature on copy #1
 - b. Accompanied by referral person - Referral person fills out Initial Referral and obtains parent's signature. Receptionist - returns copies #2 and #3 to referral person.
 - c. With copy #1 of Initial Referral - Receptionist- examines copy #1, filling in codes where necessary, and checks for parent's signature. She then searches files for copy #2. If available, she completes and mails to referral source. If not yet available, notation is made to mail it upon receipt.

3. The Receptionist - embosses a master plate, imprints, a photo source card and has youth to sign. The source card is placed in the photographers in-box (behind her desk) at the bottom of the stack and the youth is asked to be seated in the Waiting Room.

4. The Receptionist - imprints an Intake Diagnostic Form and inserts copy #1 of the Initial Referral, the embossed Master Plate and the Intake Diagnostic Form in a file folder

5. The Photographer takes a Photo Source Card from the top of the stack, calls the person's name imprinted there and takes the picture. He then hands the youth his ID Card and asks him to return to the Receptionist.

6. The Receptionist turns over the folder to a Screening Counselor as one becomes available.

7. The Screening Counselor designates the necessary services and schedules the youth to see the examiners in turn, escorting the youth and hand-carrying the folder.

8. After examinations are completed, the Screening Counselor either arranges for enrollment in the prescribed program or turns the youth over to the Outreach Section.

9. After all action is completed or before the youth is released for the day, the Counselor or Outreach Workers perform an Exit

Interview, giving the youth some idea of what he is to expect.

10. Each youth is then scheduled by the Outreach Section, for further contact.

SECTION II

Y.A.C. PROCESSING FORMS

Form #1 INITIAL REFERRAL FORM

A three (3) part form filled out by the agency or person referring the youth to the YAC. This form is filled out by the Intake Receptionist if youth is a walk-in.

Form #2 PHOTO SOURCE CARD

Is typed on arrival of youth and used to prepare the Youth ID Card.

The ID Card

Prepared for the youth to identify himself to all related services.

The Master Plate

Is prepared on the embossing-machine as soon as possible, then used to imprint all forms pertaining to the youth.

Form #3 INTAKE DIAGNOSTIC FORM

A three (3) part form prepared when the youth appears. This form is then used by the screening counselor making the determination on which services are required.

Form #4 REFERRAL AND ENROLLMENT FORM

This form is prepared after the exit interviewer has selected a program for the youth based on the diagnosis of his problems.

Form #5 FOLLOW-UP CARD

This card is prepared by the center at specific intervals and sent out to the programs to check on progress of the youth.

Form #6 FOLLOW-UP FORM

This is used by the worker assigned to follow up the case by actually contacting the youth to determine the status of his progress.

INITIAL REFERRAL FORM

This section illustrates and describes each item of the I/R Form. It is a three-copy form.

At referral, the person making the referral should fill in the top part of the form. Instructions are detailed.

Each item is displayed to clearly illustrate how to fill in the form. The sections that follow describe the items in detail.

INITIAL REFERRAL FORM

Instructions

YOUTH CODE - A code is formed by combining the first letter of the first name, the first letter of the middle name, and the first letter of the last name along with the birthdate- (month, day and year of birth in that order). If a month and/or day is a single digit number, enter the number preceded by a zero. If a person has more than one middle name, consider only the first letter of the first middle name. If the individual has no middle name, the box provided for middle initial should be left blank.

Example: John Doe, August 6, 1963

J	D	0	8	0	6	6	3

DATE - Enter a date of referral. The first two boxes are for the month, the second two for the day, and the last two for the year. If the month and/or day are single digits, they must be preceded by a zero. Use only the last two digits of the year.

Example: June 3, 1972

YOUTH'S NAME - Enter name in all capital letters. Include the first name, middle initial, and last name in that order. Place

only one letter in each block, leave one space between the first name, middle initial, and the last name. If not enough boxes are provided, use only the first initial of the first name. The middle initial may be dropped if still more space is needed.

Example: John Bernard Doe JOHN B DOE

TELEPHONE NUMBER - Insert telephone number given by youth.

ADDRESS - Enter address in all capital letters. Include street number, street name, and apartment number (if appropriate). Abbreviate street name if full address cannot be accommodated in the boxes provided. A box should contain only one digit or one alphabetic letter. Use no periods or special characters.

Example: 156 Kenilworth Ave., N.E. 156 KENIL AVE NE

ZIP CODE - The zip code is essential in the address. It should consist of 5 characters from zero to nine. No other characters should be used.

Example: 20019

CENSUS TRACT/CENTER NO. - Beginning from the left side, use only the necessary boxes. All other boxes should be left blank. Find the proper census tract with the help of the map in Attachment "A". See Referral Manual for the center no. Use 2 digits for center no., preceding the number with a zero.

Example:

BIRTHDATE - The date of birth should be written in the boxes provided. If the month and/or day is a single digit number, precede the digit by zero.

Example:

AGE - Enter the youth's age as a two-digit number.

Example: Age, 9

SEX - Mark appropriate box to indicate sex of youth.

POLICE CODE - Enter Police Code, if any. See codes in Attachment "B".

ETHNIC GROUP - Mark the box which indicates the ethnic group of the youth. Mark 'other' box if ethnic group is not included in 1 through 4.

IS YOUTH - Mark the box which indicates the current status of the youth as it pertains to school enrollment. During summer vacation, youths are to be considered in the 'in school' category if he had been regularly enrolled and attending school before vacation. If a youth has intentions of not returning to school in the fall, he may be classified in the 'dropped out'

category. (If youth has not yet entered school, leave all boxes blank).

GRADE COMPLETED - Enter any number from 01 to 12 to indicate the number of years in school. If a youth was in college, add one for each year of college completed. If youth has completed two years of college, the number entered in the boxes provided will be 14. (If youth has not yet entered the 1st grade, code this '00').

SCHOOL NAME - Enter name of the school the youth is attending or last attended.

SCHOOL CODE - A school code is the same number as the program code. When this number is used in reference to the school it is referred to as the 'school code'. The 'school code' (like the program code) may be obtained from the Youth Programs Information and Referral Manual. If the school is located outside of the District of Columbia, it will be coded 0 0 0 0 9 9 9 1. Private schools will be coded 0 0 0 0 8 8 8 1.

COURSE TAKEN - Mark the box which most closely describes the course in which youth is enrolled.

IS YOUTH EMPLOYED - Check box which indicates if youth is not employed, if employed part-time, or is employed full-time.

REASONS FOR DROPPING OUT - Mark the appropriate box. If the specific reason is not included in 1 through 4, mark 'other'.

PARENT/GUARDIAN NAME AND ADDRESS - Enter youth's parents' or guardians' name (first name, middle initial, last name) with the address (house number, street name, city and state if other than Washington, D.C.) and zip code. The address will be used to contact parents when necessary.

NAME OF REFERRING PROGRAM AND CODE - Enter the name of the referring program with its code number. Obtain the program code number for the referring program from the "Youth Programs Information and Referral Manual".

After all efforts are made to determine a source of referral, code all zeros for walk-ins or the center code for outreach referrals.

PROBLEM REFERRED - Enter the code for the Basic Problem for which the youth was initially referred. See codes in Attachment "C".

OUTREACH WORKERS CODES - If brought in by outreach, enter code. The code will consist of the worker's first and last initials, and the last four digits of his social security number.

Example: John Doe, 587-34-5147 J|D|5|1|4|7 (See Attachment "D")

ADDRESS - Write street number, street name and zip code of person to be contacted at the referring program.

REMARKS - Describe briefly the nature of the problem the youth has and the kind of help he needs.

PERSON'S SIGNATURE/PHONE NO. - The person making a referral should sign here. Also enter the telephone number of the signatory so that he can be contacted if questions arise.

CENTER ADDRESS - Check the box which indicates the Center that the young person is to report to after he obtains the signature of his parent or guardian.

PARENT OR GUARDIAN - The parent or guardian must sign copy #1 and check the box that indicates whether he approves or does not approve of the child's participation in the program.



INTAKE AND DIAGNOSTIC FORM

The Intake and Diagnostic Form (See attached example) is prepared at the Youth Assistance Center by the counselor who is initially assigned to assist the young person. This is a two-part form consisting of a master copy with ten diagnosis sections and additional service copies for each of the examination and diagnosis stations.

This form is utilized to record diagnoses and service prescriptions made by professional examiners.

Upon completion of the examinations, the Center Referral Section makes confirmed service appointments for the youth based on information contained in the Intake and Diagnostic Form.

This card (example attached) is to be initiated at the Youth Assistance Center after the young person has completed the diagnostic services prescribed by the referring person or agency and the counselor at the Youth Assistance Center.

A card is prepared for each outside referral program prescribed for the youth. Ten cards are possible for the ten services on the Intake Diagnostic Form.

The counselor, using the embossed identification/address card, which was prepared from the Initial Referral Form when the youth entered the Center, will imprint the required number of Service Referral Cards with the youth's name and identification information in the proper space on the front of the card.

The addresses of the service agencies will be taken from the Diagnostic Services Form and written on the top third of the back of the Service Referral Card. Then, also using the Diagnostic Services Form for reference, the counselor will write in the type of service, the problem code and the referral program code on the front of the card. The counselor will then enter his name and phone number.

The cards are either mailed to the Referred Service or given to the young person to hand carry to the agency.

At the agency, the requested information will be entered (see example attached. Instructions are on the card). The top third of the card will be torn off (perforated), the card folded and stapled, and mailed back to the 24 hour Youth Assistance Center.

A copy of the card will be made for data processing and sent to the Youth Opportunity Services.

Instructions for the portion to be filled out by the person enrolling the youth in the program are as follows:

DATE YOUTH REPORTED - Enter the date that the youth reported for his scheduled appointment. All single digit numbers should be preceded by zero.

The addresses of the service agencies will be taken from the Diagnostic Services Form on file at the Youth Assistance Center and written on the top third of the back of the Youth Follow-up Form. Using the Diagnostic Services

Form for reference, the counselor will write in the type of service requested, the problem code and the referred program code on the front of the card. He will then enter his name and phone number.

The cards will then be folded, with the servicing agency out, stapled and mailed to the agencies.

At the agency, the requested follow-up information will be entered (See example attached, instructions are on card). The top third of the card will be torn off (perforated), the card folded and stapled and mailed back to the Youth Assistance Center.

The person at the program should complete the card and return it to the Youth Assistance Center as per instructions. The details for each item are as follows:

DATE OF LATEST CONTACT - Enter the date the youth was last provided services. Enter the month, day and year in the boxed provided. All single digit numbers should be preceeded by zero. No special characters should be used to separate the numbers.
