Departmental Awards

CAPTAIN JOSEPH A. DI VINCENZO of Precinct 16 was awarded the Medal of Valor for exceptionally meritorious police service on the morning of January 10, 1975 when he apprehended an armed youth who had raped a waitress and robbed a patron in a nearby restaurant.

POLICE OFFICERS PAUL R. DELANO and JAMES A. MURPHY were awarded the Medal of Valor for exceptionally meritorious police service in May, 1974 while assigned to the Bureau of Narcotics. The two officers intercepted an armed suspect and as they approached the suspect's car he threatened to kill them by firing out the car window. One of the officers returned the fire, critically wounding the suspect.

POLICE OFFICER JEROME S. MC INTYRE was awarded the Medal of Merit for exceptionally meritorious police service on several occasions. During the year, the officer subdued a suspect who had threatened to kill his infant daughter and her baby-sitter. On another occasion, the officer prevented a suicide by scaling a twenty-five foot cliff and pinning the potential victim until assistance arrived.

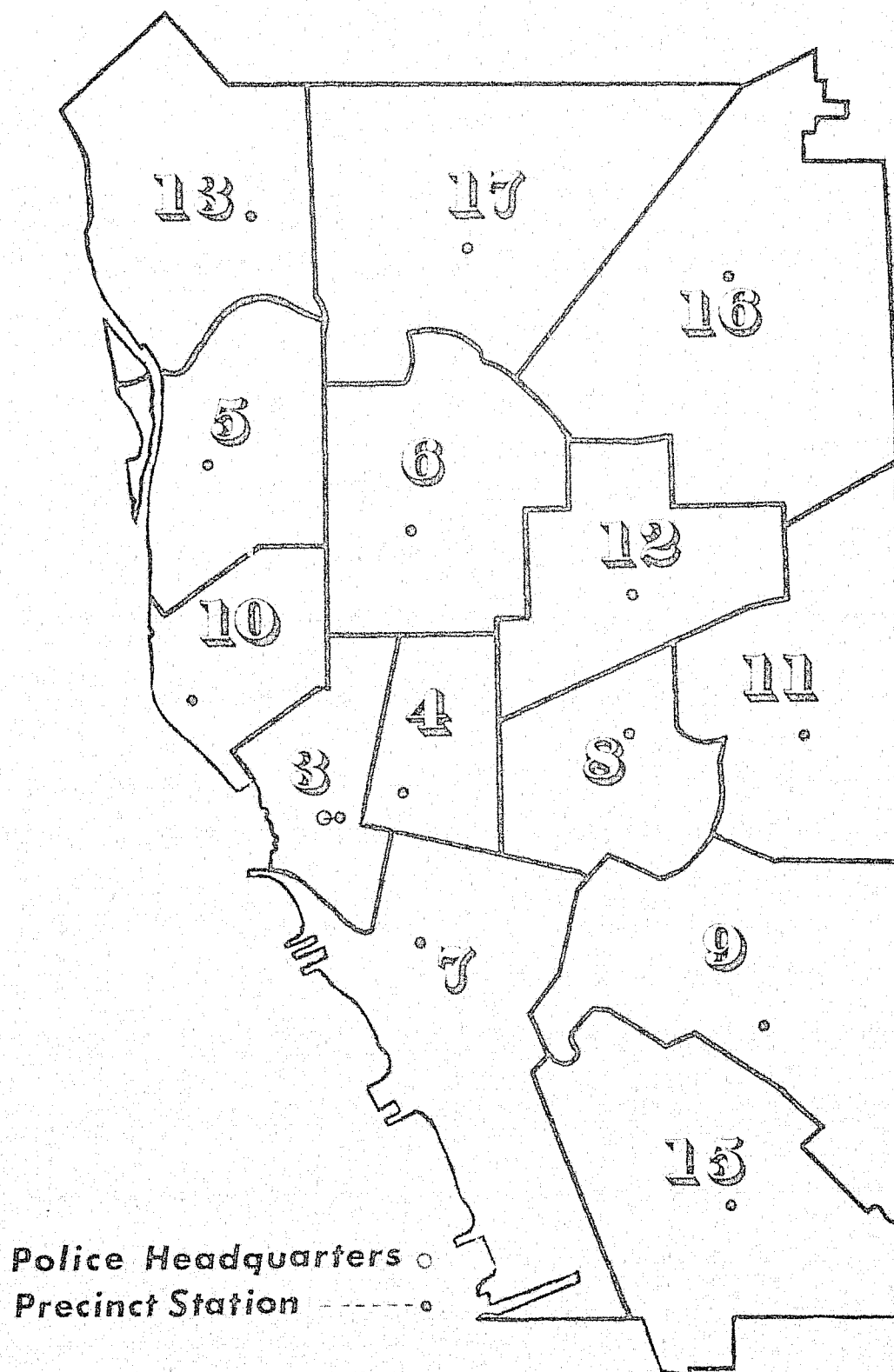
POLICE OFFICERS ROBERT GRISANTI and DONALD P. BARRY were awarded the Commendation Bar for meritorious action in thwarting an armed robbery on August 7, 1975.

POLICE OFFICERS PASQUALE V. SARDINA and THOMAS J. DONOVAN were awarded the Commendation Bar for courageous and meritorious performance of duty for their actions in rescuing several persons from a burning building on July 16, 1975.

POLICE OFFICERS DAVID P. WUEST and RONALD A. MISERANTINO were awarded the Commendation Bar for exceptionally meritorious service on October 10, 1974 when they apprehended a suspect armed with a loaded sawed-off shotgun, who had robbed a local store.

POLICE OFFICER MICHAEL R. O'CONNOR, ACTING DETECTIVES MILTON R. VOGEL and THOMAS J. JUSZKIEWICZ of the Bureau of Narcotics and POLICE OFFICER EDWARD F. LESZKOWICZ of the Motorcycle Division were awarded the Commendation Bar for their courageous actions on April 23, 1975, during the rescue of seven children from a burning building.

POLICE PRECINCT BOUNDARIES



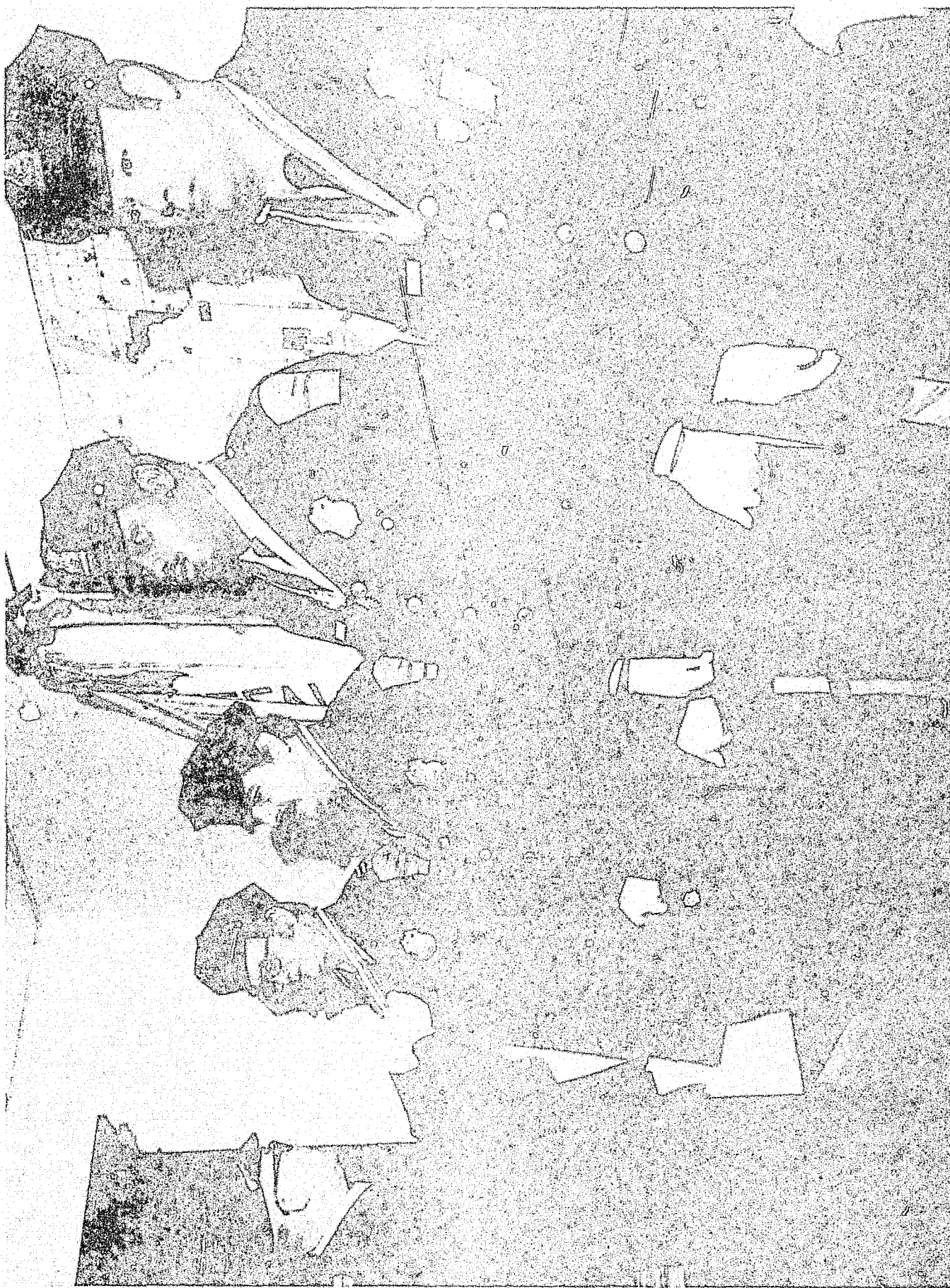

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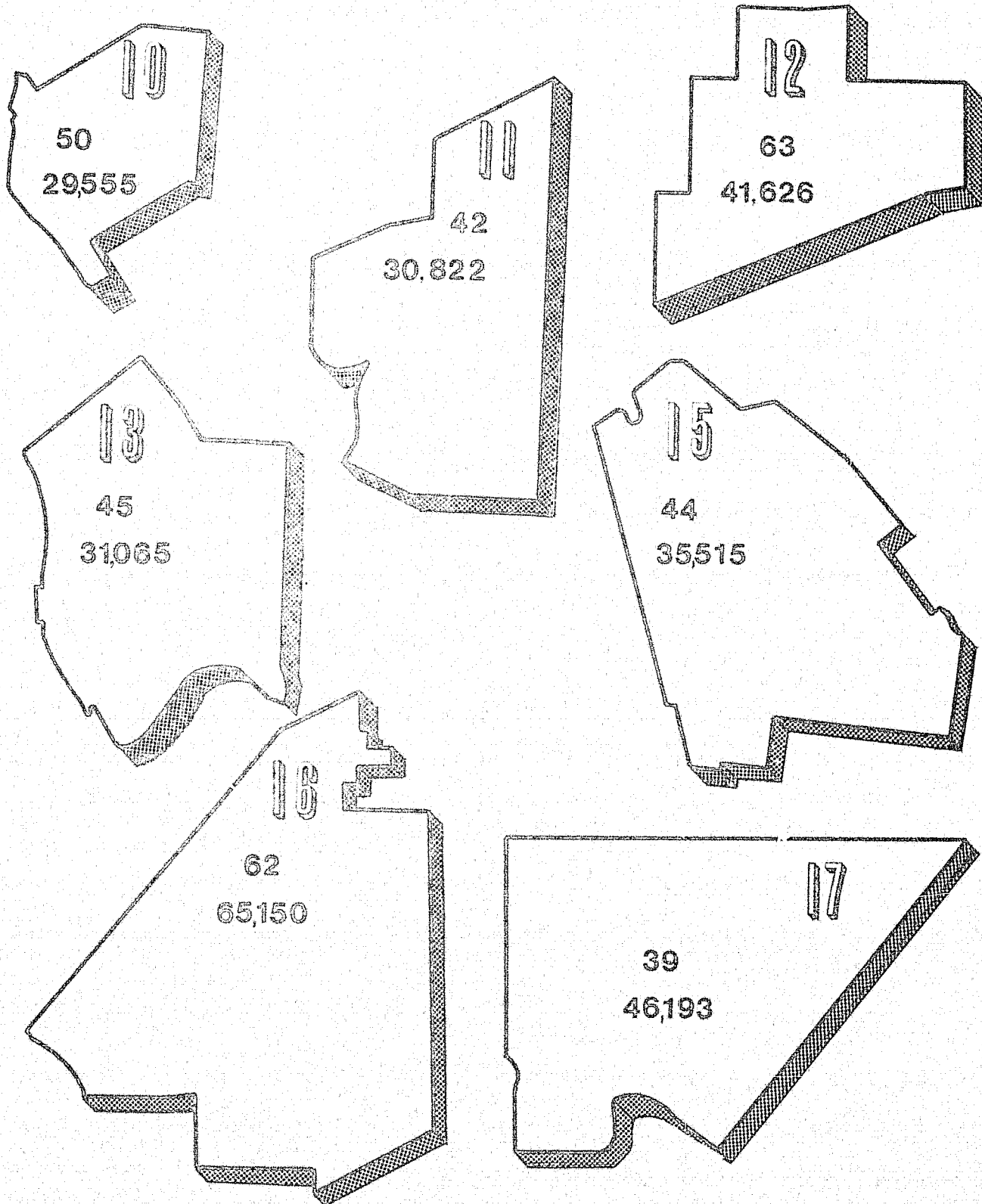
PRECINCT POPULATION AND MANPOWER
