INTRODUCTION

THE PURPOSE OF THIS DOCUMENT IS TO PROVIDE A RECORD OF THE NUMBER AND CHARACTERISTICS OF THOSE INDIVIDUALS WHO HAVE BEEN COMMITTED BY FEDERAL COURTS TO THE CUSTODY OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL OF THE UNITED STATES.

TREND TABLES, VOLUME SUMMARIES, AND DISTRIBUTIONS OF OFFENDER CHARACTERISTICS COMPRIZE THIS REPORT. THE TREND TABLES PROVIDE COMPARATIVE STATISTICS FOR THE LAST TEN YEARS ON SIZE, MOVEMENT, AVERAGE TIME SERVED, AND AVERAGE SENTENCE LENGTH OF THE FEDERAL OFFENDERS IN FEDERAL PRISON SYSTEM INSTITUTIONS.

FOR CONVENIENCE, SUMMARIES OF THE VOLUME OF THIS YEAR'S ADMISSIONS AND DISCHARGES, AS WELL AS THE POPULATION ON THE LAST DAY OF FISCAL YEAR 1975, ARE INCLUDED. PERHAPS THE MOST USEFUL SUMMARY, IN TERMS OF QUICK REFERENCE, IS THE TABLE OF FY 1972-FY 1975 COMPARISONS. THE SUMMARY TOTALS ARE THE MOST ACCURATE RECORD OF POPULATION SIZE AND CHANGE DURING THE YEAR. THE REPORTS ON OFFENDER CHARACTERISTICS ARE ORGANIZED INTO THREE SECTIONS, ONE EACH FOR YEAR-END POPULATION (TABLES A), ADMISSIONS (TABLES B), AND DISCHARGES (TABLES C).

THE FEDERAL PRISON SYSTEM IS RESPONSIBLE FOR TWO DISTINCT FEDERAL OFFENDER POPULATIONS. THE FORMER CONSISTS OF THOSE INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE HOUSED IN, ESCAPED FROM, OR IN TRANSIT BETWEEN THE 52 FEDERAL INSTITUTIONS AND COMMUNITY TREATMENT CENTERS. THE LATTER ARE THOSE WHO ARE HOUSED, AWAITING TRIAL, OR ENROUTE TOWARD STATE, LOCAL, OR

PRIVATE FACILITIES WHICH ARE UNDER CONTRACT WITH THE FEDERAL PRISON SYSTEM FOR THE HOUSING OF FEDERAL OFFENDERS. PRIOR AND CURRENT REPORTS ONLY PRESENT STATISTICS ON THE FEDERAL INSTITUTION POPULATIONS. THIS PRACTICE UNDERSTATES THE SCOPE OF THE FEDERAL PRISON SYSTEM'S RESPONSIBILITY, SINCE APPROXIMATELY 20% OF THE TOTAL POPULATION IS HOUSED IN CONTRACT FACILITIES. STATISTICS CONCERNING THE NATURE OF THE POPULATION HOUSED IN NON-FEDERAL FACILITIES ARE NOT CURRENTLY AVAILABLE, ALTHOUGH THERE ARE DATA ON THE SIZE OF THIS GROUP.

DATA ON THE SIZE OF THE POPULATION IN NON-FEDERAL FACILITIES ARE FURNISHED BY THE OFFICES OF THE U.S. MARSHALS SERVICE IN THE 94 JUDICIAL DISTRICTS IN THE UNITED STATES AND ITS TERRITORIES. DATA ON THE SIZE AND CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION IN FEDERAL FACILITIES ARE PREPARED IN THE 52 FEDERAL CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTIONS AND ARE PROCESSED BY THE AUTOMATED INMATE INFORMATION SYSTEM IN THE CENTRAL OFFICE IN WASHINGTON, DC.

SPECIAL ATTENTION SHOULD BE GIVEN TO THE REPRESENTATIVENESS AND COMPLETENESS OF THE DATA IN THE CHARACTERISTICS TABLES. THESE DATA PERTAIN ONLY TO THE FEDERAL OFFENDER POPULATION HOUSED IN FEDERAL INSTITUTIONS DURING OR ON THE LAST DAY OF THE FISCAL YEAR. FURTHER, THE DATA DESCRIBE PRIMARILY THE SENTENCED POPULATION. BECAUSE THE UNSENTENCED POPULATION IS TRANSIENT IN NATURE, IT IS DIFFICULT TO OBTAIN A COMPLETE PROFILE OF THEIR CHARACTERISTICS. HOWEVER, SINCE MORE THAN 95% OF THE FEDERAL OFFENDER POPULATION IS UNDER SENTENCE, IT IS ASSUMED THAT THE CHARACTERISTICS OF THE SENTENCED POPULATION ARE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE TOTAL POPULATION IN FEDERAL INSTITUTIONS.

TO AID THE READER OF THE SUMMARIES, REPORTS WHICH ARE NOT 100% COMPLETE ARE ANNOTATED WITH THE ACTUAL REPORTING UNIVERSE AND COMPLETENESS OF THE REPORT AS A PERCENTAGE OF THAT UNIVERSE. FOR EXAMPLE, THERE WERE 22,575 SENTENCED PRISONERS IN FEDERAL INSTITUTIONS ON JUNE 30, 1975. A REPORT ON THE SENTENCED POPULATION, WHICH ONLY TOTALS 21,400, WILL BE ANNOTATED "UNIVERSE = 22,575," AND "COMPLETENESS = 94.8%."

TO FURTHER AID INTERPRETATION, SOME OF THE REPORTS WHICH SHOW AVERAGE SENTENCE LENGTH HAVE TWO TOTAL LINES. DEPENDING UPON OTHER VARIABLES IN THE REPORT, AVERAGE SENTENCE LENGTH STATISTICS CAN BE HEAVILY SKEWED BY THE VERY SHORT SENTENCES FOR IMMIGRATION OFFENSES, AND THE VERY LONG SENTENCES FOR VIOLENT CRIME OFFENSES. FOR THIS REASON, ONE TOTAL LINE INCLUDING AND ONE TOTAL LINE EXCLUDING THESE TWO OFFENSE CLASSES ARE PROVIDED. THE VIOLENT CRIMES CLASS INCLUDES ASSAULT, KIDNAPPING, ROBBERY, HOMICIDE, AND RAPE. EACH OF THESE REPORTS HAS BEEN FOOTNOTED TO REFER TO THIS DISCUSSION.

PAROLE DATA, FORMERLY PUBLISHED IN THIS REPORT, IS NOW PUBLISHED, UNDER SEPARATE COVER, BY THE U.S. PAROLE COMMISSION.

June 30, 1955 - June 30, 1975




CHART-2 MOVEMENT OF SENTENCED FEDERAL PRISON POPULATION
FISCAL YEARS 1965 - 1975




CHART-3 MOVEMENT OF SENTENCED FEDERAL PRISON POPULATION

Percent Change, June 30, 1965 - June 30, 1975





CHART-4 METHODS OF ADMISSION TO FEDERAL INSTITUTIONS
 Percent Of Total Admissions (Transfers Excluded).


FISCAL YEARS 1965 - 1975




**CHART-6 AVERAGE TIME SERVED AND AVERAGE SENTENCE LENGTH



GLOSSARY
OF
SENTENCE PROCEDURES

Regular Adult: A D.C. Adult, Military Prisoner, or other individual who qualifies under the parole eligibility provisions of 18 U.S.C. 924(a) and 4202, or 26 U.S.C. 5871 and 7237.

18 U.S.C. 4208(b): A commitment for a study (deemed to be for the maximum sentence). The results of the study shall be provided by the Director of the Bureau of Prisons to the courts within three months.

18 U.S.C. 4208(a)(1): An individual sentenced to a term in excess of one year with the parole eligibility date determined by the court to be less than one-third of the maximum sentence imposed and no more than fifteen years.

18 U.S.C. 4208(a)(2): An individual eligible for parole at the determination of the United States Board of Parole.

18 U.S.C. 5010(e) -(YCA study and observation): A youth offender or young adult committed for observation and study. The findings of the study shall be provided by the Youth Division of the United States Board of Parole to the court within sixty days.

18 U.S.C. 5010(b) - (Youth Corrections Act, Indeterminate): A youth offender or young adult sentenced for treatment and supervision who shall be released conditionally under supervision on or before the expiration of four years from the date of conviction and who shall be discharged unconditionally on or before six years from the date of conviction.

18 U.S.C. 5010(c) - (Youth Corrections Act, specific term): A youth offender or young adult sentenced for treatment and supervision in excess of six years, but not to exceed the maximum of the offended statute, who shall be released conditionally under supervision not later than two years before expiration of the maximum sentence imposed.

18 U.S.C. 5034 - J0: A juvenile committed for observation and study. The results of the study shall be provided by the Director of the Bureau of Prisons to the court within sixty days.

18 U.S.C. 5034 - FJDA Minority: A juvenile committed for the period of his minority.

18 U.S.C. 5034 - FJDA, other than minority: A juvenile committed for a period of time less than his minority.

Glossary (continued)

16 D.C.C. 2318 - DC, Juvenile: A District of Columbia juvenile.

741 (Split Sentence, Title 18, Section 3651): A sentence on one count consisting of a suspended sentence with a definite term, and a confinement portion of six months or less followed by a period of probation not to exceed five years.

18 U.S.C. 4244 (Mental Competency Determination/not under sentence): An individual whose mental condition is examined prior to sentencing to determine if he is mentally competent to understand the proceedings against him or to assist in his own defense.

18 U.S.C. 4246 (Mental incompetency): A person found to be mentally incompetent and committed until such time as the person shall be found mentally competent to stand trial or until the pending charges against him are liquidated.

NARA (Case under study) (18 U.S.C. 4242): A person committed for an examination to determine if he is an addict and likely to be rehabilitated through treatment. The examination report shall be furnished to the court by the Attorney General within sixty days.

NARA (sentenced prisoner) (18 U.S.C. 4253): An addict committed for treatment for an indeterminate period of time not to exceed ten years or the maximum period of time which could otherwise have been imposed.

State Case: A state prisoner serving his state sentence in a federal institution under contract.




