



FISCAL YEAR 1977 ANNUAL REPORT

ACQUISITIONS

The Bureau of Detention Standards and Services, Department of Corrections, establishes minimum standards for the physical condition of county and municipal jails, houses of correction, and county juvenile detention facilities; and for the treatment of inmates with respect to their health and safety and security of the community and makes recommendations to such institutions to assure compliance with the requirements of the minimum standards. The Bureau provides consultation services for the design, construction, and administration of detention facilities, makes studies and surveys of programs and administration of such facilities, inspects each institution at least once annually, and gives notice to the county board and sheriff, or to corporate authorities of the municipality, of any noncompliance with minimum standards. In addition to the sheriff and county clerk, a copy of the county jail inspection report is forwarded to the county board chairman, chief circuit judge, county resident judge, state's attorney, and the regional director of the Illinois Law Enforcement Commission (ILEC). Municipal jail inspection reports are forwarded to the chief of police, mayor, clerk, and ILEC regional director.

The legal authority which governs the Bureau's activities is contained in the Illinois Revised Statutes, Chapter 38 - Criminal Law and Procedure, Section 1003-15-2.

The Bureau has a continuing function to provide the U. S. Bureau of Prisons correspondence courses on "Jail Operations" and "Jail Administration" to jail officers on request. The tests are graded and certificates issued to those attaining passing scores.

Appendix I reflects noncompliances with the Illinois County Jail Standards and includes noncompliances with the Illinois Standards and Guides for the Detention of Juveniles. Of the 102 Illinois counties, four do not operate a jail. One hundred and two county jail inspections were conducted (including three separate county work release centers), identifying 396 noncompliances and offering 1,390 recommendations to improve jail operations. Sixteen counties had no noncompliances. One county was not inspected because of jail renovation.

The 396 noncompliances identified during the inspections of county jails were grouped into three categories: Administration (137); Operations, including support services (164); and Building and Equipment (95). The 1,390 recommendations cover the full spectrum of facility operations.

A growing concern in county jail operation is the availability of programs for detainees. Eleven counties have an educational program that offers vocational and/or academic instruction; 56 have counseling services that include family, religion, and/or employment problems; 25 have structured library services, 12 have recreational programs that provide out-of-cell activity, either indoor or outdoor; 44 offer structured religious services; 67 provide counseling treatment for alcohol addiction

and/or drug abuse; and 57 have a work release program. In two of the counties operating a work release program, housing accommodations are separate from the jail complex and one of the counties rents space to Department of Corrections work releasees.

Appendix II reflects population statistical data of county jails, including the sentenced category. It is noted that Cook County figures include all four divisions and the Maywood Branch facility. Cook County had 55,134 inmates for FY 77, totaling 998,058 inmate days, 2,735 average daily population, and 18 jail days average per inmate. The remainder of the county jails had 96,056 inmates for 787,991 jail days, 2,159 average daily population, and eight jail days average per inmate.

Appendix III depicts both the noncompliances with the Municipal Jail and Lockup Standards and the population statistical data. As in county jail inspections, the 286 noncompliances identified were grouped into three categories: Administration (111); Operations (40); and Building and Equipment (135). A total of 299 recommendations were offered with a view toward improving jail operation.

The number of active municipal jails and lockups fluctuated throughout the year; and at the end of the reporting period, there were 264 active facilities and 268 inspections were conducted. There were 371,467 persons (adults and juveniles) processed through Illinois municipal jails or lockups during this reporting period.

Appendix IV reflects population statistical data of minors detained in the 11 locally supported independent juvenile detention facilities. An independent facility is one which is not part of the county jail or municipal lockup operation. There were 13,719 juveniles held in county detention centers and an average daily population of 311. Additionally, 73 county jails processed 3,354 juveniles and municipal jails processed 8,288 during the reporting period.

Appendix IV also depicts the noncompliances noted during inspections of county juvenile detention centers. The 112 noncompliances of the Illinois Standards and Guides for the Detention of Juveniles were grouped into four categories: Administration (23); Operations (13); Building and Equipment (74); and Programs (2).

In addition to inspecting county and municipal detention facilities, the Bureau is required to inspect all State operated adult correctional centers, youth centers, and community correctional centers.

In FY 1977, Bureau personnel conducted 418 inspections; 39 special investigations; 94 unusual occurrence investigations; 1,610 consultation and assistance visits, as well as 3,852 telephone consultations; expended 35 1/2 days for on-site training for county and municipal jail officers, in addition to 46 on-site training workshop sessions; and reviewed 47 blueprints on new jail construction or remodeling of existing facilities.

During FY 1977, the Bureau issued six-month notices to four county jails and two city jails for failure to comply with minimum standards; and requested the Attorney General to file a closing petition on one city jail

for failure to correct violations within six months after receiving a notice. Two of the four county jails and the one city jail corrected the violations during the six month period subsequent to the inspection. Action is still pending against the remaining two county jails and one city jail. Two cities voluntarily closed their jails as a result of adverse inspection reports.

During this period, the Bureau revised the Illinois County Jail Standards and the county jail inspection report checklist.

Because of budget limitations, the County Jail Officers Training Course, conducted by the Departments' Training Academy, was not funded beyond FY 1977; however, 227 jail officers attended the course during the fiscal year. A total of 347 jail officers were trained through this program (120 in FY 1976).
