




I am honored to submit to you the Annual Report of the activities of the Buffalo Police Department for the year 1977.


I must compliment each member of the Department for his outstanding performance during the past year. With substantial manpower cuts still in effect, the Department was still able to sustain any significant increase in crime. During the year, "Offenses Known to the Police" totaled 32,078 compared to 31,397 for 1976, an increase of only 2% over the previous year.

The Central Booking Bureau and the Community Youth Officer Program, both of which were inaugurated during the past year, have been most effective and have created a very positive image for the Department. In the current year, with the implementation of the Precinct Sub-Station concept and other innovations, we hope to bring the Police Department closer to the Community, increase the visibility of the Police Officers and hopefully reduce crime in our City.

On behalf of all the members of the Department, I sincerely thank you and your staff for your unstinting cooperation during the past year. Without your cooperation and guidance during the past year, our task would have been most difficult.



Departmental Awards

OFFICERS GERALD D. BAETZOLD and ROBERT J. MAZIARZ assigned to the Tactical Patrol Unit, were awarded the Medal of Valor for exceptionally conspicuous police service. On the night of January 24, 1977, Officers Baetzhold and Maziarz, while on patrol, responded to a call of 'shots fired'. Arriving at a Fillmore Avenue address, they learned that two men armed with rifles had terrorized the occupants of two apartments and forced a woman at gunpoint to accompany them in their escape. The officers traced the suspects and their victim through the snow, confronting them in a nearby yard and ordered the men to drop their firearms. The suspects opened fire, but the officers showed poise and professionalism by withholding return fire for fear of hitting the woman. The suspects left the woman behind as they fled, and were captured and their weapons seized.

OFFICERS LARRY BAEHRE and DANIEL A. DILL, assigned to Precinct #12, were awarded the Medal of Merit for exceptionally meritorious police service. On the night of June 20, 1977, Officers Baehre and Dill, while on patrol, were called to the scene of a house fire at 445 Winslow Avenue. When they arrived, they found a woman and her infant daughter trapped on a second floor roof. Without regard for their own safety, the officers entered the smoke filled house and ran through flames to reach the only stairway to check the apartments for occupants. These officers fought their way through dense smoke to reach the roof, and passed the trapped fire victims to waiting Fire Department personnel.

LIEUTENANT EDGAR CONRAD and OFFICER STEVE NICOSIA, assigned to Precinct #4, were awarded the Medal of Merit for exceptionally meritorious police service. On the night of August 6, 1977, Lieutenant Conrad and Officer Nicosia while on patrol, discovered a fire on Locust Street. After helping a woman and her daughter from the burning home, Officer Nicosia, at great personal risk, entered the rear of the home. An explosion and wall of flame followed, badly burning Officer Nicosia. Lt. Conrad, disregarding his own safety, went to the aid of the injured officer and pulled him from the flames to safety.

Departmental Awards


OFFICERS MICHAEL KENDALL and PATRICK BELTZ, assigned to Precinct #8, were awarded the Medal of Merit for exceptionally meritorious police service. On the night of February 26, 1977, Officers Kendall and Beltz, while on patrol, went to a Broadway tavern to investigate a report of an armed man. Upon arrival, the officers heard two gun shots and observed several patrons running from the tavern. As the officers approached, a suspect appeared in a doorway and pointed a pistol at them. The officers ordered the suspect to drop the weapon and, when he continued to threaten them, each officer fired a shot. The man raced back into the tavern, and the officers followed him and disarmed him, seizing an automatic pistol from the suspect.

OFFICERS DUANE BONAMICI and JOSEPH WEBER, assigned to Precinct #15, were awarded the Medal of Merit for exceptionally meritorious police service. On the night of January 26, 1977, during a severe winter storm, Officer Bonamici and Weber were assigned to patrol the waterfront and Buffalo Skyway complex. At great personal risk, the Officers entered the drifted roadway despite weather conditions so severe that one officer had to walk in front of the patrol car to provide guidance to the driver. Experiencing high winds and wind-chill temperatures of 50 degrees below zero, the officers checked 80 vehicles on the impassable road complex and then guided rescue vehicles to the aid of more than 100 stranded motorists.


POLICE PRECINCT BOUNDARIES






