Dear Mr. Davidson:

The crime statistics herein submitted reflect a 2% decrease in index crime during the year of 1977. The Austin Police Department's clearance rate for index crimes in 1977 was 31%, which is slightly higher than the 1976 rate of 28%.

The year of 1977 marked several innovations in the police training program, including the adoption of new testing and evaluation methods. The 57th and 58th cadet classes of the Police Academy were trained in 1977. A Staff Psychologist was hired to aid in the training and counseling of APD members.

During the past year, the Police Department initiated a Manpower Allocation Program to ensure the most effective utilization of patrol resources. At the same time, the Crime Analysis Unit, funded through an LEAA grant, was formed to study crime trends and patterns for the benefit of patrol personnel.

The department in 1977 also entered the planning stage of a Team Policing project for Austin. This project will be a concentrated effort to reduce crime in a specific neighborhood, as an experiment in police techniques that might possibly be applied city-wide.

I am grateful to you and members of the City Council for your support during the year. I look forward to cooperating with you and the Council in achieving the city's Goals and Objectives for 1977/79.

## **Collisions By Month**




