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#### INTRODUCTION

A new system for reporting case statistics from the clerks of superior court to the Administrative Office of the Courts was explained in the Introduction to last year's Annual Report. Under that system, which was implemented on October 1, 1976, each case which is filed in a trial court is reported by individual case number, along with date of filing and other identifying information, to the Administrative Office of the Courts; and each case disposed of is similarly reported. (Juvenile petitions are not reported by case number and this is the one category of cases not included in the present statistical reporting system.)

Upon receipt of the case data in the Administrative Office of the Courts, the data is keyed to magnetic computer tape; and computer time is purchased from the State Department of Administration's Computer Center, to process the data and to produce a variety of periodic reports. Currently, these reports are produced at the end of each quarter and are cumulative throughout the calendar year, with the last quarter reports constituting the annual data for that year. Copies of these reports, for the relevant counties and judicial districts, are furnished to the clerks of superior court, superior court and district court judges, and to the district attorneys.

During 1977 a total of 1,447,758 cases of all types were reported filed in North Carolina's superior and district courts. By category, the numbers filed ranged from 10,401 civil cases in the superior courts, to 721,048 criminal cases (traffic offenses) in the State's district courts. Each of the State's 100 counties contributed a portion of these filings, ranging from a total of 1,021 in Graham to 113,354 in Mecklenburg County.

During 1977 a total of 1,391,769 civil and criminal cases were disposed of in the State's district and superior courts. In terms of category, the numbers ranged from 9,447 civil cases disposed of by the superior courts, to 696,421 criminal cases (traffic offenses) disposed of in the State's district courts. Each of the State's 100 counties contributed a portion of these case dispositions, ranging from a total of 898 in Graham County, to 103,621 in Mecklenburg County.

The combined total of case filings and case dispositions during 1977, for the entire State, was 2,839,527. This was the total number of individual case numbers (with accompanying other data elements) reported to the Administrative Office of the Courts by the 100 clerks of superior court.

For record-keeping and statistical reporting in 1977 (by individual case number) purposes, there are five major case categories at the superior court level and five at the district court level. These are listed below, with the numbers of filings and dispositions during 1977.

There is a very considerable difference in the time and amount of court resources required for the various categories of cases. The largest volume, by far, is district court criminal (motor vehicle offenses). Yet, in relative terms, this category of cases required the least in time and court resource of all case categories. Sixty percent of this category (414,721 of the 696,421 motor vehicle cases) was disposed of on a plea of guilty and waiver of court appearance; and more than eighty percent of the remainder (227,579 cases out of 281,700) was disposed of within 90 days in the district courts. Furthermore, only six percent of all criminal cases tried in the district courts was appealed to the superior courts.

Although a distinct pattern of time and court resource required may emerge for a category of cases, individual cases within the category can and do vary substantially from the overall pattern. For example, an individual misdemeanor case tried in superior court on a plea of not guilty may take two or three days to try as compared with a half day or less for most such cases. A major felony case may be disposed of on a plea of guilty in less than an hour in the superior court, in contrast with a several-day pattern for most such cases. The point is, courts exist to do justice, under law, in *each* individual case has the possibility of proceeding along a path through the court system that may require either little or no court resource, or a great deal of the time and effort of the courts at various levels.

The question may be asked, what is the definition of a "case" for court purposes, and is, or should, there be any different definition for purposes of statistical reporting on court cases?

Under North Carolina law, a criminal case is an action by or in the name of the State against one or more defendants, charging one or more criminal offenses. Statutes as well as an extensive body of case law deal with joinder of offenses and defendants for purposes of a criminal trial. To be included or joined in a single case, different offenses must be related; and for two or more defendants to be joined in a single case for trial they must have been involved in the same act or transaction, and it must appear that the joinder will not be prejudicial to the rights of either defendant in obtaining a fair trial. Rulings on joinder or severance of defendants or offenses are within the sound discretion of the trial judge. (State v. Alford, 289 N.C. 372 (1976); Section 15A-926, North Carolina General Statutes)

A civil case is an action pertaining to the personal or property rights of one or more parties. Whether joinder of claims and remedies or joinder of parties is proper in a given case is a matter of law, determined by the presiding trial judge in accordance with relevant statutes and case law. (Section 1A-1, Rules 18 and 19, North Carolina General Statutes)

If a trial court has dealt with a matter as a "case" in the court, then it is in fact a "case" in that court; and any determination of procedural error in that case can only be made by an appellate court on appeal.

It necessarily follows that accurate statistical reporting of court "cases" in North Carolina is a reporting of what actually occurred in North Carolina courts. If the court in question dealt with a particular matter as a "case" in that court, then that is precisely what it was — a case — and should be so reported. In the context of court administration and in the context of counting "court cases", it is, for example, immaterial whether a given criminal case had one defendant or several defendants, involved one criminal charge or several charges, required no trial court time to process — because a guilty plea was entered and right to appearance in court was waived — or required six weeks to try before a jury. In each such instance, the court treated the matter as a case; and accurate statistical reporting of *court* cases will require precisely the same treatment.

As a final word in this Introduction, it is pertinent to emphasize a point which was made in the Introduction to last year's Annual Report: our present system of data reporting, although vastly improved since October, 1976, falls far short of being a full-fledged, up-to-date "computerized system", which is very much needed for North Carolina's courts. We still have a *manual* case data reporting system. All of the data on the close to three million case filings and dispositions in 1977 had to be entered on paper in the clerks' offices in the 100 North Carolina counties, and a great volume of paper was transmitted weekly to Raleigh.

Efforts are still going forward, with the assistance of LEAA grant funding, to develop a full-fledged EDP system for North Carolina courts. This is being done in the hope, and with the expectation, that State appropriations will be available in the future to maintain and operate a highly efficient and effective EDP system for North Carolina courts.

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#### THE APPELLATE DIVISION

#### THE SUPREME COURT

One hundred and fifty opinions were filed by the Supreme Court in 1977. Of the total, 58 were civil and 92 were criminal cases. Thirty-one percent (18 opinions) of the civil appeals were affirmed and fifty-nine percent (54 opinions) of the criminal appeals were affirmed. In the remaining cases, the Supreme Court modified or reversed the decisions from which the appeals were taken. Of the total number of appeals, 41 were decisions in which the Supreme Court granted a discretionary review, the remaining 109 were appeals as of right. As reported in the North Carolina Reports, the court disposed of 319 petitions for discretionary review and five motions to reconsider.

#### THE COURT OF APPEALS

In 1977 the Court of Appeals disposed of 846 appeals. The Court filed 785 written opinions during the year (covering 787 appeals). Of the 785 written opinions, 484 were in criminal cases and 301 were in civil cases, including appeals from the Insurance Complexioner, the Industrial Commission and the Utilities Commission. In addition, the Court disposed of 1,169 motions and petitions in 1977.

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#### THE SUPERIOR COURT DIVISION

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Total case activity in the superior courts during 1977, compared with total case activity during the preceding four years, is depicted in the graphs which follow. There was a slight decrease in total filings -61,665 in 1977 as compared with 63,321 in 1976. There was, however, an increase in the total number of dispositions -59,434 in 1977 as compared with 58,789 in 1976. The number of cases pending at the end of 1977 was 35,314, as compared with 33,083 at the end of 1976, an increase of 6.7%.

The total number of days of superior court scheduled in 1977 was  $11,673\frac{1}{2}$ , compared with 11,268 in 1976. There was also an increase in the total number of days of court held, 9,143 in 1977 as compared with  $8,897\frac{1}{2}$  in 1976. For all 100 counties, the percentage of scheduled days of court held in 1977 was 78.3%, compared with 78.9% in 1976,

#### SUPERIOR COURT CIVIL DOCKETS

The flow of civil cases through the Superior Courts is depicted in the two graphs which show the numbers of cases added and disposed of during 1977 and the four preceding years and the numbers of cases pending at the end of 1977 and the four preceding years. There were 373 fewer civil cases filed in Superior Court in 1977 than in 1976, while the number of dispositions changed slightly - 9,447 in 1977 compared to 9,391 in 1976, an increase of one-half of one percent. There was a 6.5% increase in the number of cases pending at the end of the year - 15,606 at the end of 1977, compared to 14,652 at the end of 1976. The distribution of the pending cases among the counties is illustrated in the table following the graphs, which shows a relatively stable pattern over the five-year span, as does the table on the ten counties with the largest numbers of pending cases: all ten appeared on this table in the 1976 Annual Report.

Data on civil case activity during 1977, in each of the counties and judicial districts, is then presented in tables showing: (1) cases pending, added and disposed of; (2) the ratios of dispositions to total caseload and of pending cases to dispositions; (3) the time from filing to disposition of cases on which superior court action was completed during the year; (4) the ages of the cases pending at the end of the year; and (5) the utilization of scheduled superior court civil sessions.

The second of these tables provides an expanded format, compared with what has been published in previous annual reports, for presenting ratios of dispositions to total caseload and of pending cases to dispositions. The ratio of dispositions to caseload varies considerably among the 100 counties, ranging from 18.3% in Warren County to 65.1% in Robeson County. The Statewide ratio of dispositions to total caseload is 37.4%.

Data on elapsed time from filing to disposition of civil superior court cases is appearing for the first time in this annual report. These statistics are now available due to the revised case reporting system (implemented on October 1, 1976), which was explained in the 1976 Annual Report. The data in this new table show that 51.6% of the Superior Court civil cases disposed of during 1977 had been pending less than one year, and 79.3% had been pending less than two years. On the surface, this would seem to indicate that civil cases move through the superior courts in a quite expeditious manner. These figures, however, must be viewed in the light of the fact that only a small portion of the civil cases filed go to jury trial: as the data on the cases disposed of in 1977 show, only 531 (5.6%) of the 9,447 cases were disposed of by jury trial and 3,343 (35.4%) by judges, leaving 59% disposed of by other means. These other means include out-of-court settlements; judgments for plaintiffs in cases where there is no answer to the complaint; non-suits taken by the plaintiff, etc. Moreover, not all cases disposed of by judges do go to trial. Among judge dispositions are cases dismissed or judgments entered on motions before there is any hearing on the facts of the substantive issues in dispute.

The table on ages of civil cases pending in the superior courts as of December 31, 1977, must be considered to obtain an accurate perspective of the flow of civil cases in the superior courts. This table shows that 8,017 cases (51.5% of the total number pending) have been pending for one year or more, and 3,825 civil cases (almost one-fourth of all pending civil cases) have been pending in the superior courts for two years or more, with 862 civil cases (5.6% of the total) pending for four years or more. By comparison, at the end of 1976 only 6,873 cases (46.8% of the total) had been pending for one year or more, and 3,042 cases (20.7%) had been pending for two years or more. Thus, the statistical picture on ages of pending cases at the end of 1977 is less favorable than it was at the end of 1976.

As indicated in the 1976 Annual Report, in comments on the ages of civil cases pending in the superior courts, if neither of the parties involved in a civil case is interested in having the case put on the trial calendar, it will not likely be calendared. This, rather than non-availability of court resources, probably explains the numbers of long-pending civil cases. The following observation, contained in the 1976 Annual Report, bears repeating:

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"From the standpoint of an efficiently functioning court system, it can be said that there is always an underlying public interest in assuring that cases of all types are disposed of promptly, consistent with the nature of the case and the rights of the parties involved. In civil matters, it is obvious that the court system (and thus the public interest) is not well served by having any such mager carried as an open, pending case for several years simply because the parties in such a case permit or tolerate this to occur because of disinterest or inattention. At the least, such cases clutter the records and give an erroneous picture of the real workload confronting the court system." As noted in last year's annual report, there is no official or generally recognized time standard for the disposition of civil cases in the superior courts. Perhaps, ideally, the superior courts should be able to dispose of any civil case within six months after it is filed. Or, perhaps it would be more realistic and in keeping with the developments in most civil cases to suggest that a civil case — absent unusual circumstances — should be disposed of within a year after the case is filed.

If a one-year standard were applied to the civil cases pending as of December 31, 1977, it is obvious that one would conclude that there is a substantial backlog of civil cases in our superior courts, with 51.5% of the total number pending for more than one year; applying a two-year standard would place almost 25% of the total (3,825 out of a total of 15,606) in a "backlog" status.

However, no specific conclusions are expressed at this time as to what should be an appropriate time-standard for the disposition of superior court civil cases. This is a matter which deserves the further attention of court officials, members of the practicing bar, and interested members of the public.

Finally, information is presented in this section of the annual report on estates cases and special proceedings, matters which are filed before the clerk of the superior court in each of the 100 counties. (Special proceedings before the clerks include such matters as petitions on foreclosures, involuntary commitments to mental hospitals, adoptions, condemnations of real property for public purposes, incompetency of persons to manage their personal financial affairs. The clerk's rulings are appealable to the superior court judge.)

The tables on estates cases and special proceedings show the numbers of cases pending, added and disposed of during the year and the ratio of dispositions to the total caseload. During 1977, a total of 31,742 estates cases were filed, compared to a total of 27,582 filed during 1976, with a total of 29,222 disposed of during 1977 compared with 26,425 during 1976. There was a 5.8% increase in the number of estates cases pending at the end of the year — 46,150 at the end of 1977 compared to 43,630 at the end of 1976.

As for special proceedings during 1977, the total filed was 27,156, a decrease from the 28,254 filed during 1976. A total of 26,888 special proceedings were disposed of during 1977 compared with 29,468 during 1976. The number of special proceedings pending at the end of 1977 was 20,601, compared with 20,333 at the end of 1976.

#### SUPERIOR COURT CRIMINAL POCKETS

Criminal case activity in the superior courts is depicted in two following graphs which show the numbers of cases added and disposed of during the years, 1973-1977, and the numbers of cases pending at the end of each of these years. For the second year in a row the number of cases filed during the year was less than the number filed during the previous year: 51,264 cases were filed in 1977, compared to 52,547 filed during 1976, a decrease of 2.4%. The decline in criminal case filings during 1977, as compared with 1976, is explained by a reduction in the number of misdemeanor cases appealed from district courts to the superior courts during 1977. The decrease in these misdemeanor appeals to the superior courts more than off-set an approximate 2% (574 cases) increase in the number of felony filings during 1977. Dispositions of criminal cases increased slightly: 49,987 cases disposed of in 1977, compared to 49,398 during 1976. There was a significant increase in the number of cases pending at the end of the year: 19,708 on December 31, 1977, compared with 18,431 on December 31, 1976 — an increase of 6.9%.

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The distribution of pending cases among the counties over the past five years along with a listing of the ten counties with the largest numbers of cases pending at the end of 1977 is shown in the following tables.

During 1977, 6% of the criminal cases tried in the district courts were appealed to the superior courts, compared with 6.5% appealed in 1976. Appeals from district courts constituted 42.3% of all superior court criminal filings during 1977, compared with 44.7% in 1976.

Information on criminal case activity, by county and judicial district, is presented in a series of tables showing: (1) felony cases pending, filed, and disposed of; (2) misdemeanor cases pending, filed and disposed of; (3) ratios of dispositions to total caseload and of pending cases to dispositions; (4) time from filing to disposition of the felony cases disposed of during 1977; (5) the ages of felony cases pending at the end of the year; (6) time from filing to disposition ot misdemeanor cases disposed of during the year; (7) ages of misdemeanor cases pending at the end of the year; (6) time from filing at the end of the year; and (8) utilization of superior court criminal sessions.

The data in the tables relating to the time from filing to disposition and to the ages of pending cases is particularly relevant to the matter of "speedy trials" and the time standards for speedy trials which were enacted in the 1977 General Assembly. For cases filed on and after October 1, 1978, the statutes now mandate disposition within 120 days of filing, and for cases filed on and after October 1, 1980, the statutes specify disposition within 90 days of filing. Certain periods of delay are excluded, such as time required for physical or mental examination of a defendant; for other trials involving the defendant; for interlocutory appeals; for hearings on motions; for delay caused by the defendant; delay agreed to by defendant and prosecutor; and delay granted by the trial judge for good cause. If a defendant is not brought to trial within the time limits specified by statute or as otherwise prescribed by the trial judge, the criminal charge is required to be dismissed on motion of the defendant.

A total of 28,819 felony cases were disposed of by the superior courts during 1977. Of this number, 56.7% (16,323 cases) were disposed of within 90 days of filing; 78.5% (22,615 cases) within 180 days of filing; and 21.5% were disposed of more than six months after filing.

A total of 11,373 felony cases were pending in the superior courts on December 31, 1977. Of this number, 47.6% (5,421 cases) had been pending for 90 days or less; and 15.7% (1,794 cases) had been pending for one year or more.

It is obvious that a substantial number of felony cases on which action was completed during 1977 required more than 120 days for disposition, and the table on ages of pending felony cases reveals a substantial number which have been pending for more than six months, and for more than a year. The question might be asked, what conclusions can one draw from the 1977 statistics regarding the likely response of the superior courts to the 120-day standard which becomes effective October 1, 1978? No clear-cut answer can be given to this question. The speedy trial statute does not mandate the 120-day standard for all criminal cases irrespective of individual case circumstances. Clearly, many criminal cases will be delayed for good cause, as recognized by the speedy trial statute. This means that the 120-day period will be exceeded in many cases but there will still be full compliance with the provisions of the speedy trial statute. The available 1977 statistics do not tell us whether the implementation of the speedy trial statute will impose any serious strain on available court resources for the handling of criminal cases. (In any event, this would not seem to be the case insofar as judge resource is concerned as eleven additional superior court judges were authorized by the 1977 General Assembly.)

The 1977 data shows an improvement in the ages of felony cases pending at the end of the year, compared with the situation at the end of 1976: 15.7% of the cases were one year or more old at the end of 1977, whereas 18.3% were one year or more old at the end of 1976.

A similar improvement was not evident for misdemeanor cases: 13.9% of the misdemeanor cases pending at the end of 1977 were one year or more old, whereas only 12.7% of the misdemeanor cases pending at the end of 1976 were one year or more old.

# The **District** Court **Division**

"The General Assembly shall, from time to time, divide the State into a convenient number of local court districts and shall prescribe where the District Courts shall sit, but a District Court must sit in at least one place in each county."

N. C. Const., Art. JH, Sec. 10

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### THE DISTRICT COURT DIVISION

Total case activity in the district courts during 1977, compared with total case activity in the preceding four years, is depicted in the graphs which immediately follow. There was a four-and-one-half percent increase in total filings: 1,327,195 in 1977, compared to 1,270,000 in 1976. There was also an increase in dispositions: 1,276,225 in 1977, compared to 1,249,609 in 1976. The increase in dispositions was not as large as the increase in filings. Consequently, there was a significant increase in cases pending at the end of the year: 228,729 cases pending December 31, 1977, compared to 177,759 at the end of 1976. The major portion of this increase in pending cases was in the criminal case category (an increase of 39,080) whereas the increase in civil cases pending was 11,890.

Data is then presented on days of district court held (both civil and criminal), followed by data on district court civil dockets, on juvenile proceedings, and on district court criminal dockets.

\* All days of court at each seat were not necessarily held by a judge assigned to the designated judicial district. In 1977 District Court Judges held a total of 275 days of court in judicial districts other than their own. A day of court is defined as at least a two hour session before lunch and at least a two hour session after lunch. Judicial hospitalization, juvenile and domestic relations cases are counted as civil court.



#### **DISTRICT COURT CIVIL DOCKETS**

Activity relating to civil cases in the district courts is depicted, first, in the graphs which show the numbers of cases added and disposed of in 1977 and the preceding four years and the numbers of cases pending at the end of 1977 and the preceding four years. There was an 8.8% increase in case filings in 1977 – 244,655, compared to 224,810 in 1976 – and a 9.7% increase in dispositions – 232,765 in 1977, compared to 212,208 in 1976. The number of cases pending at the end of the year also increased, from 64,651 pending at the end of 1976 to 76,541 pending at the end of 1977. The distribution of these pending cases among the 100 counties is depicted in the table following the graphs, which is accompanied by the table showing the ten counties with the largest numbers of pending cases, nine of which appeared on the same table in last year's Annual Report.

Two tables show the numbers of cases pending, added, and disposed of, and the manner of disposition, in the 100 counties, for general civil cases, domestic relations cases (including child-support cases), and small claims cases (including both small claims cases heard by magistrates and small claims cases appealed from magistrates to the district court). A third table shows the ratio of dispositions to caseload and ratios of pending cases to dispositions for all civil cases. (The ratio of dispositions to total caseload in the district courts varies considerably among the 100 counties, ranging from 60.9% in Warren County to 90.4% in Perquimans.) A fourth table shows the time from filing to disposition for all civil cases disposed of during 1977 in the district courts. Finally, data on the ages of cases pending at the end of 1977 is presented, giving statewide totals for each of five categories of district court civil cases: general civil cases, domestic relations cases, child support cases, small claims cases assigned to magistrates, and small claims cases on appeal from magistrates.

This is the first year in which data on time from filing to disposition has been available. It reveals that a substantial majority of the district court civil cases disposed of received prompt attention in the State's district courts: of the 232,765 cases disposed of during 1977, 206,948 (88.9%) were disposed of within 180 days of filing. It should be noted, however, that this table includes all civil cases disposed of in the district court division in 1977 and does not reveal the differences between small claims cases, most of which are heard by magistrates, and the other kinds of district court civil cases, which are tried before a judge. Small claims dispositions comprised 66% of the total number of dispositions in the district court division, and 97% of the small claims dispositions were handled within 180 days of filing. Civil cases tried before district court judges accounted for 34% of the dispositions in the district court division, and only 73% of these were disposed of within 180 days.

The table on the ages of the cases pending at the end of the year, moreover, shows that only 45.8% (35,066 cases) had been pending for less than 180 days. This leaves 54.2% (41,475 cases) pending for more than six months, and 17.0% (13,010 cases) pending for two years or more, with 2.6% (1,994 cases) pending for five years or more.

The observation on the ages of civil cases pending in the superior courts seems to be applicable to the district courts as well: if neither of the parties involved in a civil case is interested in having the case put on the trial calendar, it will not likely be calendared. This, rather than non-availability of court resources, probably explains the numbers of long-pending civil cases in the district courts. As with the superior courts, it can be said that there is always an underlying public interest in assuring that civil cases are disposed of promptly in the district courts, consistent with the nature of the case and the rights of the parties involved. In civil matters, the court system (and thus the public interest) is not well served by having civil cases carried as open, pending cases for several years in the district courts simply because the parties permit or tolerate this to occur because of disinterest or inattention. At the least, such cases clutter the district court records and give an erroneous picture of the real workload confronting the court system.

As with the superior courts, there is no official or generally recognized time standard for the disposition of civil cases in the district courts. If a one-year standard were applied to the civil cases pending as of December 31, 1977, one would conclude that there is a substantial backlog of civil cases in our district courts: 20,118 cases (26.3%) pending for more than a year. Applying a two-year standard would place 5,980 cases (7.8%) in a "backlog" status.

No specific conclusions are expressed at this time as to what should be an appropriate time standard for the disposition of district court civil cases. This is a matter which merits the further attention of court officials, members of the practicing bar, and interested members of the public.

#### JUVENILE PROCEEDINGS

For purposes of juvenile jurisdiction of the district courts, a juvenile or "child" is defined as being, with two exceptions, one who has not reached his or her *eighteenth* birthday and "is not married, emancipated, or a member of the armed services of the United States." The exceptions are where a person has committed, or is alleged to have committed, a criminal offense, including violations of the motor vehicle laws; or has violated the conditions of probation previously ordered in a court proceeding. For these latter situations, the statutes provide that a juvenile or child is one who has not reached his or her *sixteenth* birthday.

The following table presents data, by judicial district and by county, on the number of offenses and conditions alleged in juvenile petitions and on the number of children before the courts for the first time. The second table shows, by judicial district and by county, the number of adjudicatory hearings and juvenile proceedings during 1977.

The number of children before juvenile courts for the first time totaled 11,838 in 1977, compared with 12,007 in 1976, a decrease of 1.4%. The number of adjudicatory hearings in 1977 was 23,308 compared with 22,906 in 1976, an increase of 1.8%.

The relative composition of the caseload varies little from the previous year. Of the total number of offenses and conditions alleged, delinquency accounted for 57.9%, undisciplined for 20.2%, dependency for 10.5%, and neglect for 11.4%. The total number of delinquency allegations in 1977 was 13,105, a decrease of 136 (or 1%) from the previous year. Undisciplined allegations decreased from 4,825 in 1976 to 4,567 in 1977 (a decrease of 5%). On the other hand, dependency allegations increased from 2,333 in 1976, to 2,375 in 1977 (plus 1.8%); and allegations of neglect increased from 2,358 in 1976 to 2,575 in 1977 (an increase of 9.2%).

Reporting of juvenile case data is not incorporated in the revised data reporting system, under which case filings and case dispositions are reported by individual case number as described in the Introduction to the 1976 Annual Report. For this reason, data on the age of juvenile petitions pending as of December 31, 1977, is not available.

\* This table indicates the total number of adjudicatory hearings held in each category of juvenile jurisdiction during the year. Juvenile petitions may be dismissed either for failure to prove that the child is delinquent, undisciplined, dependent or neglected or, if he is found to be so, because the child is not in need of the care, protection or discipline of the State. All cases dismissed for either of these reasons are counted in the "dismissed" column; all other cases are counted in the "retained" column.

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#### DISTRICT COURT CRIMINAL DOCKETS

In the graphs which follow, criminal case activity in the District Court Division during 1977 is compared with criminal case activity in district courts during the preceding four years. There was a 3.6% increase in the number of criminal cases filed -1,082,540 in 1977, compared to 1,045,190 in 1976 - and a slight increase in the number disposed of: 1,043,460 in 1977, compared to 1,037,401 in 1976, which is an increase of six-tenths of one per cent. The difference between filings and dispositions accounts for a significant increase in the number of criminal cases pending at the end of the year: 152,188 cases were pending at the end of 1977, compared to 113,108 at the end of 1976, which is an increase of 34.6%.

The distribution among the 100 counties of these pending cases is shown in the following table; 44 counties had more than 1,000 criminal cases pending on December 31, 1977, compared to 28 counties in 1976. The ten counties with the largest numbers of cases pending at the end of 1977 are listed in another table; all ten appeared on the same table in the 1976 Annual Report.

County-by-county data is presented on: (1) numbers of motor vehicle criminal cases pending, filed and disposed of during 1977; (2) numbers of non-motor vehicle criminal cases pending, filed and disposed of; (3) the ratios of criminal case dispositions to total caseload and ratios of pending criminal cases to dispositions; (4) the time from filing to disposition of the motor vehicle criminal cases disposed of; (5) the time from filing to disposition of the non-motor vehicle criminal cases disposed of; (6) the ages of motor vehicle cases pending at the end of the year; (7) the ages of non-motor vehicle cases pending at the end of the year; and (8) the numbers of motor vehicle criminal cases disposed of by waiver and the numbers of (civil) small claims cases disposed of by magistrates.

The tables showing the time from filing to disposition of the cases disposed of during 1977, new to this year's report, show that 92.2% of the motor vehicle criminal cases and 91.3% of the non-motor vehicle criminal cases were disposed of within 90 days of filing; an additional 5.1% of the motor vehicle cases disposed of and an additional 5.6% of the non-motor vehicle cases were between 91 and 180 days old at the time of disposition. These totals, however, include those criminal cases disposed of generally within 30 days of filing. Moreover, as the tables reporting criminal cases pending, added, and disposed of indicate, dispositions by waiver account for a substantial portion of the district court caseload: of the 696,421 motor vehicle cases disposed of during 1977, 414,721 cases (60% of the total) were disposed of by waiver; of the 347,039 non-motor vehicle dispositions, 36,024 cases (10%) were by waiver. Of the motor vehicle cases not disposed of by waiver, 80.8% (227,579 cases out of 281,700) were disposed of within 90 days, and 12.7% (35,834 cases) between 91 and 180 days. This leaves a total of 18,287 motor vehicle cases older than six months at the time of disposition; and 11,061 non-motor vehicle cases were older than six months at disposition.

The tables showing the ages of cases pending at the end of the year also reveal that a significant number of district court criminal cases are not disposed of expeditiously. A total of 17,971 motor vehicle cases had been pending for over 180 days as of December 31, 1977, compared to 13,830 pending for over 180 days at the end of 1976; 16,194 non-motor vehicle cases had been pending for over 180 days at the end of 1977, compared to 10,109 at the end of 1976. These figures, together with the totals of cases older than 180 days at time of disposition, show that a significant number of district court criminal cases are not disposed of within the "speedy trial" time limit of 120 days (to be applied to cases filed on or after October 1, 1978) enacted by the 1977 General Assembly. To what extent these cases would have been exempted from the 120-day standard, for excusable delay, is not known.

The comment on speedy trial standards found in the section on the superior court criminal dockets is also applicable to district court criminal cases. The statutes in question do not distinguish between criminal cases filed in superior courts and those filed in the district courts.

#### THE NORTH CAROLINA COURT SYSTEM

North Carolina's court system is a structure of three tiers known collectively as the General Court of Justice. The three levels correspond to a division of judicial labor within the unified court system to accommodate these essential functions: review of cases (Appellate Division); trial of major cases (Superior Court Division); and trial of the large volume of minor cases (District Court Division).

#### **Appellate Division**

Supreme Court. At the apex of the judicial structure is the seven-member Supreme Court, which sits in Raleigh to review procedural questions and interpretations of the law arising from the lower courts. The court's caseload consists of lower court actions involving the death penalty or life imprisonment, substantial constitutional questions, dissent at the Court of Appeals level, utilities ratemaking decisions, or the exercise of the Supreme Court's own discretionary review. Supreme Court justices are elected by popular vote for eight-year terms. ñ

*Court of Appeals.* The 12-judge intermediate Court of Appeals sits in panels of three in Raleigh and hears the great volume of appeals originating in the State court system. Court of Appeals judges are elected for terms of eight years.

#### **Superior Court Division**

At least two sessions of superior court must be held annually in each county of the state; the 100 counties comprise 31 judicial districts. As of December 31, 1977, there are 59 regular and eight special superior court judges. North Carolina carries the rotation of its trial judges to a greater degree than any other state. A regular superior court judge is required to rotate through the judicial districts within his geographic quarter of the state, holding court for at least six months in each district; he holds court in the district of his residence for only one half-year term every three years. Regular judges are elected for eight-year terms. Special judges are appointed by the governor for four-year terms and may be assigned to hold court in any county in the state.

The superior court is a trial court of general jurisdiction and is the "proper" court for civil cases involving more than \$5,000 in controversy. The criminal jurisdiction of the superior court extends to all felonies and some misdemeanors, including misdemeanor charges that are closely connected with felony charges as well as misdemeanor convictions at the district court level which are appealed for a new trial in superior court.

#### **District Court Division**

This level of the trial court in North Carolina has limited jurisdiction, extending to misdemeanors, and is the proper court for civil cases involving \$5,000 or less. The major portion of all cases filed in the State's courts is disposed of in the district court division.

District Court Judges. There are 124 district court judges as of December 31, 1977, elected to fouryear terms. District court judges hold court in rotation among the counties in their district. The 31 districts at this level of court correspond to the superior court judicial districts.

For civil cases involving \$5,000 or less, the district court is the proper division for trial, which can include a jury. In criminal matters, the district court's jurisdiction extends to all misdemeanors and to preliminary hearings on felony charges; trial of misdemeanors is without a jury. This court division also has jurisdiction of proceedings involving juveniles.

Magistrates. There are more than 500 magistrates as of December 31, 1977. Magistrates are nominated in each county by the clerk of superior court, appointed by the senior resident superior court judge, and work under the supervision of the chief district court judge. Magistrates are officers of the district court, paid by the state, and in many cases work part-time. Their civil jurisdiction includes small claims involving \$500 or less. In criminal matters, the magistrate tries worthless check cases involving \$50 or less, accepts guilty pleas in cases involving no more than a \$50 fine or a 30 day jail sentence, issues warrants, and conducts first appearance hearings.

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#### **Other Key Officials**

District Attorneys. The state is divided into prosecutorial districts that correspond with the judicial districts except in the case of the 27th Judicial District, which is divided into prosecutorial Districts 27A (Gaston County) and 27B (Cleveland and Lincoln Counties). A district attorney is elected to a four-year term for each of the 32 districts. The responsibility of the district attorney and his assistants is to represent the state in criminal and certain juvenile matters. The district attorney is responsible for the calendaring of criminal cases.

Public Defenders. As of December 31, 1977, there are five public defenders in North Carolina (serving Judicial Districts 12, 18, 26, 27, and 28) who provide legal representation for persons determined to be indigent. In unusual circumstances, such as the existence of a conflict of interests, an indigent in one of these districts may be represented by private counsel, appointed by the court and paid a fee for his legal services by the State; in the other 26 districts this assigned private counsel system is the only one employed. The public defender for the 28th district is appointed by the senior resident superior court judge from recommendations by the district bar; for the other districts, the appointment is by the governor from recommendations of the district bar. Their terms are four years. Each public defender is by statute provided one full-time assistant; additional full-time or part-time assistants may be authorized by the Administrative Office of the Courts.

A person is determined to be indigent if he is found "financially unable to secure legal representation." He is entitled to State-paid legal representation in: any proceeding which may result in (or which seeks relief from) confinement, a fine of \$500 or more, or extradition to another state; a proceeding alleging mental illness or incapacity which may result in hospitalization, sterilization, or the loss of certain property rights; and juvenile proceedings which may result in confinement, transfer to superior court for a felony trial, or a transfer of custody upon a finding of neglect.

*Clerks of Superior Court.* The clerk of superior court maintains a system of records for both the district and superior courts. Thus, there is one trial court clerk in each county, elected for a four-year term. The clerk is also judge of probate and special proceedings. He is authorized to issue warrants and accept trial waivers in traffic cases.

Juvenile Court Counselors. There are from four to twenty-four juvenile court counselors in each judicial district of the state. As part of their "intake" responsibilities, the counselors screen complaints regarding children to determine whether petitions should be filed in juvenile court or some other means should be used to solve the problem. The counselors also exercise probation responsibility for juveniles assigned to counseling within the community, and they provide aftercare supervision for children conditionally released from training schools.

## THE JUDICIAL PLANNING COMMITTEE

A Judicial Planning Committee for North Carolina was appointed by the Supreme Court of North Carolina in September, 1977, pursuant to Section 203(c) of the Federal Crime Control Act of 1976 and Section 143B-339 of the North Carolina General Statutes (as amended in 1977). Under the Federal legislation, State judicial planning committees are given a special role in planning for judicial departments under the LEAA program, and specifically in the allocation of LEAA funds to judicial department projects. In addition, the Federal legislation encourages State judicial planning committees to examine, assess and recommend measures for the improvement of State court systems regardless of the sources of funding. The State statute is similarly broad in the scope of responsibility assigned to the North Carolina Judicial Planning Committee.

A staff person was employed in December, 1977, with LEAA funding, to be part of the Research and Planning Division of the Administrative Office of the Courts and to give primary emphasis to the work of the Judicial Planning Committee, along with other staff of the Research and Planning Division. Staff work on behalf of the Committee began during the final weeks of 1977. It is expected that the first work of the North Carolina Judicial Planning Committee will be development and approval of the State's Judicial Plan for purposes of the LEAA program for the fiscal year 1978-79.

## THE NORTH CAROLINA JUDICIAL COUNCIL IN 1977

The Judicial Council submitted twelve bills for consideration by the 1977 General Assembly. Of these twelve bills, eleven were submitted by the Council to the Governor and the General Assembly with the Council's recommendation that they be passed. The twelfth bill, proposing new sentencing procedures in capital cases, was submitted without any recommendation on the part of the Council as to whether the death penalty should be retained or abolished. The Council felt that this question was a policy matter for determination by the General Assembly and, therefore, a matter which was beyond the scope of the Council's function. The Council did submit the bill as one which it believed to be constitutionally acceptable under the most recent United States Supreme Court decisions dealing with the death penalty.

Of the eleven bills recommended to the General Assembly for passage, eight were passed and ratified. The eight proposals included; (1) a bill adding a new section, numbered G.S. 14-225.1, to Chapter 14, Article 30 (Obstructing Justice) of the General Statutes, prohibiting picketing and demonstrations near courthouses when the picketing is for the purpose of influencing jurors or court officers; (2) a bill amending G.S. 1-84 to provide for removal of a civil cause to any adjacent county if the same is necessary to insure a fair trial and further amending G.S. 1-84 to delete all reference to criminal actions; (3) a bill amending G.S. 7A-66, relating to the removal of District Attorneys, so as to clarify the authority of a Superior Court Judge to dismiss a frivolous removal petition without conducting a hearing and to expand the time in which the court has to act from 15 to 30 days; (4) a bill amending Article 8 of Chapter 20 of the General Statutes, commonly known as the Habitual Offender Act, by repealing it in its entirety; (5) a bill amending G.S. 15A-1002, relating to the determination of a criminal defendant's incapacity to proceed, so as to protect the confidentiality of the medical report and assure the physician-patient privilege; (6) a bill amending G.S. 15-223, the expunction statute for offenders under the age of 18 at the time of conviction, so as to exclude traffic offenses from its purview; (7) a bill adding a new section to the General Statutes, numbered G.S. 15-144.1, statutorily defining the essentials of a bill of indictment for rape; and (8) a bill amending G.S. 15A-1002(a) so as to require specificity in the motion questioning the capacity of a defendant to proceed. Each of these eight bills passed the General Assembly either exactly or substantially as recommended by the Judicial Council.

Three other recommendations of the Council passed one house of the General Assembly, but did not pass the other before adjournment. These three recommendations are expected to receive further consideration during the 1978 short session of the General Assembly. These three recommendations include: (1) a proposal to provide counsel for indigent parties in proceedings for termination of parental rights under G.S. 7A-288; (2) a proposal to remove the authority of a judge under G.S. 14-269.1 to order a confiscated weapon turned over to a law enforcement agency for use by that agency; and (3) a proposal to amend G.S. 15A-1002, dealing with the question of capacity of a defendant to proceed, so as to provide that judges would have the option of referring the matter to a local panel of psychiatrists and lawyers for study.

The Council's proposal for sentencing procedures in capital cases was based on a draft initially prepared by the Attorney General's office. Following extended consideration in both House and Senate Judiciary Committees, the General Assembly reenacted the death penalty for first degree murder and adopted substantially the proposal of the Judicial Council for sentencing procedures in these capital cases.

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## **THE JUDICIAL STANDARDS COMMISSION IN 1977**

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The Judicial Standards Commission was established by the General Assembly pursuant to a constitutional amendment approved by the voters at the general election in November, 1972. The membership consists of a Court of Appeals judge, a superior court judge, and a district court judge, each appointed by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court; two members of the State Bar, elected by the State Bar Council; and two citizens who are not judges nor members of the State Bar, appointed by the Governor. The Court of Appeals judge serves as chairman of the Commission.

Upon recommendation of the Commission, the Supreme Court may censure or remove any justice or judge for willful misconduct in office, willful and persistent failure to perform his duties, habitual intemperance, conviction of a crime involving moral turpitude, or conduct prejudicial to the administration of justice that brings the judicial office into disrepute. Upon recommendation of the Commission, the Supreme Court may remove any justice or judge for mental or physical incapacity interfering with the performance of his duties, which is, or is likely to become, permanent.

A complaint or other information against a judge, whether filed with the Commission or by action of the Commission on its own motion, is denominated by the Commission as an "Inquiry Concerning a Judge." There were fifty-seven "Inquiries Concerning a Judge" during 1977 including three inquiries carried over from 1976 and seven pending at the end of 1977.

Twenty-eight of these inquiries were determined by the Judicial Standards Commission to involve subject matter not within the jurisdiction of the Commission.

Ten inquiries were determined by the Commission to involve subject matter within the jurisdiction of the Commission, but which did not warrant any further proceeding by the Commission.

Twelve inquiries were determined by the Commission to require preliminary investigation. In three of these inquiries the investigation was completed and the Commission determined that no further action was justified.

There was one inquiry in which the investigation was completed and a formal hearing was conducted, and a recommendation of censure was filed with the Supreme Court of North Carolina.

There were four inquiries in which the investigation was completed, but two of the subject judges resigned and two retired and the Commission elected to discontinue further proceedings at that time.

There were four inquiries in which the investigation was completed and which await final determination by the Commission.

There were seven inquiries at the end of 1977 which were awaiting initial action by the Commission.

Appropriations from the State's General Fund for *operating expenses* for all departments and agencies of state government, including the Judicial Department, totalled \$1,989,501,948 for the 1976-77 fiscal year. (Appropriations from the Highway Fund and appropriations from the General Fund for capital improvements are not included in this total.)

The appropriation from the General Fund for operating expenses of the Judicial Department for fiscal year 1976-77 was \$47,222,627, or 2.4% of the total General Fund appropriations for operating expenses of all state departments and agencies.

#### COST AND CASE DATA IN REPRESENTATION OF INDIGENTS

#### (For Fiscal Year, July 1, 1976 - June 30, 1977)

The State provides legal counsel for indigent persons in a variety of actions and proceedings, as specified in the North Carolina General Statutes, Section 7A-450 *et seq*. These include criminal proceedings, judicial hospitalization proceedings, juvenile proceedings that may result in commitment to an institution or transfer to superior court for trial as an adult. Legal representation for indigents may be by assignment of private counsel, by assignment of special public counsel (involving mental hospital commitments), or by assignment of a public defender.

Five of North Carolina's judicial districts have an office of public defender: the 12th, 18th, 26th, 27th, and 28th districts. The other 26 judicial districts utilize only assignment of private counsel. Private counsel is also assigned in the five districts which have a public defender in the event of a conflict of interests involving the public defender's office and the indigent and in the event of unusual circumstances when, in the opinion of the court, the proper administration of justice requires the assignment of private counsel rather than the public defender in those cases.

In addition, the State provides a full-time Special Counsel at each of the State's four mental hospitals, to represent patients in commitment or recommitment hearings before a district court judge. Under State law, each patient committed to a mental hospital is entitled to a judicial hearing (before a district court judge) within 90 days after the initial commitment, a further hearing within 180 days after the initial commitment, and thereafter a hearing once each year during the continuance of an involuntary commitment.

The cost of the entire program of indigent representation, rounded to the nearest dollar, was \$4,869,632 in the 1976-77 fiscal year, compared to \$4,844,746 in the 1975-76 fiscal year, an increase of one-half of one percent. The total amount expended for representation of indigents was 10.7% of total Judicial Department expenditures in the 1976-77 fiscal year.

Payments for assigned counsel in criminal cases accounted for 94.0% of total expenditures for assigned counsel, commitment cases payments accounted for 2.9%, and juvenile case payments for 3.1%.

The total cost of providing special counsel at each of the State's four mental hospitals, to represent patients in commitment or recommitment hearings, was \$115,224 for the Fiscal Year, 1976-77. There were a total of 10,669 hearings *during the fiscal year*, for an average cost per hearing of \$10.80.

Following is a summary of hearing data for *calendar* year, 1977, for each of the State's mental hospitals. There was a significant increase in the number of hearings: a total of 11,256 in 1977, compared with a total of 6,413 during calendar year, 1976, an increase of 75.5%.
