

PREFACE

The Kansas Department of Corrections, as created, effective July 1, 1974, was vested with responsibilities of the previous Office of the Director of Penal Institutions relating to the management and supervision of the adult correctional facilities; secondly, it assumed responsibility from the State Board of Probation and Parole for statewide supervision of adult parolees and supervision of adult probationers in 99 counties (the four larger urban counties and the counties of McPherson and Harvey have their own probation systems); thirdly, it was vested with responsibility of inspecting county and city jail facilities.

The Department currently operates through three divisions, the Division of Institutional Services, the Division of Community Correctional Services, and the Division of Management Services. The Division of Institutional Services encompasses operation of the five adult correctional institutions, inmate training programs, and the Toronto Honor Camp. The Division of Community Correctional Services encompasses the operation of work release facilities, the jail inspection program, and probation and parole supervision. The Division of Management Services encompasses the correctional industries program, and the functions of fiscal management, research and planning, personnel, and staff training. The departmental programs will be operated in Fiscal Year 1978 by 1,132.5 authorized equivalent full-time positions funded within the department's budgets, 10 positions funded through the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation of the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services, and approximately 82 contracted educational program positions. On June 30, 1977, the Department was charged with the custody of 5,585 individuals.

The purpose of this report is to provide statistical information concerning the operation of the Kansas Department of Corrections and the adult felony offender in custody of the Secretary of Corrections. Such information includes the number of authorized equivalent full-time positions; the approved Fiscal Year 1978 budget and the estimated annual and per day capita operating costs; the institutional admissions and releases by category for the past six fiscal years; the average daily institutional inmate census on June 30, 1977, as compared to June 30, 1976; the age, race, and educational levels of the inmate population on June 30, 1977; and other descriptive and criminal conviction data. During Fiscal Year 1977, which ended June 30, 1977, both the average daily institutional inmate census and the probation and parole caseload continued the increasing trend upward. The number of males incarcerated on June 30, 1977, increased by 284 or 15.3% over June 30, 1976. The number of females over the same period remained essentially the same. The probation and parole caseload increased by 349 or 12.6% during the period.






