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PREFACE

This report presents a statistical summary of the demographics of inmates admitted to, released from, and currently confined in the Texas Department of Corrections. The information presented here was extracted from data processing files of the Department of Corrections, that are regularly updated with information furnished by the Bureau of Records and Classification.

The <u>Annual Statistical Report</u> has the following purposes:

- 1. It serves as a historical record of the demographic characteristics of the inmate population for the year reported.
- 2. It provides management with information necessary for the effective and efficient operation of the Department.
- 3. It provides the public with a yearly record of the characteristics of adult felony inmates in the State of Texas.
- 4. It serves as a resource document for research in crime and criminology.

These purposes provide the basis for the existence of this document, which is intended to provide demographic information about the inmate population of the Texas Department of Corrections for those who have a need for such information.

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SUMMARY

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SUMMARY NARRATIVE FOR THE 1976 ANNUAL STATISTICAL REPORT

INTRODUCTION

The data provided in the 1976 Annual Statistical
Report is for the most part self-explanatory and does not
require further elaboration. However, a summary narrative
of the trends of the period January 1, 1976 to December
31, 1976 will provide a reference framework for the reader
of this report and indicate in general what the many tables
and graphs of this report present in detail.

POPULATION TRENDS

The inmate population of the Texas Department of Corrections (TDC) increased 8% during 1976 (Table 3) in continuance of a long-standing upward population trend although the rate of increase dropped somewhat over the 12% rate of 1975. As indicated in section 6 of this report, the projected population trend of TDC is anticipated to increase but at a decreasing rate overall through 1980. The increase in inmate population through 1976 cannot be attributed per se to the population growth of Texas (Table 1). In fact an examination of Table 1 clearly indicates that the population of TDC has been steadily increasing per 100,000 Texas population since 1970; this increase closely parallels to the FBI crime rate per 100,000 in Texas. It would be appropriate to assume that any substantial change in the TDC inmate population would first be signaled by a significant change in the Texas crime rate.

POPULATION CHARACTERISTICS

The sexual and racial makeup of the inmate population of TDC was not noticeably altered in 1976. The female portion of the inmate population remained at approximately 4% and the racial composition remained at 38% White, 44% Black, and 18% Mexican respectively. The measured intelligence of the inmate admissions to TDC during 1976 appeared to decline slightly (Table 3G) as compared to 1975 but no clear trend is indicated. In terms of offenses committed the frequency of robbery was the only notable change (Table 3H), increasing from 14.63% of inmate admission in 1975 to 18.48% in 1976. In terms of age for inmate admission 1976 saw a slight decrease in the numbers of those aged 25 years or less and a slight increase in those inmates between 26 and 40 years of age.

CONCLUSIONS

The data contained within this report represents a demographic statement of the inmate population of TDC during 1976. It has been prepared with all possible accuracy to assist potential users in both descriptive and research efforts. The use of this report alone or in conjunction with the Annual Statistical Reports of earlier periods (e.g. 1975, 1974, etc.) will allow many useful comparisons and assessments of trends beyond those discussed in this narrative.

DEFINITION OF TERMS

The following is a brief explanation of the categories or populations represented in this report.

Total Receives: The total receives category includes all receives transactions and not just the actual persons received. In this category an inmate may show as more than one receive. It contains 15 actual receives categories: new receives, new receives-voluntarily surrendered, received by additional sentence, received from bench warrants, received from federal bench warrants, conditional paroles, escapes, attempted escapes, paroles, paroles-voluntarily surrendered, reprieves, reprieves-medical, reprieves-violators, state hospital transfers, and others-specify.

Total Departures: The total departures category includes all forms of departures transactions, not just discharge and paroles. Total departures is comprised of 18 departures categories: departed by additional sentence, bench warrants, federal bench warrants, conditional pardons, escapes, attempted escapes, paroles, paroles-hold, paroles reinstatement, reprieves, reprieves-medical, state hospital transfers, discharges-expiration of sentence, discharges-hold, discharges-court order, death, transfers, and other-specify.

Admissions: The admissions category is designed to represent actual persons received by the Department; it

excludes all paperwork-only receives. It contains two actual receives categories: admissions and admissions-voluntarily surrendered.

Inmates Discharged: The inmates discharged category is designed to represent actual persons discharged by the Department; it excludes all paperwork-only discharges. It contains three actual discharge categories: discharges-expiration of sentence, discharges-hold, and discharges-court order.

<u>Inmates Paroled</u>: The inmates paroled category is designed to represent actual persons paroled from the Department; it excludes all paperwork-only paroles. It contains three actual parole categories: paroles, paroles-hold and paroles-reinstatement.

Inmates on Hand: The inmates on hand category represents the actual number of inmates physically present at the end of any stated workday. For the purposes of this report, on-hand categories are for December 31, 1976.

SMSA: The SMSA is a standard metropolitan statistical area generally made up of a core city with a population of 50,000 or more inhabitants and the surrounding county or counties which share certain metropolitan characteristics.

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

The projection of future inmate population on Table 10 was based upon a more conservative input-output assessment rather than the somewhat higher estimates based on the earlier use of regression techniques. The assumptions of this estimate are as follows:

Assumptions

New Receives—Based upon a PFPT derived 5% increase each year actual increases over the period 1970 through 1976 have ranged from 0 to 13% with an average increase of 5.5%. The probability of the increase being 3% or less is orby 16 in 100. The probability of the increase being greater than 5% is 50 in 100.


Parole—The parole estimates are based upon the Board of Pardons and Parole budget estimates for 1977 and 1978. This assumption is viewed as optimistic and contingent upon the effective expansion of the parole system. If this optimism is not justified by actual future events, approximately 2,000 inmates per year would be added to the Dec. 31 population after 1977.






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FIGURE 2 INMATE POPULATION FLUCTUATIONS BY MONTH 1976



FIGURE 3 INMATES ADMITTED AND DISCHARGED IN 1976 BY MONTH




----- DISCHARGES

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FIGURE 4 INMATES DISCHARGED AND PAROLED IN 1976 BY MONTH





FIGURE 5 DEPARTED, RECEIVED, PAROLED, AND DISCHARGED BY YEAR



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
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

ALL OFFENSES




ONE INMATE ADMITTED EVERY 55 MINUTES


ONE INMATE ADMITTED EVERY 13 HOURS AND 10 MINUTES


ONE INMATE ADMITTED EVERY 6 HOURS AND 15 MINUTES


ONE INMATE ADMITTED EVERY 2 HOUPS AND 55 MINUTES









INMATE POPULATION PROJECTION

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FUTURE INMATE POPULATION

From the period starting December 31, 1970 to December 31, 1976 the inmate population increased from 14,331 to 20,717 indicating an average annual population growth of approximately 6%. Many separate factors play a role in any population change, but especially in a prison population we find the often immediate and unforeseen impact of legal or legislative decision, expansion or reduction of the judiciary, parole, or probationary systems. known forecasting technique can account for a new law which directly impacts a prison population but was non-existent at the time the forecast was made. We can, however, examine trends, and by carefully extracting our information and stating our assumptions provide a useful guide upon which to make decisions and assess the impact of unforeseen changes when they occur; this in a single statement is the purpose of forecasting.

The projection of future inmate population on Table 6 was based upon a more conservative input-output assessment rather than the somewhat higher estimates based on the earlier use of regression techniques. The assumptions of this estimate are as follows:

Assumptions

New Receives - Based upon a PERT derived 5% increase each year actual increases over the period 1970 through 1976 have ranged from 0 to 13% with an average increase of 5.5%. The probability of the increase being 3% or less is only 16 in

- 100. The probability of the increase being greater than 5% is 50 in 100.
- Parole The parole estimates are based upon the Board of Pardons and Parole budget estimates for 1977 and 1978. This assumption is viewed as optimistic and contingent upon the effective expansion of the parole system. If this optimism is not justified by actual future events, approximately 2,000 inmates per year would be added to the Dec. 31 population after 1977.
- Discharge These estimates are based upon a remarkably stable per annum rate of discharges (ranging from 3,109 to 3,675) during the period 1970 through 1976. In general, discharges per annum have equaled approximately 16% of the on-hand population.
