




INTRODUCTION

Arizona has 66 city and county jails ranging in age from one year to over 70 years, and in capacity from one inmate to 600 inmates, with a total statewide capacity of 3,772. Arizona jails are found in locations as varied as Phoenix (population 682,200) and Fredonia (population 1,150). On September 30, 1978, Arizona jails held 2,503 inmates.

This report contains the major findings of a jail survey conducted in September of 1978 by the Statistical Analysis Center of the Arizona State Justice Planning Agency (ASJPA). As defined for this study, a jail is an area of confinement intended for adults, which is under the control of a county sheriff or a city police chief. Such questions as the age and capacity of facilities, the number and type of inmates, and the number of jail employees were asked of each local jail in the state. Juvenile detention centers and jails located on military bases, Indian reservations, and national parks were not included in the jail survey. A similar survey of Arizona jails was conducted by the Statistical Analysis Center in September 1977. The results of this 1977 survey are summarized in the report Arizona Jails published by ASJPA in November 1977.

Update on Arizona Jails has five sections. The first section is a summary of data on jail facilities. The second section summarizes data on inmate characteristics. Data on jail employees are presented in the third section, while booking information collected from each facility at the end of the 1977 calendar year is summarized in the fourth. The final section is a listing by county of data on jail facilities and inmates.



JAIL FACILITIES

Each of the state's fourteen counties maintains at least one jail in its county seat, and eight counties also maintain substation jails in outlying communities. In addition, many cities and towns have jails, although the number of municipal jails has decreased in recent years.


NUMBER OF JAILS

Arizona has 66* city and county jails: 25 city jails, 14 county jails, 3 county jail annexes, and 24 substation jails. The number of city jails is down more than 35% from the number identified in a 1970 jail survey conducted by ASJPA. This decrease is due primarily to the closing of many city jails in favor of the joint use of county facilities. In the twelve months following the 1977 ASJPA jail survey, three jails were closed—the Avondale City Jail, the Casa Grande City Jail, and the Greenlee County Duncan Substation Jail. Two new jails were opened during the year—the Maricopa County Avondale Substation Jail and the Pinal County Casa Grande Substation Jail. Also, Apache County replaced its old county jail with a new facility in 1978.

AGE OF JAILS

Twenty-one of Arizona's 66 jails are less than 10 years old. In contrast, 8 jails have been in operation for 40 or more years. On the average, county jails and jail annexes are older than city jails and substation jails. The average age of county jails and jail annexes is 24 years, compared to an average age of 20 years for city jails and 12 years for substation jails.

Perhaps because of their age, seven county jails and two jail annexes have been renovated in recent years. Nine other jails in the state have also been upgraded since their construction.

CAPACITY

Arizona's jails have a combined capacity of 3,772 inmates, a decrease of approximately 1% from the number determined in the 1970 ASJPA jail survey; but an increase of approximately 1% from the 1977 survey. On the average, county jails and jail annexes are much larger than city jails and substation jails. County jails and annexes have an average capacity of 169 inmates while city jails and substation jails average 23 and 13 inmates, respectively.

During the month of September 1978, the highest daily statewide jail population was 2,949 inmates, or 78% of capacity, while the lowest daily jail population was 2,202 inmates, or 58% of capacity. On September 30, 1978, the overall rate of occupancy in Arizona jails was 66%. County jails had the highest rate of occupancy (82%). The three county jail annexes had an occupancy rate of 57%, while city jails and substation jails had occupancy rates of 40% and 23%, respectively.

INMATES

Local jails are the intake points of the entire criminal justice system. City and county jails are used both as detention centers for adults facing criminal charges and, along with state prisons, as correctional facilities for those serving sentences. Confinement in a local jail may range from a few hours prior to initial court appearance or transportation to another facility, up to one year if sentenced.

Jails in Arizona confined 2,503 inmates on September 30, 1978. Eighty-eight percent of the inmates (2,208) were held in county jails and jail annexes. City jails held 224 inmates or 9% of the total, and substation jails held 71 inmates, or 3%.

Males predominated the jail population, accounting for almost 9 out of 10 inmates; however, there was a sharp increase (52%) in the number of females detained. Females accounted for 8% (194) of the jail population in 1977 and for 12% (296) in 1978. Over one-half of the inmates were between the ages of 18 and 24 years. Whites made up 56% of the inmate population compared to 72% of the total Arizona population. In contrast, Blacks and American Indians were overrepresented in the jail population. Approximately one of every 13 inmates was a citizen of Mexico; about half of them were incarcerated in the four counties which border Mexico.

GEOGRAPHIC DISTRIBUTION

Maricopa County and Pima County which together account for 75% of the state population, held 74% of the jail inmates on September 30, 1978. Navajo County ranked first in the number of inmates per 1,000 population (2.0). Santa Cruz County followed closely with 1.9 inmates per 1,000 population.

LEGAL STATUS

Just over half of the inmates in jail on September 30, 1978, had not been convicted — 9% were awaiting arraignment and 44% had been arraigned and were awaiting trial. Sentenced inmates comprised 29% of the inmate population, a 6% decrease from the number of sentenced inmates identified in the 1977 survey. Another 6% had been convicted but were awaiting further legal action such as sentencing or appeal. The "Waiting Sentence or Appeal" category increased considerably in 1978, from 2% (36) of the total inmate population on September 30, 1977, to 6% (157) of the total on September 30, 1978. Four percent of the jail population fell into the category "Waiting Transfer" which includes persons awaiting transfer to prison and persons being held for federal or other authorities.

CUSTODY

Roughly half of the inmates confined on the last day of September were held in maximum custody. A working definition of maximum custody is a type of confinement which requires constant supervision of inmates by jail staff. This type of custody is characterized by very tight security, limited movement, and absolute control.

Eighteen percent of the inmates were held in medium custody. Although still within a tight security environment, medium custody requires a lesser degree of supervision than maximum custody. Medium custody allows the inmate to move within the secured areas of the jail without constant or direct supervision.

The remaining 30% of the jail inmates were in minimum custody, the type of confinement usually given to "trusties." Minimum custody allows the inmate a margin of freedom to work with intermittent supervision, both inside and outside the jail facility.

JAIL EMPLOYEES

Arizona jails employ 742 persons. Eighty-two percent of these employees are jail officers, while the remainder are engaged in other functions such as administration, food service, and maintenance.

STAFFING

Of the 742 jail employees, 8% work on a part-time basis. The majority of the part-time employees (44 out of 59) are reported by city police departments, many of which utilize patrolmen, radio dispatchers, and clerical staff in the operation of their jails. With both full-time and part-time staff support, all of the county jails and jail annexes, 76% of the city jails, and 38% of the substation jails are attended 24 hours per day, 7 days per week.

On September 30, 1978, the ratio of inmates to Arizona jail employees, both full-time and part-time, was 3.4 to 1. Among the counties, the ratio varied widely. In two counties the number of jail employees exceeded the number of inmates, while in another the ratio of inmates to employees was 5 to 1. It is important to note that these figures reflect the total number of jail employees. Thus, for many facilities, the ratio of inmates to employees on any one shift is considerably higher than indicated in Table 6.

JAIL BOOKING INFORMATION

Jail booking information was obtained from every local jail facility which operated during the 1977 calendar year. A jail booking is an administrative action officially recording an arrest, and identifying the person, the place, the time, the arresting authority, the reason for the arrest, and other pertinent data. Booking information gives an indication of the number of persons processed through the jails in Arizona. Nearly 100,000 prisoners were booked into Arizona jails during 1977. Fifty-three percent of the bookings were in Maricopa County, while Pima County accounted for 17% of the total.


