


WHERE TO GET HELP IN CONNECTICUT is a compilation of organizations and agencies which offer essential services to Connecticut residents. Almost all organizations in this booklet will make referrals in situations where, because of geographic qualifying factors or other reasons, the agency originally contacted cannot provide the needed service.

The listings in this booklet are in alphabetical order under the parent or umbrella title. Although many organizations offer a wide variety of services and programs, WHERE TO GET HELP gives only those available to individuals, couples and/or families on a walk-in or phone call basis. Also, all services and programs included must be available free of charge, for a nominal fee or on a sliding scale (determined by the individual's ability to pay) basis.



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

When a family is left homeless because of fire or natural disaster, provides emergency housing, feeding and clothing. Care arranged on a 24-hour basis.

Holds regular classes in First Aid — what to do until the doctor comes. Includes instruction on handling home accidents, shock, animal bites and heart attacks.

Holds classes in home nursing for care of those recuperating at home after serious illness or accident. Classes conducted to prepare expectant parents for their newborn.

COMMUNITY NURSING AND HOME HEALTH SERVICES

SERVICES: Community nursing, physical therapy and home health aide services for patients in their own homes are available throughout Connecticut; speech therapy, occupational therapy and social work services are available in some communities. Nursing services are also available in such places as schools, clinics, some housing units.

Care given per orders of the patient's physician. Patients and families are taught how to take care of themselves.

ELIGIBILITY: Contact with the agency will determine whether the staff can be helpful in a given situation.

FEES: Services provided at cost with a sliding fee schedule based on family's ability to pay. These services are provided and paid for as benefits of the Medicare program, Title XIX and other private insurance programs. Medicare home health services are available throughout the state.

These agencies participate in health maintenance, screening programs, sponsor child health clinics, mothers and newborn infants are visited as are persons needing follow-up from clinics and state mental hospitals. There is participation in control of communicable diseases.


