

REPORT OF PERSONS DISCHARGED FROM PAROLE AND PERSONS VIOLATING PAROLE FISCAL YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 1977

This report contains statistical data on persons discharged from parole and persons who violated parole during the fiscal year 1977 in Virginia. The parole officers in the twenty-nine Probation and Parole Districts of the Commonwealth submitted data to the Bureau of Research, Reporting and Evaluation on parolees under their supervision who were discharged or violated parole conditions.

The total number of persons discharged from or violating parole increased from 1,176 in fiscal 1976 to 1,438* in fiscal 1977, a 22.3 percent increase. Discharges from parole increased from 761 to 977, a 28.4 percent increase, while parole violations increased from 415 to 461, an 11.1 percent increase.

Parole Violators

District and Violation Type

Parole violators (461) represented 32.1 percent of the total persons released. This violation rate indicates a 3.2 percent rate of change from the previous year's rate of 35.3 percent. District One (City of Richmond, Henrico County) reported the highest number of violations with 133. Districts Twenty-six and Twenty-eight had no report of violations.

An evaluation of the distribution of violations by type shows that of all violators reported, 34.9 percent committed felonies, 16.5 percent committed misdemeanors, 18.2 percent broke regulations and 30.4 percent absconded. The number of parolees who committed felonies (161) decreased 9.6 percent from fiscal 1976 while the number of parolees who committed misdemeanors (76) increased 20.6 percent. The number of parolees who broke regulations (84) increased 33.3 percent over fiscal 1976 while the number of parolees who

absconded increased 26.1 percent over fiscal 1976. District One had the highest number of violations in each category with 41 felonies, 17 misdemeanors, 23 persons who broke regulations, and 52 parolees who absconded. The 133 violations in District One represented 28.9 percent of the total violations reported, while the same district carried 21.7 percent of the parole supervision caseload on June 30, 1977.**

Race and Sex

Twenty-one persons who violated parole were female and 440 were male. The violators were 61.6 percent non-white and 38.4 percent white, compared to 63.9 percent non-white and 36.1 percent white in fiscal year 1976. Violations by type for non-white violators ranged from 108, or 38.0 percent, on felony offenses to 52, or 18.3 percent, on misdemeanor charges. The white violators varied from a high of 53, or 29.9 percent, with felony offenses to a low of 24, or 13.6 percent, who committed misdemeanor offenses.

Marital Status

As in fiscal 1976, the majority of the parole violators were single (291 or 63.1 percent). There were 45 or 9.8 percent married persons violating parole. Further analysis shows that 90.0 percent of the violators were either single, separated, divorced or widowed.

Length of Sentence

For parole violators the median length of sentence at the time of parole, including any additional sentences received after commitment, was 6 - 9 years. This was the same median category in fiscal year 1976. The most frequent length of sentence again fell into the 6 - 9 year category with 91 occurrences. It should be noted that of the 20 persons with life sentences who were released from parole supervision, eight of these violated their parole, a 40.0 percent violation rate.

Parolees Discharged

The Division of Probation and Parole Services discharged 977 persons from supervision in Virginia during fiscal year 1977. The above represents a 216 person or 28.4 percent increase in the number of parolees discharged in fiscal 1977 over fiscal 1976 when 761 persons were discharged.

Race and Sex

Of the 977 parolees discharged within the state in fiscal year 1977, 913 or 93.4 percent were male, and 64 or 6.6 percent were female. Non-white parolees accounted for 506 or 51.8 percent of the total and white parolees numbered 471 or 48.2 percent. This compares with the racial distribution in fiscal 1976 of 52.4 percent non-white and 47.6 percent white.

Marital Status

Single parolees who were discharged numbered 531, or 54.4 percent, while those who were married, living with spouse, represented only 19.0 percent (186). This contrasts to 9.8 percent of parole violators being married, living with spouse. The unmarried parolees (single, separated, divorced and widowed) accounted for 80.9 percent of all discharges.

Length of Sentence

At the time of parole, 64.2 percent of the parolees discharged in fiscal year 1977 had a total sentence of five years or less. As in fiscal 1976 the most frequent sentence was five years, representing 17.3 percent of all discharges. Once again, as in fiscal 1976, the second most frequent sentence was from 6 - 9 years, numbering 166 or 17.0 percent. This year, as in fiscal 1976, only twelve parolees, or 1.2 percent, with life sentences were successfully discharged from parole supervision.

Offense

At the time of their last conviction in Virginia, 23.9 percent of the parolees discharged in fiscal year 1977 received sentences for Burglary, or Break and Enter, while 17.8 percent had convictions for violation of Narcotic Laws and 14.0 percent were in custody for Robbery or Attempted Robbery. As in fiscal 1976, these three categories accounted for more than half of all parolees discharged.

Five Year Trend

During the past five fiscal years, the total number of persons released from parole by discharge or violation has almost doubled, going from 784 in fiscal 1973 to 1,438 in fiscal 1977, an 83.4 percent increase. If however, the 646 parolees released by discharges or violations in fiscal 1972 (6 fiscal years ago) is compared with the 1,438 parole releases by discharges or violations in fiscal 1977 there has been a 122.6 percent increase since fiscal 1972. Fiscal 1976, registered a decrease from the previous fiscal year, 1,345 to 1,176 in fiscal 1976, a 12.6 percent decrease. Fiscal year 1974 experienced by far the largest change, increasing by 52.0 percent from 784 in fiscal 1973 to 1,192 in fiscal 1974.

The number of parolees discharged from supervision has increased since fiscal 1973 except for fiscal 1976 when there was a 22.3 percent decrease in discharges. Fiscal 1977 countered the fiscal 1976 decrease with a 28.4 percent increase. Fiscal 1974 showed the largest increase of any of the fiscal years with a 58.3 percent increase.

Parole violations have almost doubled during the fiscal years 1973 through 1977, increasing by 94.5 percent from 237 to 461. If fiscal 1972 (6 fiscal years ago) is taken into consideration, the increase in violations has more than tripled, increasing by 205.3 percent from 151 violations in fiscal 1972 to 461 in fiscal 1977. Fiscal 1974 registered the greatest increase during the five year period, increasing from 237 in fiscal 1973 to 326 in fiscal 1974, a 37.6 percent increase. An analysis of the violation rates shows that the highest rate of violation occurred in fiscal 1976 with a 35.3 rate.

APPENDIX I CLARIFICATION OF DATA COLLECTION PROCEDURES

According to the Division of Probation and Parole Services, there were 1,459 persons discharged from parole supervision during fiscal 1977. Data for this report was supplied on only 1,438 of these discharges. The narrative analysis and the tables, therefore, do not reflect the missing twenty-one persons. Table I is the only table which has been adjusted to reflect the total group of persons discharged during the fiscal year.

Parole code sheets come to the Bureau of Research, Reporting and Evaluation from the parole officers of each respective district. They are edited for missing or invalid data. The Bureau of Electronic Data Processing provides data entry services, editing and production of a report containing the aggregate statistics.

APPENDIX III DEFINITIONS RELATIVE TO PERSONS DISCHARGED FROM PAROLE AND PERSONS VIOLATING PAROLE

- I. PERSON VIOLATING PAROLE --- For purpose of this report, a person violating parole is defined as:
 - a. An individual who is being charged with failing to comply with one or more conditions of their parole; or
 - b. An individual who has failed to comply with one or more conditions of their parole, and has had their parole revoked. The types of violations are as follows:
 - a. FELONY The parolee has been convicted of an offense which carries a sentence of at least one year in the Virginia Correctional System.
 - b. MISDEMEANOR The parolee has been convicted of an offense that carries a maximum sentence of twelve months in jail.
 - c. BROKE REGULATION The parolee has violated one or more of the technical conditions of their parole.
 - d. ABSCONDER A person who has broken contact with the parole officer and whose whereabouts are unknown.
- II. PERSON DISCHARGED FROM PAROLE --- The individual has satisfactorily complied with the terms of his or her parole and has been released from parole supervision.
- III. VIOLATION RATE --- In any particular category, the violation rate is calculated as:

$$\frac{PV}{PV + PD} = VR$$

Where PV = Parole Violators

PD = Parole Discharges

VR = Violation Rate

Violation rates are expressed as percentages.
