

X CHARACTERISTICS OF THE FEMALE POPULATION

AT THE RHODE ISLAND TRAINING SCHOOL

July 1, 1976 - June 30, 1977

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PREFACE

This report provides a detailed picture of the girls detained or committed to the Rhode Island Training School during the period July 1, 1976 through June 30, 1977. These studies are done on an annual basis and the information reported is used by planners, administrators, and other criminal justice personnel for the purposes of short term and long range policy, program, and facility development. Information includes age, race, length of stay, prior incarceration, charge, residence, child welfare history, and ages at first commitment, current commitment, and release.

INTRODUCTION

This report as the title suggests is an inventory of the characteristics of the female population at the Rhode Island Training School for those juveniles who were detained during the period July 1, 1976 - June 30, 1977. A total of 92 girls passed through this institution during that 12 month period. These 92 girls served 108 separate detentions. Of these 92 girls; 58 at least once, were sentenced directly from the Family Court to the Training School after a court appearance. Sixteen (16) girls were at least once, sentenced to the Diagnostic Center but were held at the Training School while awaiting an opening at the Diagnostic Center. Twenty-five (25) girls were, at least once, held by state or local police departments or a judge but were not sentenced to the Training School after their court appearance.

In this report ten (10) variables are considered:

- 1) Classification of Detainee (regular court detainée, Diagnostic Center hold, or other hold)
- 2) Race
- 3) Age at first commitment
- 4) Age of current commitment
- 5) Age of release
- 6) Number of Detention (First, second, third, etc.)
- 7) Length of Detention (Both legal and on-grounds)
- 8) Type of offense
- 9) Residence
- 10) Child Welfare Service intervention.

Each of these variables and their interrelationships are explained in the preceding text and in the tables following the text.

CLASSIFICATION OF DETAINEES

The Rhode Island Training School served mainly as a facility for detaining girls who had appeared in Family Court and had been detained by a Family Court judge as a result of this appearance. The Training School also served as a facility for holding girls awaiting placement at the Juvenile Diagnostic Center and as a facility to hold girls for state and local police departments. Girls held in the latter category were frequently held after a verbal order of a judge. In this report these three categories of detainee are referred to as Regular Court Detentions, Diagnostic Center Holds, and Other Holds. During the period of this study July 1, 1976 through June 30, 1977, 92 different individuals passed through the Training School during 108 separate detentions.

During this 12 month period, 58 different girls were detained as a result of a Family Court appearance in which the judge ordered that the girl be detained at the Training School (regular court detention). During that period, 51 girls served one such detention, six (6) girls served two such detentions, and one girl served four such detentions.

Sixteen (16) girls were detained at the Training School while awaiting Diagnostic Center placement. All 16 girls served one and only one term at the Training School while awaiting Diagnostic Center placement. Five of these girls who were detained as Diagnostic Center holds at one time during the year, were also detained as Regular Court detainees at another time during this same year.

There were 25 girls who were held at the Training School to await a Family Court appearance and were released from the Training School at this appearance. These persons who are referred to in this report as Other Holds, may have been detained by the verbal order of a Family Court judge or by order of one of the State's police departments. Of these 25 girls, only two were detained at any other time during the year.

RACE

Data with respect to race occurs frequently throughout the report. Table one (1) shows the racial breakdown according to classification of detainee. Of the 92 girls who passed through the Training School during July 1, 1976 - June 30, 1977; 79 percent were known to be white and 13 percent were known to be black. The race was unknown for the remaining eight percent. Seventy-nine (79) percent of the detentions involved white girls, 15 per cent of the detentions involved black girls and 6 per cent of the detentions involved girls whose race was unknown. Seven of the eight girls whose race was unknown were "holds" who were released upon court appearance and never returned to the Training School. In every one of these cases the girl stayed at the Training School for not more than three (3) days.

Among the regular court detainees, 81 per cent were white and 17 per cent were black. Seventy-eight (78) per cent of the detentions involved white girls and 21 percent of the detentions involved black girls. Two of the black girls were detained more than once.

Among the Diagnostic Center Holds, 15 out of the 16 detainees were white. Similarly, 15 of the 16 detentions (94 percent) involved white girls. Among the Other Holds, 72 percent were known to be white, four per cent were known to be black, and 24 per cent were of unknown race.

Table 4 shows the racial data according to classification of detainee and number of previous detentions. Over 70 per cent of all white detentions were first detentions. In addition, 20 per cent of the white detentions were second detentions. Thus only nine per cent of the whites had two or more previous detentions. Among the detentions involving black girls 56 per cent were first detentions, 19 per cent were second detentions and 25 per cent were third or fourth detentions. Among the regular court detentions, 58 per cent of those involving white girls and 50 per cent of those involving black girls were first detentions. All but one of the Diagnostic Center holds were first detentions and all but two of the Other Holds were first detentions.

Table 7 is a cross tabulation of race, type of detention, and age of current commitment. This table shows that the white girls were as a group, younger than the black girls. The median age of commitment was 15.4 for white detentions and 17.1 for black detentions. The most common age at commitment was 15 for white girls and 17 for black girls.

Table 11 is a cross-tabulation of race and type of offense. Status offenses accounted for 53 per cent of the detentions involving white girls but only 19 per cent of the detentions involving black girls. Violent crimes (murder and assault) accounted for eight white detentions and four black detentions. Property offenses accounted for 17 white detentions and three black detentions.

Table 17 cross tabulates race, child welfare service history, and type of detention. Sixty-seven (67) per cent of the white girls and fifty-eight (58) per cent of the black girls were currently or formerly clients of Child Welfare Services. CWS clients or former clients accounted for 70 per cent of the regular court detentions, 81 per cent of the Diagnostic Center Holds and 52 per cent of the "Other Holds".

AGE AT FIRST COMMITMENT

Data with regard to age at which the girl was committed to the Training School for the first time are contained in Table 2 and Table 12. The age at first commitment in these two tables refers to first Regular Court Detention or Diagnostic Center Hold. Other holds are excluded from the definition of first commitment. The median age of first commitment was 15.4 years. This figure was similar among all classifications of detainee (15.4 for regular court detentions, 15.2 for Diagnostic Center holds, and 15.3 for other holds). The age of first commitment ranged from as young as 11 to as old as 18.

A correlation was found between age at first detention and number of detention (first, second, third etc.). The median age at first commitment was 16.1 years for those committed for the first time, 15.1 for those committed for the second time, and 15.4 for those committed for the third or subsequent detention.

AGE OF CURRENT COMMITMENT

Data with regard to age of current commitment appear in Tables 7, 13, and 16. Table 7 presents these data according to race and type of detention. The median age of current commitment was 15.7 - 15.8 for Regular Court Detentions, 15.2 for Diagnostic Center holds and 15.9 for Other holds. The median age was 15.4 for whites and 17.1 for blacks.

Table 13 is a cross tabulation of age of current commitment and length of detention. The Legal length of detention includes all the time in which the girl is under the administrative control of the Training School. This includes time on runaway status, temporary community placements, and any other absence. On the other hand on-grounds length of detention refers only to the time in which the girl is housed in the Training School cottages. There was no significant relationship between age of commitment and length of detention for either legal or on-grounds lengths of detention. The median legal length of detention was 19 days and the median on grounds detention was 14 days. The median legal length of detention was 42 days for regular court detentions, 19 days for Diagnostic Center Holds and 1.5 days for Other Holds. The corresponding figures for on grounds length of detention were 33 days for regular court detentions, 18 days for Diagnostic Center holds, and 1.5 days for "other holds".

Table 16 cross-tabulates age of commitment with type of offense. Status offenders were slightly younger (median - 15.6) than non-status offenders (median 16.0).

AGE OF RELEASE

Table 8 is a cross tabulation of age of release and type of detention. Due to the short average duration of detention, the median age of release (15.8) is only slightly older than the median age of commitment (15.7). The median age of release was 16.0 for regular court detentions, 15.2 for Diagnostic Center holds and 15.9 for other holds. There were eight detentions that were still incomplete at the time this study was undertaken.

NUMBER OF PREVIOUS DETENTIONS

Data with regard to number of previous detentions (excluding other holds) appear in several tables in this report. Table 3 cross-tabulates number of previous detentions with type of detention. Seventy per cent of all detentions were first detentions, 19 per cent were second detentions and 11 per cent were third or subsequent detentions. First detentions accounted for 57 per cent of the Regular Court detentions, 94 per cent of the Diagnostic Center holds, and 92 per cent of the "other holds".

Table 4 cross-tabulates number of previous detentions with race. Nearly four-fifths (79 per cent) of the first detentions were known to involve white girls, 12 per cent were known to involve black girls, and nine per cent involved girls whose race was unknown. Similarly 78 per cent of the second or subsequent detentions were known to involve white girls. Further analysis of this table was presented in the previous section under Race.

Table 12 is a cross-tabulation of age at first detention and number of previous detentions. It was stated in a previous section of this text (age of First Commitment) that as the age of first detention increases, the proportion of first detentions also increases. Nine of the 16 detentions involving persons whose first detention was at ages 11, 12, or 13 were second or subsequent detentions; while all 10 girls whose first detention was at age 17 or older were serving their first detention.

Table 14 cross-tabulates length of detention and number of previous detentions. The legal length of detention includes all time in which the girl is under the jurisdiction* of the Training School; including all authorized absences (such as temporary community placement, hospitals, prisons, etc.) and unauthorized absences (runaways). The median length of detention was only 8.0 days for first detentions, but was 83.5 days for second or subsequent detentions. Similarly, the median for the on-grounds length of detention was 7.0 days for first detentions and 41.0 days for second or subsequent detentions.

Table 18 cross-tabulates number of previous detentions and Child Welfare Services intervention. Sixty-two (62) per cent of the first detentions and 81 per cent of the second or subsequent detentions involved girls who were current or former clients of Child Welfare Services.

*The Family Court retains jurisdiction of the juvenile but the Training School has the responsibility of finding the appropriate placement in accordance with the Family Court decree.

LENGTH OF DETENTION

At the time this study was undertaken, 100 of the 108 girls detained in fiscal 1976-1977 had been released. In this study, length of detention is defined in two ways:

- 1) Legal length of detention refers to the entire length of time in which the girl was placed under the administrative control of the Training School. This includes time spent on the Training School grounds, time spent on unauthorized absences, (runaway status) and time spent on authorized absences (such as in temporary Community Placements, IMH, hospitals, etc.)
- 2) On Grounds length of detention refers only to the time in which the girl is housed in the Training School cottages.

Table 5 shows the legal length of detention by type of detention. Most detentions were very short. All 25 of the other holds were less than seven days long. The median and mean lengths of Diagnostic Center holds were 19.0 and 21.6 days respectively. Even the regular court detentions had a median length of only 42 days. Fifty-four (54) per cent of these detentions lasted 60 days or less. One detention lasted over one year.

The on-grounds lengths of detention (See table 6) were even shorter. Two-thirds (67 per cent) of all the girls resided 30 days or less on the Training School grounds. Eighty one (81) percent stayed 60 days or less. The 59 Regular Court detainees spent a median of 33 days and a mean of 49 days on the Training School grounds. The 16 Diagnostic Center holds spent a median of 18 days and a mean of 17 days. The median length of the 25 other holds was 1.5 days.

Table 13 is a cross-tabulation of age of commitment and length of detention. For total detentions, no significant relationship was found between the two variables. The on-grounds length of detention was slightly shorter for older detainees. Among the regular court detainees, the wide variation in median length of stay for the various age groups is probably due to chance variation caused by small numbers. A study similar to this for 1974-1975 showed a completely different pattern.

The numbers in each age group for the Diagnostic Center holds and other holds are too small to draw any valid statistical inferences from.

Table 14 is a cross tabulation of length of detention and number of previous detentions. The most important conclusion that can be derived from the data is that second or subsequent detentions were much longer than first detentions. The median legal length of stay for first detentions was only 8.0 days. Girls detained for their second or subsequent detention had a legal median length of 83.5 days. The on-grounds lengths of stay varied similarly. The median on-grounds length of detention for first detentions was 7.0 days,

but the corresponding figure for second or subsequent detentions was 41.0 days. For regular court detentions, the legal median length of stay was 27.5 days for first detentions and 95.0 days for second or subsequent detentions. The on-grounds median was 21.5 days for first detentions and 57.0 days for second or subsequent detentions. There were so few second or subsequent Diagnostic Center holds or Other holds that no medians were calculated for these groups.

Table 15 is a cross-tabulation of charge and length of detention. The length of detention for the same or similar offenses varied widely. The major offense types and their mean and median lengths of detention are shown in the tables below.

TYPE OF OFFENSE

Table 9 is a cross-tabulation of type of detention and type of offense. Twelve (12) per cent of the cohort were detained for violent crimes (assault and murder); 18.5 per cent were detained for property offenses; 50 per cent were detained for status offenses, and 17.6 per cent were detained for other offenses (drug offenses, violation of probation, prostitution, false police report). The offense was unknown for 1.9 per cent. Status offenders accounted for 38.8 per cent of the regular court detentions, 62.5 per cent of the Diagnostic Center holds and 72 per cent of the "other holds". This is in sharp contrast to the corresponding figures for the boys at the Training School. Only 3.2 per cent of the detentions involving boys were for status offenses.

Table 11 is a cross-tabulation of charge and race. Among the whites, 52.9 per cent of the detentions were for status offenses, while only 18.8 per cent of the blacks were detained for status offenses. The most common offenses committed by both races are shown in the table below.

Table 15 is a cross tabulation of type of offense and length of detention. The highlights of this table are discussed in the preceding section under Length of Detention. It should be noted that eight girls were still serving part of their detention at the time this report was written. These eight girls were excluded from Table 15.

RESIDENCE

Table 10 shows the 92 detainees and 108 detentions according to city or town and census tract of residence. A brief summary of these data is shown in the table below:

INTERVENTION OF CHILD WELFARE SERVICES

Date with regard to Child Welfare Services clients is contained in Tables 17 and 18. Two thirds (67 per cent) of the white girls and 58 per cent of the black girls were current or former CWS clients. CWS clients accounted for 70 per cent of the regular court detentions, 81 per cent of the Diagnostic Center holds and 52 per cent of the "other holds". CWS clients accounted for 62 per cent of all first detentions and 81 per cent of all second or subsequent detentions.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

1. The racial distribution for the girls was -

- 1) White - 79 per cent
- 2) Black - 13 per cent
- 3) Unknown - 8 per cent.

For regular court detentions this distribution was -

- 1) White - 78 per cent
- 2) Black - 21 per cent
- 3) Unknown - 2 per cent

For Diagnostic Center holds this distribution was -

- 1) White - 94 per cent
- 2) Black - 6 per cent

For other holds this distribution was -

- 1) Known whites - 72 per cent
- 2) Known blacks - 4 per cent
- 3) Unknown - 24 percent

2. The median age of current commitment was younger for the white girls (15.4) than the corresponding age for black girls (17.1)

3. The median age of first commitment at the Training School was 15.4..
15.4 for regular court detentions,
15.2 for Diagnostic Center holds and
15.3 for "other holds".

The median age of first commitment was younger for those returning to school for their second or subsequent commitment.

4. The median age of current commitment was 15.7; therefore the median age of release of 15.8 reflects the short average length of stay.

5. Data on number of previous detentions can be summarized by the following percentage distribution:

The legal lengths of detention varied from less than a day to 577 days. The on-grounds lengths of detention varied from less than a day to 202 days.

8. Most of the detainees came from the urbanized area of the State. Nearly 34 percent of all detainees resided in the City of Providence; eight per cent resided in Newport; seven per cent resided in Woonsocket; five per cent resided in Warwick, and four per cent resided in Cranston, Pawtucket and West Warwick. Nine girls were residents of other states.

9. Two thirds of the white girls and 58 per cent of the black girls were known to Child Welfare Services. CWS clients accounted for 70 per cent of the regular court detentions, 81 per cent of the Diagnostic Center holds and 52 per cent of the "other holds".
