

INTRODUCTION

One of the more significant social phenomena that has surfaced in the last few decades is the acknowledgement that social and physical architects should be responsive to the overall impact of their plans and programs. For example, responsible urban planning requires a great deal more detail than mere traffic patterns when routing a new freeway or locating a mass transit terminal. Each decision is measured in terms of its chain-reaction effect on the existing system and on any future proposals.

In a similar vein, criminal justice decision-makers and practitioners are learning to consider the overall impact of change to any one part of the criminal justice system. It is no longer enough to speak of increasing public safety without asking the collateral questions regarding the rest of the system. For example, if increased public safety is to be achieved by stiffer prison sentences, then what is the impact on the prisons, jails, courts, custodial and parole programs, corrections staff and the individual prisoner in overcrowded facility? A single question about public safety, therefore, may require complex research involving social as well as financial issues.

Thus, the important questions of impact are being asked. But in order to provide answers, there must be detailed systematic sets of data from which to logically and reasonably construct a set of cost-effective alternatives.

As the need for system-wide information for decision-making becomes more evident, various organizations tasked with the collection been and analysis statistical and descriptive data. In the field of criminal justice for the State of Washington, the Statistical Analysis Center of the Division of Criminal Justice within the Office of Financial Management is one of these. This volume is one of a regular series of descriptive reference manuals for the state-wide criminal justice process produced b y Statistical Analysis Center.

Specifically, this volume of Management and Administrative Statistics is an attempt to portray the individual entities that comprise the criminal justice system of the state. Manpower statistics include the type of skills required, educational attainment, age, sex and pay levels. Certain workload statistics depict the volume of work in gross terms.

Fund flows are explained where source and repository are not self-evident. In some instances data was not complete or easily comparable due to differences in time periods or definitions. This fact is noted in each instance in the narrative preceding the individual chapters.

Production of this volume involved the cooperation and assistance of numerous organizations and individuals. Space will not permit proper acknowledgment for all concerned but we are certainly appreciative and do wish to expess our thanks. LAW ENFORCEMENT

Thirty-eight of Washington's 39 counties elect a sheriff who serves a four-year term and is the chief law enforcement in the county. King County has established Department of Public Safety with an appointed Sheriff-Director who is responsible for functions exercised by elected sheriffs as well as additional duties.

General duties of the sheriff include arrest and jailing of violators of state law and county ordinances, defense of the public peace and safety, execution of orders and processes of judges, execution of warrants from public officers and attendance at court sessions. Unlike municipal and state law enforcement officers, the sheriff must serve civil process and is required to maintain a county jail. The sheriff has charge of all persons confined in the jail and must either be the jailer himself or appoint a deputy to perform that function.

Deputy sheriffs may perform the same official duties as the sheriff. Their salaries and terms of employment are established according to merit system regulations set forth by state law and county ordinances.

Although the sheriff may enforce state law and ordinance anywhere in the county, regardless of town or city boundaries, in common practice he exercises responsibilites only in unincorporated areas. However, the sheriff generally provides emergency assistance municipalities which request it and, since the sheriff is required to operate a jail, he generally provides detention services for many of the communities. Due to local manpower shortages, the sheriff may conduct felony investigations in third and fourth class cities and towns. The sheriff also may provide support to communities which have contracted with county for law enforcement services. Although community cannot contract directly with the sheriff for services, the community can contract with the county, which in turn provides law enforcment services through the sheriff.

City police departments are responsible for enforcement of state laws and county and municipal ordinances within the limits of their jurisdictions.

Cities and towns in the state are divided into four classes. Cities of the first class may frame a charter regulating the organization of its police. The State Supreme Court has ruled that cities of this class (over 10,000 population) may exercise their police powers without additional state authorization as long as the subject matter is local, the cities' ordinances are not inconsistent with the general laws and public policies as declared by the State Legislature.

The police functions of second-class cities are specified by state statute. The law requires that there be an appointive chief of police and such number of patrolmen as shall, from time to time, be fixed and determined by the city council. The mayor appoints the police chief and all subordinates with the consent of the council. Nine members of the city council may remove the police chief or he can be removed by the mayor without the consent of the council.

The police chief in third-class cities is appointed by the mayor and may be removed by him. In addition to general law enforcement duties, the police chief in third-class cities is charged with prosecuting all violations of city ordinance.

Police chiefs in fourth-class towns are appointed by their respective mayors with no confirmation by the city council and are referred to in the statute as town marshals. In addition to serving as prosecutor as in third-class cities, they are responsible for the town prison and prisoners.

Data and Data Constraints

Information is presented on the manpower budget, and reported crime and arrests for counties and cities of Washington State. Each county is listed by population size as is each jurisdiction within the county.

The law enforcement manpower table contains information on the size of population served, number of commissioned staff, sex, range of hire, number of commissioned staff with over 20 years service, level of education, and monthly pay ranges. The pay ranges reflect the pay for five representative positions in the departmental hierarchy. This table also indicates whether or not a municipality provides its own police services or contracts with the county sheriff for services.

Most of the information for the law enforcement manpower table was drawn from the 1977 Washington State Law Enforcement Survey which is conducted annually by the Office of the Attorney General. The shortcoming of this survey is that it is limited to jurisdictions with populations greater than 2,000, therefore, only minimal information is available on smaller departments.

The law enforcement budget table is also based on information the 1977 Law Enforcement collected in Survey. departmental budgets as well as a break down by the following categories is provided: administration, investigation, patrol, crime prevention, training, facilities, communication, other municipal services, and care and custody of prisoners. The total budget for departments is valid, however, the reader must be cautioned in the use of the subcategories of police budgets. Because there mandatory guidelines for the use of the budget subcategories, police departments are free to report their budgets as best departmental accounting their systems. This resulted in non-comparable data in many cases.

The table for law enforcement activities represents the FBI Part I reported crime rates, the number of total arrests and the number of Part I arrests for the participating counties and cities. At the time this report was being written, the latest available FBI statistics which showed local crime figures was for 1976. Also included in the law enforcement activities is an indication as to whether or not a local jurisdiction has it own police force or contracts with the county sheriff. "X" indicates that a jurisdiction has its own police force, and "S" indicates that the jurisdiction contracts with the county. Finally, the number of police per thousand population is listed.

COUNTY PROSECUTION

"Prosecuting attorneys are attorneys authorized by law to appear for and represent the state and counties thereof in actions and proceedings before the courts and judicial officers."

Revised Code of Washington 36.27.005.

Each county has a prosecuting attorney, elected for a four-year term, who may be part-time or full-time depending upon the size of the county. In fourth class counties, the prosecutor must also serve as coroner. Except for violations of municipal ordinances, filing all criminal charges within the county is within the discretion of the prosecutor. Prosecution of municipal violations is the responsibility of the corporation counsel employed by the appropriate city.

According to state law, county prosecutors have a specific list of 14 duties to perform, ranging from the filing of felony charges to a general directive to "Seek to reform and improve the administration of criminal substantive or procedural law." Other duties include the counseling and representation of county officials, precinct officers and school directors in criminal and civil matters, advising the county grand jury and bringing election law violations to the attention of the proper jurisdicition. The prosecutor must validate certain court also cost bills before submission to county commissioners, annually examine records and books of the auditor, assessor, sheriff and school superintendent, and annually examine all bonds issued by the Specific responsibilities to the state include submission of an annual report to the Governor covering "the amount and nature of business transacted by him that year," and the preparation of an annual report to the State Liquor Control Board listing all prosecutions brought under state liquor laws.

Data and Data Constraints

Information is presented on the manpower, budgets, and prosecutorial activities of the 39 county prosecutors.

There are two tables which show manpower characteristics of the county prosecutors' offices. The first table, "Prosecutors' Staffs" lists, by size of county population, the size of the total prosecutorial staff, the number of deputy prosecutors, a breakdown of the number of deputy prosecutors by speciality, the number of investigative staff, and the number of special employees. The specialities list

for the deputy prosecutor category includes: criminal deputies, civil deputies, juvenile deputies, and combined specialities. Also included in this table is identification of full or part time county prosecutors.

The second table displaying the manpower characteristics of the county prosecutors includes the annual salary, number of years of service, and sex distribution for chief deputies, deputy prosecutors, and legal stenos. These positions represent a sample of the different positions in the prosecutors' offices. The table also includes the portion of the budget used for salaries, the prosecutor's annual salary, and full or part time designation for the different prosecutors.

The sources of information for the prosecutorial manpower information were Prosecutor Association surveys and individual Prosecutor Reports.

There are two tables which provide information concerning the county prosecutors' budgets. The first, "Frosecutors Budgets 1977" lists by size county the assessed tax base of each of the counties, the total prosecutorial budget, the per capita cost of prosecutor services, and detail breakdown of the prosecutor's budget. The budget detail includes the following categories: salaries, supplies, travel and other. The total budget figures can be viewed as accurate. Because there is no standarization for the budget detail, these figures must be used with caution.

The second table, "Prosecuting Attorney's Salaries payments to Counties - Fiscal Year 1976 and Fiscal Year 1977" includes the State's payments to the individual counties for prosecutor's salaries. By statute, the state pays one-half of the county prosecuting attorneys salaries.

Population and assessed valuation information is drawn from State of Washington Pocket Data Book 1977. Budget information was provided by the Prosecutors Association survey, and the State's portion of the prosecuting attorneys salaries was provided by the fiscal year 1977 Annual Report of the State Treasurer.

The "Prosecutors' Activities 1977" table provides information on the criminal, civil, and coroner activities of the county prosecutors by size of the counties' populations. These prosecutorial activities are set against a background of the counties' arrest statistics. Statewide, there is a strong tie between arrest and prosecutor activity. However, a strong caveat must be issued against making detailed local interpretation of arrest versus prosecutor activities on the county level. The major problem lies in the number of agencies reporting arrests within a specific county. In some

cases the portion of the population represented in arrest statistics is as low as 12 to 31 percent. Projections from such small and unrepresentative samples are at best tenuous.

The criminal activities portion of the prosecutor report enumerates the major court actions in which the prosecutor is involved. Included are the number of felony preliminary hearings, appeals from the district court to the superior court, number of criminal filings in superior court (which does not include appeals from district courts), and the estimated number of superior court cases (which represents an approximate combination of both appeals and filings). Also included under criminal activities for prosecutors are the number of jury and non jury trials at both the district court and the superior court levels. Finally, the number of cases presented in the state's appellate and supreme courts is listed.

A number of things are important to understand in the attempt to classify prosecutor activities. First, the use of the felony preliminary hearing which takes place in the district court is an optional court procedure prosecutors may exercise. Second, district court appeals to the superior court are misdemeanors while superior court filings are all felonies. Next, the estimated number of total superior court cases is problematic because the counting methods vary somewhat by county to county and prosecutors count differently than the courts.

Three different measures are used for measuring court cases. These include the number of people (or individuals), the number of criminal charges, and the number of cases. District court appeals are counted by the district court as they leave the district court, however, not all of the appeals are actually heard or tried in superior court and those not heard or tried are returned to the district court for disposition.

The information for the prosecutor activities reports was obtained primarily from two sources, individual prosecutor reports and Judicial Administration in the Courts, State of Washington 1977. The problem with the data is not so much with the actual counting of the events, but with the varied methods of counting. These data are best used as general indicators for comparative purposes.

The estimated number of Superior Court cases should not be directly compared to Superior Court filing. Superior Court filing, for the most part, are the number of charges' prosecutors file in Superior Court. Usually there are a greater number of charges filed than there are cases. For example, in Spokane County they filed 1,092 cases in Superior Court which contained 1,164 specific charges. This yellds a 1,07 ratio for charges per case.

JUDICIARY

THE JUDICIARY

"Article IV of the Washington State Constitution, as amended, establishes the judiciary as a separate but equal branch of government. In accordance with the article, the courts of Washington are divided into four levels: The Supreme Court, the Court of Appeals, the Superior Courts and the court of limited jurisdiction."

Judicial Administration in the Courts, State of Washington, 1977.

Supreme Court

The State's court of final resort is composed of nine justices, each elected on a non-partisan ballot for staggered six year terms. Should a vacancy occur, the Governor fills it by appointement and the appointee holds that position until the next general election. The Chief Justice is elected to the position by his peers and serves a two-year term.

The Supreme Court has general appellate jurisdiction over direct appeals in cases involving state officials, the constitutionality of statutes and conflicting statutes or issues of broad public importance. It also reviews less-than-unanimous decisions of the Court of Appeals and promulgates rules of procedure for all court levels.

Under administrative purview of the court is the state's Administrator for the Courts and his forty-three person staff. Created by statute in 1957, the Administrator collects data and makes recommendations to the Chief Justice regarding court administrative procedures and assignment of judges. A reporter of Decisions and the Supreme Court Clerk report to the Court. The state law library is also under direction of the court.

The Washington Judicial Council, created by the Legislature in 1925, is composed of members representing all three branches of government. The Council continuously reviews the judicial process and the operation of the rules of practice and procedure, reporting its findings to the Supreme Court.

Court of Appeals

This court is organized into three divisions, headquartered in Seattle, Tacoma, and Spokane, and has general appellate jurisdiction in all actions except those which are directly

appealable to the supreme court. During 1977, each division was served by three judges. Each judge is elected on non-partisan ballots for staggered six-year terms. As with the Supreme Court, vacancies are filled by the Governor and the position is held until the next election.

A presiding chief judge is elected annually and assumes responsibility for coordinating the administration of all three units. Chief judges are elected at the division level for two year terms and are responsible for administration of their own individual division.

Superior court

One hundred ten judges serve 28 superior court districts statewide. Ten of these districts serve two or more counties; the remainder serve one county each.

The state's only trial court of record, it has unlimited authority to hear all matters. Lower courts can hear cases involving traffic violations, misdemeanors and civil actions in which contested amounts are under \$1,000 but superior courts have exclusive jurisdiction in probate and domestic relations matters. Appeals from municipal and district courts are heard de novo or "anew" by superior courts.

Superior court judges are elected to four year terms by the people of the districts they serve. Elections occur in even numbered years coincident with the national presidential election.

Court is held as business requires. "However, to insure the efficient use of judicial resources, superior court judges may sit in districts other than their own on the invitation of the resident judge or judges, on order of the Governor, or on order of the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court."

Courts of Limited Jurisdiction

These courts include district, municipal, police and justice of the peace courts. In this report, however, police and justice of the peace courts have been combined with municipal courts. With jurisdiction over all traffic and misdemeanor cases, these courts have the largest caseload in the state. There are 73 district and 243 municipal courts statewide (One hundred twenty two municipalities contract with district courts for services). Ninety-nine judges serve in district courts, 119 serve in a municipal court capacity. District court judges are elected on nonpartisan ballots in even numbered years not coincidental with the national presidential election. Municipal court judges may either be appointed or elected, depending upon the provisions under

which the court was established.

Criminal jurisdiction of district and justice of the peace courts is limited to and concurrent with that of the superior court in cases involving misdemeanors and gross misdemeanors. Additionally, district courts have concurrent or shared jurisdiction with superior court for preliminary hearings in felony cases. Municipal courts have jurisdiction over violations of municipal ordinances. District and municipal courts can impose a sentence with a maximum of \$500 fine or six months in jail, or both. A justice of the peace may not impose a fine greater than \$100 or imprisonment for 30 days in jail.

District courts also have jurisdiction over some civil matters, including recovery on contracts, damages for injury to persons or personal property, surety bonds, and all small claim matters in which the parties represent themselves and the amounts in controversy are less than \$300. In November 1977, a State Constitutional Amendment was passed (SJR 113) increasing the civil jurisdiction for district courts to include cases involving amounts in controversy up to \$3,000 or as established by the legislature. However, until implementing legislation is passed, district courts will continue to hear civil claims for amounts no greater than \$1,000. In addition, district courts are restricted from hearing actions for false imprisonment, libel, slander, malicious prosecution, criminal conversation and seduction.

Courts of limited jurisdiction are not trial courts of record and transcripts are not made of their proceedings. Therefore, appeals from judgments of courts of limited jurisdiction are heard anew, or de novo, by the superior courts in their respective counties and the cases are completely retried.

Since enactment of the Justice Court Act in 1961, all counties except Columbia County have discontinued the practice of justice of the peace "fee system" and have established justice court districts, served by district courts. At the close of 1977, there were 73 district courts and only two justice of the peace courts in the state.

Data and Data Constraints

Information is presented on the manpower, budget, and court activities for the judiciary. Included in the judicature are the five levels of courts in Washington State, municipal, district (or justice), superior, appellate, and supreme courts.

Manpower information includes the number of judges for each

superior, district, and municipal court jurisdiction. For those municipal courts that contract for services, the contracting district court is listed. Where the information was available, the following information is displayed for each court: full time or part time judgeships, attorney or non-attorney judges, years in office, sex, age, and salary. Summary information on each of these items is presented for municipal, district, and superior courts.

The monetary income and expenditure for the different courts is a complex process. A number of tables are used to display in detail the receipts of the different courts; the state, county, and municipal revenues received from the courts; and the state, county, and municipal expenditures for the courts.

Complete information is not readily available which indicates the total process of court receipts, court expenditures and court funding. In many situations calendar year 1977 information is presented in conjunction with fiscal year 1977 data. The problems of missing data and data from different types of fiscal years must be carefully examined before they are used for comparison.

The first table -- "Detail of Municipal and District Court Receipts, County and Municipal Revenue and Expenditures From/For the Courts, and State Income from the Courts" -- displays by the superior court districts and the district and municipal courts within the superior court districts the following information: municipal court receipts, district court receipts, county and municipal revenue from the courts, county and municipal expenditures for the courts, state income from the superior courts, state share of income from the district court suspense funds, and state income from direct penalities collected in district and municipal courts. Totals are provided for these categories for each superior court jurisdiction. Statewide totals are provided for each of the above categories on the summary sheet for this table.

The second table related to court receipts and funding -"Distribution of Court Receipts" -- shows the total income
from fines, fees, and forfeitures for each type of court.
The recipients of funds and the amounts received are also
listed. This table is subject to the same caveats as the
other courts receipts and funding tables.

The third table related to court receipts and funding -"Summary of State Income from the Courts by Fund Category and
Recipient Agency Fiscal Year 1977" -- list the amount of
money disbursed from the different State Treasury funds into
agency budgets. The sources of income are listed for each of
the treasury funds as are the agencies receiving funds from
the income from the courts. The source of this information
is the Annual Report of the State Treasurer.

The fourth table related to court receipts and funding -"Source of Funds for Court Expenditures" -- shows the source
and amount of funds used for court operations. The problem
of fiscal information from different fiscal years makes the
data usable in only a general sense. There are also a number
of situations where information was not available without
additional expenditure of data collection resources.

The fifth table related to court receipts and funding -"State Income from State Penalties and the District Courts'
Suspense Funds by the Type of Income by County" -- presents
the total income to the state from court receipts minus the
income from superior, appellate, and supreme courts. The
totals received from municipalities is also listed but is not
listed individually by jurisdiction. State totals by
different types of fines (traffic safety, motor vehicle
intoxication penalties, highway safety, overload, game and
fish, and school) are listed individually by county. Other
sources of state income from the district and municipal
courts are listed as subtotals. Finally, the total state
income from the district and municipal courts for fiscal year
1977 is listed. The information for this table was extracted
from the Annual Report of the State Treasurer.

The sixth table related to court recipts and funding -"Supreme Court, Court of Appeals Budget and State Share of
Superior Court Cost for Fiscal Year 1977" -- includes the
number of staff for each court, the average staff year cost,
and a budget detail for salaries and wages, personal services
contracts, goods and services, travel, equipment, employee
benefits, and indigent appeals. This information was
provided by the Office of the Administrator for the Courts.

The next set of tables addresses the activities of the different levels of courts. The first table of court activities addresses the activities of the supreme court. Here, information is provided separately for the summary of information concerning filings and dispositions. Next, tables are presented which show the activities of the court of appeals. The first table presents the summary of filings information; the second presents the summary of dispositions; and the third table presents the summary of cases pending at year end 1977. Two tables present information concerning the superior courts activities. The first table shows the case filings information and a detailed breakdown of criminal filings, dispositions and trials by county and superior court district. The second table shows the pattern of judicial assistance among the superior courts.

Finally, two tables are presented which indicate district and municipal court activities. The table for district court activities lists the types and number of filings, number of criminal trials, and the number of cases appealed to the

superior court for each district court. The table for municipal court activities lists the types and number of filings, types and number of bail forfeitures, number of trials, and the number of cases appealed to superior court for each municipal court. Municipal courts which contract with district courts for services have their records maintained separately from district court activities; it is therefore possible to report on each municipal court.

JUVENILE COURT SERVICES

Description and Responsibilities

"...the judges of the superior court shall, at such times as they may determine, designate one or more of their number whose duty it shall be to hear all cases arising under this chapter.* A special session to be designated as the "juvenile court session" shall be provided for the hearing of such cases...and the court, may, for convenience, be called the juvenile court."

13.04.030, Revised Code of Washington

"the court shall, in any county or judicial district in the state, appoint or designate one or more persons of good character to serve as probation counselors during the pleasure of the court."

13.04.040, Revised Code of Washington

Thirty-two juvenile court service units serve the state's 28 superior court districts. Twenty-five of these are single-county service units; the remaining seven serve two counties each.

With the exception of King County, all juvenile court service units are under the jurisdiction of the superior court judges. In King County, administration of juvenile court services was transferred, in February, 1977, to an executive branch, "Department of Youth Affairs."

During the period covered by data referenced in this report, juvenile courts processed as many as 12,000 delinquent, 2,000 status offenders and 1,300 non-offender youth in the largest juvenile court jurisdiction, to as few as 81 delinquent, 20 status offenders, and 15 status offender youths in the smallest jurisdiction reporting.

Primary funding of juvenile court services i.s the responsibility of the county. The state, through juvenile probation subsidy program administered by DSDS' Bureau of Juvenile Rehabilitation and the LEAA program administered by OFM's Division of Criminal Justice (formerly and Justice Planning Division), provides supplementary funding. Positions funded by the federal CETA program may provide additional support.

* Designation of a single judge applies only in those jurisdictions of 30,000 or more inhabitants. In smaller counties, any judge may hear juvenile cases.

Data and Data Constraints

Information is presented on the manpower and juvenile court activities for 28 of the 32 juvenile court services units. Budget information is presented for 27 of the 32 juvenile court service areas.

The table for manpower information presents the information by the size of the juvenile population (measured as those youths who are between kindergarten and twelfth grade) in the juvenile court service areas. The number of persons, the sex, age, educational attainment, years of service, and salary range is provided for the major job titles within the juvenile court services units.

The budget information for juvenile court services presents the following information: the county population, or the combined counties population where appropriate; the youth population (which is represented by the number of youths in school ranging from kindergarten to twelfth grade); the number of staff; the total budget; and budget detail. Included in the budget detail is a category for the cost of detention services. In some instances, this category is not independent of the other budget subcategories. Hence, cost of detention services should be used only as a separate item. Subcategories for the budgets include personnel and benefits, equipment and supplies, travel, training, food, capital improvement, and other.

Two tables are presented which portray information concerning juvenile court services activities. The first table presents client under information on intake the headings and non-offenders. delinquent, status offenders, Also included in this table is information pertaining to the organization of intake services and involvement with court The second table displays the types of services appearances. available in the juvenile court services organizations, in other governmental agencies, and in private agencies in the coummunity.

The source of the information for juvenile court services was a survey conducted by the Statistical Analysis Center in the Division of Criminal Justice of the Office of Financial Management (formerly the Law and Justice Planning Division).

BUREAU OF JUVENILE REHABILITATION*

"The bureau's goals are (1) the provision of institutional confinement or community supervision of juveniles committed to the department by county juvenile courts or transferred to the department under provision of the interstate compact on juveniles; and (2) assistance to local governments to prevent commitment of juveniles who are not dangerous and to allow their supervision in their communities."

1977 Annual Report, Human Resource Agencies, State of Washington

The Bureau of Juvenile Rehabilitation operates parole, group home and institutional programs for offenders committed by juvenile courts. In addition, the Bureau's probation subsidy program provides funds for special supervision for approximately 3500 youths per year under county jurisdiction.

Three insitutions - Echo Glen Children's Center near Issaquah, Maple Lane School in south Thurston County and Green Bill School in Chehalis - provide moderate to high security for up to 600 boys and girls. Cedar Creek, Mission Creek and Naselle Youth Camps provide low security care for about 275 boys. The Bureau also operates six group homes housing 80 youngsters needing small group care and the availability of community resources.

Juvenile Parole Services provides supervision for institutional releases, "but their main functions are to help paroled youngsters locate and enter appropriate educational, vocational and work programs and to provide linkages to appropriate social services". It is also responsible for five learning centers, specialized foster homes and the Interstate Compact on Juveniles. The latter, a reciprocal agreement between the 50 states for courtesy supervision of parolees and probationers who move across state borders, involves nearly 300 youth annually.

Data and Data Constraints

Information is presented on the manpower, budget, and the activities for each suborganization in the Bureau of Juvenile Rehabilitation.

* In 1978, the Bureau of Juvenile Rehabilitation became the Division of Juvenile Rehabilitation.

The manpower table for the suborganizations for the Bureau of Juvenile Rehabilitation categorizes jobs into general organizational categories —— e.g.,; management, parole staff, delinquency prevention staff, and so on —— and then further subdivides them into specific job titles or in some cases the number of persons in a general job category. Also portrayed in this fashion is information on the sex, age, educational level at hire, length of service with state, and salary level. The source of this information was the Office of Informational Services in the Department of Social and Health Services.

Budget information is provided for each sub-organization and as a bureau total for the Bureau of Juvenile Rehabilitation. The subcategories of the budget include salaries, employee benefits, supplies, training, food, travel, equipment, and all other. The information for this table was provided by the Management and Budget Division of the Department of Social and Health Services.

The activities for the Bureau of Juvenile Rehabilitation are reported as the average population for each of the Bureau's institutions. Information on regional or group home populations is not reported. The source of this information was the Plynning and Research Division of the Department of Social and Health Services.

DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL AND HEALTH SERVICES ADULT CORRECTIONS DIVISION

The Adult Corrections Division is responsible for the supervision and care of all persons remanded to the Department of Social and Health Services following felony convictions in superior courts.

PROGRAM GOALS

- 1. To protect the public by the control of criminal activity by persons convicted of felonies and the inhibition of future criminal acts; and
- To maintain humane, secure settings in which offenders may serve their sentences and receive opportunities for self-improvement.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

- To administer penalties set by the superior courts and the state Board of Prision Terms and Paroles;
- 2. To maintain custodial control or community supervision during the time offenders are under the jurisdiction of the department;
- 3. To provide opportunities for development or preservation of abilities, work habits, attitudes, and inter-personal skills to enable the offender to adjust to release; and
- 4. To encourage the maturation, personal responsibility, self-esteem, and productivity of offenders under the department's jurisdiction.

In addition to its regular activites, the Division's Adult Probation and parole system directed two special efforts during the period covered by this report, viz., the Classification and Work Unit project, and the Intensive Supervision Project. The goal of the former project was standardization of surveillance and supervision of offenders while in parole status. The Intensive Supervision Project processed up to 200 early releasees under the assumption that a portion of the population going into the state prisons could be managed in the community with no greater risk and at less cost, providing they are carefully selected and under proper supervision.

The Division also directed a work/training release program, expecting that a total of 450 beds in 20 facilities would be dedicated to the effort by 1977.

Data and Data Constraints

Information is presented on the manpower, budget, and activities for each of the suborganizations in the Division of Adult Corrections.

The manpower table for the suborganizations for the Division of Adult Corrections categorizes jobs into general

organization categories — i.e.— management, probation/parole staff, correctional officer, and so on — and then further subdivides these categories into specific job titles. The number of persons within the specific job titles or, in some cases the number of persons in a general job category is listed for each suborganization. Also portrayed in this fashion is information on sex, age, educational level at hire, length of service with the state, and salary level. The source of this information was the Office of Information Services in the Department of Social and Health Services

Budget information is provided each suborganization and as a division total for the Division of Adult Corrections. The subcategories of the budget includes salaries, employee benefits, supplies, training, food, travel, equipment, and all other. The information for this table was provided by the Management and Budget Division of the Department of Social and Health Services.

Three tables are used to present information on the activities of the Division of Adult Corrections. The first table presents information on the average daily population for probation, parole, and the institutions. The data are presented by month for both fiscal and calendar year 1977. The second table shows the probation and parole populations by each of the six Department of Social and Health Service regions. Data are presented for this second table for the beginning and end of ccalendar year 1977.

The third table related to the activities of the Division of Adult Corrections portrays the resident population by institutional facility by admitting region for the first and last months of calendar year 1977. The source of the information for all three activity tables was the Planning and Research Division of the Department of Social and Health Services.

BOARD OF PRISON TERMS AND PAROLES

The Board's primary functions may be divided into three general areas:

Fix minimum terms of confinement for all persons sentenced to an adult correctional institution;

Review progress and determine when and under what conditions to parole to the community; and

Retake and discharge from parole as is appropriate.

For the seven person, paid, fulltime Board of Prison Terms and Paroles, 1977 was, "a year of re-examination and evaluation of...goals and direction...The Board has focused on the articulation of criteria for making decisions and development of basic policies as differentiated from day-by-day, case-by-case decision functions...the Board has examined the basic concepts of sentencing and reaffirmed its commitment to the incorporation of visible criteria - in the form of standards and guidelines - in making judgements at all levels of the criminal justice system."

Re-examination was influenced by state adoption of a new criminal code in July of 1976, a gubernatorial mandate to "restore confidence of the public and criminal justice professionals in the State's exercise of incarceration discretion.." and a LEAA-funded research effort directed at the improvement of parole decision making through "development of the best statistical tool for predicition of parole success and failure."

Data and Data Constraints

Manpower, budgets, and activities for the Board of Prison Terms and Parole are presented in a single table. manpower portion of the table reports the number, sex, length of service, and salary levels for specific jobs which are organized within broader job categories. The budget information presents three separate budgets used to fund the Board of Prison Terms and Parole during the fiscal and calendar year 1977. The operations budget shows the cost of operating the formal procedures of the parole board. other two budgets are related to a special LEAA funded research project while the smaller budget funded a special one time research task. The activities reported for the Board of Prison Terms and Paroles include the number of admission meetings, number of reconsideration meetings, number of paroles granted, the number of parole revocation hearings, and the number of paroles terminated by the reason for termination.

Information for this table was provided by the Board of Prison Terms and Paroles, the Office of Fiscal Management, and the Department of Social and Health Services.
