INTRODUCTION

The provisions of IC 33-2.1-7-3 which, among other things, provide that the Division of State Court Administration shall collect and compile statistical data and other information on the judicial work of the courts in the state and shall prepare and publish reports, not less than one nor more than two times per year, on the nature and volume of judicial work performed by the courts.

The first Indiana Judicial Report was published in 1977 and contained information collected during the first year of operation of this office, 1976. Since that initial effort the data gathering system has been reevaluated continuously to better fit our statistical needs.

SCOPE OF REPORT

The 1978 report reflects the filings, dispositions and methods of disposition for cases in all trial courts of record during the calendar year. Information dealing with the actual expenditures by the counties on their trial courts and the revenues generated through the operation of their trial courts is also included in this report. The aforementioned data is collected and

submitted by the trial judges and/or their staff specifically for this report. The caseload information is reported on a quarterly basis while the financial reports are completed at the end of the calendar year. Once received in this office, the data submitted by the trial courts is entered on an IBM System 6 Information Processor.

The caseload reports for the Indiana Supreme Court and the Court of Appeals are prepared by the offices of their respective administrators and are reflected in this report.

In order to aid in the understanding of the statistical information a description of the structure of Indiana's judicial system during 1978 follows.

INDIANA'S JUDICIAL SYSTEM

The Indiana Constitution provides for a Supreme Court, an intermediate Court of Appeals and a Circuit Court. In addition to these courts, the General Assembly has created Superior Courts with general trial jurisdiction and County Courts with limited jurisdiction. Specialized courts and additional tribunals with limited jurisdiction are found in the more populous counties.

SUPREME COURT

The Indiana Supreme Court consists of five justices, one of whom is the Chief Justice of the State (selected by the Indiana Judicial Nominating Commission).¹

The Supreme Court has no original jurisdiction except in (a) admission to the practice of law; (b) discipline and disbarment of those admitted; (c) unauthorized practice of law; (d) discipline, removal, and retirement of judges; and (e) exercise of jurisdiction by other courts.

Its appellate jurisdiction includes appeals from judgments imposing a sentence of death, life imprisonment or imprisonment for

a term greater than 10 years; cases where a state or federal statute has been declared unconstitutional; appeals from denial of release in habeas corpus cases arising out of criminal, extradition or mental health proceedings; and, on petition, cases involving substantial questions of law, great public importance, or emergencies.²

The justices are appointed by the Governor after nomination by a Judicial Nominating Commission. After an initial two-year term, they run on a "Yes--No" retention ballot, and, if successful, they then serve ten-year terms.

COURT OF APPEALS

The Court of Appeals became a constitutional court under a 1970 revision of the Constitution. The Judicial Article provides that the state be divided into geographic districts by the General Assembly, and that each district have three judges.³ Presently, the court has four districts, with a total of twelve judges.⁴ The twelve judges select one of their number as Chief Judge, and each

district elects a presiding judge.⁵ The Court of Appeals has no original jurisdiction except as authorized by Supreme Court rules to review directly final decisions of certain administrative agencies.⁶ It has jurisdiction over all appeals not taken to the Supreme Court.

The judges of the Court of Appeals are selected in the same manner as the Supreme Court Justices.

CIRCUIT COURTS

The Indiana Constitution directs that the state be divided into several circuits by the General Assembly and that a judge be elected for each circuit.⁷ Eighty-four, of a total of ninety-two counties, each constitute a circuit, while the remaining eight counties are in four "joint" circuits with two counties each.

The Circuit Courts are vested with unlimited trial jurisdiction in all cases, except when exclusive or concurrent jurisdiction is conferred upon other courts (i.e., Circuit Courts in Marion and Lake Counties have no criminal jurisdiction.) They also have appellate jurisdiction over appeals from City and Town

Courts⁸ and, in Marion County, from the Small Claims Courts.⁹

The Circuit Courts in twenty-two counties are required to maintain a small claims docket where civil claims of \$1,500 or less and possessory actions between landlord and tenant, where the rent does not exceed \$500 per month, may be filed. A litigant on the small claims docket need not be represented by an attorney because the trials are held in an informal atmosphere.¹⁰ In the remaining counties, the small claims dockets have been established either in the Superior or County Court in the county. The caseload on the former small claims dockets is usually referred to as the "County Court Function" of the Circuit or Superior Court due to the establishment of these dockets under the 1975 County Court Law.

SUPERIOR COURTS

Superior Courts are created by the General Assembly one at a time as local judicial needs change. Though their organization and jurisdiction may vary from county to county, for the most part, they are courts of general jurisdiction. They have the same

appellate jurisdiction as Circuit Courts over appeals from City, Town and Small Claims Courts.

There are eighty-three judges serving the Superior Courts of thirty-five counties.¹¹ Seventeen of these counties have more than one such court or division. Ten of the thirty-five counties have one unified Superior Court with two or more judges. Nine counties have their small claims divisions within the Superior Court (Allen, Cass, DeKalb, Hendricks, Miami, Monroe, St. Joseph, Vanderburgh and Warrick Counties. In Hendricks, Monroe and Vanderburgh Counties civil cases of up to \$3,000 may be filed on the superior court small claims docket.) The same nine counties have a minor offenses docket within their Superior Court for all misdemeanor and infraction cases and cases involving violations of local ordinances and requests for surety of the peace.¹²

PROBATE COURTS (Marion and St. Joseph Counties)

There are only two counties in which specialized Probate

Courts exist, Marion¹³ and St. Joseph.¹⁴ These courts have one judge each and have original jurisdiction in all matters pertaining to the probate of wills, appointment of guardians, assignees, executors, administrators and trustees, settlements of incompetents' estates and adoptions.¹⁵ The Marion Probate Court has concurrent jurisdiction of proceedings in partition, applications for appointment of receivers, actions against corporations by creditors or stockholders and related matters. The St. Joseph Probate Court also has exclusive juvenile jurisdiction.

The jurisdiction of the Marion County Probate Court will be assumed by the Marion County Superior Court on January 1, 1979, when the Probate Court will cease to exist.¹⁶

JUVENILE COURT (Marion County)

The enabling legislation creates a juvenile court in every county with population over 250,000. Presently, only one county, Marion, has a Juvenile Court. The remaining counties within the above category (Lake, St. Joseph and Allen) have unified Superior Courts which handle the juvenile jurisdiction.

The Marion County Juvenile Court has one judge and has original, exclusive jurisdiction in all juvenile matters, and in paternity suits.¹⁷ A reorganized Marion County Superior Court will assume this juvenile jurisdiction on January 1, 1979,¹⁸ and the Juvenile Court will no longer be a separate entity.

CRIMINAL COURTS (Marion County Only)

Marion County is the only county with a separate Criminal Court. The Court has four judges. It has original jurisdiction of all crimes and misdemeanors,¹⁹ though the Marion Municipal Court has concurrent jurisdiction over misdemeanors and handles all of them. The court also has some appellate jurisdiction over appeals of peace bond cases from the Marion County Small Claims Courts and other criminal appeals from the Marion Municipal Courts.

On January 1, 1979, this criminal jurisdiction will be vested in a reorganized Marion Superior Court.

MUNICIPAL COURT (Marion County)

The territorial jurisdiction of the Marion County

Municipal Court extends to the City-County consolidation of Indianapolis-Marion. The court has 15 judges, 14 of whom are trial judges, and 1 a presiding judge. It has concurrent jurisdiction with the Criminal Court in all misdemeanors, infractions, and over local ordinance violations. The court's civil jurisdiction is concurrent with the Superior and Circuit Courts in all civil cases founded on contract or tort which do not exceed \$10,000, and, irrespective of the value of property, in possessory actions between landlord and tenant.²⁰

Appeals in civil cases are taken to the Court of Appeals,²¹ while appeals of criminal cases are taken to the Marion County Criminal Court and are tried on the record.²²

COUNTY COURTS

In 1975, the General Assembly created a new system of County Courts to replace the Justice of the Peace Courts.²³ The County Courts began operating on January 1, 1976, when the Justice of the Peace Courts went out of existence. There are fifty-six County Courts and Judges serving sixty counties, with some counties

sharing a court, and others having more than one.²⁴

The County Court has original and concurrent jurisdiction in all civil cases founded in contract or tort where the damages do not exceed \$3,000, possessory actions between landlord and tenant where the rent does not exceed \$500 per month, all actions for the possession of property where the value of the property sought to be recovered does not exceed \$3,000, misdemeanor and infraction cases, violations of local ordinances and surety of the peace cases.²⁵ The County Court also has a small claims docket like that of the Circuit Court.²⁶

The County Courts have been specifically precluded from exercising any jurisdiction over cases involving injunctive relief, partition of, or liens on, real estate, paternity, juvenile matters, probate, receivership or dissolution of marriage. It may conduct preliminary hearings in felony cases.²⁷

Appeals from the County Court, including its small claims docket, go to the Court of Appeals in the same manner as appeals from the Circuit or Superior Court.

CITY COURTS

City courts were to go out of existence on December 31, 1979. A 1978 legislative amendment²⁸, however, has provided that city courts may be continued until December 31, 1983, if the city, before January 1, 1979, adopts an ordinance providing for such continuation for four more years. The exception to these provisions is that city courts in second-class cities, in counties with population in excess of 500,000 (Lake County) are not abolished. There are approximately ninety city courts operating in Indiana with varied jurisdiction depending on the city's classification.

As of October 1, 1977, the city courts in cities of the second, third, fourth and fifth-class (Indianapolis is the only first-class city and has no city court) have jurisdiction in all misdemeanor and infraction cases.²⁹ The courts also have

jurisdiction over violations of city ordinances.³⁰

In second, third and fourth-class cities city courts have jurisdiction of civil claims of up to \$500.³¹ In counties having three or more second-class cities (Lake County), the city courts in such cities have civil jurisdiction of claims up to \$2,500 and criminal jurisdiction of all state law violations, but they may only assess a penalty of a fine up to \$1,000 and/or imprisonment for one year.³²

Some city courts have civil jurisdiction of claims up to, but not exceeding, \$1,000.³³

Appeals from city courts (except those in Lake County) are taken to the Circuit or Superior Court and tried de novo.³⁴ Appeals from the city courts in second-class cities in Lake County are also

taken to the Circuit or Superior Courts but are tried on assignment of error as in the Court of Appeals.³⁵

TOWN COURTS

As in the case of the city courts, town courts were to go out of existence on December 31, 1979, and could not be created after such date. A 1978 legislative amendment³⁶ has provided that such town courts may be continued until December 31, 1983, if the town, before January 1, 1979, adopts an ordinance providing for such continuation for four years. Town courts can be established by an ordinance of the town board of trustees (except in counties of over 200,000, and in counties where minor courts have already been abolished).³⁷ There are about nineteen town courts operating in Indiana. The town courts have jurisdiction coextensive with the county over town ordinance violations and state law violations for which the penalty cannot exceed a fine of \$500 and/or six months imprisonment.³⁸ Appeals from town courts are taken to the circuit

or superior court and tried de novo.³⁹

SMALL CLAIMS COURTS (Marion County)

The Marion County Small Claims Court came into existence on January 1, 1976, and replaced the Justice of the Peace Courts in that county. The court has eight divisions based on township lines whose territorial jurisdiction extends throughout the county. The court's trial jurisdiction is concurrent with the Circuit, Superior and Municipal Courts in all civil cases founded on contract or tort in which the claim does not exceed \$1,500,⁴⁰ in actions for possession of property where the value of the property sought to be recovered does not exceed \$1,500, in possessory actions between landlord and tenant in which the past due rent at the time of filing does not exceed \$1,500,⁴¹ and cases requesting surety of the peace.⁴² The Small Claims Court has no jurisdiction in actions seeking injunctive relief or involving partition of real estate, or to declare or enforce any lien thereon (with certain exceptions), or in cases in which the appointment of a receiver is asked, or in

suits for dissolution or annulment of marriage.⁴³ The Small Claims Court is not a court of record,⁴⁴ and the appeals are tried de novo in the Circuit or Superior Courts⁴⁵ (or in the Criminal Court if it is an appeal on a surety of the peace proceeding).⁴⁶



CASELOAD OF TRIAL COURTS

The trial court caseload data reflected herein was reported by the trial courts on a standard form (Quarterly Case Status Report) on a quarterly basis. These reports contain information on the cases filed (including those that come on a change of venue), disposed and pending at the end of the reporting period. This information is categorized by type of case, such as criminal, civil, dissolution, etc. The reports also show the method of disposition for the type of cases. Other matters, such as number of days with Judges Pro Tempore, number of trials disposed by Special Judges, number of cases heard or disposed by Masters, the use of Court Commissioner or Referee, and the number of days the Judge served in another County are also reported but are not reflected in this report. The information submitted on a quarterly basis has been combined and is presented here as yearly totals.

The reports are divided into two sets, Caseload of the Circuit and Superior Courts (including the Marion County Municipal, Juvenile, Probate and Criminal Courts, and the St. Joseph Probate Court) and Caseload of the County Courts. The latter set includes the cases filed in the small claims and misdemeanor dockets of the

Circuit and Superior Courts, where such dockets exist. This caseload is referred to as "County Court Function" of the Circuit and Superior Courts.

As used in this report, the following definitions apply:

Criminal: This includes both misdemeanors and felony cases. Where multi-defendants are jointly charged and tried, only one criminal case is noted.

Re-Docketed Criminal: This includes those criminal matters which are re-opened after an initial judgment is entered. An example of this type of case would be a proceeding under Post Conviction Remedy Rule 1.

Juvenile: This includes all juvenile matters where formal proceedings are initiated and such proceedings concern a minor.

Civil: This includes all civil cases other than dissolution, probate, adoption, or guardianship cases. In the County Courts and the "County Court Function" of the Circuit and Superior Courts,

small claims are reported separately.

Re-Docketed Civil: Those civil matters which for some reason are again brought before the court following the entry of the initial judgment.

Dissolution: Cases where the parties seek to dissolve a marriage.

Re-Docketed Dissolution: Dissolution cases where the cause is brought before the court after the initial judgment. This would include petitions to modify and contempt citations.

Probate-Adoption: Those proceedings involving the distribution of estates or adoption of children. This would not include claims against an estate which are litigated; such matters are shown as "civil" cases. Non-Felony Traffic:

Cases where a traffic citation was issued.

Guardianship: This involves such matters as where a guardianship is opened under existing

law of the state.

Others: This category is intended to include matters where an adjudication is made, but the full formalities of a trial are not involved. This would include probable cause determinations and commitment proceedings.

FISCAL REPORT

Along with the caseload information, the trial courts were asked to submit fiscal information. The requested data included the court's 1979 requested and approved budget, the actual expenditures for 1978, and the revenues collected through the operation of the court.

Following is a summary of the 1978 expenditures of the trial courts and revenues generated through their operation.

EXPENDITURES

The Indiana trial courts and related offices are supported primarily by county funds. State funds are used for a portion of the judges'¹ and prosecutors'² salaries and reimbursements to the county for special judge costs.³ Occasionally, the trial courts use revenue-sharing funds and federal grant moneys, but such sums are usually insignificant in comparison with county expenditures.

Within twenty days following the end of a calendar year, each

trial court is requested to submit a report on the actual expenditures of the court. The reporting form follows accounting reports filed with the State Board of Accounts and deals with five major areas: Personal Services, Contractual Services, Supplies, Current Charges and Properties. Each of these areas contains more information on specific items.

In some of the more populous counties, separate budgets may be maintained for probation, juvenile services or public defense. When available, these expenditures have been included in the final totals.

Expenditures which have not been included in this report are those that are not budgeted for within the court's budget. Thus, expenses for the prosecutor and clerk of the county (which offices submit and operate their own budgets) are not included in this report. The acquisition and operation of physical facilities for juveniles (juvenile detention centers), when distinguishable from temporary juvenile care, have also been excluded since such expenditures fall more appropriately under corrections-related expenditures rather than judicial functions.

REVENUES

The typical sources of revenues in the trial court are filing fees and fines. The fines and forfeitures are designated for a special state fund, the Common School Fund.⁴ Following is a list of the fees collected in the more typical cases.

1. The docket fee in civil cases in Circuit, Superior, and Probate Courts, and on the plenary docket of the County Court, is \$19. Seven dollars of that sum go to the state as state docket fee, and the remainder goes to the county as court costs.⁵

The docket fee for civil cases in the small claims dockets of the Circuit, Superior, and County Courts is \$10.00, and goes to the county.⁶

In Marion County Municipal Court, the docket fee for civil cases is \$15.00, and it goes to the county.⁷

2. In criminal cases filed in the Circuit, Superior, Probate, Criminal or Juvenile Courts, a \$10.00 fee is charged upon

conviction, which fee goes to the County General Fund.⁸ In Marion County Municipal Court, that fee is \$15.00, and goes to the City General Fund.⁹ In cases on the criminal dockets of the County Courts, or on the misdemeanor dockets of the Superior or Circuit Courts, there is a \$5.00 county docket fee and a \$5.00 state docket fee.¹⁰

3. A prosecutor's fee of \$18.00 is charged in all criminal cases. Four dollars of this fee go to the county, and the remainder goes to the state (where it is earmarked for special funds). In cases involving Class A misdemeanors or felonies, the prosecutor's fee is \$28.50. It is distributed as the fee of \$18.00 with the additional \$10.50 going to crime compensation funds (\$10.00 for the violent crime fund and \$.50 for rape victim services).¹¹ When the prosecutor is required to appear in non-criminal cases, \$20.00 is collected and deposited with the State General Fund as "state

counsel fees".¹²

4. In addition to the above fees, in any case in the Circuit, Superior, Probate, Juvenile, Municipal and Criminal Court, and on the plenary docket of the County Court, a judicial fee of \$9.00 is charged and paid to the state.¹³ (Of this fee, \$1.30 is deposited in a special retirement fund.) The judicial fee in cases on the criminal docket of the County Court, or the misdemeanor dockets of the Circuit and Superior Courts is \$1.00.¹⁴

This report reflects the fees listed above, service of process fees and jury fees.

The report also includes the revenues collected through the \$3.00 fee charged in all traffic cases for the Bureau of Motor Vehicles¹⁵, and the \$10.00 fee charged for enforcement of support orders.¹⁶ It does not reflect the sums paid into the County General

Fund by other counties for cases coming to the court on a change of venue. In counties which are adjacent to the more populous counties and thus receive many cases on change of venue, this amount could be considerable.

There are many other fees collected during the course of a proceeding. Such fees are not enumerated above but should be reflected in the "other" category of the report.


