



This volume addresses primarily the 1976 civil addict population, movement, and characteristics compared with the 1975 data and selected long-term trend statistics.

Movement statistics include all movements within a given calendar year. Population characteristics statistics are based on December 31 of the designated year.

CALIFORNIA REHABILITATION CENTER PROGRAM 1976

SUMMARY

INSTITUTION POPULATION AND MOVEMENT

The California Rehabilitation Center institution population numbered 2,445 on December 31, 1976. The ratio of institution population to 100,000 State population on that date was 11.4, the largest ratio since 1970. The population rose from 2,138 on December 31, 1975, to 2,445 at the close of 1976, an increase of 14.4 percent. The December 31, 1976 population was comprised of 2,034 men and 411 women.

CIVIL NARCOTIC ADDICTS ADMITTED TO CALIFORNIA REHABILITATION CENTER

In 1976, the California Rehabilitation Center received 1,716 men and 401 women civil narcotic addicts newly admitted from court. Of the men, 94.9 percent were charged with a felony, 5.0 percent with a misdemeanor, and 0.1 percent had no criminal charge. Women addicts newly admitted from court were charged: 84.3 percent with felony, and 15.7 percent with misdemeanor charges. The percentage of male civil narcotic addicts newly admitted with felony charges has been increasing annually since 1967.

CHARACTERISTICS OF RESIDENTS IN CALIFORNIA REHABILITATION CENTER INSTITUTION PROGRAM

Of the 2,034 men and the 411 women addicts in the institution population on December 31, 1976, felony charges were pending against 95.3 percent of the men residents and against 83.9 percent of the women residents. These percentages are very similar to those of men and women civil narcotic addicts newly admitted from court in 1976.

Of the civil addicts in the institution program with criminal charges pending, 41.1 percent of the men and 46.9 percent of the women had been convicted of controlled substance or marijuana offenses.

CIVIL NARCOTIC ADDICTS RELEASED FROM THE INSTITUTION

Men released from the institution program in 1976 totaled 3,932, of which 3,485 men were placed in outpatient status, 431 were discharged as unfit for the program, 14 were discharged by expiration of commitment, and two men died. Men released for the first time and going to outpatient status comprised 34.0 percent of all males released. These men were in the institution program a median of seven months before release.

Women released from institutional care numbered 725, of which 578 were released to outpatient status and 47 were discharged as unfit for the

program. Women released to outpatient status for the first time constituted 39.3 percent of all women released. These women had been in residence a median seven months.

OUTPATIENT POPULATION

The civil narcotic addict outpatient population totaled 4,939 persons on December 31, 1976, consisting of 4,135 men and 804 women. These figures were less than similar populations at the beginning of the year, as popula-

tion decreased by 362 patients, 337 men and 25 women.

Persons entering outpatient status in 1976 numbered 8,578 with 4,163 coming directly from the institution, 4,414 being reinstated after having been suspended from active outpatient status, and one case reactivated. During 1976, 8,940 addicts were removed from outpatient status, 7,865 being suspended, 783 successfully completing the program, 202 being discharged by court order, and 90 died.


Felony charges were pending against 93.9 percent of the men and 83.3 percent of the women in outpatient status on December 31, 1976.

The population in the California Rehabilitation Center institution program increased 14.4 percent during the year 1976. On December 31, 1976, the 2.445 civil addicts in this program included 2.034 men and 411 women. The total institution population formed a ratio of 11.4 persons per 100,000 State population, and was the highest ratio at the close of any year since

The California Rehabilitation Center institution program received 4,556 men during 1976, and released 4.385. The majority (2.435) of men received were outpatients returned but 1.716 men were newly committed from court. Of the 4.385 men released from the institution program, 3,485, or 79.5 percent, were placed under outpatient supervision. Men discharged by court order numbered 431, and men released due to expiration of commitment totaled 14.

The California Rehabilitation Center institution program received 1,026 women during 1976, with 401 women newly committed from court and 467 women outpatients returned. Women released from the institution numbered 890, an increase of 16.8 percent over 1975, with 678 women being placed on outpatient status and 47 discharged by order of the court.

During 1976, male outpatients returned to the institution without a new narcotic commitment numbered 2,229 (91.5 percent) of the male outpatients returned. Women outpatients returned without a new narcotic commitment number 442 (94.6 percent) of the women outpatients returned to the institution.

CIVIL NARCOTIC ADDICTS ADMITTED TO CALIFORNIA REHABILITATION CENTER

In 1976. the California Rehabilitation Center received 1,716 male civil narcotic addicts newly admitted from court. Of these, 94.9 percent had felony charges, 5.0 percent had misdemeanor charges, and 0.1 percent had no criminal charge. Women civil narcotic addicts newly admitted from court numbered 401, with 84.3 percent having felony charges, and 15.7 percent misdemeanor charges. The percentage of male civil addicts newly admitted from court with felony charges pending has been increasing annually since 1967. The admission rates per 100,000 State population in 1976 were 7.98 for male addicts and 1.86 for women addicts.

Of the 1.714 men who were admitted to the institution program in 1976, after conviction of a criminal offense, 35.2 percent had been charged with a controlled substance or marijuana offense. Other offenses with which male addicts had been charged include burglary, 32.3 percent; theft except auto, 12.0 percent; and robbery, 8.7 percent.

The offense charge distribution for the 401 women civil addicts admitted was 36.9 percent for controlled substances and marijuana, 20.0 percent for forgery and checks, 17.0 percent for theft except auto, and 11.3 percent for burglary.

Based on county population, the commitment rates by county for the five counties with the highest commitment rate in 1976 were: first, Placer, 47.02; second, Imperial, 31.40; third, Colusa, 31.25; fourth, Monterey, 30.57; and fifth, Kings, 25.53.

The ethnic distribution for male civil addicts admitted in 1976 was similar to that occurring in 1975: white, 44.3 percent; Mexican-American, 30.2 percent; black, 24.5 percent; and all others, 1.0 percent. The ethnic distribution for women civil narcotic addicts received in 1976 was: white, 55.6 percent; Mexican-American, 22.4 percent; black, 20.0 percent; and all others, 2.0 percent.

The median age at admission in 1976 was 26.1 years for male addicts. Also, 7.2 percent of the male addicts were under 21 years of age and 42.7 percent were under 25 years of age. The women had a median age of 24.6 years, with 12.7 percent being under 21 years of age, and 53.9 percent under 25 years of age.

Based on tests administered by the Center, the level of educational achievement for male addicts admitted during 1976 was a 7.8 grade median. The level of educational achievement for women addicts admitted during 1976 was a median grade of 7.5.

In 1976, 10.3 percent of the man and 8.2 percent of the women admitted had spent less than ten years in the State before commitment on the current charge.

The median age at first known arrest, including the present arrest, was 17.2 years for men and 18.5 years for women received in 1976.

Prior criminal commitments had been served by 84.0 percent of the men and 66.1 percent of the women admitted in 1976. Prior prison commitments had been served by 14.7 percent of the men and 2.7 percent of the women admitted.



WOMEN CIVIL NARCOTIC ADDICTS ADMITTED TO



CHARACTERISTICS OF RESIDENTS IN CALIFORNIA REHABILITATION CENTER INSTITUTION PROGRAM

On December 31, 1976, 95.3 percent of the men residents had felony charges pending, while 83.9 percent of the women residents had felony charges pending. Of the men with criminal charges pending, 41.1 percent had controlled substances or marijuana charges and of the women with criminal charges, 46.9 percent had controlled substances or marijuana charges pending.

Southern California counties had committed 56.1 percent of the men in the institution program in 1976, including Los Angeles County which had sent 27.8 percent of the men. Los Angeles County contributed 24.3 percent of the women in the institution and was part of the ten Southern California counties which had sent 57.4 percent of the women in the institution as of December 31, 1976.

The ethnic composition of men in the institution program on December 31, 1976 was: 40.3 percent white, 32.5 percent Mexican-American, and 26.3 percent black. The ethnic groups for women were: 52.8 percent white, 23.1 percent Mexican-American, and 21.7 percent black.

The median age for men in the institution program was 27.5 years, with 2.9 percent under 21 years and 30.3 percent under 25 years. The median age for women in the program was 26.0 years, with 7.0 percent under 21 years, and 42.1 percent under 25 years.

Prior criminal commitments had been served by 88.2 percent of the men in the institution program in 1976 and by 69.8 percent of the women in the program in 1976.

On December 31, 1976, 53.0 percent of the men in the institution program had not been released to outpatient supervision since commitment, while 62.5 percent of the women were in the same category.







PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF CIVIL NARCOTIC ADDICTS AT CALIFORNIA REHABILITATION CENTER



CALIFORNIA NARCOTIC ADDICTS RELEASED FROM THE INSTITUTION

In 1976, the men released from institutional care totaled 3,932, with 3,485 of these men going to outpatient supervision, 431 discharged as unfit for the program, 14 discharged at expiration of commitment, and 2 died. Men released for the first time accounted for 39.1 percent of all released.

Women leaving institutional care in 1976 numbered 725, with 678 released to outpatient status and 47 discharged as unfit for the program. Women departing for the first time accounted for 41.4 percent of those released.

The median time spent in residence for men before first release to outpatient status in 1976 was seven months. Men returned from outpatient status with a new civil narcotic commitment were in the institution a median of eight months before again being placed in outpatient status in 1976. Those who had been returned to the institution program without a new civil commitment had been in the institution a median of four months before being returned to outpatient status in 1976.

Women first released to outpatient status had spent a median seven months in residence. Women re-released to outpatient status had spent seven months in residence if returned to the institution with a new civil commitment, but a median of only four months if returned without a new

civil commitment.







WOMEN CIVIL NARCOTIC ADDICTS





OUTPATIENT POPULATION

The civil narcotic outpatient population was 4,939 persons on December 31, 1976, a decrease of 362 from the prior December. This decrease occurred in both the men and the women populations. On December 31, 1976, the men under outpatient supervision numbered 4,135, which was 337 less than the prior year, while the vomen numbered 804, a decrease of 25 women from the close of 1975.

Civil addicts placed under outpatient supervision during 1976 totaled 8,578 persons, of which 4,163 came directly from the institution and 4,414 were reinstated after having been suspended from active outpatient status and one case was reactivated. During the same year, 8,940 persons were removed from outpatient status. Of those leaving outpatient status, 7,865 were suspended, 783 successfully completed the program, 202 were discharged by court order, and 90 died.

On December 31, 1976, 4,135 men and 804 women were under active outpatient supervision. Felony charges were pending against 93.9 percent of this male population and 83.3 percent of the women.

Of the 3,883 male addict outpatients with felony charges pending on December 31, 1976, almost one-half (48.2 percent) were convicted for controlled substance or marijuana offenses and 42.6 percent for crimes against property. Of the 670 women outpatients with felony charges, 53.7 percent were convicted of controlled substance or marijuana offenses and 42.9 percent for crimes against property.

....

Almost all of the outpatients were under supervision in California on December 31, 1976. Less than 3 percent were out-of-state or in custody. Of the 4,135 men outpatients under supervision, 54.3 percent were in Southern California counties and 42.9 percent in the northern area of the State. The 804 women outpatients were located with 60.7 percent in Southern California counties and 37.3 percent in the northern counties. The ethnic classification of men outpatients at the end of 1976 was 47.3 percent white, 29.7 percent Mexican-American, and 22.1 percent black. The women were ethnically grouped 54.5 percent white, 20.0 percent Mexican-American, and 23.8 percent black.

Less than 50 percent (48.2) male addicts under supervision on December 31, 1976 were experiencing outpatient supervision for the first time. At the close of 1975, this percent had been 52.1. The percentage of women experiencing first time as outpatients also changed from 56.1 percent at the end of 1975 to 53.9 percent at the close of 1976.

The percentage of outpatients who had been under supervision less than one year on December 31, 1976 was 52.8 percent of the men under supervision and 50.1 percent of the women. In both groups the percentage had increased from that of the close of 1975 when these groups were 46.8 percent and 46.9 percent respectively.

During the year 1976, 3,185 men and 611 women were suspended from

outpatient status for the first time. The median time under supervision before first suspension was three months for both the men and the women.

Of the 3,484 men in outpatient supervision in California during 1976, 54.0 percent were suspended during the year of release. This is the highest percentage of men suspended during year of release since 1967. Of the 678 women released to outpatient supervision in California during 1976, only 44.1 percent were suspended during that year. This is the lowest percentage suspended during year of release since 1971.

Not all outpatients suspended are returned to the institution. Many are reinstated to active outpatient supervision. During 1976, 4,414 persons

were reinstated. These included 3,660 men and 754 women.


Outpatients returned to the California Rehabilitation Center during 1976, the year of their release from the institution to outpatient supervision, were 25.1 percent of the men released and 26.2 percent of the women. These percentages were the highest in seven years for the men and in nine years for the women.

The disposition of civil narcotic addict outpatients by year of release from the institution program to outpatient status is studied for a period of six years, including the initial year of release. California statutes require that persons under certain types of commitment not be discharged from outpatient status until a specific period of time with good behavior has lapsed. The final disposition of persons placed in outpatient supervision is more accurately reflected in the data of earlier release cohorts. Approximately one-third (33.8 percent) of the women and 20.7 percent of the men who were released to outpatient status during 1971 successfully completed the program as of December 31, 1976. A sufficient period of time has not elapsed to determine the percentage of persons who may successfully complete the outpatient supervision program during 1973 and hereafter.



COMMUNITY CORRECTIONAL CENTERS

Community correctional centers provide assistance and short-term housing for civil narcotic addict outpatients. The purpose of the centers is to help the person make the adjustment from a controlled institution environment to the free society situation. Outpatients received in the centers may have been committed directly from the institution, from independent residence, from some limited custody situation, or for assistance in medical needs.

Residents are expected to pay a portion of their room and board, obtain employment or attend school, and generally adjust to living within the community.

Four community correctional centers operated by the Department of Corrections during 1976 housed civil narcotic addicts. These were Central City Community Correctional Center, opened November 2, 1976; Rupert Crittenden Center in Oakland; Sacramento Valley Community Correctional Center in Sacramento, and Vinewood Community Correctional Center in Los Angeles, closed January 23, 1976.

Statistical information regarding the movement of civil narcotic addicts in the community correctional centers are shown in Appendices VI A and VI B.
