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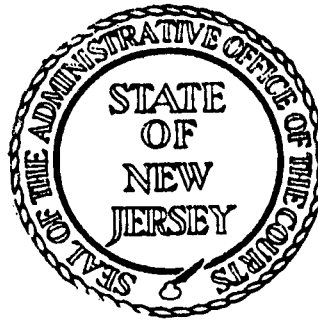

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The design of the Adult Probation Management Information System has benefited from the input of many individuals over a number of years. It is impossible to name them all, but the following merit particular attention for their contributions.

The System was pre-tested in the Passaic County Probation Department. The leadership and line staff of that Department contributed to the design of the System by allowing it to be tested within their department. This venturing in faith is greatly appreciated.

Once the pre-test was complete, together with the analysis thereof, it was time to put the system into operation. Many bugs and operational mysteries remained to be worked out. John J. Enright, Chief Probation Officer in Morris County, made two Senior Probation Officers available to assist in this process. These two officers, Bruce Fornelius and James Villere, enthusiastically entered into the task and brought very fresh, creative, caring and energetic minds to bear on the design and much of the quality of this System bears their mark.

WHAT IS THE ADULT PROBATION MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEM?

Introduction

The Adult Probation Management Information System (APMIS) is an offender-based information system designed to assist supervising probation officers in the supervision of their cases and to assist county and state probation administrators in the administration of probation.

The APMIS assists the probation officer first by providing a format for comprehensively, objectively and uniformly describing every probationer. This comprehensive record of the case profile informs periodic case reviews with supervisor(s), assists in identifying which cases require maximum, medium or minimum supervision (i.e., classification), and provides a new supervising officer with comprehensive information when a case is transferred intra- or extra-departmentally.

Secondly, the APMIS supplies probation officers and their supervisors with information that assists the management of caseloads. For example, there is a flagging mechanism which periodically identifies (1) persons with outstanding bench warrants and (2) persons who are expected to terminate in a given month. In addition, other management information reports identify areas in which specialized training of officers may be needed due to probationer service requirements (thereby promoting equipping the officer with needed skills to do the job well), reveal inequities in workload among officers (thereby promoting equitable distribution of workload), and identify department-wide as well as caseload profiles (thereby giving the officer a comparative framework for cross-referencing activities, needs, etc.).

The System assists county and state probation administrators by generating information required for effective management in the following areas: (1) Operations, (2) Managerial decision making, (3) Research and planning, and (4) Evaluation. The APMIS enables these administrators to base their formation of policy and day-to-day operations on known facts about their clients. Further, it assists them in efficiently and accurately complying with requests for information and accountability made by public, private and governmental agencies.

The APMIS also assists administrators in the development of a case management approach and is a major component of a comprehensive case management system. In some cases these data gathering instruments form the foundation for caseload review with supervisors.

The System

The APMIS consists of three basic steps. First, there is a series of data gathering instruments that generate files that are computerized for efficient and complex data analysis. The instruments are completed by probation officers and reviewed by their supervisors, after which the forms are submitted to the Probation Administrative Management System of the Administrative Office of the Courts.

The second step is the integration of the data supplied by the county probation department into the data base for that county, including data analysis.

The final step is the generation of reports that are returned to county and state probation administrators.

The APMIS is a dynamic system and will always be in process. It will require changes over time as probation is a changing system. One particular change that will develop over time is the refinement of the system. In its youth it is quite fat. As it matures, it will be trimmed down into a much tighter system.

Management Information Reports

The potential for reports is almost limitless and we will not try to outline all of those possibilities here. But it is helpful to identify the kinds of reports that will be generated. First, regular, periodic reports--some monthly, some bi-monthly and others quarterly--will be issued. They will promote the analysis of changes during the year. These reports will ultimately replace some of the reporting currently done by the Monthly Statistical Summary Report System.

The second kind of reports that will be generated are annual reports. Both the county probation departments and the Administrative Office of the Courts issue annual reports, and this system will generate more than enough information in a timely fashion so that those reports can be more extensive and report information of a greater depth and breadth never before possible.

Finally, special reports can be produced from time to time on issues of particular interest to probation administrators, legislators or any other persons with information needs. The system allows prompt analysis of numerous research issues and we expect many such reports will be requested as the system matures.

GENERAL OPERATIONAL PROCEDURES

Introduction

This chapter identifies the tasks and responsibilities of the supervisors who administer the APMIS in the various counties as well as illustrates in a schematic fashion the overall flow of documents. Since it is helpful to have the overall framework in mind from the outset, we will begin with the latter.

Schematic Overview of the APMIS

We are taking as an example an actual case, although the specifics have been changed in order to prevent identification of the probationer. In this case, the probationer was sentenced five different times in four different courts by three different judges. Each disposition was a separate, new probation term. We will see how the APMIS is set up to handle this and similar cases.

Basic operation. When a person first begins a probation term, a Profile Report, the APMIS I, should be completed. When that first term ends, whether or not there are consecutive terms that continue the person under probation supervision, a Termination Report, the APMIS III, should be completed. However, not everyone has a single probation term that begins and ends with no intervening terms. When there is a minimum of one term whose running time extends beyond the termination date of the first term, a new record of the probationer must be established when the first Termination Report is completed. Therefore, when the first Termination Report is completed, a second Profile Report should be completed that pertains to the remaining term whose length of time is longest beyond the termination date of the first term.

¹The defendant was placed on probation in Superior Court (then County Court) by Judge #1. The APMIS I, the Profile Report, should have been completed shortly after the term began. This establishes an APMIS record for this person. The APMIS identification number is assigned at this time and will continue throughout the time the person remains on probation, regardless of the number of intervening terms. However, if there is a period of time between two separate terms during which the person is not on probation, a new APMIS identification number will be assigned at the outset of the new term.

²Shortly after this date the Termination Report, APMIS III, would be completed. If the Worksheet had been used, the data included thereon between 1/1/75 and 1/1/78 would be reported on this Termination Report. On or about 1/2/78, you would review all other dispositions in effect as of that date and determine which one extended the length of time the person was to continue on probation extended that time the longest. Then a new APMIS I, using the same identification number, would be completed on or about 1/2/78 with the data pertaining to the third subsequent offense (6/1/75) and the probationer's status as of the day the APMIS I is completed.

³This represents the first new conviction after the beginning of the probation term. In this case, Municipal Court Judge #1 was sitting in Municipal Court #1 and placed the defendant on probation for 18 months. Therefore, a Report of the First Subsequent Conviction should be completed.

⁴Although a probation term is ending at this point in time, no Termination Report is to be completed here.

⁵The third probation disposition was ordered by Municipal Court Judge #2 sitting in Municipal Court #2. At this point in time a Report of Second Subsequent Conviction should be completed since this conviction occurred during the running time of the first probation term. However, since it is consecutive by a total of four months to the first term, this case should be flagged so that when the termination date arrives, officers will know to generate a new record of the person's presence as a probationer, as outlined above in the comments for footnote #2.

⁶Since there is a probation term that extends beyond this termination date, this date may be overlooked entirely. No Termination Report is completed here.

⁷The fourth probation disposition was ordered by the same judge sitting in the same court as was the third. As you can see, this new disposition on a separate charge was handed down only some two weeks later and has the effect of extending the prior disposition an additional two weeks. Anyway, at this point in time, namely, on or about 6/1/75, a Report of Third Subsequent Conviction should be completed. Then, on or about 1/2/78, as the prior term has run out and this term sustains the person on probation, the APMIS I should be completed. This will generate the new record that will follow the probationer until 6/1/78, the last known termination date of all continuously running probation terms.

⁸It is at this point in time that the second and last Termination Report is to be completed. It covers only the time between 1/2/78 when the first term ended and 6/1/78, the date of the term whose running time was longest when the first term ended.

⁹This sentence was ordered by Municipal Court Judge #1 sitting in Municipal Court #3. On or about 4/18/79, a Report of Fourth Subsequent Conviction should be completed.

¹⁰Although this is properly the end of a probation term, no Termination Report is to be completed since it is contained within another probation term.

With that we conclude our review of the general structure of the APMIS and proceed with instructions for the supervisors who maintain the APMIS in county probation departments.

Instructions for Supervisors

County-level supervisors have a critical role in the management of the APMIS. They coordinate and guide all activities within the county probation department. Further, they are the link between the department and the Administrative Office of the Courts. Therefore, supervisors should pay very close attention to the tasks outlined below.

1. Assigning identification numbers--The actual mechanics for the assignment of APMIS identification numbers is up to the supervisor(s). Nevertheless, however it is done, here is what must be done. The supervisor(s) must assign numbers to every new supervision case. This assignment of numbers should be handled by a single person so that duplicate numbers do not appear.

The first pair of digits refers to the code number for your county. Therefore, these two digits will always be the same. Consult the County/State Codes to identify the correct two-digit code for your county.

The second two digits of the APMIS identification number pertain to the calendar year in which the person begins the probation term. If the person were sentenced on 9/1/79 and began the probation term on that very day, then you would make "79" the third and fourth digits of the APMIS identification number. However, if the person were sentenced on 9/1/79 but due to the time being spent in custody due to its being a split sentence the term doesn't actually begin until 1/1/80, then this portion of the APMIS identification number would be "80".

The last four digits should be assigned as follows. We suggest that as soon as you receive a name to be added to your department's supervision workload, you write the person's name in the Data Flow Log Book (to be discussed next) and assign this person the next available number indicated in the Log Book. The only concern is to avoid duplicate numbers.

Let's look at an example. Let's say your county is Atlantic County. You learn from the County/State Codes that your county is "01". The person began the probation term during calendar year 1975, so the second pair of digits is "75". Finally, the next available number in the Data Flow Log Book is 0123. Therefore, this probationer's complete APMIS identification number is 01750123.

The APMIS identification number should be given to the probation officer to whom supervision will be assigned. Therefore, when the officer is advised of this new case, a part of that notification will be the APMIS identification number.

2. Maintaining the Data Flow Log Book--A Data Flow Log Book has been designed to assist both county-level supervisors and AOC staff in monitoring the flow of literally hundreds of documents. It has been constructed in such a way as to enable all to know what reports have been filed. A reduction of the Log Book, which normally is printed on 8½ x 14" paper, is provided on page B-5.

The first column pertains to the identification number for the probationer. The second column records the date on which this client's term of probation began. The probationer's name should be entered in the third column, either by printing or by typing. The fourth column is where the date on which the APMIS I is received from staff will be recorded.

Next there are some 12 columns that pertain to monitoring all updating activities. The next-to-last column records the date that the probationer actually terminated, and the last column is for the date that the Termination Report is received.

The only APMIS report not included on this Log Book is APMIS II-A. That report is submitted on a regular, monthly basis. A separate sheet has been prepared for monitoring submission of APMIS II-A Reports, and may be consulted on page B-6.

3. Handling transfer cases--Counties who participate in the APMIS agree to share all APMIS-related documentation. Therefore if a probationer transfers from one county to another New Jersey county using the APMIS, then we expect that work will not be duplicated. Rather, the new county will return to the original county all APMIS statistics pertinent to supervision during the time the probationer is under their courtesy supervision as well as fulfil their own APMIS needs.

Incoming transfer cases from other states will be handled as totally new cases. That means that an identification number will be assigned as per the above instructions. The APMIS I will be completed by the probation officer to whom the case is assigned. All pertinent update reports will be completed when appropriate, and when the probationer either terminates or moves out of your jurisdiction and you end your interest in the case, the Termination Report is to be completed.

Incoming transfer cases from other New Jersey counties will be handled as follows. Upon receipt for courtesy supervision follow the procedures already outlined for assigning an APMIS identification number. The AOC staff will already have the APMIS I in the system if the probationer is coming from a county in which the APMIS is operational. If that is the case, then no new APMIS I needs to be generated. The AOC will have been advised by the sending county that the case has been transferred to the new county and the AOC staff will automatically transfer the data to the new county. However, if the sending county is not a participant in the APMIS, then the probation officer who will be supervising the case must complete the APMIS I. Regardless of whether the probationer is from a county that uses the APMIS, the new probation officer must complete all pertinent update reports as long as the probationer remains under her or his supervision. Finally, when the person terminates, the Termination Report must be completed by the officer in your county. This Termination Report is for your county's statistics only and should include only services provided while under courtesy supervision by you. The sending county will also complete a Termination Report that will include BOTH service statistics while under their supervision and while under the supervision of all other jurisdictions. The Termination Report completed by the county providing ~~courtesy~~ supervision should be completed in duplicate. One copy will be sent to the AOC and the other to the sending county so they will have your data to incorporate in their report.

4. Training new staff in APMIS procedures--Any time a new probation officer begins to work in an area in which the APMIS is being used, the supervisor is responsible for training that new officer in all APMIS procedures and operations.

5. Maintaining replacement Handbooks--A supervisor should keep on hand a few extra Handbooks for new, incoming probation officers. As supplementary or replacement pages are issued by the AOC, those copies of the Handbook should be kept up to date so that they will be complete when the new person is trained.

6. Monitoring availability of all APMIS forms/documents--A supervisor should keep tabs on the stock of supplies for all APMIS purposes. When the supply of a particular report is nearing exhaustion, the supervisor should request additional copies from the AOC.

7. Answering APMIS questions raised by probation officers--The supervisor is to be an expert in the design and intent of the APMIS. All questions generated in the field are to be answered by a supervisor. When the supervisor does not know the answer, then the supervisor should consult with AOC staff. As critical comments or suggestions surface that should bear on future revisions of either the Handbook or any data gathering instrument, the supervisor should make a careful note and at least monthly submit such comments to the AOC with comments and recommendations.

8. Reviewing data gathering instruments--Every single data gathering instrument should be reviewed by a supervisor before it is passed on to the AOC. This basically entails a quick once-over to determine if there is substantial missing data, to be sure all sections are completed, and to check with the probation officer if such omissions need to be corrected. This does not entail an exhaustive review of each data element. Rather, it is a brief check.

9. Managing the flow of completed reports--By use of the Data Flow Log Book, review of reports, etc., the supervisor is responsible for submitting completed reports to the AOC and, upon receipt of those reports back from the AOC, returning the reports to the appropriate probation officer.

Surely other tasks and responsibilities will emerge as the system matures, but for now, that should cover the territory.

GENERAL CODING INSTRUCTIONS

Introduction

The format of the data gathering instruments is uniform. Each section within a report has a heading and each item has a unique number, its own name, and spaces at the right of the item for entering data. Each separate component of the instruments is defined here so we can establish a commonly understood vocabulary for the Handbook.

"Data gathering instrument," or "instrument," refer to the sheets of paper upon which data is written. In our case, there are three sets of instruments: the APMIS I, the APMIS II series, and the APMIS III.

"Section heading" refers to the word or phrase in italics that begins a new section of a data gathering instrument. It attempts to give the coder a short hand notice of the type of information coming up in the next section for coding. The first section heading of the APMIS I is "APMIS Identification" and the second section heading is "Demographic Variables."

"Item #" refers to the numbers at the left margin of each page. These numbers are continuous and unique within every separate data gathering instrument. If you need to refer to a particular item, you can reference it easily by citing the specific APMIS instrument in question and the item #.

"Item" is the actual name of the variable for which data is being supplied. For example, item #5 of the APMIS I is the variable "Month, day and year of birth." Sometimes we will use the word "variable" synonymously with the word "item."

"Space" identifies the column of spaces at the right margin of each instrument. These are the spaces in which data is to be written. All data is placed in the spaces that correspond to the proper item. You can determine the appropriate space for a given item simply by noting that it (or they) is immediately to the right of the item in question (or the last code of the item in question). Below each space is a number that is of no importance for you, the coder. These numbers identify the column number of the computer card in which the data will be keypunched. NOTE: EVERY SPACE GETS ONLY ONE INTEGER. Be sure to carefully place the correct integer in the correct space in a very legible fashion.

"Codes" refers to the possible choices available for a given item. For example, the possible codes for the item, "Sex," are obviously male and female.

"Code numbers" are the integers that correspond to the codes. Each code has a code number assigned to it that is found in parentheses to the left of the code itself. This is the number that is placed in the space(s) to the right of each item.

From time to time you will note a boxed-in entry such as "Begin Card 1." These boxes and their contents are signals to keypunchers that a given computer card begins or ends at the time they arrive at the box.

How to Code

Use a pencil with dark lead, i.e., not a No. 3. Erase mistakes and make corrections carefully and cleanly. DO NOT USE INK. There is no way to make clean corrections on entries made in ink.

With one exception, all of the data entered into the APMIS is numeric. The single exception is the item, "State Bureau of Identification number," which will frequently have an alphabetic character appended to the number. Otherwise, all data you enter will be numeric.

The responsibility of the coder is to select the code that best, most accurately and/or most comprehensively depicts the probationer for every single item. Now each item has one of two kinds of codes. There are items for which the codes are fixed and there are items for which no codes are available at all.

"Fixed codes" are the codes for items where an exclusive list of possible codes is provided. For example, item #7 of APMIS I, "Sex," identifies two possible codes: male and female. No other codes are allowed. ONLY ONE CODE NUMBER MAY BE ENTERED FOR EACH VARIABLE. You must select the single code that is most accurate for the probationer and place the corresponding code number in the correct space(s).

If two or more of the fixed codes are applicable for a given item, determine which code is more comprehensive, came first in time, or can otherwise be thought to supercede the other(s) in significance and use that code. If your reasoning process fails to determine the best code, then pick the code for that variable that has the highest number.

Fixed codes for the items are found in one of two places. Almost all of the fixed codes are printed directly on the instruments below the variable names. There are seven items, though, for which the codes are so numerous that it is impractical to include them on the data gathering instruments. For example, there are hundreds of municipalities in New Jersey. Instead of including the codes on the instruments

the list of codes has been provided in the Handbook. When a list of codes is not available on the instrument, then, the coder will have to consult the Handbook to determine the correct code number to enter on the instrument. For example, the coder will find a note under item #4, "Municipality of residence," that says, "See Municipality Codes." The coder will then consult the Municipality Codes, find the municipality under consideration, identify its code number, and place the number in the spaces for this variable. The seven items for which extensive lists are required are Municipality, Offense, Judge, Probation Officer, County/State Special Conditions, and Reason for Termination.

The second type of codes is those that are not fixed. Rather, no lists are provided at all. These codes always refer either to dates or the total number of something.

Any time a date is to be coded you should follow these directions. Six spaces are supplied for most dates. The first two pertain to the month, the middle two represent the day, and the last two refer to the last two digits of the year. Zeros should always be placed before single digits. Several examples of properly coded dates follow:

January 1, 1948	<u>0</u> <u>1</u> <u>0</u> <u>1</u> <u>4</u> <u>8</u>
November 1, 1978	<u>1</u> <u>1</u> <u>0</u> <u>1</u> <u>7</u> <u>8</u>
December 31, 1901	<u>1</u> <u>2</u> <u>3</u> <u>1</u> <u>0</u> <u>1</u>

All other dates are captured in four spaces only. In this case the first two spaces pertain to the month and the second pair refers to the last two digits of the year. The day is omitted. Note the following examples:

October 1, 1953	<u>1</u> <u>0</u> <u>5</u> <u>3</u>
February 28, 1900	<u>0</u> <u>2</u> <u>0</u> <u>0</u>

The other items for which there are no fixed codes are those items for which the total number of something is required. In these cases you merely supply the total number appropriate for the item in question. For example, if the item is "Number of dependents," you count the total number of dependents per the guidelines set forth in the Handbook and place the total number in the appropriate spaces. If there are no dependents at all, then your entry will be 0 0. If there are eight dependents, your entry will be 0 8. If there are 13 dependents, you will enter 13 in the correct spaces. In cases where the correct number is less than one but more than zero, consider the correct answer to be one. For example, it may be that a person was previously on probation for only one week while the variable asks for the number of months instead of weeks. In this case, you will always enter data thus: 0 1. In cases where there are fractions or decimals (other than below the number one) always round off to the nearest number (1-49 down and 50-99 up).

When Data Is Not Known

NEVER GUESS. Supply data only when such data has been obtained from a valid source and/or is free from reasonable suspicion regarding its truthfulness. The criterion for information to be supplied in the APMIS is that information which you can reasonably defend before the bench.

This is not to say that in some instances you will not have to make inferences or rely on reasoned intuition, etc. If there is reason for supplying a particular bit of information, then do so. But never put something in simply because the item is there.

If a bit of information is just not available, leave the spaces for that item blank. Never enter a zero if something is not known. Blanks mean data was not known while zeros are data.

When There Are Conflicting Sources of Data

It will frequently be the case that the defendant says one thing, the police say something else, and one or more additional sources vary as well. First, anything that has been proven in court is to be taken over any person's story. The court record holds. Second, the police account is to be accepted except when the police account has not been demonstrated in court and there is evidence that the police account is questionable. Then you must weigh the evidence and decide which account is the most credible given the weight of the evidence. Consult any of the parties (i.e., police, defendant, etc.) if there is a problem in interpretation. If all accounts are completely irreconcilable and there is no evidence that tips the balance in favor of one story in particular, then leave the space blank and write directly on the data gathering instrument, "Facts disputed." We expect you will rarely fail to come to a conclusion, but in those few instances where it may occur, these guidelines will hopefully assist you in deciding what course to follow.

When Data Does Not Fit APMIS Codes

There will be some occasions, hopefully very infrequent, when the facts simply do not fit any of the fixed codes made available in the APMIS. When this occurs, first consult the next-to-last paragraph on page D-2 of this chapter. If that does not result in a satisfactory resolution, then leave the space blank and write directly near the item in question a concise explanation of why no code does justice to your case and recommend a way the case could have been captured.

Other Coding Problems

Should any other problems with coding arise, consult with your supervisors. They will work it out with you. Remember that the APMIS is a dynamic system that will constantly require revision and improvement. The utility of the system depends largely on your creative deployment of it.

APMIS I--THE ADULT PROFILE REPORT

Introduction

The APMIS I is the basic instrument and foundation for the entire system. It sets the stage for what will be recorded throughout a probationer's term and provides the reference point from which subsequent activities will be noted. The Profile Report seeks to describe who a given probationer is at the time the probation term begins. It includes demographic variables, describes the nature and circumstances of the offense as well as the offense history, personal and family items, education, health and vocational variables, an assessment of the probationer's problems/needs, and the facts of the disposition.

When Is the APMIS I to Be Completed?

1. When a person has been placed on probation by a New Jersey Court and the person begins the probation term.
2. When a person is transferred into your county for courtesy supervision, be it inter- or intra-state transfer.
3. When a probationer has been sentenced to a new probation term while still on probation IF that new probation term is consecutive for one day or more to the original probation term.

Who Is to Complete the APMIS I?

Unless otherwise provided for your county, the probation officer to whom the new probationer has been assigned or under whose supervision the probationer remains will complete the APMIS I.

When Is the Completed APMIS I Due?

Unless otherwise provided, the APMIS I should be submitted to your supervisor within one month of the date the person was added to your caseload or within one month of the date the probationer was sentenced to the probation term that runs beyond the current term.

Time Frame for Coding the APMIS I

The APMIS I is to be completed by supplying the correct data as of the date of the presentence investigation (PSI) except when that data has changed during the time between the completion of the PSI and the beginning of the probation term. If there has been such a change, then supply the data that is correct as of the beginning of the term.

Instructions for Completing the APMIS I

The next several pages operationally define each and every item in the APMIS I. When you have a question about the proper way to supply data for a given variable, consult these instructions before you contact your supervisor.

APMIS Identification

1. County--The first two digits of the full identification number are the code numbers for the county in which the case is being activated. This means the person has been placed on probation by a court in this county or has been received by this county probation department on intra- or inter-state transfer. Consult the County/State Codes for the appropriate code number.
2. Year case activated--The third and fourth digits of the identification number represent the calendar year during which the person actually begins to be supervised by the county probation department. Include only the third and fourth digits of the year, e.g., 1979 should be 79 only.
3. Identification number assigned--A supervisor in your department will be responsible for assigning a discreet number to every new probationer. The supervisor will give that number to you when the case is assigned. If the number is 37, then you will supply the numbers in spaces 5-8 as follows: 0 0 3 7. Note that space 9 already has a "1" in it. That refers to computer card one and you will merely skip over this space and leave the 1 in tact.
4. State Bureau of Identification number--This is the identification number used by the New Jersey State Police. Note that this item is completed differently from all other items. The first difference is that many SBI numbers include an alphabetic character at the end of the number. No other APMIS item will have an alphabetic character. The second difference is that the data should be entered in a way called "right justified." Right justified means that if there are any spaces to be left blank because the number occupies fewer spaces than are provided, they are the spaces to the left. Another way to say it is that the number is to be flush with the right-most column. Let us take a hypothetical number for example: 1234A. There are only five characters in that number, but this item allows for seven spaces. In this case, the first two spaces will be left blank and the number, 1234A, will be placed in spaces 12-16.

Demographic Variables

5. Municipality of residence--Determine the probationer's current municipality of residence, consult the Municipality Codes, and find the appropriate code number. Should the municipality not be found, then consult Appendix A, "List of Local Places in New Jersey." This reference supplies the name of every local place in New Jersey in the first column. The second column gives the name of the incorporated entity within which that local place is found. Find the name of the local place in column one, then determine the name of the incorporated township, town or city, then consult the Municipality Codes for the number of the incorporated township, town or city you have just identified and use that code number. If the local place or the municipality is not to be found, write the name in the place provided and leave the spaces blank. If a person has two or more places of residence, determine which address is the legal address. If that still does not resolve the dilemma, use the address closest to the county seat of your county.
6. Month, Day and Year of Birth--Identify the probationer's birth date from a valid source (e.g., rap sheet, driver license, etc.) and code the date in spaces 20-25. If there are two or more dates with no certainty as to the correct date, enter the one that you are best able to determine to be the most accurate. If that gets you nowhere, then go with the earliest date.
7. Race/ethnicity--This is not a satisfactory typology for race and/or ethnicity; however it is less unsatisfactory than others. It is an amended version of codes promulgated by the Office of Federal Statistical Policy and Standards in the Department of Commerce. Operational definitions of the various codes follow, together with instructions for making assessments in case of mixed parentage and/or heritage:

White, not of Hispanic origin, is a person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, North Africa or the Middle East.

Black, not of Hispanic origin, is a person having origins in the black racial groups of Africa.

Hispanic--Puerto Rican, is a person having origins in the peoples of Puerto Rico, regardless of race.

Hispanic--Cuban, is a person having origins in the peoples of Cuba, regardless of race.

Hispanic--other, is a person having origins in the peoples of Mexico, Central or South America or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

American Indian or Alaskan Native is a person having origins in any of the original peoples of North America, and who maintains cultural identification through tribal affiliation or community recognition.

Asian or Pacific Islander is a person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, the Indian subcontinent, or the Pacific Islands.

If a person is of mixed parentage, identify the racial/ethnic group which is claimed by that person as having influenced their identity more powerfully.

8. Sex--Identify the probationer's sexual identification and place the code number in space 27.

Nature and Circumstances of the Offense

- 9-11. Most serious final charge, Second most serious final charge and Third most serious final charge--Determine from official court records the final charge or charges of which the person has been adjudicated guilty and which result in the probation term. These are the charges for which the defendant has been sentenced, so if there have been mergers or any other modifications of the original charges, only the charges remaining at the time of sentencing are to be considered here. DO NOT INCLUDE ADJUDICATED CHARGES THAT DO NOT RESULT IN PROBATION TERMS.

On occasion it will be necessary to refer to the 2A statutes that have been replaced by the 2C statutes. When this is the case you will have to consult Appendix B, "New Jersey Code of Criminal Justice--Comparison of Provisions of Code to Existing Statutes: Schedule of Allocations." This appendix is to be used as follows: identify the specific statute under which the person has been convicted and is being sentenced according to the 2A series. Look in the right column to find the corresponding 2C statute number. At that point you can consult the Offense Codes by using the 2C number, and the code number found there will be entered in the appropriate spaces. When the comparison list fails to identify an equivalent 2C category, write the statute number of the old 2A citation to the right of the item and leave the spaces blank.

Note that you will have to assess the relative seriousness of the charge(s). "Seriousness" here is to be determined as follows: Any offense threatening or resulting in harm to self and/or others is more serious than an offense that does not. Further, an offense whose degree is higher is more serious than an offense with a lower degree (except for an offense of a lower degree that results in personal harm). If two offenses are of the same degree, the one is more serious that results in greater harm or greater loss, actual or potential. Finally, if two offenses cannot be distinguished along these lines, place the code number of the one that is encountered first on an official court record.

Once you have identified the order of seriousness of the offenses, then consult the Offense Codes, find the statute number for the offense(s) in question and enter the code number(s) in the appropriate spaces, most serious first, second most serious second, etc. Note that all statutes are entered in numerical order, New Jersey Statutes Annotated (NJSA) first. The NJSA items are followed by codes for local ordinances.

When there is only one charge, leave the other two sets of spaces blank. Similarly, if there are two charges, leave the third set blank.

Always identify the appropriate offense and code number by statute number, not by generic offense name.

12. Total number of adjudicated charges--Count the total number of separate statutes for violation of which the probationer has been sentenced. For example, if there is one indictment with three counts and each count cites a separate statute or separate sections within a statute, the total number of adjudicated charges is 3, not 1. Similarly, if there is one indictment with three counts and each count cites the same statute, the number is 1, not 3. Finally, if there are two or more indictments, count the total number of statutes cited in each indictment and add the total from each indictment to all other indictments. Therefore, if you have two indictments with three statutes cited in each, your total number of adjudicated charges is 6, even if the statutes cited in each indictment are the same. Finally, do not count charges of which the defendant was not adjudicated guilty or which were merged or plea bargained away and do not appear on the judgment of conviction.
13. Defendant's relationship to the criminal justice system when present offense was committed--Determine whether or not the defendant was in any relationship to the criminal justice system when she or he committed the offense or, in the case of multiple offenses, any offense. If the person was completely free from any relationship with the criminal justice system, then enter a "1" in space 38, thereby indicating "no relationship." Otherwise, place the correct code number of the appropriate relationship in space 38. Should the defendant have been involved with two or more of the codes identified herein, use the code that has the highest number (1 being low, 7 high).
14. Offender's basic attitude toward offense--Here is a case where you will have to exercise cautious, prudent judgment. Usually you will abide by the stated attitude of the defendant. But you may have reason to believe that the real attitude is other than what the probationer would have you believe. Do your best to pick the code that best represents the offender's basic attitude, not necessarily the attitude that is being projected. Do not deviate from the stated attitude, though, unless you have very good reason to do so. If there is a combination of attitudes, pick the one that seems to dominate.

Differentiate between rationalization of an act and justification of an act as follows: rationalization refers to general conditions thought to contribute to the act (e.g., "I had a terrible childhood.") while justification refers to specific circumstances justifying commission of the act (e.g., "I was hungry."--assuming the person was actually hungry). Finally, if the probationer admits guilt but projects no attitude toward her or his conduct, then pick code 4 (admits involvement--not elsewhere included).

15. Weapon use--Determine by review of the official police record whether or not any weapon was employed in the commission of the offense, whether or not this element has been plea bargained away. If the offense is mere possession and the actual use of the weapon in the commission of a criminal act is absent, then use code "1" (No weapon involved in this offense). If a weapon was employed in the commission of the crime, then review the available codes and pick the one that best describes such usage.
16. Violence index of present offense--If the person has no prior record of convictions, then place a "1" (First offender, no grounds for comparison) in space 41. If the person has at least one prior conviction, and neither the instant offense nor that prior conviction was a violent offense, then place a "2" (Neither this nor any former offense was violent) in space 41. If the instant offense is violent, but no prior offense was violent, then place a "3" (First offense with violence) in space 41. Further, if the instant offense was violent and one or more prior offenses was violent, compare the violence of the instant offense with the most violent prior offense and choose among codes 4-6. Finally, if the instant offense is not violent, but one or more prior convictions were for violent offenses, place a "7" (Not violent, but at least one former violent offense) in space 41.

Only the following offenses or their equivalents in other jurisdictions are to be considered violent for the purposes of this item:

17. The defendant was under the influence of what substances at the time of the offense?--Determine whether or not the defendant had been using any drugs within four hours prior to and/or during the time of committing the offense. If there was no drug involved at all, then place a "0" (none) in space 42 and again in space 43. If there was one drug, then find the appropriate code and place its number in space 42 and a "0" in space 43. If two or more drugs were being used, pick the two that caused the greatest disorienting effect and place the appropriate code numbers in spaces 42 and 43 respectively, the most disorienting drug first.
18. Degree to which defendant was under emotional stress in the commission of the offense--"Emotional stress" means the presence of any factor that has created emotional distress for the defendant and which had some etiological (i.e., causal) relationship with (1) the cause of the offense (i.e., would the offense be less likely to have occurred had this factor been absent?) and/or (2) the expression of the offense (i.e., did the presence of any emotional stress affect the way in which the offense was committed?). Examples include loss of a job; instances of physical abuse in the home; loss of a serious girl/boyfriend, spouse or other loved one; other events that are tumultuous or traumatic. If there is no emotional stress as described above, place a "1" in space 44. If there is any at all, but not much, place a "3" in that space. Further, if the defendant went beserk, was extraordinarily outraged or otherwise was under extreme emotional stress, place a "5" in space 44. Otherwise, if the degree of stress was anywhere between "some" and "extreme," then place a "4" (moderate) in space 44. Finally, if the defendant claims to have been under stress while the facts provide no evidence of same, then choose code "2": Claims moderate or extreme stress but no evidence of same.

*Offense History at Time of Sentencing***Juvenile:**

19. Number of arrests--Count the total number of times the defendant was ever arrested, or, if there was no arrest involved, charged, before the age of 18. Place the correct total in spaces 45-46. We realize that juvenile history will some times not be available. Report only what you can verify and don't worry about anything else.

20. Number of JINS adjudications (including continuances)--Count the total number of times the defendant appeared in court as a juvenile on a JINS charge or its equivalent and the juvenile was presumed guilty (whether referred to the Juvenile Conference Committee or placed under Court Rule 5:9-9b(1)) or found guilty (and placed on probation or given any other disposition) and place the total number in spaces 47-48.

If a person had charges before the passage of the JINS law that would have been JINS offenses had the law been in effect at the time, count those offenses as JINS offenses.

21. Number of delinquency adjudications: Crime of 1st-4th degree--Count the total number of times the defendant was convicted of offenses equivalent to 2C crimes of 1st-4th degree inclusive, regardless of disposition, and place the total number in spaces 49-50.
22. Number of delinquency adjudications: DP, PDP & other offenses less than 4th degree--Count the total number of times the defendant was convicted of offenses that would be or now are ranked as of the degree of disorderly persons or lower (lower including local ordinances but not traffic violations) and enter the total number in spaces 51-52.

Adult:

23. Number of arrests--Count the total number of times the defendant has been arrested (EXCLUDING ARRESTS FOR PROBATION/PAROLE VIOLATION) or charged when there was no arrest on or following the 18th birthday and place the total number in spaces 53-54. DO NOT INCLUDE THE ARREST FOR THE INSTANT OFFENSE. If the person was arrested between the time of the arrest for the instant offense and the beginning of the probation term, you should include it (them?).
24. Number of convictions for crimes of 1st-4th degree--Count the total number of times the defendant has been convicted of crimes of the 1st through the 4th degree or their equivalent according to the 2C statutes and place the total number in spaces 55-56. Count only separate criminal events, not necessarily dispositional events. An armed robbery with a dozen counts is one conviction, not twelve. Be sure to include any convictions prior to day the probation term began, even if they occurred after the date of arrest for the instant offense.
25. Number of convictions for crimes of DP, PDP and other offenses less than 4th degree--Count the total number of separate convictions of offenses equivalent to the current ranking of disorderly persons, petty disorderly persons or offenses of lesser degree this defendant has since the 18th birthday and place the number in spaces 57-58. Do not include dispositions under 24:21-27 (i.e., conditional discharge/supervisory treatment) or P.T.I. events as convictions.

26. Age at first contact ever with the criminal justice system-- Determine how old this person was on the occasion of the first arrest, appearance in court, or other contact with the criminal justice system as a juvenile or adult defendant and place the number of years in spaces 59-60.
27. Number of prior adjudications for violent offenses--If the person is a first offender, place a "0" in space 61, for there are obviously no prior convictions of violent offenses. If there are prior convictions, review them carefully and determine if any are violent offenses. A violent offense is understood as any offense found in the list provided in this Handbook for item #16. Consult pages E-6,7 for details.
28. Is the defendant listed in the CDS registry?--Determine whether or not the defendant is included in the CDS registry and place the appropriate code number in space 62.
29. Comparison of present offense with all pre-sentencing criminal history--The objective of this variable is to compare the instant offense(s) with the defendant's entire prior history of convictions. If there is no prior conviction, then place a "1" (no prior history) in space 63. If there is one or more prior convictions, then determine whether or not the instant offense is similar to or unlike all prior offenses. If it is similar, then you are working with a "consistent" recidivist (i.e., repeater). Determine whether the instant offense is less serious, similarly serious, or more serious than all prior convictions and place the appropriate code number in space 63. On the other hand, if the instant offense is different from one or more prior convictions, then you have an "inconsistent" recidivist. Again, determine whether the instant offense is less serious, similarly serious, or more serious than all prior convictions and pick the appropriate code, placing the number in space 63.

Offenses are deemed to be similar or consistent when all offenses are alike in some significant way. For example, all offenses committed for pecuniary gain are to be considered consistent, be they burglary, robbery, shoplifting or embezzlement. Further, if it is known that two separate offenses are committed for the same reason, then the person is a consistent recidivist. For example, if a person has a prior conviction for possession of heroin and the instant conviction is a burglary charge that can be reasonably associated with heroin dependency, then the person is a consistent recidivist. On the other hand, if the two offenses cannot be so associated, then the person is an inconsistent recidivist.

An offense is more serious than another if it is of a higher degree, is of the same degree but resulted in more harm or a greater pecuniary loss, or in any other way deserves a greater degree of blameworthiness.

30. Number of months prior probation served--Count the total number of months the defendant has ever been on probation, juvenile + adult, regardless of jurisdiction, and place the total number in spaces 64-65. Do not include time spent under supervision under P.T.I. or conditional discharge/supervisory treatment.
31. Number of months prior sentenced incarceration served--Count the total number of months the defendant has ever spent in sentenced imprisonment. Do not include time spent in detention except when a sentence has specified that time served is credited to the punishment. Be sure to include all types of custodial institutions, regardless of jurisdiction (i.e., include municipal and county jails, state and Federal institutions).
32. Number of months prior parole served--Count the total number of months the person has ever been on parole, juvenile + adult, and place the total number in spaces 68-69.

Personal and Family Items

33. Number of years residing in present municipality--Count the total number of years the defendant has resided in the municipality in which she or he currently or most recently resided. Do not include a jail or prison as a place of residence in this or the following two variables. Any periods of incarceration will be counted in terms of the legal home address at which the person resided before incarceration or, if it changed during the term of incarceration, the newest permanent/legal address. If a person has been away from his or her legal address to study elsewhere, consider that time to be years residing at home address.
34. Number of years residing in present county--Count the total number of years the defendant has resided in the county in which he or she presently or most recently resided and place the total number in spaces 72-73. See directions in item #33 if needed.
35. Number of years residing in New Jersey--Count the total number of years the defendant has resided in New Jersey and place the total number in spaces 74-75. Consult directions for item #33 if needed.
36. Parents' status through major part of defendant's first 18 years--Review the possible codes for this variable and choose the one that best identifies the relationship of this defendant's natural or adopted parents (or combination thereof) for the longest period of time during the first 18 years of the defendant's life and place the appropriate code number in space 76.

37. Most recent non-custodial living arrangement--Determine the defendant's most recent living arrangement excluding a jail or prison or any other place of involuntary residency and place the code number for the best answer in space 77.
38. Defendant's current marital status--Select the code that best represents the person's current marital status and place the number in space 78.
39. Is this defendant under a court order for support or alimony?--Determine the correct answer to that question, yes or no. If the answer is no, determine the status of the no and if the answer is yes, determine the status of the affirmative and place the correct code number in space 79. If the person has no spouse or children and could not be under an order for support or alimony, place an "8" (not applicable) in space 79.
40. Number of dependents--Count the total number of dependents for whom this defendant is responsible and place the total number in space 80. For the purposes of this variable we are using an adapted version of the regulations of the Internal Revenue Service. "the term 'dependent' means any of the following individuals over half of whose support" for half or more of the year prior to the beginning of the probation term "was received from the" probationer:
- (1) A son or daughter, or a descendant of either,
 - (2) A stepson or stepdaughter,
 - (3) A brother, sister, stepbrother, or stepsister,
 - (4) The father or mother, or an ancestor of either,
 - (5) A stepfather or stepmother,
 - (6) A son or daughter of a brother or sister,
 - (7) A brother or sister of the father or mother,
 - (8) A son-in-law, daughter-in-law, father-in-law, mother-in-law, brother-in-law, or sister-in-law,
 - (9) An individual (other than an individual who at any time during the taxable year was the spouse ... of the probationer) who ... has as his principle place of abode the home of the probationer and is a member of the probationer's household.
- All of the relationships described in points 1 through 8 are relationships to the probationer, e.g., #2 is "a stepson or stepdaughter of the probationer, etc.

Source: Internal Revenue Code: 1979, section 152.

41. APMIS Identification--At this point you are beginning data that will appear on computer card #2. Enter in spaces 1-8 the digits you entered in spaces 1-8 of card 1. That is the complete APMIS identification number. Space 9, as you can tell, will always have a "2" as it represents the number of the card.

Education

42. Current educational status--Review the codes available for this variable and pick the one that most accurately indicates the defendant's current educational status and place the number for that code in space 10. If the person is about to enter a program, but the program has not begun, then consider this person not to be in the program.
43. Highest level of education completed--This variable is a rough means of assessing the total number of school years the person has completed. If the person went half way through the eighth grade, then enter 07 since only the seventh grade was actually completed, and so on. Place the number of the code that most closely represents that total number of years in spaces 11-12.
44. What was the precipitating reason for leaving high school?--If the person is a high school graduate, then enter a "1" (not applicable) in space 13. Otherwise, pick the code that best represents the main reason behind the probationer's departure from school as a juvenile and place the number in space 13. If the probationer has subsequently completed the GED, you will still need to assess a reason for dropping out of school.

Health and Physical

45. Is the defendant using any prescribed medications?--Determine whether or not the person is on medication prescribed by a doctor or on methadone maintenance under legal auspices. If the probationer is on methadone maintenance and using prescribed medications, place a "4" (both) in space 14.
46. What is the defendant's own assessment of his/her health?--Ask the defendant to make a general assessment of her/his health, then pick the code that is closest to the defendant's own words and place its code number in space 15. These codes were recommended by a former professor at the New Jersey College of Medicine and Dentistry who is a nutritionist.
47. Subject's alcohol use history--Determine whether or not the subject drinks alcohol at all and if so, then determine the subject's alcohol use history and pick the code that best represents the truth of the matter and place the number in space 16. Be sure to distinguish between codes for former use and current use.
48. History of alcohol treatment(s)--Determine whether or not this person has ever received treatment for alcohol use that extended beyond three exploratory visits. Review the codes and pick the one that best represents this history.

49. Subject's marijuana/hashish use history--Determine whether the subject has ever used marijuana and/or hashish and, if so, assess the nature of that usage and pick the code that best represents a summary of that usage. If the probationer has never used the substance, then place a "1" (none at all) in space 18.
50. Subject's history of hallucinogen use--Determine whether or not the subject has ever used any hallucinogen. A list of hallucinogens is available for consultation in Appendix D. Use the same codes as in item #49. If a substance that is not included in the list is proper for inclusion in this section, do not fail to consider it a hallucinogen just because it does not appear in the list. This is true for the following substances as well.
51. Subject's history of barbiturate use--Determine whether or not the probationer has ever used barbiturates and pick the code that best summarizes the barbiturate use history. A list of barbiturates is included in Appendix D.
52. Subject's history of amphetamine use--Determine whether or not the probationer has ever used amphetamines and pick the code that best summarizes the amphetamine use history. A list of amphetamines is included in Appendix D.
53. Subject's history of inhalant use--Determine whether or not the probationer has ever used inhalants and pick the code that best summarizes such inhalant use history. Appendix D may be consulted for a list of inhalants.
54. Subject's heroin use history--Determine whether or not the subject has ever used heroin. Assess the extent to which heroin has been used, consult the available codes for this item and pick the code that best summarizes that heroin use history.
55. Subject's history of cocaine use--Determine whether or not the probationer has ever made use of cocaine. Assess the extent to which cocaine has been used, consult the available codes and pick the code that best summarizes that heroin use history.
56. Subject's history of other drug use--Determine whether any drug not included in variables 48 through 55 have ever been used, assess the extent to which any have been used, and select the code that best represents the history of the use of the most heavily used drug in this category.

57. History of non-alcoholic drug treatment(s)--"Non-alcoholic drug treatment" refers to all kinds of treatment--residential, outpatient, group, etc.--for any drug other than alcohol. Refer to item #48 for the codes for this item. Choose the code that represents the farthest the subject has gone in treatment and best summarizes the extent of treatment.
58. History of mental health treatment--Determine the nature of all prior mental health treatment which this defendant has received, if any, review the codes, and pick the code with the highest number that is applicable. For example, if the person had been counseled by her or his minister within the past two years and had received no other counseling, then you would pick the second code. However, if the probationer had been committed to an institution, subsequently released and is now under psychiatric care on an outpatient basis, you would pick code #7.

Do not include instances in which the subject went to fewer than three sessions with any therapist. For the purposes of this variable, the person has a history only if three or more sessions were attended.

Employment/Vocational

Current or most recent job

Variables 59 through 61 pertain only to the current or most recent job that the probationer has had, excluding jobs maintained within residential institutions (e.g., prisons, jails, residential treatment programs, etc.). Before proceeding with variable #59, write in the position or job name held at that job in the space provided to the right of this sub-heading. Consider a person's presence in the military to be full-time employment.

59. Job type--Choose the appropriate classification of this job as per the codes provided. If it is not clear which code should be selected for this specific job, then consult Appendix C, "Classification of Occupations." You can find the specific type of work done there, identify which type within which the job has been placed, and then return to the codes to identify the correct code number. If there is ever any substantive doubt as to which code should be selected, leave spaces 28-29 blank and briefly describe the nature of the work done in the area around the place where you entered the job title.

If the work that was last done is an illegal occupation, simply pick the code that is closest to being a functional equivalent to the work done illegally.

60. Number of months at that job--Count the total number of months the subject worked at that job (i.e., the job referred to in item #59) even if there was an interruption and the employment was not continuous, as long as the employing agent or agency was the same (or a new owner of the same business) and place the total number of months in spaces 30-32. If the nature of the work was irregular or seasonal, simply add all miscellaneous months together for a grand total. The months do not have to be consecutive.
61. Gross weekly earnings in last week at that job--Determine the gross (i.e., total) amount of dollars the subject was earning per week at that job as of the last week she or he was employed. Round off cents to whole dollars and place the total amount in spaces 33-35.

Work record in 12 months prior to presentence investigation

Variables 62 through 65 all pertain to the subject's employment record during the 12 months prior to the presentence investigation. Be sure that each of these variables is answered with that specific time frame in mind.

62. Number of weeks worked full-time in previous 12 months--Count the total number of weeks that the subject worked full-time during the 12 months prior to the presentence investigation. If the subject could not have been employed for that period of time (e.g., was in custody, a hospital, etc.), then place a "99" (not applicable) in spaces 36-37. "Full-time" work is any job that an employer or employee considers to be full-time work and is in excess of 30 hours per week. When counting weeks, if a person worked three days, that should be counted a full week. In other words, if there are loose days here and there, add them up and divide by 5 (assuming 5 working days per week). Any extra days should be rounded up or down. Do not include illegal jobs as work here.
63. Number of weeks worked part-time in previous 12 months--This is identical to the previous variable except the item in consideration is part-time employment, not full-time employment. For the purposes of this variable "part-time" employment means any work had on an ongoing, dependable basis that was not considered to be full-time work in item #62. It may be necessary to count total number of days during which part-time or outside employment was had and divide by five. Otherwise, follow the directions for item #62 and place the total number in spaces 38-39.
64. Defendant's gross earnings (including investment returns & unreported income)--Compute the total, gross dollars earned by the subject during the 12 months prior to the presentence investigation. Include earnings only, but earnings encompasses not only

salaried or commissioned wages, but income from savings, investments, under-the-table jobs, illegal "jobs," and other unreported types of earnings.

We suggest that unreported earnings be sought particularly in instances of offenses related to illegal earnings. Such offenses include sale of drugs, burglaries, lottery, etc. In cases where such income is not immediately suggested by the nature of the offense, make an inquiry in this area but we do not recommend pressing in this direction.

Note: items #64 and #65 pertain only to the probationer, not to other members of the household. For example, if a spouse also has earnings, do not include those earnings in these statistics.

65. All other income (excluding earnings) defendant received--Calculate the total amount of income (other than income included in item #64) the probationer received in the 12 months prior to the presentence investigation. All other income includes sources such as welfare, pensions, family/friends, and social security. Compute the total number of whole dollars as best you can in consultation with the probationer and place the sum in spaces 45-49.
66. Household's three principal sources of income in defendant's last year of liberty, in descending order, beginning with the largest source--Determine the single largest source of income (be it earnings or any other sort of income) the defendant had during the last year of liberty, find the appropriate code number for that source and place it in spaces 50-51 (to the right of the number, one. Then determine which was the second largest source of income in that period of time and place its code number in spaces 52-53. Finally, place the code number of the third largest source of income in spaces 54-55. If there is any instance in which there is no income (for example, if there were only two sources), place a 99 (not applicable) in the appropriate set of spaces. A 99 should never appear in all three spaces for it is assumed that a person must have some sort of income from some source to survive. If there is a person who lives off the land and has no contact with civilization that requires any income, then you will be forced to use code #23: Other. If the person is a seasonal worker, then complete this variable based on whether the person works full- and/or part-time during the season of employment.
67. Defendant's current employment status--What is the defendant's employment status at the time of the presentence investigation? Review the codes and select the one that most comprehensively answers that question at that point in time and place its number in space 56. Note that if a person is employed full- or part-time and is studying, even if studying part-time, you should select code 3: Student & working.

68. The household in which the defendant resides is basically--This variable is an indicator of the economic status of the household in which the defendant currently or last resided prior to any custodial term. "Economically independent and with sufficient means" includes families who are sustained by their own employment and earn enough money to supply the basic necessities of life comfortably. "Comfortably" suggests that the basic necessities are clearly met and there is at least a small amount left over for items/activities of preference (as opposed to necessity), e.g., leisure, the arts, etc. "Economically independent and without sufficient means" includes those families that are trying to make it on their own without outside assistance, but really are struggling and occasionally or frequently fail to meet the basic necessities or barely do so but have no funds left over for any items/activities of preference, as identified above. "Economically dependent with sufficient means" includes families that are economically dependent for 50% or more of their income (e.g., alimony, welfare) but receive enough to supply the basic necessities of life with some left over for items/activities of preference. Finally, "economically dependent without sufficient means" applies to families that are both economically dependent for 50% or more of their income and frequently or usually fail to enjoy the basic necessities of life and/or opportunities for items/activities of preference. These people just aren't making it on what they have.
69. Offender's vocational aspiration/goal--Ask the defendant what job she or he really wants to strive for? What job do they really desire? Be sure to push for a realistic, attainable aspiration/goal. So ask not only what they really want, but what they think they can attain.

Choose the classification that is appropriate for the job, consulting Appendix C, "Classification of Occupations," if necessary to find the proper code.

Assessment of Defendant's Problems/Needs

There are sixteen variables which facilitate a comprehensive problem/need assessment for each probationer. Within the guidelines set forth in the following paragraph, make your professional appraisal, in consultation with the probationer, of the extent to which each variable is a problem or need at the time of the beginning of the probation term. Then rank each variable on a scale of 1 to 5 accordingly, a "1" meaning the variable is no problem or need at all and "5" representing a severe or critical problem or need. These assessments are designed to provide a summary assessment, an indication of the basic situation of the subject. Do not consider exceptions to the ordinary except when they pose real or probable threats to any person's well-being at any time (i.e., if they are likely to be repeated) or when the result of that exception has been irretrievably damaging or nearly so.

One way to make your judgment is to consider how close the subject's situation is to either pole, to 1 or to 5. A one is the total absence of any known special need or problem. It means, for example, that the subject never has problems because of consumption of alcohol (although it may be consumed), enjoys a basically supportive home environment, is healthy, eats well, has a good work situation, enjoys sufficient income, etc.

At the other extreme, a five is the presence of a known (not suspected or probable) problem or need that is so severe that the situation has reached crisis proportions. Crises include, for example, an open wound or a long-standing undiagnosed ailment that requires immediate medical attention, inability to speak or read English at all, being drug dependent, and having no job skills.

Schematically, the two poles might be compared with each other by virtue of reviewing the following table:

Once the two extremes are clear, then you can assess relative closeness to either extreme. A 2 means a little need or problem, but it does represent something of a problem. Similarly, a 4 is just short of a crisis but it is more serious than a 3. Finally, the 3 is the midpoint between the extremes, representing a moderate condition of need or problem that is between the 2 and the 4.

It may be that two or more of the following variables are interdependent. For example, let's say a person has great difficulty sustaining employment (and you have decided to rank it 5) because the person does not get along with fellow employees (and you have decided to rank item #77, "Interpersonal relationships other than family/marital," number 5 also). In this case, it is clear that the major reason the person cannot sustain employment is an inability to get along with people. Rank each item independently, even though they are interdependent. Do not try to ascertain which one causes the other.

70. Ability to sustain a job--What is the probationer's current ability to sustain employment? Consider at least each of the following issues in making this assessment: work history, motivation to work, ability to work under supervision, timeliness of arrival and departure from work station, coming to work mentally and physically fit to work, and ability to get along with other workers as well as superiors on the job. Review the sum of these factors and, based thereon, make your determination of the extent to which the subject currently has a problem sustaining employment.
71. Job skills to secure a job--Does the subject have sufficient skills for acquiring adequate employment? Is more training or schooling necessary or desirable? Is the probationer satisfied with the skills she or he has? "Adequate employment" here means employment that produces a net income sufficient for meeting basic human needs (shelter, food and transportation) with funds left over for savings, playful activities and other opportunities for human development.
72. Psychiatric/psychological therapy--Is there a demonstrated need for psychiatric/psychological therapy (hereafter, therapy)? "4's" and "5's" should be limited to cases that have been diagnosed by a psychiatrist/psychologist and this should reflect their recommendation. Assume that everyone can benefit from counseling and then go beyond that to assess the extent to which this probationer needs therapy (as opposed to less intense and less structured counseling) by a professional therapist

is not a critical need for such. A "4" indicates that some therapeutic intervention is necessary while a "5" represents a critical situation in which major intervention is very desirable.

73. Family/marital relationships--Consider at least all of the following in assessing this variable: presence/absence of supportive family relationships resulting in problem or need; feelings for mother, father and/or siblings; strength/weakness of the marital relationship; ability to get along with members of extended family (e.g., uncles, aunts, cousins, etc.).

If the person is not "a family person," that per se is not a problem. Absence of family is not a problem per se, either. There is no problem if a person is a well-adjusted, basically happy loner. But if there are occasional arguments, fights or other disturbances, then there may be something to look at more closely.

74. Overall current home environment--This variable basically assesses whether or not the person has a supportive home environment. The degree to which such an environment is absent, the higher the degree to which this should be reported as a need, except in the case of very well-adjusted loners. If a person is living at home with parents or family and there are no significant problems, then you will select a "1" or a "2". If the person is transient and has no place to call home, and wishes there were a place to call home, then there is a need. The extent of the need must be reviewed with the probationer.

75. Physical health, medical needs--Does the subject have any unattended wounds, undiagnosed ailments, pains or other physical conditions that require medical attention? Does the person need dental or optical care? Is the subject hypoglycemic, prone to coronary problems, or diabetic? If the medical need is exclusively related to a narcotic problem, then do not rank this item as high as you otherwise would have. Be sure to still reflect a drug-related health problem herethough.

76. Financial management--Does the subject seem to manage her or his finances in such a fashion that is satisfactory to him/her? Or does money seem to disappear resulting in a helpless feeling? Is the person familiar with the ins and outs of filing the income tax forms, budgeting funds for necessities, savings, etc.? Are a lot of bills due that just do not seem to get paid?

77. Interpersonal relationships other than family/marital--Does the subject basically get along well with other people, or do conflicts, arguments, fights, etc., frequently result? Does the

person have any persons considered to be true friends (considered so by the subject, not by the probation officer), or does the subject have difficulty with intimacy? The fact that a person may be a loner is not to be considered a problem necessarily.

78. Housing needs--Does the person live in or have access to adequate housing? "Adequate housing" means a sound physical structure with functional plumbing and electricity that is within the economic means of the probationer. Or is the housing in which the person resides dilapidated? Are too many persons crowded into too few rooms? As a rule of thumb, if three or more persons have to sleep in a single room, this is to be considered too crowded.
79. Day care needs--Does this household have a need for day care? There is a need, for example, if a mother or father wishes to work but cannot because of dependent children in the home.
80. Transportation needs--Consider availability of mass transit, location of residence vis-a-vis place of employment and location of site for probation reporting, ability to secure and/or maintain private means of transportation, etc.
81. Legal needs--Consider pending legal actions, availability of counsel, etc. If there are pending legal actions, there is a need. What is the extent to which the person currently requires legal services and to what extent are those services available to this person?
82. Food, nutrition--Does the subject have two or three nutritious meals a day, or does he/she primarily consume so-called junk foods (e.g., soda, chips, sweets, etc.)? Is food readily available in the subject's home? Are there any visible effects that the person eats poorly (e.g., moodiness, tired all the time, etc.), especially in terms of negative results upon the person's behavior and mental functioning?
83. Ability to read and write effectively in English--Does the subject have any difficulty understanding written materials or submitting materials in writing to the probation department, court or other agency? Is there an indication from a school or other record that the person reads at a level below the 12th grade level?
84. Ability to speak and understand English--Are there any limitations on the subject's ability to speak English effectively or comprehend another English-speaking person? Some people try to hide their difficulty with English so be sure to avoid a superficial judgment.

A nod of the head does not necessarily mean comprehension. If you are bilingual and communicate with the subject in a language other than English, you should evaluate this variable in terms of the subject's English language ability apart from your relationship. A person fully non-communicative in English would be ranked "5".

85. Sexuality--Consider only the following in making your assessment of this item: the extent to which there was a sexual element in the crime or offense; whether or not the person engages in unreported crimes with a sexual element; whether or not the person is content with their sexual identify; the extent to which the person engages in sexual activities in an irresponsible manner (i.e., producing unwanted children, unfamiliarity with contraception, etc.).

Do not consider the following in making your assessment of this item: the person's sexual preference (i.e., neither homosexuality nor heterosexuality is a problem per se); the person's private sexual conduct not included in the former paragraph.

86. Amenability to probation--The basic question to be considered here is the extent to which the defendant would benefit from a term of probation. This item is one of the mitigating factors that judges are to consider for withholding or imposing a sentence of imprisonment (see N.J.S.A. 2C:44-1b(10)). The following must be considered in making this assessment. First, the person's past probation terms, if any. How did the defendant benefit from them? Was probation revoked or terminated without improvement or in an otherwise negative fashion? Is he or she likely to similarly fail to benefit from probation this time, or have there been changes in the person's life that lead you to conclude that she or he would do better on probation this time? Further, consider changes in the probation service that may make it more beneficial to the defendant.

Second, consider the resources available through probation. Are there resources available from which the defendant could benefit, particularly as they compare to similar services in custodial settings?

Finally, is there any indication that the defendant would take advantage of those resources? Is she/he motivated to benefit from probationary supervision and opportunities afforded through probation?

Do not consider the following in making your assessment of this variable: protection of the community and the need to do so by imprisoning this person; deterrence of the defendant and others from committing crimes.

Disposition Profile

87. Disposition--Pick the code that is correct for the sentence that resulted in this defendant being placed on probation. In the case of multiple adjudications being disposed of simultaneously, report the sentence of the offense group identified in the section, "Nature and Circumstances of the Offense." Remember, do not include disposition information from matters being adjudicated that are independent from the probation segment of the sentence.
88. Number of days to be served as a condition of probation--Under the Penal Code a person may be required to serve a term of imprisonment as a condition of probation (NJSA 2C:45-1c). For the purposes of this item, consider both custodial portions of the so-called split sentences ordered prior to September 1, 1979 and custodial conditions of probation effective after September 1, 1979, pursuant to the new statutes. Therefore, if in recouping data on old cases you find someone sentenced to a custodial term (excluding probationers sent to a state institution, as this, technically, is not to be considered to be a split sentence) to be followed by a probation term, include here the length of that custodial term. If a portion of that time is credited as time served, be sure to include that as well. Therefore, if a person was in county jail for six months prior to sentencing, and the disposition was six months county jail plus three years of probation, credit for time served, then you would place 180 in spaces 78-80 (having multiplied six months times thirty days per month). Do not subtract time not spent in jail that was deferred as good time. The item is time sentenced, not time spent. Do not include here state or county custodial terms that are suspended.
89. APMIS Identification--Having just ended card two we must enter the identification number again to begin card three. Enter the numbers you put in spaces 1-8 on page 1 of the APMIS I in these first eight spaces. Space 9 here will always have a "3" in it.
90. Month, day and year of sentence--Write the two digits that correspond to the month in spaces 10-11, the two digits that correspond to the day in spaces 12-13 and the last two digits of the year of the date of sentencing in spaces 14-15.
91. Identification of sentencing judge--Consult the Judge Codes to determine the number to be entered in spaces 16-22. If a judge's name does not appear in the list of codes, write the judge's name and jurisdiction to the left of the item. PAMS staff will make a note of the missing judge, ascertain the appropriate number, make the correction on the APMIS I form, and, on a periodic basis, issue updated lists of judges. If the judge is from out-of-state, then place all "9's" in spaces 16-22.
92. Maximum number of years imprisonment suspended (0's if none)--Place the maximum total number of years of the disposition. If the term is indeterminate, then place "99" in the spaces. If the amount of time is any period of time less than 1½ years, place "01" in the spaces.

93. Length of probation term--Place the total number of months of probation that the judge has ordered for the defendant in spaces 25-26. If the judge has not specified a period of time, place "98" in spaces 25-26.
- 94-96. Special Condition #1, Special Condition #2, and Special Condition #3--If the judge has ordered any special conditions or any sets of special conditions, then consult the Special Conditions Codes, identify the appropriate code number for each condition, and place them in the appropriate spaces. Enter the special conditions in the order in which the judge has ordered them. If there is no apparent order, then place the conditions in the following sequence: most restrictive or most confining first, least restrictive or least confining last. If the judge ordered one or another special condition, enter only the one that is the most restrictive. Do not enter both. If a special condition is not found in the list of codes, write the condition under the variable number in which it should be entered. This list will be constantly updated and new codes sent to the field on a periodic basis. If four or more special conditions are ordered, then record here the first three that the judge ordered or, if there is no apparent order to the judge's sentence, record the three that are the most restrictive.
97. Total number of special conditions ordered--Place the total number of special conditions the judge has ordered for the defendant in space 36. Do not count activities required of the probation department as special conditions for the probationer. For example, if the probation department is to get back to the judge by a certain date, that is not a special condition for the purposes of this or the former three variables. Special conditions pertain only to conditions imposed on the probationer.
98. Fine + Court Costs--Discern whether or not the judge ordered a fine and/or court costs. If so, then place the sum of the fine plus the court costs in spaces 37-41. If the total is more than \$99,997, then place 99997 in spaces 37-41. If a fine was ordered, but suspended, place 99998 in spaces 37-41. If a fine was ordered, but the amount was to be determined at a later date and the amount has still not been specified, then place 99999 in spaces 37-41. If the amount has been determined since the date of sentencing, then put the total amount in these spaces per the directions above.
99. This is an item for internal APMIS data processing. Simply place in spaces 42-46 the digits you placed in spaces 37-41.
100. Means of paying fine--Discern how the court desires the fine to be paid, select the code number appropriate for that mode of payment and place the code number in space 47.

101. Restitution--Discern whether or not the judge ordered a dollar amount or its equivalent for restitution. If so, place the total amount in whole dollars, rounding off if necessary, in spaces 48-52. Follow the instructions in item #98 for other variations in the amount.
102. This is another item for internal APMIS data processing. Like item #99, place the integers you wrote in spaces 48-52 in spaces 53-57.
103. Means of paying restitution--Discern how the court desires the restitution to be paid. Select the code number appropriate for that means of payment and place the number in space 58.

Probation Management Information Data

104. Type of presentence investigation--Place in space 59 the code number that identifies the type of presentence investigation that was conducted on this probationer for this sentencing event and place the code number in space 59.
105. Immediate origin of the probationer--From what jurisdiction is this person being received for supervision in your department? Note that if this is the second (or third ...) time the APMIS I has been completed on this probationer that the correct code is not the particular sentencing court. Rather, the correct code is #8, "Partially concurrent with prior term included in APMIS."
106. Probation Officer assigned for supervision--Look up the code number for the probation officer in the Probation Officer Codes and write that number in spaces 61-66. If the officer's name is not found in that list, write the officer's full name and title below the item and leave the spaces blank. The name will be included in an updated list at a later point in time and AOC staff will insert the correct number.
107. This is the third variable for internal APMIS data processing use. Simply place the same integers you placed in spaces 61-66 in spaces 67-72.
108. Number of days from date probation term began to date of first substantive contact between supervising probation officer & subject--Beginning on the day the probation term begins, count the total number of days that passed until the day of the first

substantive contact between the supervising officer and the probationer. "First substantive contact" means the first session between the probationer and the officer in which a quantity of time in excess of 15 minutes is invested in establishing the relationship beyond mere superficiality. That means that a matter-of-course signing of probationer forms (e.g., conditions of probation, etc.) is not to be counted as such a contact, unless a significant effort is made to establish the relationship beyond that activity.

If the sentence has been appealed and if probation has been stayed pursuant to R. 3:23-5c, for the purposes of this variable the date the probation term begins is that date that the appeal process is complete and the relief from order of probation has been canceled by the court.

In the case of transfer cases, the number of days to be entered for this item is the total number of days from the time the probation officer is advised that the case has been assigned to his or her caseload to the date of the first substantive contact.

109. Probationer classification--Find the code that corresponds with the classification of this probationer that has been made by your department. If your department has no classification system, then leave space 75 blank.

Note that each case should initially be classified as maximum, medium or minimum. Only as the term proceeds should anyone ever come under bench warrant status.

110. Parole status at beginning of probation term--Determine whether or not the probationer is also on parole at the time the probation term begins. Place the appropriate code number in space 76.
- 111-116. These items on page 10 are included in order to set up the deck of cards for every probationer. Write in the probationer's identification number in each item, as indicated.

APMIS II--THE UPDATE REPORTS

Introduction

The APMIS II consists of thirteen separate reports that enable the system to update the Adult Profile Report and thereby monitor significant changes of status during a probationer's term. The thirteen reports are subdivided into four types of reports, as the following list illustrates:

Reports of general and miscellaneous variables

APMIS II-A Monthly Update Report

Reports of violation hearings

APMIS II-B	Report of First Violation Hearing
APMIS II-C	Report of Second Violation Hearing
APMIS II-D	Report of Third Violation Hearing
APMIS II-E	Report of Fourth Violation Hearing
APMIS II-F	Report of Fifth Violation Hearing

Reports of convictions for new offenses

APMIS II-G	Report of First Subsequent Conviction
APMIS II-H	Report of Second Subsequent Conviction

The first report noted above, Monthly Update Report, is completed on a monthly basis and captures data on all probationers for whom there have been certain changes. The other reports, though, are completed only when an appropriate event has necessitated the completion of the pertinent report. For example, none of the reports of new conviction will ever be completed on the probationer who is never convicted of a new offense during a term. Therefore if a probationer is never violated, convicted or brought to court on a review/modification hearing, none of those reports will ever be completed for that probationer. Each report is discussed in detail individually in the following pages.

MONTHLY UPDATE REPORT

Introduction

The Monthly Update Report is the only APMIS report that is not limited to a single probationer. Rather, it is a report on which you report a number of changes for all probationers whose status changed during that month. Every discreet change will be reported individually on this report as outlined below.

When Is Data to Be Recorded on the Monthly Update Report (APMIS II-A)?

One or more pieces of information are to be recorded on the APMIS II-A every time any of the following events occurs:

1. A bench warrant is issued or withdrawn.
2. A probationer is transferred to another jurisdiction.
3. A probationer is reassigned to a new supervising probation officer.
4. The probationer moves to a new municipality.
5. The probationer is placed in a sentenced custodial term or a sentenced custodial term ends.
6. The probationer is discharged from parole supervision or begins a period of parole supervision.
7. The probationer's classification is altered.
8. The probationer absconds.
9. The probationer begins a residential treatment program or leaves a residential treatment program.
10. There is a significant change in a data item on the APMIS I.

How Is the Monthly Update Report to Be Completed?

There are three steps to follow in entering data correctly on the APMIS II-A. First, enter the probationer's identification number in the first column of spaces. Second, enter the number of the item (as per the list on the following page) that has changed in the space in the middle column. Third, enter the code number date, whichever is applicable, in the last column of spaces in the same row.

For example, let's say a probationer has been transferred to Georgia. First, find the probationer's 8-digit APMIS identification number and place that number in the first column. Second, you review the list of update items and find the item that refers to transfer to a new jurisdiction. You will find it to be item #5, so you will then write "5" in the space in the middle column immediately to the right of the APMIS identification number you placed in the space in the first column. Finally, consult the County/State Codes to determine the appropriate code number for the state of Georgia, which is 32, and write "32" in the next space to the right in the third column. If there is another update item for this same probationer, then place that change on the next line or lines. This example would appear on the APMIS II-A instrument as follows:

1. 12345678 5 32

Record every change on the Monthly Update Report on the same day that the change is brought to your attention. Keep a running account of these changes as they occur. If you wait until the end of the month and then try to recount what happened during the month, important data will be lost.

When Is the Monthly Update Report Due to the Supervisor?

This report is due to your supervisor on the first Monday of every month. If there has been no change at all in the status of any probationer on your caseload, you will still need to submit this report to your supervisor. This is the only way to ensure that all of your probationers have been covered. The submission of a blank report means that no changes have occurred during the course of the month for your clients.

When to Report Changes in Data Supplied in the Original APMIS I

From the time the APMIS I is completed until the time the probationer completes the term many changes could be effected in that original data. New information comes to light, perceptions change, etc. We are not interested in doing that because it would be a never-ending task. But we do need to provide for changes that report significantly erroneous data found in the original APMIS I for a client. For example, let's say that six months into the term the probation officer discovers that a probationer has a significant alcohol problem whereas none was reported on the APMIS I. In that case, the alcohol variable of the APMIS I needs to be revised accordingly. Therefore, updates of the APMIS I should be made only when there is a significant error in the APMIS I to correct. "Significant" is defined as any inaccuracy whose correct code is three points or more on the five-point scale away from the original number entered for the item. For example, if you entered a "1" for Housing needs and subsequent information suggests that a 4

would be more correct, then you would report this on the Monthly Update Report. Other examples of significant errors include the following: any error in the disposition matters or probation management information data at the end of the report, an incorrect State Bureau of Identification number, the wrong month or year of birth, the wrong most serious final charge, and data for history of alcohol or other narcotic treatment if it is two or more points away from the originally entered codes. Examples of incorrect data that should not be corrected include wrong day of birth date (only month and year are important enough to change), highest level of education completed (unless it is grossly in error, such as a B.A. instead of 7th grade), etc. Remember--this provision is for data that was wrong when it was entered, not data that changes during the course of the probation term. So if the current educational status, for example, was "Not studying or enrolled" at the beginning of the term and the probationer has begun college, then you do not update this item.

When you have such an error to correct on this report here is the proper way to enter that correction. Just as with APMIS II-A items, first you place the probationer's APMIS identification number in the space in the first column, then you find the number of the item that is being updated. The difference is that you must prefix the item number with a "I" like this: I-78, for example, for item #78. Then you would find the correct code number for that item and place that number in the space in the third column of that row.

Discussion of APMIS II-A Variables

1. Reason for first change of supervising probation officer within the department--The first time a probationer is reassigned to a new probation officer variable #'s 1 and 2 must be completed. This item identifies the primary reason for which the case has been reassigned and item #2 identifies the new supervising probation officer. Review the available codes and pick the one that best explains the reason why the case was reassigned.
2. Identification of new probation officer for case--Consult the Probation Officer Codes and place the code number for the new supervising officer in the third column. This item is completed every time items 1, 3 or 4 is reported. In other words, any time a change in a case's supervising officer occurs both the reason for the change (be it first, second or third change) and the identification of the new officer must be completed.
- 3-4. Reason for second change of supervising probation officer, Reason for third change of supervising probation officer--These items are to be completed when a probationer is assigned a new supervising probation officer a second or third time, even if the new officer is the first officer. If there are changes in supervising officer beyond three, complete the information as if it were the third change in supervising probation officer. For example, if a person has been changed to a fifth supervising probation officer, you will place a "3" (representing Reason for third change of supervising probation officer) in the middle column of the APMIS II-A and you will place the identification number of the new officer in the third column, even though it is actually the fourth change of supervising probation officer.
5. Transfer of supervision to another jurisdiction--Consult the County/State Codes and write the code number of the receiving jurisdiction in the third column, following the "5" in the middle column and the probationer's identification number in the first column.
6. Change of municipality of residence--When the probationer moves to a new municipality, consult the Municipality Codes and enter the appropriate code number of the new municipality in the third column. If the probationer has moved but the code number remains the same, this item is not to be filled out.
7. Change in custodial status--It may be that a probationer is sentenced to a custodial term during the probation term. NOTE: this variable should be reported only when a probationer has been in such sentenced custody for a minimum of seven days and is still in custody at the end of the month when you are submitting the Monthly Update Report to your supervisor or when the person has been sentenced to a custodial term of two months or more.

8. Date of change in custodial status--Every time you complete item #7 you must indicate the date of that change by completing item #8. If the probationer has been placed in custody, note the date that the term begins. When the person is released, you will cite this item again and supply the date that the person is discharged. It is sufficient to note only the month and year.
9. Change in parole status--Sometimes probationers are on parole when they begin their probation terms and a few may begin a parole term while on probation. This variable should be reported only when a probationer is either discharged from parole or begins to be supervised by the Bureau of Parole.
10. Change in classification--This variable should be reported any time a person is placed on absconder status, a bench warrant is issued for the probationer, or a decision has been reached to alter the probationer's classification. Place the code number of the new classification in the third column.
11. Change in residential program--Complete this variable any time a probationer is placed in a residential program (e.g., narcotic program, hospital) or is released from such a program or institution. Admission to a residential program should be reported only when the probationer has been at the institution for a minimum of seven days and is still a resident of that or a similar institution at the end of the month when you are preparing to turn in your Monthly Update Report to your supervisor.
12. Bench warrant issued--Any time a bench warrant is issued, whether for violation of probation or any other reason, this item is to be reported on the APMIS II-A if the warrant is still in effect when the Monthly Update Report is submitted at the end of the month.
13. Bench warrant withdrawn--Any time you have reported on the APMIS II-A that a bench warrant has been issued, if that warrant is ever withdrawn then you must report the date of that withdrawal.

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VIOLATION HEARING REPORTS

Introduction

The APMIS provides for capturing up to five separate violation hearings during a given probationer's term. There is a separate report for each of the five instances. Each report has the identical format and is to be completed the same way. Therefore one set of instructions is sufficient to describe how to complete all five reports.

When Is a Report of Violation Hearing to Be Completed?

A report of violation hearing is to be completed every time a probationer is violated and the matter is heard and disposed of in court EXCEPT when the violation hearing results in a revocation of probation and the termination of probation. If a violation hearing results in the termination of probation, then the Termination Report, APMIS III, is to be completed, not an APMIS II report.

The report is to be completed when the violation is cleared in court. When the matter is finally resolved, and only then, the correct report is to be completed and submitted to your supervisor. The appropriate report is due to your supervisor within five working days of the completed action.

If a probationer has been violated but the violation is withdrawn before a court hearing occurs, then no report of violation hearing is to be completed.

There are five separate Reports of Violation Hearing. If a probationer is never violated, none will ever be completed. Each is to be completed only when a violation hearing occurs that requires a report. For example, on the occasion of the first violation hearing the Report of First Violation Hearing is completed. When the second violation hearing has passed, then the Report of Second Violation Hearing is completed, etc., through five instances. In the unlikely event of six or more violation hearings, take any one of the violation hearing reports and scratch through the number assigned to it and insert the correct number, such that if there is a sixth violation hearing, you will take a Report of First Violation Hearing, scratch through the word "First" and write "Sixth" below. Then complete the report as you would otherwise.

Instructions for Completing a Report of Violation Hearing

Before you begin entering the data that describes the hearing, be sure to print or type the probationer's name in the spaces at the top of the page and then insert the probationer's APMIS identification number in the other set of spaces. Also, be sure you have secured the correct reporting format for this violation.

1. Reason for first (or other) violation--What was the precipitating factor that led to the violation of this probationer? Pick the first code that is most descriptive of that primary reason. If none of them applies, then place a "9" (other) in the appropriate space and make a brief and clear statement of the reason in the space provided for that purpose.

2. What happened to the violation?--Did the court sustain the violation, i.e., find the probationer guilty of the charge(s), or did the court find the charge(s) unsupported? Review the codes and write the code number of the correct one in the appropriate space. If neither the first nor second code satisfies the question, then pick the third code and write a brief statement of the outcome of the violation hearing in the space provided and write "3" in the appropriate space.
3. Month and year violation effectively disposed of--Determine the date on which the judge completed action on this violation and write the two digits of the month in spaces 24-25 and the last two digits of the year of that action in spaces 26-27.
4. Results of violation event--There are six items that may be changed by virtue of the judge's action on a violation matter that are being recorded in these reports. If no changes affect the original sentence, all items in #4 will remain blank. Otherwise, complete only those items which have changed.
 - A. Number of months probation term extended--If the probation term is extended beyond the original sentence, then write the total number of months beyond the originally expected termination date that have been added to the term. If the amount is less than one month, enter "1" if the new time results in the expected termination date being postponed into another month. If the new amount of time results in no change in the month in which the probation term is expected to end, then leave this item blank.
 - B. Number of months custody imposed (probation being continued)--Count the total number of months the probationer has been sentenced to serve in custody that will be served during the probation term, unless this sentence has been suspended and no time will be served in custody.
 - C. Modification of fine--total amount added--Write the amount of fine and/or court costs that are added beyond what was ordered in the original sentence. If there is a reduction in the original amount of fine and/or court costs, then you must also complete this item on a Report of Review/Modification.
 - D. Modification of restitution--total amount added--Follow the instructions just supplied for item 4.C.
 - E, F. First new special condition added, Second new special condition added--If the judge orders any new special conditions that were not included in the original sentence, consult the Special Conditions Codes and enter the code numbers in the appropriate spaces. If there is only one new condition, leave F blank.

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SUBSEQUENT CONVICTIONS REPORTS

Introduction

The APMIS provides for capturing up to four separate convictions that occur subsequent to the beginning of the probation term. There is a separate report for each of the four instances and each report has the same format. The following instructions apply to each of the four reports.

When Is a Report of Subsequent Conviction to Be Completed?

A Report of Subsequent Conviction is to be completed every time a probationer is convicted of new charges (EXCEPT FOR MOTOR VEHICLE OFFENSES pursuant to Title 39 AND FOR PROBATION VIOLATIONS) any time during the probation term unless at the time of the conviction the probation term is revoked, in which case the Termination Report should be completed. Even if the offense were committed prior to the beginning of this probation term, as long as the conviction occurs during the term, a Report of Subsequent Conviction should be completed.

Instructions for Completing Reports of Subsequent Convictions

Write the probationer's name in the spaces provided at the top of the page and then enter the correct APMIS identification number in the spaces provided. Then you can proceed with data entry.

- 1-2. Most serious offense, Second most serious offense--Consult the Offense Codes, follow the instructions provided for the APMIS I for items 9-11, and place the correct code numbers in the appropriate spaces.
3. Total number of final charges in new adjudication--Follow the instructions for item #12 in the APMIS I section of the Handbook and place the correct total in the appropriate space.
4. Month and year of sentencing--Discern the date on which the judge sentenced the probationer and place the two digits of the month in the first two spaces and the last two digits of the year in the second pair of spaces. The date on which the disposition was made is not entered.
5. Month and year offense was committed--Determine the date on which the probationer committed the offense and place the month of the act in the first two spaces and the last two digits of the year in the second set of spaces. Again, the day of the action is not captured. If the offense(s) took place over an extended period of time, enter the date of the earliest offense or earliest indictable action of the offense.

6. Jurisdiction of sentencing court--Determine the correct sentencing court of this action, find the code number and place that number in the appropriate space.
7. Identification of sentencing judge--Consult the Judge Codes, find the correct code and place that code in the appropriate spaces. If the judge's name is not found, write the full name under the item and leave the spaces blank.
8. Disposition--Review the available codes and place the code number of the best code in the appropriate space.
9. Changes in current probation term--Complete only those items under this heading that actually affect the current probation term. If there is no change in any of the original sentencing effects, then all of these items will be left blank. All items that have not been enlarged or otherwise changed will be left blank.
 - A. Number of months probation term extended by virtue of the consecutive nature of the sentence--Determine whether this sentence adds any time to the normally expected termination date of the original sentence. If it does, then write the total number of months that original term is, in effect, being extended in the appropriate spaces. Otherwise leave it blank.

NOTE: If there are any months entered for this item, you must activate a new APMIS sequence for the probationer. That means that the APMIS I must be completed for this offense. When the prior probation term ends, then the Termination Report will be completed and the new term begins or continues. Your supervisor will assign a totally new APMIS identification number and you will begin collecting service statistics that will be reported on the Termination Report for this new probation term when it ends.
 - B. Additional fine ordered--If there is a fine and/or court cost as part of this disposition, place the total amount of either or the sum of both in the correct spaces, rounding off to whole dollars. Otherwise leave the spaces blank.
 - C. Additional restitution ordered--If any amount of restitution in addition to the original amount, if any, is ordered, then place that total amount in the correct spaces, rounding off to whole dollars. Otherwise leave the spaces blank.
 - D, E. First new special condition ordered, Second new special condition ordered--Consult the Special Conditions Codes and place the correct code numbers for any special conditions that are ordered on the occasion of sentencing for this new conviction. Leave spaces blank where there is (are) no special conditions.

F. Custodial term imposed, probation being continued

- 1) Number of months to be served with probation time interrupted pursuant to 2C:44-5g(2)--The Penal Code reads, "If the defendant is sentenced to imprisonment of 1 year or less, the period of the suspension or probation shall not run during the period of such imprisonment." When a probationer is sentenced under this statute, place the total number of months of this sentence in the appropriate spaces.
- 2) Number of months to be served while probation term continues, probation term not being interrupted--This item records periods of incarceration prior to the effective date of the Penal Code when a person was sentenced to incarceration to be served without an interruption of the running of the probation term's time. Place the correct number of months of such sentence in the appropriate spaces. Do not count actually served time but sentenced time.

REVIEW/MODIFICATION REPORTS

Introduction

The APMIS provides for reporting on three instances of review and/or modification of terms of a sentence. Each report is identical in format and the following instructions govern their completion.

When Is a Review/Modification Report to Be Completed?

A Review/Modification Report is to be completed every time a reduction in the amount of fine or restitution has been ordered as noted in prior sections of this Handbook or when there is some court action otherwise that results in any other modification of fine or restitution, or adds or deletes special conditions.

The due date of the report is one week after the effective date of the modification. Only those items that are affected should be completed. All other items should be left blank.

Instructions for Completing a Review/Modification Report

Fill in the spaces provided at the top of the page for the probationer's name and APMIS identification number. Then proceed to complete any of the items that have been modified.

- 1-2. First new special condition added, Second new special condition added--These two items provide for reporting new special conditions that the court has ordered during the probation term. Find the code number by consulting the Special Conditions Codes and place that number in the appropriate spaces. If three or more special conditions have been added, record the two that are most restrictive of the probationer's liberty or the most punitive.
- 3-4. First special condition deleted, Second special condition deleted--These two items provide for reporting the elimination by the court of any special conditions formerly ordered. Find the code number by consulting the Special Conditions Codes and place that number in the appropriate spaces. If three or more special conditions have been deleted, record the two that were most restrictive of the probationer's liberty or the most punitive.
5. Modification of fine, total fine amount after modification--If the judge has added to or subtracted from the original amount of fine plus court costs, place the new total in the appropriate spaces.
6. Modification of restitution, total amount after modification--If the judge has added to or subtracted from the original amount of restitution ordered, place the new total in the appropriate spaces.

7. Court ordering modification--Identify the court that has ordered these modifications and place the appropriate code number in the respective spaces.

The Adult Termination Report, APMIS III, is the last component of the APMIS. It reviews the activities of the probationer, the probation service and outside agencies. Once the APMIS III has been completed, then analysis of a probationer at two points of time--beginning and end of the term--can be made, reviewing significant events in the duration of the term as well.

When Is the APMIS III to Be Completed?

The APMIS III should be completed

1. When a probationer is discharged from probation altogether;
2. When a probationer has been discharged from one term but is continuing on the consecutive portion of another term. The APMIS III is completed for the first term at its termination and again at the conclusion of the consecutive term.

The APMIS III is due to your supervisor at the time you submit a request for order of termination (in those counties in which judges sign such orders) or on the date of termination (in those counties in which judges do not participate in the termination process).

How Is the APMIS III to Be Completed?

Two APMIS III Worksheets have been prepared to facilitate the completion of the APMIS III at the end of the term. Work Sheet #1 is to be used for cases who are in a probation term that was not continuous in part from or consecutive to a prior probation term. In those cases where a probationer has completed one term but begun or continued another, then use the Work Sheet #2. The Work Sheet #2 should be used beginning with the first day after the prior probation term is ended. Do not recoup services rendered prior to the beginning of this new period of probation. That would result in confusing duplication.

The supervising probation officer should keep the worksheet up-to-date. When one of the services has been provided, a hash mark should be made on the appropriate line no later than one working day after the service was rendered or the day after the officer becomes aware of it. The Worksheet is a tool for the supervising officer and is not intended to function as part of caseload management supervision by your superiors.

You are encouraged to conduct a close out interview with the probationer. This interview, while preferably conducted in person, may be conducted by telephone. Be sure to ascertain any data elements of the APMIS which you do not already know and take advantage of this opportunity to wish the probationer well.

As a general principle, remember that the data for the APMIS III is either a total quantity or quality of services delivered during the term or an assessment of the probationer's status as of the last day of the term.

Before completing any of the data items be sure to insert the probationer's name and APMIS identification number in the spaces provided at the top of the page.

1. Month, day and year of termination--Identify the actual, official date on which the probationer was discharged from probation. In some counties this is the day the judge signs an Order Granting Termination, in some counties it is the day that the term runs its natural course, and there are certainly other possible ways as well of identifying the termination date. For example, if probation has been revoked it is the date of the revocation.
2. Reason for termination--Consult the Reason for Termination Codes and identify the one that accounts for the termination. When there is any doubt as to the correct code, choose the code that has the highest number.
3. Number of jurisdictions other than your county having supervised case--Count the total number of times other jurisdictions supervised this probationer during this term. If supervision was transferred to another county, returned to your county, then transferred to that same county again, you would enter a "2" in space 44. If the person never was supervised by another jurisdiction, then enter a "0" in space 44.

Services Provided by Probation Department to Subject

4. Personal counseling (number of sessions)--"Personal counseling" is defined as any counseling session in which a probation officer spends a minimum of fifteen minutes in providing counseling assistance to the probationer that is not included in items 5 through 9. Counseling does not include, for the purposes of this variable, casual conversation, catching up on stories, gathering information, completing forms, or other similar activities. Rather, counseling includes any dialog in which the probationer seeks or receives assistance in clarification about courses of action or thought. Place a hash mark on the Worksheet every time such an event occurs.

5. Group counseling (number of sessions)--"Group counseling" refers to counseling sessions led by probation officers in which two or more probationers are present. This item should capture all group counseling sessions the probationer attends EXCEPT those that are related specifically to family/marital, alcohol or other drug use counseling.
6. Professional therapy (number of sessions)--"Professional therapy" is any therapy or counseling provided by professional psychologists, psychiatrists, psychiatric social workers or other licensed therapists who are full-time or part-time employees of your probation department. The item of count is the number of times a probationer is counseled by such a therapist.
7. Family/marital counseling (number of sessions)--"Family/marital counseling" is any counseling provided by probation officers that is uniquely for the purpose of addressing family and/or marital issues. If the partners of the marriage or family are together for the counseling, this counseling is not to be considered group counseling (cf. item #5 above).
8. Alcohol counseling/treatment (number of sessions)--"Alcohol counseling" is any counseling/therapy rendered because of an alcohol abuse problem. This includes group sessions if they are led by probation officers or other probation staff.
9. All other drug abuse counseling/treatment (number of sessions)--"All other drug abuse counseling/treatment" refers to any therapy/counseling rendered because of a drug problem other than alcohol. If a person is in a residential program, solicit from that program the number of therapy sessions, individual and group, in which the probationer participated. The total number throughout the entire probation term is the number that should ultimately be entered in spaces 55-56.

Services Provided Subject on Referral by Non-probation Personnel

10. Psychological/psychiatric therapy - public (number of sessions)--"Psychological/psychiatric therapy - public" refers to all therapy provided by a psychologist or psychiatrist in the public sector (e.g., a county mental health clinic). Count the total number of therapy sessions and place that number in spaces 57-58.
11. Psychological/psychiatric therapy - private (number of sessions)--This item is the same as #10 except it captures the number of therapy sessions provided by a therapist with whom the probationer has contracted privately.

12. Family/marital counseling (number of sessions)--"Family/marital counseling" refers to any counseling provided to a probationer and/or family member(s) that focuses on a family or marital situation, when the counseling service is provided by non-probation professionals.
13. Alcohol related--Review the available codes and select the one that best summarizes the alcohol treatment, if any, that has been provided by non-probation sources. Place the code number in space #63.
14. All other drug abuse program participation--Review the codes in item #13, select the code that best summarizes any other drug abuse treatment that was provided by non-probation agencies/persons and place the number in space #64.
15. Employment assistance/counseling (number of contacts)--Count here the number of times the probationer visited employment agencies, sought assistance from outside agencies in the preparation of resumes and the development of job-securing skills, etc. Do not count actual job interviews. Place the total number of such contacts in spaces 65-66.
16. Job training--Select the code that best summarizes the job training that the probation received during the term and place the code number in space 67.

Education

17. Educational level at termination--Determine the highest number of school years completed by the date of termination and pick the code most representative of that number.
18. Schooling during term--Pick the code that best summarizes the probationer's contact with schools of any kind during the probation term and place its number in space 70.

Employment Record

19. Employment status at termination--Determine the probationer's employment status on the date of termination, select the best code and place its number in space 71. Should you need further assistance with this variable, consult the directions for item #67 in the APMIS I on page E-16 of the Handbook.
20. Employment history during probation term--Review the available codes carefully, select the one most representative of the proba-

tioner's employment history throughout the entire term and place the code number in space 72.

21. Number of months worked full-time during entire probation term-- Count the total number of months throughout the entire term during which the probationer worked full-time and place the total in spaces 73-74. If the employment record was off-and-on, then add up all the bits and pieces for a total sum. Consult the instructions for APMIS I item #62 on page E-15 of the Handbook for details on the nature of full-time work.
22. Number of months worked part-time during entire probation term-- Count the total number of months throughout the entire term during which the probationer worked part-time and place the total in spaces 75-76. Consult the instructions for APMIS I item #63 on page E-15 of the Handbook should you need assistance clarifying what is meant by part-time employment.
23. Number of months worked full-time during last 6 months of probation term-- Ascertain the total number of months that the probationer worked full-time in the last 6 months of the term. Even if the probationer were on probation for only 3 months, then find the total number of months worked full-time during that period. Place the total number of months in space 77.
24. APMIS Identification Number-- Place the probationer's identification number in spaces 1-8. Spaces 9-10 represent card 10 and will always have a "1" and a "0" in them.
25. Number of months worked part-time during last 6 months of probation term-- Determine the total number of months during the last 6 months of the term in which the probationer worked part-time and place the total number in space 11.
26. Gross weekly earnings in last week at most recent or current job-- Find out the total amount that the probationer was earning per week during the last full week of employment during the probation term. If the probationer never had any earnings at all during the term, then place "0's" in spaces 12-14. If the probationer worked only part-time for one week, and did no other work during the term, then place the amount earned in that week in spaces 12-14.
27. Total gross earnings in last 6 months of probation term-- Determine the total amount of earnings the probationer brought in during the last 6 months of the probation term. This is the total, gross amount, not take-home pay. It includes all earnings, whether full- or part-time. It does not include income from other sources (e.g., welfare, alimony, etc.). If you have any problems deciding what to include here, consult APMIS I item #64 as discussed on pages E-15-16 of this Handbook.

Health and Physical

28-38. All of these items are identical to items in the APMIS I, with the exception that they refer to the probationer as of the date of termination. While they may be self-explanatory, should you need directions or clarification, consult the respective item in the APMIS I instructions on pages E-12 and E-13.

Assessment of Probationer's Problems/Needs at End of Term

39-54. This is another complete set of items that is duplicated from the APMIS I except for their temporal frame of reference. Follow the same instructions as provided there, except make your assessments as of the probationer's status on the day of termination. These are not summaries of the probationer's progress during the term; rather, they should reflect only the probationer's status as you evaluate it at the very end of the term.

Other Assessments

55. Number of months during term probationer was under a bench warrant--
Count the total number of months during which a bench warrant was outstanding against this probationer and place the total number in spaces 47-48. If none, place "0's" in those spaces. If the probationer was under a warrant for less than half a month, place a "01" in spaces 47-48. Round off all other numbers.
56. Estimate of likelihood to recidivate in next twelve months (or in the first 12 months of release from custody for cases that have been discharged to custody)--Review the probationer very carefully and estimate the likelihood to which she or he will be convicted of another offense in the first 12 months after termination or in the first 12 months after release from a custodial institution in cases that are being discharged from probation to serve a custodial term. Pick the code that is closest to your assessment and place its number in space 49.
57. Status at discharge--summary of progress/regress--Which of the codes best summarizes the progress/regress that the probationer made during the term. This is an overall, whole-term assessment and should not be skewed necessarily by events at the end of the term if there are other considerations that outweigh them. If the probationer is being discharged as an absconder, do not make an overall assessment. Rather, pick code "6" and place that number in space 50.

Supervision Statistics - Supervising Probation Officer(s)

58. Supervision schedule during term--Review the possible codes, find the one that best summarizes the nature of supervision that was provided throughout the entire term, and place the code number in space 51.
59. Number of field visits with subject during term--Review the Worksheet you (and any other officers who supervised this case) have kept throughout the probationer's term, sum up the hash marks for this item, and place that total number in spaces 52-53. "Field visits" includes ONLY the following: face-to-face and telephone contacts with the probationer anywhere except in probation offices or the court. This does not include happenstance encounters with probationers (such as unexpectedly seeing them and visiting for a few minutes on the sidewalk).
60. Number of office contacts with subject during term--Review the Worksheet you (and any other officers who supervised this case) have kept throughout the probationer's term, sum up the hash marks for this item, and place the total in spaces 54-55. "Office contacts" basically refers to face-to-face contacts with the probationer in probation offices or in court.
61. Number of collateral activities--Review the Worksheet, add up the hash marks you and any colleagues may have placed there for this item, and place the total number in spaces 56-57. "Collateral activities" includes face-to-face or telephone contacts with any of the following: probationer's family, friend, employer, or attorney, court personnel (if it pertains to this probationer), and other significant persons in the probationer's life.

Supervision Statistics - Volunteer Probation Counselor(s)

- 62-64. These items are identical to items 59-61 except that they record statistics for volunteers. If the probationer never was supervised by a volunteer probation counselor, then place "0's" in the appropriate spaces. Otherwise, place the total number of contacts for each variable in the appropriate spaces, referring to the Worksheet maintained by the volunteer counselor(s).

Collections

65. Total amount of restitution collected--Review official departmental records, assess the total amount of restitution that the probationer actually did pay during the course of the term and place the total amount in spaces 64-68. Place "0's" in the spaces if none was ordered and "99998" if the entire amount was suspended.

66. Total amount of fine + court costs collected--Review official probation department accounting records, ascertain the exact amount of the total sum of fine plus court costs that was collected from this probationer during the term, and place the total amount in spaces 69-73. If neither was a part of the original sentence, place "0's" in these spaces. If the entire amount was suspended, then place "99998" in the spaces.

Supervisor's Summary of Case

- 67-69. These three items are to be left blank by the supervising probation officer. They will be completed by your supervisor. This data is primarily for management and research purposes and assesses the overall quality of the probation experience.
