Division of Corrections Juvenile Institutions
Calendar Year 1978

H I G H L I G H T S

- * A total of 1,278 juvenile males and 184 juvenile females were admitted to state juvenile correctional institutions in 1978, compared with 1,159 males and 183 females in 1977. Among the males, 670 were new admissions (including 66 state probation violators); 215 were returns from aftercare; 92 were returns from aftercare pending a revocation hearing; 41 were temporary admissions from probation pending a revocation hearing; 188 were returns from aftercare for replacement planning, and 72 were temporary admissions from probation for replacement planning. Among the females, 108 were new admissions (including 10 state probation violators); 13 were returns from aftercare; 17 were returns from aftercare pending a revocation hearing; 11 were temporary admissions from probation pending a revocation hearing; 14 were returns from aftercare for replacement planning, and 21 were temporary admissions from probation for replacement planning. (Tables 1 and 1-A)
- * Nearly one-half (48.1 percent) of the juveniles admitted in 1978 came from the six counties which comprise the Milwaukee and Southeastern Regions. The Milwaukee Region accounted for 27.8 percent of all admissions and the Southeastern Region for 20.3 percent. The Northern Region accounted for only 14.2 percent of all admissions but for the highest proportion (21.2 percent) of female admissions. (Table 3)
- * Median age of all juvenile males admitted in 1978 was 16.4 years, compared with 16.3 years in 1977. The median age of females declined to 16.1 years from 16.4 years in 1977. (Table 4)
- * Among new admissions, median age of the males was 16.2 years and of the females, 15.8 years, compared with 16.1 years and 15.9 years respectively in 1977. (Table 5)

- * About three-fourths of the juveniles admitted to correctional institutions during 1978 (75.8 percent of the males and 74.5 percent of the females) were White. Of the rest, 18.2 percent of the males and 19.0 percent of the females were Black, while 5.9 percent of the males and 6.5 percent of the females were Native Americans. The proportion of Black juveniles of both sexes has declined steadily since 1976. (Table 7)
- * More than three-fourths (77.3 percent) of the newly-admitted juvenile males had been involved in burglary (43.8 percent), auto theft (18.4 percent) or other theft (15.1 percent). Among the newly-admitted females, more than one-third (34.2 percent) had been involved in theft, other than auto theft, and 14.7 percent had been involved in auto theft. (Table 10)
- * Nearly three-fifths (58.1 percent) of the males sent back to correctional institutions from aftercare were returned for violating the law, and 69.2 percent of the females were returned for absconding or running away. (Table 11)
- * Among the juveniles newly-admitted in 1978, females were more likely than males to have acted alone or to have had two or more companions when involved in delinquent behavior. However, males were more likely to have had one companion when committing delinquent acts. This represents a marked change from the two previous years, when a significantly higher proportion of females acted alone and a significantly higher proportion of males had two or more companions. (Table 12)
- * At least 85 percent of the newly-admitted males and about three-fourths of the females had been on probation at some time before being committed to a correctional institution. Forty-one percent of the males and 46.3 percent of the females had been under supervision by a county social services agency, while 27.0 percent of the males and 13.0 percent of the females had been supervised by a juvenile court worker. Another 14.3 percent of the males and 14.8 percent of the females had been supervised by the State Department of Health and Social Services. (Table 13)

- * Nearly one-half of the newly-admitted juvenile males (48.8 percent) and three-fifths of the females (60.2 percent) had had experience with child guidance clinics or other child caring agencies before being committed to a correctional institution. (Table 14)
- * Less than one-fourth of the newly-admitted juveniles (22.8 percent of the males and 22.2 percent of the females) came from families receiving some form of public assistance. (Table 15)
- * Forty percent of the newly-admitted males and 47.2 percent of the females had completed eight grades of school or less. Another 34.4 percent of the males and one-third of the females had completed ninth grade. (Table 16)
- * Only 280 of the 670 newly-admitted males and none of the 108 females were reported to have been given an achievement test upon admission. Of those tested, 55.4 percent scored at the sixth grade level or lower. (Table 17)
- * Ten counties accounted for the bulk of new admissions and returns from aftercare in 1978--63.8 percent of the juvenile males and 53.7 percent of the juvenile females. Milwaukee County alone accounted for 28.8 percent of the males and 19.8 percent of the females. (Appendix A)
Characteristics of newly-admitted juveniles from the 10 counties are shown in Appendix B.
- * In every Region except the Northern Region, the percentage of juvenile males who were admitted from probation or returned from aftercare for replacement planning rose substantially in 1978. The percentage of admissions from probation doubled, from 2.8 percent in 1977 to 5.6 percent in 1978, while the percentage of returns from aftercare jumped from 8.7 percent in 1977 to 14.7 percent in 1978. (Appendix C)
- * By contrast, the percentage of juvenile females admitted from probation for replacement purposes held steady while the percentage returned from aftercare dropped sharply, from 23.0 percent in 1977 to 7.6 percent in 1978. Ironically, the Northern Region had the highest percentage of females admitted from probation for replacement planning in both years--

30.5 percent in 1977 and 28.1 percent in 1978. Only 17.9 percent of the 1978 juvenile female admissions from the Northern Region were new admissions, compared with 40 to 88 percent in the other five Regions. (Appendix D)
