### ACQUISITIONS

On June 30, 1978, there were 598 juvenile residents in Wisconsin Juvenile correctional facilities. Ethan Allen School housed 361 boys, Lincoln Hills School held 172 boys and 54 girls, and Camp Flambeau had 11 boys. These totals do not include 106 juveniles (89 boys and 17 girls) who were temporarily absent on furlough on that date. The characteristics of those temporarily absent are not included in this semi-annual bulletin.

The population of juvenile males declined by 24.8 percent and of juvenile females by 3.7 percent from the previous year, primarily through efforts by the Division of Corrections to reduce overcrowding of the juvenile institutions by placing selected youths in alternate care facilities. The 544 boys resident represented a five-year low for June 30th counts. The 54 girls resident were two fewer than a year ago and 35 percent fewer than the number housed four years ago.

The proportion of White juveniles, excluding those of Mexican origin, rose to 68.4 percent, nearly four percentage points higher than a year ago. The percentage of White boys rose only from 65.4 percent to 66.2 percent, but the percentage of White girls rose from 53.6 percent to 72.2 percent.

The median age of juvenile institution residents changed slightly from 16.6 years to 16.5 years for boys and from 16.3 years to 16.1 years for girls.

The proportion of juvenile males who had spent less than three months in institutions on current stay rose to a five-year high of 43 percent. While half of the females had been residents less than three months, the proportion who had been residents for six months or more rose significantly, from 17.9 percent a year earlier to 37 percent on June 30, 1978.

The proportion of newly-committed boys remained stable but, for the third consecutive year, there was an increase in the percentage of boys returned for replacement or medical care, or pending a revocation hearing. The proportion of newly-committed girls rose by more than 18 percentage points while the percentage returned for replacement or medical care dropped from 25 percent to less than 10 percent. Because the total number of girls was small, changes in only a few cases result in large percentage changes.

Milwaukee was the county of commitment for 39.9 percent of the boys and 25.9 percent of the girls resident in juvenile correctional institutions on June 30, 1978. The percentage of boys from Milwaukee County was about the same as a year earlier, but the percentage of girls was down from 44.6 percent on June 30, 1977.
