## ACQUISITIONS

This bulletin summarizes the volume and movement of offender populations supervised by Wisconsin Division of Corrections in fiscal year 1978. Five-year trends are presented for the major population groups, residents in Wisconsin correctional institutions, offenders supervised in the community under probation and parole, residents in the Bureau of Community Correctional Residential Centers, and absconders from probation and parole supervision. Appendix tables present information on average population totals, intake, and separation by institution or type of population and sex for adult institutions, youthful offender institutions, juvenile institutions, probation and parole services, probation and parole absconders, and Bureau of Community Correctional Residential Centers. This bulletin is the companion publication of C-60B, which reports the same information on a calendar year basis.

The total population supervised by the Division of Corrections increased by 7.0 percent, or 1,704 cases, in fiscal year 1978, from 24,320 cases on July 1, 1977 to 26,024 cases on June 30, 1978. This total end-of-year figure represented an 8.5 percent increase in institutional populations to 4,419, a 6.9 percent increase in community supervised populations to 19,056, and a 5.5 percent increase in absconders to 2,549.

Of special interest was the change in the number of youthful offender residents during fiscal year 1978 from 68 to 106, a 55.9 percent increase. The first youthful offender institution opened on July 1, 1976.

Note: Beginning July 1, 1976, absconders were reported separately from actively supervised Probation and Parole cases. Since absconders could not be reported separately prior to fiscal year 1977, they are included in the five-year tables showing Probation and Parole figures for fiscal years 1977 and 1978 as well. However, Tables G and I are new tables identifying these absconders separately for fiscal year 1977 and 1978.

Note: Due to problems in reporting Average Daily Population for Probation and Parole data, the computing method was changed to Average End-of-Month population beginning in September, 1977. Both in order to report data on sexes and type of commitment separately, and to maintain consistency in the data, all figures for Probation and Parole and absconders have been recomputed by average end-of-month population for all years.

Table A presents the average daily population of the total number of cases supervised by the Division of Corrections in both correctional institutions and in the community, with percent change, for fiscal years 1974 through 1978. The total average population rose by almost 8,000 cases over the past five years, from 16,790 in 1974 to 25,116 in 1978. This increase was consistent, except for 1977, where the average population decreased by about 700 cases. On a percentage basis, this rise in the average population was much greater through 1976 than in 1977 and 1978. The percent of increase was 16.5 in 1974, 21.1 in 1976, but only 5.3 in 1978.

Table B presents the average daily population and percent change of the total population supervised in correctional institutions. The total average population rose from 2,899 in 1974 to 4,113 in 1978. The rate of increase was not consistent, however. The population increased by 6.5 percent in 1974, but by 14.2 in 1975 and 13.0 percent in 1976. This rate of change decelerated to 8.0 percent in 1977, and still more to 1.8 percent in 1978.

Table C presents the average daily population of the total correctional institution population by type of institution and sex. The increase in the total population appeared largely due to increases in the adult populations. Adult males rose from 2,089 in 1974 to 3,120 in 1978. The slight decrease in males in 1978 appeared due to the opening of community residential centers on July 29, 1977, and of youthful offender institutions on July 1, 1976. The number of female adults almost doubled over the past five years, from 73 in 1974 to 144 in 1978. Youthful offender populations almost tripled since opening two years ago, rising from 35 males in 1977 to 94 males and one female in 1978. Both male and female juvenile populations remained relatively stable over the years, with males stable at about 660 and females stable at about 60.

Table D presents the average end-of-month population of the total number of cases under community supervision, including probation, parole, and absconders, with percent of change. The average population increased dramatically from 13,891 in 1974 to 21,003 in 1978. The pattern of change from year to year was very similar to the pattern in Table A. The population increased by about 20 percent through 1976, decreased by 5.1 percent in 1977, and then rose slightly by 6.0 percent in 1978.

Table E presents the average end-of-month population of the total number of cases under community supervision broken down by probation and parole, including absconders. The great majority of cases were supervised under probation. The probation population rose dramatically from 11,042 in 1974 to 17,526 in 1976. This figure dropped by 900 cases in 1977 to 16,627, and then rose again to 17,510 cases in 1978. Offenders supervised under parole, including mandatory releases, accounted for much less of the total cases under community supervision. The parole population remained stable at about 2,850 in 1974 and 1975, and then rose to 3,290 in 1976. Like probation cases, the parole population decreased to 3,183 in 1977, and then rose again to 3,493 in 1978.

Table F presents the average end-of-month populations under probation supervision by type and sex of populations, including absconders. The great majority of probation cases were adult males and females. Adult male cases increased from 8,930 in 1974 to 14,209 in 1976. Male cases decreased since 1976 to 12,994 in 1978, reflecting in part the growing number of cases designated as youthful offenders since July 1, 1976. Adult female cases increased from 1,566 in 1974 to 2,734 in 1978, with a slight decrease in 1977. Female cases did not continue to decrease in 1978, as did male cases, perhaps reflecting the growing number of women committing crimes similar to men, and the increasingly equitable treatment of men and women in recent years.

Table G presents the average end-of-month absconders from probation supervision separately by type and sex in fiscal years 1977 and 1978. Total number of absconders increased from 2,076 in 1977 to 2,228 in 1978. Almost all absconders were adults. Male cases rose from 1,715 in 1977 to 1,803 in 1978, and female cases rose from 359 in 1977 to 417 in 1978.

Table H presents the average end-of-month population under parole and juvenile aftercare supervision by type and sex of populations, including absconders. The vast majority of cases were males. Male cases under every type of supervision increased from 1974 to 1978. Adult females tended to increase slightly since 1974. Female cases under inter-state compact and under juvenile aftercare decreased from 1974 to 1978. Juvenile cases decreased from 149 in 1974 to 91 in 1978.

Table I presents the average end-of-month absconders from parole and juvenile aftercare supervision separately by type and sex in fiscal years 1977 and 1978. Total number of absconders remained relatively stable at 269 in 1977 and 275 in 1978. Almost all absconders were adults. Male adults rose slightly from 234 in 1977 to 242 in 1978. All other categories showed no change.
