PROBATION AND PAROLE TERMINATIONS 1977

A total of 9,105 persons (8,277 adults and 828 juveniles) were removed from Division of Corrections probation and parole caseloads during calendar year 1977. Supervision was terminated either because the term of probation, parole, or aftercare was successfully completed or because supervision was revoked for law or rules violation. It should be noted that juvenile probation and aftercare supervision is automatically terminated upon attainment of the age of majority (18 years).

Tables 1 through 17 contain information on adult probation and parole terminations. A total of 7,174 men and 1,103 women were removed from field caseloads in 1977. Data for 50 male probationers, 18 male parolees, and three female probationers who died while under supervision are included only in Table 1. Information specific to the 888 men and 70 women revoked during 1977 may be found in Tables 16 and 17. Information about the 724 boys and 104 girls removed from juvenile probation or aftercare supervision during the same time period may be found in Tables 18-39. Information about one boy on juvenile probation who died while under supervision is included only in Table 18. Tables 38 and 39 deal only with juveniles whose supervision was revoked.

Adult Male Terminations

Division of Corrections field supervision of 7,174 men (6,053 probationers and 1,121 parolees) was terminated during 1977. Probationers completed supervision successfully in 9 out of 10 cases; parolees in 77 percent of the cases.

Employment, income, and marital ties seem directly related to success or failure while under probation or parole supervision. Men reported as holding full-time employment while under supervision were successful in 95 percent of the cases. Men unemployed while on probation or parole were successful in 83 percent of the cases. (See Table 9.) The importance of an adequate income as a concomitant with successful completion of probation or parole supervision is clearly indicated in Table 10. Almost all men (97 percent of the probationers and 90 percent of the parolees) who earned at least \$400.00 per month successfully completed supervision. Those with lesser incomes were somewhat less successful, while men reported as having no income were successful in only 6 out of 10 cases. Men who were married at the time of termination had a success rate 10 percentage points higher than those who were single, divorced, or separated. (See Table 6.)

Men who resided in Milwaukee County were less likely to complete supervision successfully than those living in other areas of the state. The success rate in Milwaukee County was 80 percent compared with a 90 percent rate in all other counties. (See Table 2). White males, whether probationers or parolees, were more often successful than non-Whites. (See Table 5.)

Nearly two-fifths of the probationers and over two-fifths of the parolees who were revoked had been convicted of new offenses or had been revoked in lieu of conviction. Roughly one-fifth (22 percent of the probationers, 18 percent of the parolees) were revoked because they absconded from supervision. (See Table 16.) Property offenses were reported as the most serious violation for 4 out of 10 unsuccessful probationers and parolees. Seventeen percent of the revoked probationers, as contrasted with 28 percent of the revoked parolees, were reported as having committed new crimes against persons. (See Table 17.)

Adult Female Terminations

A total of 1,100 women (1,037 probationers and 63 parolees) were removed from supervision in 1977. Nine out of 10 women successfully completed supervision. Women who were employed on either a full or part-time basis while on parole were successful in all cases. Women on probation who were employed on either a full or a regular part-time basis were successful in almost all cases. Women under either type of supervision who had some reported monthly income were more successful than those who had none. (See Tables 9 and 10.)

The percentage of women successfully completing supervision was higher than that of men, especially among parolees. Over 93 percent of the women probationers and nearly 97 percent of the parolees were terminated successfully. (See Table 3.)

Almost 40 percent of the female probationers who were unsuccessful were revoked because of, or in lieu of, conviction of new charges. (See Table 16.) About two-fifths of the revoked probationers were convicted of property offenses. (See Table 17.)

Juvenile Male Terminations

Seven hundred and twenty-four boys (200 probationers and 524 aftercare cases) were terminated in 1977. Boys on probation were successful in 8 out of 10 cases; those on aftercare in 7 out of 10 cases. (See Table 20.)

A significantly higher percentage of White boys (85 percent) successfully completed probation than Blacks (48 percent); however, 73 percent of Blacks successfully completed aftercare supervision, compared with 68 percent of Whites. (See Table 22.)

About two-thirds of the boys who were known to be drug users successfully completed probation or aftercare supervision. By contrast, about 85 percent of those who did not use drugs had successful completions. (See Table 35).

School enrollment (probably masked by the age variable) seems to have had little relationship to the successful completion of a period of probation or aftercare. Boys who were not enrolled in shoool were more often successful than those who were. (See Table 29.) Boys who were employed full-time or on a regular part-time basis while on probation or aftercare were more successful than those who were unemployed or employed on a sporadic basis. (See Table 24.)

Juvenile Female Terminations

One hundred and four girls (33 probation cases and 71 aftercare cases) were removed from supervision in 1977. Probationers were terminated successfully in 8 out of 10 cases, while those removed from aftercare were successful in 7 out of 10 cases. (See Table 20.)

Nearly one-third of the girls on probation or aftercare were known to have used drugs while under supervision. Sixty-three percent of this group terminated supervision successfully, compared with 80 percent of those who were not drug users. (See Table 35.)

Girls who were enrolled in some type of school program while on supervision were somewhat less successful than those not enrolled. (See Table 29.)


