#### **PREFACE**

The explosion of computer technology and the growth of data banks has led increasingly to concern over the exchange of information about individuals. Not surprisingly, the right of privacy related to the use of medical, credit, financial, and criminal justice information has become a major social issue of the current decade.

The attention given to the topic of privacy in recent years has accentuated the need to compile a collection of privacy documents in the criminal justice field. The bibliography that follows cites publications concerned with privacy, confidentiality and security of criminal justice information. Containing over 600 references, this volume focuses on documents which have been published during the past ten years.

The bibliography has been compiled to assist those who must formulate policy and draft legislation that will govern the collection, storage and dissemination of criminal justice information. Consequently, sources from many disciplines have been drawn upon. The scope of the present bibliography ranges across literature from the legal, planning, research, computer and information systems areas, as well as from other disciplines involved with privacy policy. Information sources include legal and periodical literature, government publications, and publications produced by both the private sector and public interest groups.

#### HOW TO USE THE BIBLIOGRAPHY

#### Structure

The bibliography information is divided into four categories of publications, each comprising a major section. The first section, legal publications, includes articles and comments prepared for and published in journals of law schools throughout the United States. Also included are articles of interest to the legal profession which were published in magazines, newspapers, and other periodicals.

The second section contains references to periodical literature and books. Included are articles on topics of informational privacy and security practices published in newspapers, magazines and journals, which reflect the research and thoughts of individual authors.

The third section groups citations to documents published by the public sector. These entries reference reports and studies which have been officially sponsored by, and prepared on behalf, of a public agency at the federal or state level, or on behalf of foreign governments. Documents from all branches of government are cited.

Finally, publications of the private sector and of organizations working in the public interest are represented in the fourth section. Covered are studies and articles by corporations, private associations and foundations. In this section, as in the government publications section, entries are alphabetically listed under the responsible organization. Where individuals either author or edit a publication, their identity is acknowledged under the heading of the organization. This organization-based approach to the latter two groups of literature should facilitate retrieval of documents.

In addition to these four sections which contain document citations, two

other sections designed to assist retrieval have been included.

Section 5 is a listing of subject index key words which briefly describe the contents of the documents. Section 6, applies this listing by connecting the subject index key words to the citations. An explanation of how to use this section to enhance document retrieval is discussed below.

## Illustration

Each citation in the bibliography contains three units of information:

- (1) citation number
- (2) document citation
- (3) subject index number (key word)

Each citation or reference to a document contains both a unique citation number (sequential) assigned to it and a set of subject index numbers. The latter numbers represent terms which characterize the content of each document cited. All citations are arranged alphabetically within each section and subsection.

The bibliography is structured to permit two principal methods of retrieval. First, because entries are arranged alphabetically, an author or sponsoring organization may be found by means of scanning the text. Once located, the reader can determine what topics the publication addresses by simply matching the subject index key word (key word number located in the right margin) with the numbers listed in Section 5. These numbers are cross-referenced to the subject index key words. In this way annotation is gained without the need for an abstract. Second, if the subject of interest is known, the search may be narrowed by use of the subject index to document citations found in Section 6. The index enables searches to be conducted by special topics or selected privacy areas.

The subject index (Section 6) contains two units of information:

- (1) key word and number
- (2) citation numbers

The citation numbers found under the key word represent those documents in the bibliography which include a discussion of the key word listed. In addition, citation numbers pinpoint the location of the entry in the bibliography. To illustrate, consider the key word "confidentiality."


Go directly to that heading in Section 6, and, having found the citation numbers dealing with "confidentiality", proceed to the page which contains the full citation entry. In this manner, a general scanning of the bibliography is avoided.


Figure 1 graphically illustrates the use of the subject index. The step-by-step procedure would go as follows:

- Choose from Section 5 the subject matter area to be searched (Example here: "Standards").
- 2. Go to Section 6
- 3. Proceed to the key word (listed alphabetically).
- 4. Note citation numbers listed (e.g., 4087).
- Proceed to section of the bibliography where the full citation is given.
- 6. Seek other citations discussing this same subject matter using the same procedure.

Once the citation is found, the user may note the additional subject index numbers given in the right column for each document. In the illustration, these numbers ("200, 685, 790, 840") indicate other topics the publication addresses and provide clues for use of additional subject index key words which may lead to other cited documents of interest.
