You will find attached four studies of time served by sentence length for inmates authorized for parole from the Indiana Reformatory. These studies are for sentences of; (1) 1-5 years, (2) 2-5 years, (3) 1-10 years, and (4) 2-10 years.

In the near future additional studies will be conducted for those inmates authorized for parole from the Indiana Reformatory with a singular sentence of; (1) 2-14 years, (2) 2-21 years, (3) 10 years, (4) 10-20 years, and (5) 10-25 years.

The Research and Statistics Division also plans to conduct similar studies for those inmates authorized for parole from the Indiana Youth Center and the Indiana Women's Prison. These studies are to be completed within the next few weeks.

The present studies were conducted with the assistance of Miss Florence Muli, graduate student from Indiana State University, and Mr. James Hague, Indiana Parole Board Assistant.

#### -INDIANA REFORMATORY-

The primary goal of this study was to determine the average length of institutional time served in the Indiana Department of Correction by inmates at the Indiana Reformatory who had a sentence length of 1-5 years and who received parole authorization.

There were ninty-five (95) inmates with a singular sentence of 1-5 years authorized for parole from the Indiana Reformatory from January, 1975, through October, 1975. From this population a sample of twenty-five (25) inmates was randomly selected to serve as subjects. The data for this study was obtained from the "minutes" of the Indiana Parole Board and from the Central Office packets of the subjects. The following information was collected; (1) the inmate's file number, (2) the inmate's month and year of admission into the Indiana Department of Correction, (3) the month and year the inmate was authorized for parole, (4) the inmate's ethnic group, and (5) the most serious commiting offense of the inmate.

This information was analyzed to determine; (1) the average length of institutional time served in the Indiana Department of Correction by inmates authorized for parole from the Indiana Reformatory who had a sentence length of 1-5 years, (2) the range of time served by all subjects in this study, (3) the ethnic breakdown of the subjects in this study, (4) the average (mean) length of time served by the White inmates in this study, (5) the range of time served by the Black inmates in this study, and (7) the range of time served by the Black inmates in this study.
