"Sesame Street Goes to Prison" is now functioning at Dwight and Joliet Correctional Centers in Illinois. These are the first two facilities in Illinois to receive grant money to set up the program. The grant is funded through the cooperation of the Children's Television Workshop, the John Howard Association and the Illinois Department of Corrections.

The Policy Development Division, specifically Research and Evaluation, of the Ill. Dept. of Corrections has worked together with these correctional centers in a mutual interest for the program. A result of this interest will be an evaluation of this program in hopes that this type of cooperation will produce better and more effective programming in the future.

A pre-program type of questionnaire was developed and then distributed at Dwight Correctional Center. This questionnaire figured to help produce a more complete evaluation of the Sesame Street Program. Another questionnaire of a similar nature will follow several months into the program.

This attitude questionnaire/survey was distributed and filled out by both residents and staff alike in an effort to gauge their feelings about the program before it started which would offer a basis of comparison for a similar survey once the program was in full progress. The results of this later comparison would form a basis for determining the effectiveness and usefulness of the program.

The information presented here is just a basic tabulation of all the answers for each individual question--by staff members and then by residents.

The same questionnaire was distributed to the residents and staff however there were some questions that pertained specifically to one or the other group separately. The completed questionnaires were kept and tallied separately by staff and by resident groups in order to see if there was a difference in attitudes between the two groups.

The following information shows the results of the tabulations that were done on those attitude questionnaires.
