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ABSTRACT

This report examines the recidivism rates for individuals released from drug contract houses during 1977 and 1978.

After an analysis of the data, the following conclusions can be reached: of the 21 individuals who were released to the streets from a drug contract house in 1977, one individual recidivated giving a recidivism rate of <u>58</u>. Of those residents released during 1978, there were 13 releases and two were recidivists during the one year follow-up period giving a recidivism rate of <u>158</u>. For the combined sample of releases from drug contract houses during 1977 and 1978, there were 34 individuals released and 3 were returned during the year follow-up giving a recidivism rate of <u>98</u>.

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INTRODUCTION

In June of 1977, the Massachusetts Department of Correction began sending individuals to drug contract houses. These programs were established to address the needs of drug abusers in the system and to assist them in their reintegration into the community. The several different programs utilize different techniques and strategies, but they all attempt to prevent the individuals' return to drug dependency upon release back into the community.

This present study is the third component of a three-part evaluation of residents released from a drug contract house in 1977 and 1978. The first report was a client profile of these residents as well as a statistical breakdown of background characteristics of program particlpants according to their classification as program completers or noncompleters.¹ The second report was an analysis of the sample in terms of the basic statistical differences between individuals who were program completers and those who were program non-completers.² This report is a one-year recidivism evaluation for those individuals released from a drug contract house in 1977 and 1978.

SAMPLES:

For the purpose of this study, a population consisting of residents released from drug contract houses during 1977 and 1978 was chosen as the sample. During 1977, a total of 21 individuals were released from drug contract houses to the community on parole or discharge status. For 1978, 13 residents were released from drug contract houses to the community. The breakdown by specific house or program follows in Table I.

OUTCOME MEASURE:

In measuring the reduction of further criminal behavior, the standard used will be recidivism rates. A recidivist is defined as any subject who is returned to a federal or state correctional institution or to a county jail or house of correction for 30 days or more as a result of either a parole violation or a new court sentence.

DATA COLLECTION:

Data collected for both samples consists of (1) commitment variage bles, (2) personal background variables, (3) criminal history variables, (4) furlough variables and (5) recidivism variables. This material was collected from the computerized data base developed by the Correction and Parole Management Information System (CAPMIS). Additional data was collected from the files of the Department of Correction, the Parole Board, and the Board of Probation. The data was analyzed on the Massachusetts State College Computer Network (MSCCN).

RESULTS

For 1977, of the 21 individuals who were released from one of the drug contract houses, one individual was returned to a federal or state correctional institution or to a county jail or house of correction for 30 days or more within one year of follow-up. This gives a recidivism rate for releases from drug contract houses in 1977 of 5%.

Regarding the 1978 releases, of the 13 individuals who were released from one of the drug contract houses, two individuals were reincarcerated during the one-year follow-up. This yields a recidivism rate for releases from drug contract houses in 1978 of <u>158</u>. For the combined sample of 1977 and 1978 releases, out of the 34 individuals who were released from a drug contract house, three recidivated giving a total recidivism rate for the combined sample of 9%. For the three recidivists, one was returned for violating the conditions of his parole (changed home or job without notification to parole officer) and two were returned for committing new offenses. A comparison of the recidivism rates for individuals released in 1977 from drug contract houses to those released from walled institutions and other facilities follows in Table II and Table III.³

The recidivism rates for the drug contract houses seem to be much lower than the walled institutions and comparable to the rates for pre-release centers. However, due to the small sample size, it was not possible to control for selection factors in this population sample.

Appendix I contains a statistical description of characteristics of individuals released to the street from drug contract houses during 1977 and 1978 with corresponding recidivism rates.

For the combined sample of 1977 and 1978 releases, it is possible to analyze the sample to determine the expected rate of recidivism for the sample. This was accomplished through the use of base expectancy tables. The specific base expectancy table utilized was constructed on a population of individuals released from Massachusetts Department of Correction institutions during the year 1976.⁴ This table is presented in Table IV; the specific risk categories are summarized and presented as Table V.

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Base expectancy risk categories as summarized in Table V were applied to the combined population of individuals released from drug contract houses during 1977 and 1978. This procedure resulted in an expected recidivism rate of 30.21% for the combined sample. This rate is higher than the actual rate of 9%. These findings are summarized in Table VI.
