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AN ANALYSIS OF RECIDIVISM AMONG WOMEN RELEASED FROM CHARLOTTE HOUSE 1977 AND 1978 RELEASES

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## ABSTRACT

This report examines the recidivism rates for women released from Charlotte House during 1977 and 1978.

After an analysis of the data, the following conclusions can be reached: of the 15 women released from Charlotte House during 1977, one woman recidivated giving a recidivism rate of 7%. Of those women released during 1978, there were 12 women released and one recidivated during the one year follow-up period giving . a recidivism rate of 8%. For the combined sample of 1977 and 1978 Charlotte House releases, there were 27 women who were released and 2 were returned during the one year follow-up, giving a recidivism rate of 7%.

### INTRODUCTION

In June of 1972, the Massachusetts legislature passed the "Correctional Reform Act" which authorized the establishment of different correctional programs that were to be outside of the walled institutions. Charlotte House was one such program that was established to service women offenders and assist them in their reintegration into the community. In 1973, Charlotte House began accepting women on a pre-release basis from the Massachusetts Department of Correction.

This report is the third component of a three-part evaluation of women released from Charlotte House during 1977 and 1978. The first component of the evaluation was a client profile of these women released during 1977 and 1978.<sup>1</sup> The second component of the evaluation was an analysis of the sample in terms of the basic statistical differences between women who were program completers and those who were program non-completers.<sup>2</sup> This report is a recidivism follow-up examination for women released to the streets from Charlotte House during 1977 and 1978.

## Research Design

This study was designed with the purpose of answering the following research question:

Are those women who ended their terms of incarceration in Charlotte House less likely to be reincarcerated within one year of their release than are similar types of individuals who did not participate in the pre-release program?

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## Samples

In measuring the reduction of further criminal behavior, a population consisting of all women released from Charlotte House, either by permit of the Parole Board or a certidicate of discharge, during the years 1977 and 1978 was chosen (N=27). The follow-up period was one year from the date of release for all women released in 1977 and 1978.

## Data Collection

Data collection consisted of criminal history variables, social background variables, commitment variables, and recidivism variables. The material was collected from the Massachusetts Department of Correction Central Office files and from the computerized data base developed by the Correction and Parole Management Information System (CAPMIS) and was produced on the Massachusetts State College Computer Network (MSCCN).

#### Outcome Measure

In measuring the reduction of further criminal behavior, the standard used will be recidivism rates. A recidivist is defined as any women who is returned to a Federal or State prison to a county house of correction or to a jail for 30 days or more. The follow-up period will be exactly one full year from the date of the subject's release from Charlotte House. A person can be returned either as a parole violator or on a new conviction for a new offense.

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#### Results

For 1977, there were 15 women released directly from Charlotte House to the streets. Of these fifteen, one was returned for more than thirty days during the one year follow-up period, giving a recidivism rate of 7%. During 1978, there were 12 women released from Charlotte House and one recidivated, giving a rate of 8%. For the combined sample of 1977 and 1978 releases, there were 27 women released during this period and two were returned during the year follow-up, giving a recidivism rate for the total sample of 7%. These results are summarized in Table I below.

These rates can be compared to the rates found during 1977, the last year that recidivism statistics were analyzed.<sup>3</sup> Table II gives the recidivism rates by releasing institution for all individuals released during 1977.

When the Charlotte House rate is compared to the Framinghamwomen rates, Charlotte House has a rate that is much lower (7% vs. 23%). The Charlotte House rate is also comparable to the rates for the other pre-release centers in general. Due to the small sample size, it was not possible to control for selection factors in making this analysis:
